Kentucky 2003: Safe Schools Data Project



January 2004

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re Kentucky schools safe? The Kentucky Center for School Safety (KCSS) is committed to assisting schools in becoming as safe an environment as possible for the children of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The following report is one of the many tasks that KCSS completes each year in that endeavor.

School safety is paramount not only to KCSS, but to every parent who has a child in a Kentucky public school. However, let's consider school safety in the larger context of child safety. While a child is in school approximately seven hours, the other seventeen hours are spent elsewhere in the community. Whether a child rides a school bus or private car or walks, getting the child to and from school safely propels us into the discussion of traffic safety. On the other hand, visiting a local shopping mall, a park, recreational center, museum, or other public place begs the question of public safety. Reports of domestic violence and abuse relate to issues of personal safety. As important as school safety is, we should not view school safety in isolation, but in the broader context of community safety. When we place school safety in context, we realize that the safety of our children is not the responsibility of schools or parents alone, but that of all who live in the community. Keeping our children safe can only be accomplished through a coordinated effort among parents, school personnel, community groups, and every citizen.

As this fifth Safe Schools Data report is published, we urge schools and communities to use this data in conjunction with school officials to help make our communities safer – both in school and out-of-school.

he Kentucky Center for School Safety (KCSS) has reported discipline data from school districts since the Safe Schools Data Project began in 1998 as a pilot project. In the beginning, with partial funding from a federal grant, the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) collaborated with the Research Triangle Institute (RTI) in North Carolina to design an electronic reporting system. Individual schools completed specific data-gathering worksheets and then entered the data into a Web database managed by RTI. After arranging and sorting



the data for interpretation purposes, KCSS and KDE received the data for analysis and a report was issued. For the second year, 1999-2000, the data collection process remained essentially unchanged; however, additional attendance data were collected regarding suspensions and expulsions. KCSS contracted with R.E.A.C.H. of Louisville, Inc. to analyze, interpret, and write the project report. Three separate reports were issued organized around state, regional and district-level summaries. In the third year of the collection process as in previous years, data were entered into an electronic system operated by the Research Triangle Institute and each district confirmed electronic completion of the data. The data set was then sent to R.E.A.C.H. for entry into a statistical analysis program and subsequently forwarded to KCSS for interpretation, analysis, and writing. In the third year of reporting, Eastern Kentucky University staff consolidated these responsibilities and was solely responsible for producing the report. The third report combined district, regional and state data into one report and was issued in March 2002. In the fourth year of data collection, school districts, with the exception of Jefferson County, used the STI software for data collection and electronically transported their data to KDE. Superintendents were given a final chance to check the data and returned a signed verification sheet to KDE.

he fifth year of data collection is the first time that data collection procedures have been identical to those used the previous year. The reporting format has changed somewhat in that we are no longer reporting alternative placements as a disciplinary action. Collection of alternative placements as disciplinary actions has been problematic from the beginning. Consider that

an alternative placement is often the result of a pattern of behavior rather than a single event. A suspension or expulsion has frequently been levied as a disciplinary action for a specific behavioral incident awaiting the results of the referral process to an alternative setting. Since each behavioral incident must be connected to one

disciplinary action, suspensions and expulsions are reported first to ensure accurate reporting of all out-of-school proceedings. To prevent duplicate counting of disciplinary actions, the alternative placement that may have occurred following the suspension of expulsion would not be reported; therefore, creating a under-reporting of alternative placements. Since alternative placements may not be as accurate as other disciplinary actions; moreover, it is the Center's belief that alternative placements should be considered an intervention, expulsion (with and without services), suspensions and corporal punishment are the only reported disciplinary actions at the district level. However, in order to remain consistent with past years and to allow for comparisons between years, charts that have total disciplinary actions will include alternative placements. As a result, the task of analyzing and reporting the state's disciplinary data is guite monumental, as 1,265 schools report four categories of disciplinary actions for nine board policy violations and three categories of disciplinary actions for thirty-three law violations. This creates a lengthy process of compiling, sorting and crosschecking the data before analysis can begin. However, without this arduous and tedious attention to detail, confidence in the data would be compromised.

