## Kentucky 2004: Safe Schools Data Project

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**A**s we ask, “Are Kentucky schools safe?” this year, we remind readers that the question of school safety cannot be answered simply yes or no, but must be answered differently based on the perspective of the stakeholder. For a student who is academically successful, supported emotionally, connected socially, and safeguarded physically, the school feels very safe indeed. Conversely, for the student who is struggling with academic, emotional, social, or physical issues, a completely different reality exists. Previous safe schools data have indicated that schools in Kentucky are generally safe; however, school leaders cannot be content to think only about safety from the perspective of the majority of students, but must consider and work to change the perspective of school safety from the vantage point of our most disenfranchised student.

The Kentucky Center for School Safety (KCSS) is committed to promoting the constant and vigilant examination of school safety for all students. KCSS provides services to schools that analyze school safety beyond the reporting of this data. For example, many schools have utilized KCSS in collaboration with the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) and the Kentucky School Boards Association (KSBA) to assess the level of school safety through multiple measures. Briefly, the School Safety Assessment consists of: a. obtaining survey and interview data from students, staff and parents; b. reviewing two-three years of safe schools and community data; c. examining current policies and procedures; d. inspecting the physical plant; and e. directly observing daily operations. The team prepares a comprehensive report citing commendations and suggesting ways to remediate areas of mutual concern. Upon request, KCSS can provide additional technical assistance and professional development to the school based on the team’s recommendations. Feedback from schools regarding this service has been extremely positive and further validates the value of the process.

As this sixth Safe Schools Data report is published, we urge readers to extend their use of multiple data sources in making our schools safer environments for all of our students.

# INTRODUCTION

The Kentucky Center for School Safety (KCSS) has reported discipline data from school districts since the Safe Schools Data Project began in 1998 as a pilot project. In the beginning, with partial funding from a federal grant, the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) collaborated with the Research Triangle Institute (RTI) in North Carolina to design an electronic reporting system. Individual schools completed specific data-gathering worksheets and then entered the data into a Web database managed by RTI. After arranging and sorting the data for interpretation purposes, KCSS and KDE received the data for analysis and a report was issued. For the second year, 1999-2000, the data collection process remained essentially unchanged; however, additional data were collected regarding suspensions and expulsions. Three separate reports were organized around state, regional and district-level summaries. In the third year of the collection process, as in previous years, data were entered into an electronic system operated by the Research Triangle Institute and each district confirmed electronic completion of the data. The data set was then sent to R.E.A.C.H. for entry into a statistical analysis program and subsequently forwarded to KCSS for interpretation, analysis, and writing. In the third year of reporting, Eastern Kentucky University staff consolidated these responsibilities and was solely responsible for producing the report. The third report combined district, regional and state data into one report that was issued in March 2002. In the fourth and fifth year of data collection, school districts, with the exception of Jefferson County, used the STI software for data collection and electronically transported their data to KDE. Superintendents were given a final chance to check the data and to return a signed verification sheet to KDE. The fifth year of data collection was the first time that data collection procedures were essentially the same as those used the previous year except that "alternative placements" as a disciplinary action were no longer reported.