As in past years, the data are first reported for all students. Data for Caucasian and African-American students are then disaggregated when the number of African-American students in the district is large enough to allow reporting without violating the Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Asian American, Hispanic American, American Indian, and other racial groups are not reported since their numbers are so small in most Kentucky counties that privacy rules might be violated.

Although with continued training support from KDE and KCSS data definitions have remained constant, there are areas that need additional consideration. Those areas include:

- 1) **Board policy violation categories**. There is still variability across districts as to how they report an incident that is not included in the current list. For example, disturbance on a bus is often reported as a class disturbance since that is the closest match from the list.
- 2) <u>Unique identifier</u>. The discipline data are reported by incident and disciplinary action. Assigning each Kentucky student a unique number that would move with them regardless of where they were enrolled would allow the data to be analyzed more comprehensively. For example, a unique identifier would allow the dis-aggregation of the data by placement in special education, mobility, low socio-economic status, repeat offenders, limited English proficiency, etc. Currently, we are unable to perform these types of analyses and that limits the interpretative value of the data.

KCSS has worked diligently over the past five years to provide a report that reflects as accurately as possible a picture of student behavior in Kentucky schools. Each year our confidence has grown in our data collection procedures and this year's report is reflective of the developmental process that has occurred.

he passage of HB330 in 1998 not only created the Kentucky Center for School Safety, but also required all Kentucky public schools to create a school safety plan. Additionally, schools were mandated to report all discipline data to the Kentucky Department of Education. While the bill does not specifically link these two activities, a school safety plan cannot be considered comprehensive unless there is a direct link between the data collection and the planning processes.



Let's consider what is essential in a comprehensive school safety plan. Graphic A illustrates that four components are necessary for a school safety plan to be considered comprehensive, i.e., Student Management Plan, Emergency Management Plan, Physical Plant Plan and Staff Handbook. However, the over-arching representation of data symbolizes the necessity for data to be collected, analyzed and reviewed at every step of the planning process.



DATA COLLECTION, ANALYSIS AND REVIEW

First and foremost, a school safety plan must begin with the collection of data. A school should begin the development of a school safety plan with the collection and/or consolidation of several types of data. A school should use the data collected for this report as a starting point. Data regarding suspension, expulsion and corporal punishment, as well as other discipline responses that occurred as a result of an office discipline referral should be compiled. Next, a format similar to the one below should be used to analyze the data:

- 1. Collect other forms of data, i.e., observational and student, staff and parent surveys, and combine with discipline data.
- 2. Sort the data by location, month, time, gender, ethnicity and type. Depict the data graphically or pictorially.
- 3. Analyze the data by posing several questions:
 - 3.1. What are the most frequent infractions?
 - 3.2. Where and when are they occurring?
 - 3.3. What are your least frequent infractions?
 - 3.4. Where and when are they occurring?
 - 3.5. Who are your most frequent offenders?
 - 3.6. Is there a common denominator among repeat offenders, type of infraction occurring most frequently, and location and time of most infractions?
- 4. Sort the data into four categories for possible changes: <u>Structural</u>, <u>Organizational</u>, <u>Instructional</u>, and <u>Rules and Policies</u>.

The goal with the data collection and analysis is to produce information that drives planning and decision-making.

<u>Student Management Plan:</u> Every school should clearly articulate the rules and expectations for positive student behavior. Frequently schools call this a Discipline Plan or Code of Conduct; however, rather than a list of "Thou Shall Nots", the plan should clearly specify expectations for student behavior that will result in student success. An approach to developing the Student Management Plan is to:

- 1. Use the school data to direct the development of a pro-active student management plan that acts as a guide for positive student behavior and sets the stage for student success.
- Include the school's mission and a philosophy of behavior management that treats students with respect and dignity while placing the responsibility for behavior squarely on the shoulders of the student.
- 3. Address misbehavior in the plan. Rather than give a finite listing of infractions with a corresponding consequence, construct a menu of disciplinary consequences for misbehavior. This will provide staff the opportunity to consider the degree and frequency of the misbehavior before choosing an appropriate consequence.