## Historical Perspective

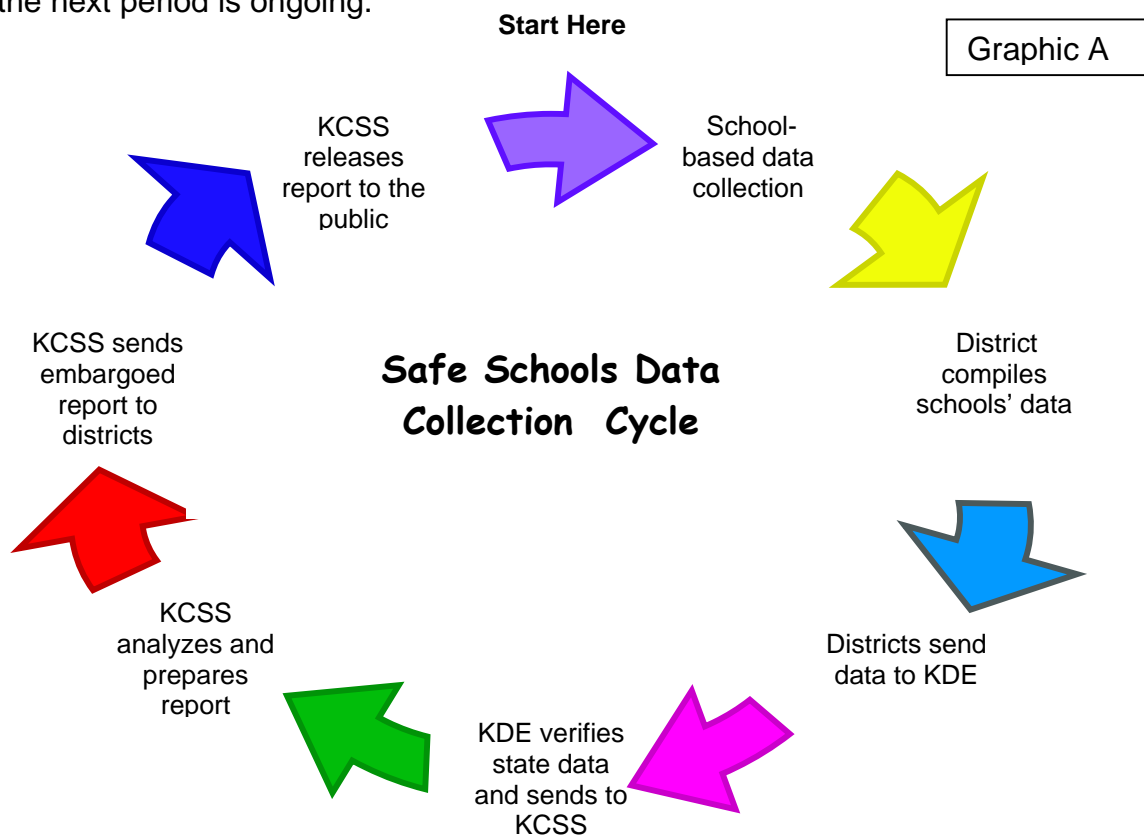
**T**he long-awaited uniformity in data collection has been realized in the sixth year when all 176 school districts have used the STI software. The report, as in past years, is organized to present the data reported for all students initially. Data for Caucasian and African-American students are then disaggregated when the number of African-American students in the district is large enough to allow reporting without violating the Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Asian American, Hispanic American, American Indian, and other racial groups are not reported since their numbers are so small in most Kentucky counties that privacy rules could be violated.

## **Data Collection Year Six**

While researchers continually stress accuracy and consistency in data collection, the lack of a unique identifier encumbers the research process to go beyond descriptive data. Thus, we again encourage schools to look more closely at their individual school data in planning and evaluating prevention programs that are intended to support the behavioral needs of their students.

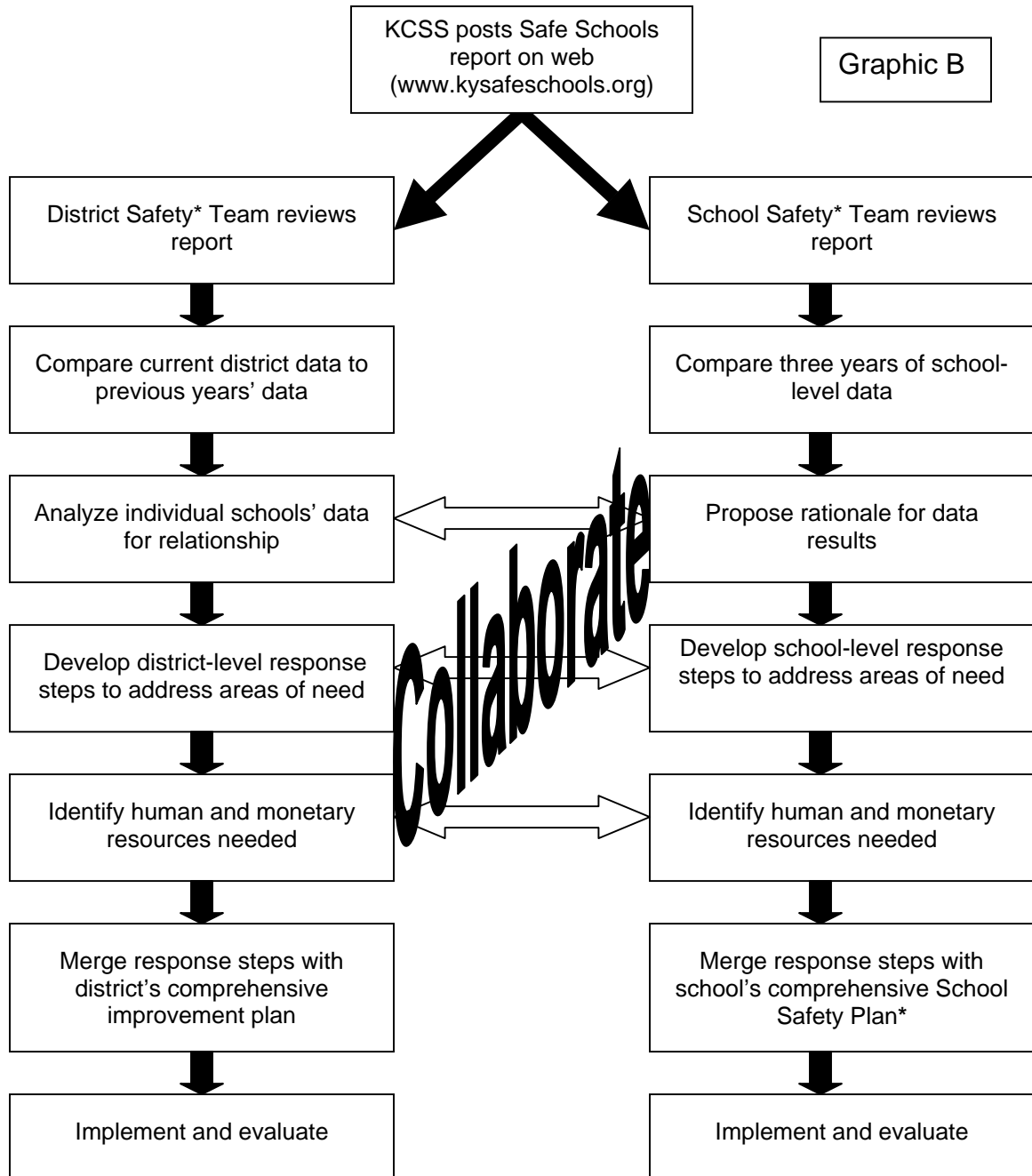
**T**he process that provides the data for this report has developed into a predictable and dependable cycle (Graphic A). All public schools in Kentucky use STI software to collect discipline data each year beginning July 1 and ending June 30. Throughout the school year, the school enters discipline data daily and performs periodic error checks to maintain data accuracy. At the local district level, the designated STI technology coordinator also performs error checks and works with the school to reconcile any discrepancies. At the end of the year, final verifications with the school and district are made before the district transmits the data to KDE, which performs its own verification check. Once KDE has finished inspecting the data and is satisfied with the accuracy, the data are sent to KCSS. The data are checked again and entered into a statistical package for organization and analysis. KCSS staff writes an annual report of the data with state and regional interpretation. District level data are illustrated in charts that report disciplinary actions by raw numbers, total student rate and rate for white and African-American students. The report is sent to districts in an embargoed form to allow districts to make a final confirmation of their data, after which the final corrections to the report are made at the Center. Following the embargoed period, the report is released to the public during a press conference and posted at [www.kysafeschools.org](http://www.kysafeschools.org), the Center's website. While the posting of the report is the end of that sequence, the collection of school-level data for the next period is ongoing.