Emergency Management Guide: In a natural or man-made disaster, events occur that necessitate the coordination and delivery of crisis intervention and response services. Consequently, schools must be prepared with a plan of action, which is really a set of plans rather than one overall plan. For every possible emergency situation, a school should have a plan that addresses readiness, response and recovery and identifies the responsibilities of each staff for each stage. For example, responding to a fire in a school is very different than responding to a tornado; therefore, a plan for each is necessary. Practice drills are necessary to ensure that staff and students know how to respond to emergency situations. <u>Physical Plant Plan:</u> Creating a safe and healthy learning environment necessitates maintaining an appropriate physical setting. The plan should require that a complete safety inspection of the building and grounds be conducted annually. Additionally, requisite monthly safety checks should be implemented as mitigating unsafe conditions may arise in short periods of time. All staff members should be made aware of the process for reporting potentially unsafe conditions to the principal for a timely response to remedy the unsafe conditions.

Staff Handbook: A staff handbook is a vital tool for not only the new teacher, but the seasoned teacher as well. A staff handbook should include everything a teacher needs to know about school rules, routines and procedures. While the rules, routines and procedures are preventive in nature, a major portion of the handbook should address positive student management and extend the student discipline plan to include staff instructional responsibilities. For example, during student arrival, the handbook will clearly identify staff responsibilities for supervision while different responsibilities may be identified for dismissal. Additionally, the handbook should outline a plan for instructing students regarding the student management and emergency management plans.

Data should always be reviewed in context. For example, a school experiencing a suspension increase could be experiencing any or all of the following: (1) a rising level of student misbehavior and school disorder; (2) an administrative accentuation on commission of offenses; or (3) a building with physical plant or staffing problems.


The context should drive the intervention plan.

suspension, corporal punishment, alternative placement*, expulsion with services and expulsion without services. Kentucky's total public school population for 2002-2003 was 629,030 students. Of that total, only 8.5% students committed an offense that resulted in a suspension, corporal punishment or an



expulsion (with or without services), (Lesser disciplinary actions, e.g., parent conferences, detentions, in-school suspensions, are not reported to KDE). In reviewing the upcoming data regarding commission of board and law violations, it is very important to keep in mind that over 91% of Kentucky's students were <u>not</u> included in the data. To illustrate that point, **Chart 1** shows the percentage of offenders compared to total population.






Chart 2 illustrates the percentage of offenders by population group. White offenders comprise 75.44% of offenders, African-Americans 22.30%, and all other racial groups, 2.26%. Since Kentucky's student population is approximately 10% African-American, their representation in the offender group is larger than their proportion in the general student population.

Offenders by Population Group






The term offender as used in Charts 1 and 2 refers to an individual student involved in committing an incident of prohibited behavior. An offender, however, may commit multiple offenses. Multiple infractions are included in disciplinary actions.


Disciplinary Actions for Violations of Board Policy

Chart 3 provides the total number of disciplinary actions for nine categories of school board policy violations for the past three years. Disciplinary actions for the current year were 3.5% higher than the total for 2001-2002. This year's increase combined with a 3.8% increase in '01-02 yields a 7.5% increase from the 2000-2001 total. The data indicate a strong upward trend in disciplinary actions for board violations and suggest the need for closer analysis at the school and district level.





A categorical breakdown of disciplinary actions for board policy violations is depicted in **Chart 4**. Tobacco Violations, Profanity or Vulgarity, and Failure to Attend Detention have shown a steady decline over the three years; however, aggressive behaviors, (e.g., Fighting and Threat and Intimidation violations) have shown a more troubling upward trend. The fluctuations seen in the other six categories suggest that a trend has not yet emerged in those areas. A careful school-level analysis is necessary to examine factors that may be contributing to this increase to develop appropriate interventions.



With regard to specific disciplinary actions, the results presented in **Chart 5** indicate that the number of out-of-school suspensions has increased each of the three years reported. Suspensions in '02-03 increased 3.8% over the number reported in '01-02. Expulsions with and without services continue to be a relatively small number statewide and indicate an overall downward trend. Disciplinary actions involving corporal punishment '02-03 were 9.98% less than the number reported in '00-01 despite a 3.67% increase in corporal punishment from '00-01 to '01-02.



Disciplinary actions for board policy violations are disaggregated by gender and ethnicity in **Chart 6**. The results presented in **Chart 6** indicate that the number of disciplinary actions for board violations increased during the three-year reporting period. The percentage increases from '00-01 to '02-03 for total disciplinary actions were: a. males up 7.3%, b. females up 7.95%, c. White, non-Hispanics up 5.7%, and African-Americans up 8.2%. Disciplinary actions for all other ethnic groups more than doubled, although the raw number of disciplinary actions is quite small when compared to Whites and African-Americans. The Kentucky Department of Education reports that approximately 10.4% of Kentucky's students are African-American. The proportion of disciplinary actions among white students (approximately 86.29% of the population) is 76.9% while the proportion of disciplinary actions for African-Americans is 20.7%.


he FBI Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Form was adopted at the beginning of this reporting process as a format for reporting law violations on school grounds or at school-related activities.

Under this system, *Part I* crimes involve an illegal act directed against a person or property and are generally considered to be more serious offenses.

Part II law violations may result in an arrest, but are considered less serious. Definitions of Part I and Part II crimes can be found in **Appendix A**. The following charts show the reported incidents of Part I and Part II law violations from 2000-2003.

Disciplinary actions for *Part I* law violations are depicted in **Chart 7**. The 2002-2003 data show an 11.9% decrease in Part I law violations from the 2001-2002 school year.



Part I law violations relate to acts against a person or property and are generally considered to be more serious offenses. Refer to Appendix A for definitions of *Part I* and *Part II* law violations.


Disciplinary actions for *Part I* law violations by category are shown in **Chart 8**. Fluctuating numbers for robbery, motor vehicle theft, burglary and arson suggest that a trend has not been established at this point. Larceny-theft has steadily decreased in the past three years with this year's data showing a 52.9% decrease from '00-01. There were no reports of the most violent of Part I offenses, homicide and forcible rape, during the three years depicted; however, the 30.7% increase in disciplinary actions for aggravated assaults from '01-02 to '02-03 is troubling.

Total disciplinary actions for Part II law violations are shown in **Chart 9**. The 2002-2003 data represent a 2.1% decrease from the total in '00-01. Although small, the decrease is certainly promising. Schools should look at their own data to determine possible contributing factors for this decrease.



Part II law violations may result in an arrest, but are considered to be less serious than Part I crimes. Refer to Appendix A for definitions of Part I and Part II law violations.

Charts 10 and 11 depict disciplinary actions for *Part II* law violations by category. In Chart 10, the most significant categories are weapons A. handguns and other weapons, D. Disciplinary actions for handguns increased from 18 cases in '00-01 to 48 in '02-03 while other weapon possession decreased from 421 to 272 during the same period. Some of the increase in the handgun category may be due to better classification of weapons by school staff; thus, more accurate classification of handguns would reduce the number of other firearms and other weapons violations.



Note that relatively minor changes in single or double digit numbers can have a dramatic impact on percentages.


Drug abuse violations during the 2002-2003 school year decreased (8.2% from the 2001-2002 totals and 5.9% decrease over 2000-2001), which is encouraging news. However, the majority of categories of Part II law violations depicted in **Chart 11** fluctuated year-to-year with the exception of vandalism (15.5% increase), drunkenness (26.3% increase), and liquor laws (25.4% decrease). Three categories of terroristic threatening (threat, bomb and chemical/bionuclear) are reported for the first time with the 2002-2003 reporting; thus no comparison can be made with past years since terroristic threatening was previously reported under all other offenses with no way to separate it from other offenses.