## Section I Using this Report





The following flowchart, Graphic B, illustrates how the information in this report can be used by the district and at the school level. The district's Safety Team, or other designated committee, should review the report and compare current data with previous years' data. The district data should be further analyzed by reviewing the individual school-level data to determine areas of concern. In addition, a school-level team should review the school's data, comparing it to past data. District and school personnel should begin to collaborate to prepare an action plan. The plan should include needed monetary and human resources. Subsequently, the school and district should develop implementation plans that specify the responsible person(s), beginning/ending dates, and evaluation measures.

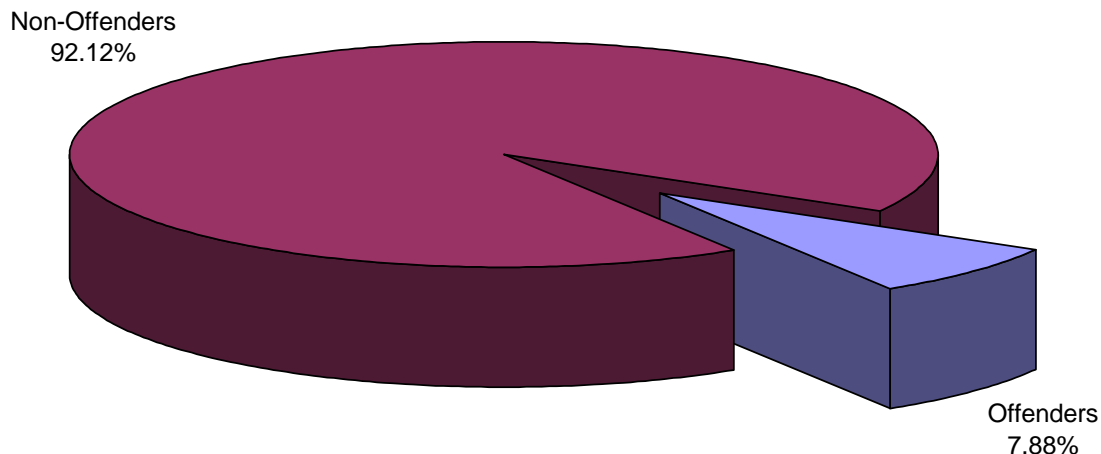
**T**he Safe Schools Data Project collects data from all Kentucky public schools regarding the commission of law and board violations that result in one of four disciplinary actions, (i.e.,

suspension, corporal punishment, expulsion with services and expulsion without services.) Kentucky's total public school population for 2003-2004 was 632,130 students, a .5% increase over 2002-2003. Of that total, only 7.88% of students committed an offense that resulted in a suspension, corporal punishment or an expulsion (with or without services). Students may receive other disciplinary responses, (e.g., parent conferences, detentions, in-school suspensions,) for infractions of school rules, but these are not reported to KDE and are not reflected in this report. In reviewing the upcoming data regarding commission of board and law violations, it is very important to keep in mind that over 92% of Kentucky's students were **not** included in the data. To illustrate that point, **Chart 1** shows the percentage of offenders compared to total population.

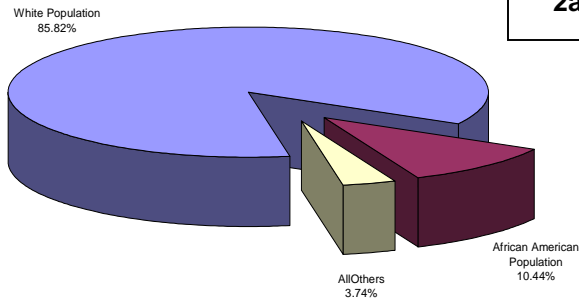
Kentucky Enrollment Compared to Student Offenders 2003-2004



**Chart 2a** illustrates the percentage of enrollment by population group. **Chart 2b** shows Whites comprise 77.64% of offenders, African-Americans 19.69%, and all other racial groups, 2.66%. African-American offenders are represented at a higher

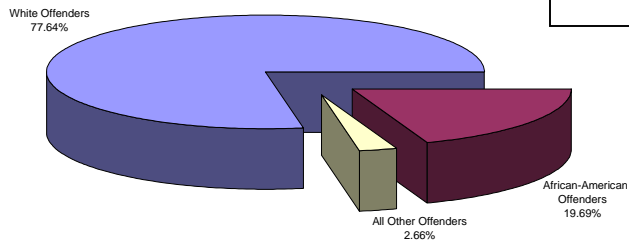
proportion than their representation in the total student population; however, there was a decrease from 22.2% representation in 2002-2003 to 19.69% in 2003-2004. While it is too soon to establish a trend, it is encouraging that the numbers are declining.