Disciplinary actions for *Part I* and *Part II* law violations are reported by ethnicity and gender in **Charts 12** and **13**. Here we see that representation of African-Americans in disciplinary actions for *Part I* and *Part II* law violations for '02-03 is 33.6% and 24.5%, respectively, while African-Americans students are 10.4% of the total population in Kentucky Schools. This trend is similar to national data as the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) <u>Crime in the United States - 2002</u> reveals that more than twice as many African-American juveniles are arrested as should be proportionate to the population. These findings suggest a national problem as well as a state one and suggest the need for further exploration at all levels.

Disciplinary actions for all law violations are depicted in **Chart 14**. As seen with board violations, suspensions for law violations continue to rise showing a 7.75% increase from '00-01 to '01-02. Expulsions, both with and without services, continued to show a dramatic decrease (43.98% and 43.33% respectively). Chart





Chart 15 illustrates the numbers of school days that students were suspended from '00-01 to '02-03 for board policy and law violations. The number of suspension days increased 9% in 2001-2002 over the 2000-2001 school year with an additional 2.5% increase from the 2001-2002 days to 2002-2003 totals. Chart


CSS has divided the school districts into eight regions (Map 1) to maintain consistency with past reporting. This section of the report will disaggregate the school safety data by these geographical regions to examine regional differences in disciplinary actions of board policy and law violations.


To facilitate comparisons between regions, the standardized measurement of rate per 100 is used on the following maps. The rate listed indicated how many incidents of disciplinary actions occurred in relation to every 100 students in the region.

Map 2 shows the regional rate of disciplinary actions for board policy violations for all students. Jefferson County again reports the lowest rate, 9.66 per 100, for board policy violations and the South Central region the highest, 15.99. Jefferson County and the Southwest region rates cluster together at the low end of the range while the other six regions show a higher rate overall.




Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations 2002-2003 – All Students

Disciplinary actions for law violations are shown on **Map 3**. The Southwest region reports the lowest rate at .59 per 100 and Jefferson County at 3.26 reports the highest rate.




Disciplinary Actions for Law Policy Violations 2002-2003 – All Students

Map 4 displays the **disciplinary actions for white students for board violations**. Jefferson County reports the lowest rate, 6.22 per 100, for disciplinary actions for board violations while the South Central region reports the highest rate, 15.92.




Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations 2002-2003 – White Students

The Southwest region reported the lowest rate of **disciplinary actions of white students for law violations (Map 5)**, .57 per 100, while Jefferson County reported the highest rate, 2.28.




Disciplinary Actions for Law Policy Violations 2002-2003 – White Students

Jefferson County's African-American population is 34.7%; however, they reported the lowest state rate of 16.42 per 100 **disciplinary actions for African-American students for board policy violations** during the '02-03 school year. Conversely, the West region with an African-American population of 7.3% reports the highest rate of 44.89 per 100. Although the other six regions report a lower rate per 100, considering the extremely small minority population in some of the regions, African-Americans are particularly over-represented in disciplinary actions. (**Map 6**).

The southeast region reports the lowest rate, .95, of **disciplinary actions for African-American students for law violations** while Jefferson County has the highest rate at 5.22 per 100 as shown in **Map 7**.

istricts are encouraged to examine their data over the three years of reporting.
Additionally, districts are encouraged to make comparisons to other districts of similar size, to their region, and to the state. Similar comparisons can be made between building level data to other schools in their district as well as comparisons to their district, region and the state. Keep in mind that data should be reviewed in context to understand the full meaning of the data and to avoid misinterpretation.

Section IV District Level Data

Occurrence of School District Disciplinary Consequences for Law and Board Violations

able I reports the number of disciplinary actions for law and board violations for each Kentucky school district from the 2000-2001 school year until the 2002-2003 school year. County districts (in bold type) are organized alphabetically with independent school districts shown beneath the county school district they adjoin. The data in this table represent the raw number of reported disciplinary consequences associated with specific incidents. Attendance data collected by the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) are shown in the enrollment column. Membership data are collected once yearly and are the most accurate snapshot of a district's total number of students.

Note: Local school boards are responsible for determining what disciplinary consequences are permissible in their schools. Some school boards have enacted policies prohibiting the use of corporal punishment; therefore, the data contained in the following table under corporal punishment reflect only those districts where it is allowed.

Standard Scale of Measurement

he following tables utilize a standard scale of measurement, rate per 100, to facilitate comparison between districts of dissimilar sizes. Therefore, the rate listed indicates how many incidents occurred in relation to every 100 students in the given districts. Districts are grouped by size to allow for more meaningful comparisons and due to the small number of expulsions across the state, expulsions with and without services are combined in

these tables. District rates for disciplinary actions for all students are shown in **Table 2**. The same data are shown in **Tables 3** and **4**, but have been disaggregated to show the rates for white and African-American students.

Note: A relatively small number of incidents can have a more dramatic effect on the rate per 100 in very small districts and in districts with a small number of African-Americans which may distort interpretation.

Districts <u>not found</u> in **Tables 3** and **4** were not reported at the district level because the number of African-American students was so small that reporting the numbers might make them "personally identifiable" in violation of federal privacy laws (Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act, FERPA). Because their numbers were so small in most counties the concern for violating the privacy laws also results in the omission entirely of Asian, Hispanic, American Indian and other racial groups from the tables.




he reporting of the Safe Schools data has finished its first five-year cycle. From the pilot year to the current year, the major focus of the project has been to establish a common statewide system of reporting and to increase accuracy. All 176 districts have now converted to the STI software and with each year, districts have had fewer data errors. With the accomplishment of the first major goal of the project, we now turn our attention to taking the next crucial step in our journey.


The Kentucky Center for School Safety recognizes that reporting discipline data is the beginning and not the end of the task. Most importantly, the data that are collected must be used to drive planning and decision-making. Since the implementation of Kentucky Educational Reform Act (KERA), school staffs have learned to examine and analyze their academic data with the expressed purpose of using the results to yield academic progress. Staff should take a similar approach in "mining" discipline data. The purpose of using a school's discipline data is to improve the safety and emotional climate of the school so that students can learn and teachers can teach. This is *not* a separate goal from the school's goal to improve academic performance, but is an integral part of school improvement.









Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations by Gender 2002-2003










Part 1 Law Violations By Race and Gender





APPENDIX A Definitions of Law Violations

Definitions of Part I* Crimes

Aggravated Assault – An unlawful act by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

Arson – Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another.

Burglary – The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. **Criminal Homicide** – The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Forcible Rape – The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

Larceny-Theft – The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another.

Motor Vehicle Theft – The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

Robbery – The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force and/or putting the victim in fear.

Definitions of Part II* Crimes

Curfew and Loitering – Based on existence of local curfew or loitering ordinances, where such laws exist.

Disorderly Conduct – Committing a breach of the peace, including affray, unlawful assembly, disturbing the peace, disturbing meetings, disorderly conduct, blasphemy, profanity, obscene language, desecrating the flag, refusing to assist an officer, all attempts to commit any of these.

Driving Under the Influence – Driving or operating any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics, including motor vehicles, train, streetcar, boat, etc.

Drug Abuse Violations – Includes all arrests for violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful, possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

Drunkenness – Includes all offenses of drunkenness or intoxication, with the exception of "driving under the influence".

Embezzlement – Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control, to include altering or forging records; making, altering, forging, or counterfeiting bills, notes, drafts, tickets, checks, credit cards; forging wills, deeds, notes, bonds, seals, trademarks; possessing forged or counterfeited instruments; erasures; signing the name of another; using forged labels; possession of counterfeiting apparatus; and/or selling goods with altered, forged, or counterfeited trademarks.

*FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Form

Fraud – Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses, including bad checks, confidence games, leaving gas station without paying, and/or unauthorized ATM withdrawal.

Gambling – Charges related to promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling, including bookmaking, numbers, and lottery.

Liquor Law Violations – Includes illegal manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, or possessing intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; and/or drinking on train or public conveyance.

Offenses Against the Family and Children – All charges of non-support and neglect or abuse of family and children, such as desertion, abandonment, or non-support of spouse or child; neglect or abuse of spouse or child; and/or nonpayment of alimony.

Other Assaults (simple) – Assaults and attempted assaults where no weapon was used or which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim, with offense titles such as simple assault, minor assault, assault and battery, injury by culpable negligence, resisting or obstructing an officer, intimidation, coercion, and/or hazing.

Prostitution and Commercialized Vice – Prostitution; keeping a bawdy house, disorderly house, or house of ill fame; and/or pandering, procuring, transporting, or detaining women for immoral purposes

Runaways (persons under 18) – Incidents for protective custody as defined by local statute, to be counted by home jurisdiction.

Sex Offenses – Adultery, fornication, buggery, incest, indecent exposure, indecent liberties, seduction, sodomy or crime against nature, and/or statutory rape.

Stolen Property - Buying, receiving, possessing of stolen property including attempts to commit any of these offenses.

Vandalism – The willful or malicious destructions, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

Includes a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property, such as cutting auto tires; drawing obscene pictures on public restroom walls, smashing windows, destroying school records, tipping over gravestones, and defacing library books.

Carrying, Possessing Weapons – Manufacture, sale, possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly; using, manufacturing silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors, and/or aliens possessing deadly weapons. These are reported by category: (1) handgun; (2) shotgun or rifle; (3) other firearm; and (4) all other weapons.

All other Offenses – To include (but not limited to) blackmail and extortion; criminal anarchism; criminal syndicalism; kidnapping; possession of drug paraphernalia or look-alike drugs.

Definitions of Terroristic Threatening*

508.075 Terroristic threatening in the first degree.

- (1) A person is guilty of terroristic threatening in the first degree when he or she:
 - (a) Intentionally makes false statements that he or she or another person has placed a weapon of mass destruction on:
 - 1. The real property or any building of any public or private elementary or secondary school, vocational school, or institution of postsecondary education;
 - 2. A school bus or other vehicle owned, operated, or leased by a school:
 - 3. The real property or any building public or private that is the site of an official school-sanctioned function; or
 - 4. 4. The real property or any building owned or leased by a government agency; or
 - (b) Intentionally and without lawful authority, places a counterfeit weapon of mass destruction at any location or on any object specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection.
- (2) A counterfeit weapon of mass destruction is placed with lawful authority if it is placed, with the written permission of the chief officer of the school or other institution, as a part of an official training exercise and is placed by a public servant, as defined in KRS 522.010.
- (3) A person is not guilty of commission of an offense under this section if he or she, innocently and believing the information to be true, communicates a threat made by another person to school personnel, a peace officer, a law enforcement agency, a public agency involved in emergency response, or a public safety answering point and identifies the person from whom the threat was communicated, if known.
- (4) Terroristic threatening in the first degree is a Class C felony.

*Kentucky Statute

508.078 Terroristic threatening in the second degree.

(1) A person is guilty of terroristic threatening in the second degree when, other than as

provided in KRS 508.075, he or she intentionally:

(a) With respect to a school function, threatens to commit any act likely to result in death or serious physical injury to any student group, teacher, volunteer worker, or employee of a public or private elementary or secondary school, vocational school, or institution of postsecondary education, or to any other person reasonably expected to lawfully be on school property or at a schoolsanctioned

activity, if the threat is related to their employment by a school, or work or attendance at school, or a school function. A threat directed at a person or persons or at a school does not need to identify a specific person or persons or school in order for a violation of this section to occur;

- (b) Makes false statements that he or she has placed a weapon of mass destruction
- at any location other than one specified in KRS 508.075; or
- (c) Without lawful authority places a counterfeit weapon of mass destruction at any location other than one specified in KRS 508.075.
- (2) A counterfeit weapon of mass destruction is placed with lawful authority if it is placed as part of an official training exercise by a public servant, as defined in KRS

522.010.

(3) A person is not guilty of commission of an offense under this section if he or she.






Suspensions for Violations of School Board Rule Rates per 100 Students