**Offenders by Population Group 2003-2004**



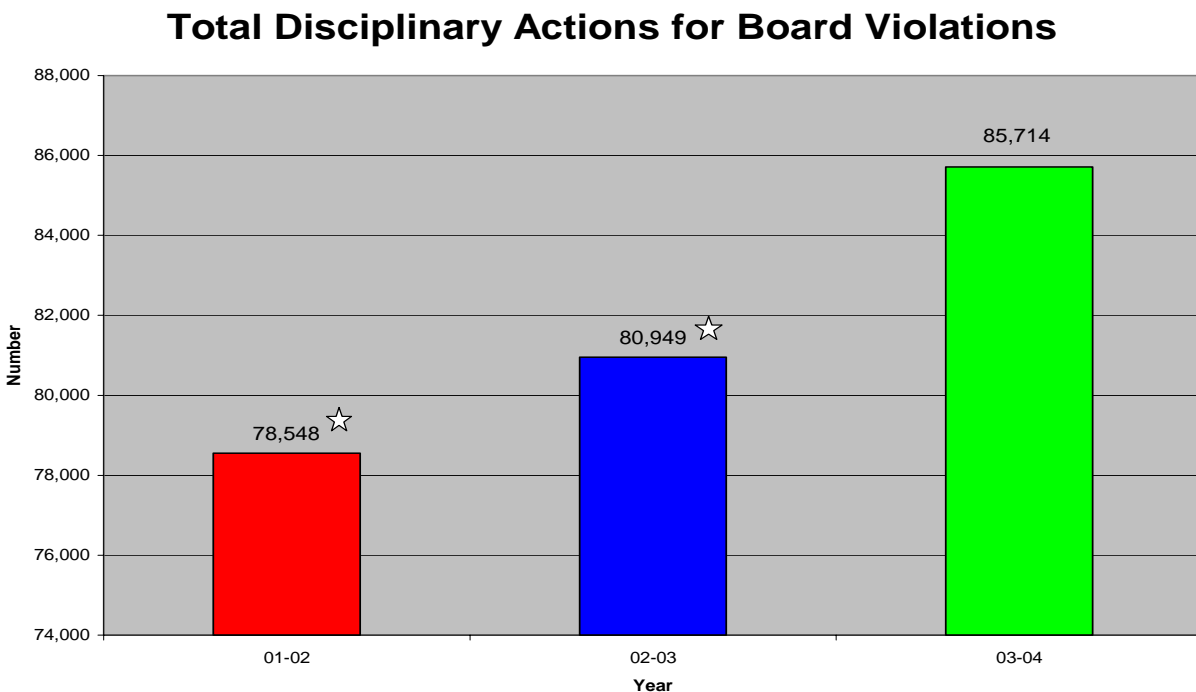

**The term offender as used in Charts 1 and 2 refers to an individual student involved in committing an incident of prohibited behavior. An offender, however, may commit multiple offenses.**

## Disciplinary Actions for Violations of Board Policy

**Chart 3** illustrates the total number of disciplinary actions for nine categories of school board policy violations for the past three years. Disciplinary actions for the current year were higher than the two previous years; however, the data do not include 2,188 Jefferson County suspensions for 2001-2002 and 2,248 for 2002-2003 due to incompatibility between the state STI software and the Jefferson County Public Schools data collection system. Consequently, while there is an increase in board violations, the increase is less than the chart depicts. School districts should examine their data carefully in this area to determine local trends.

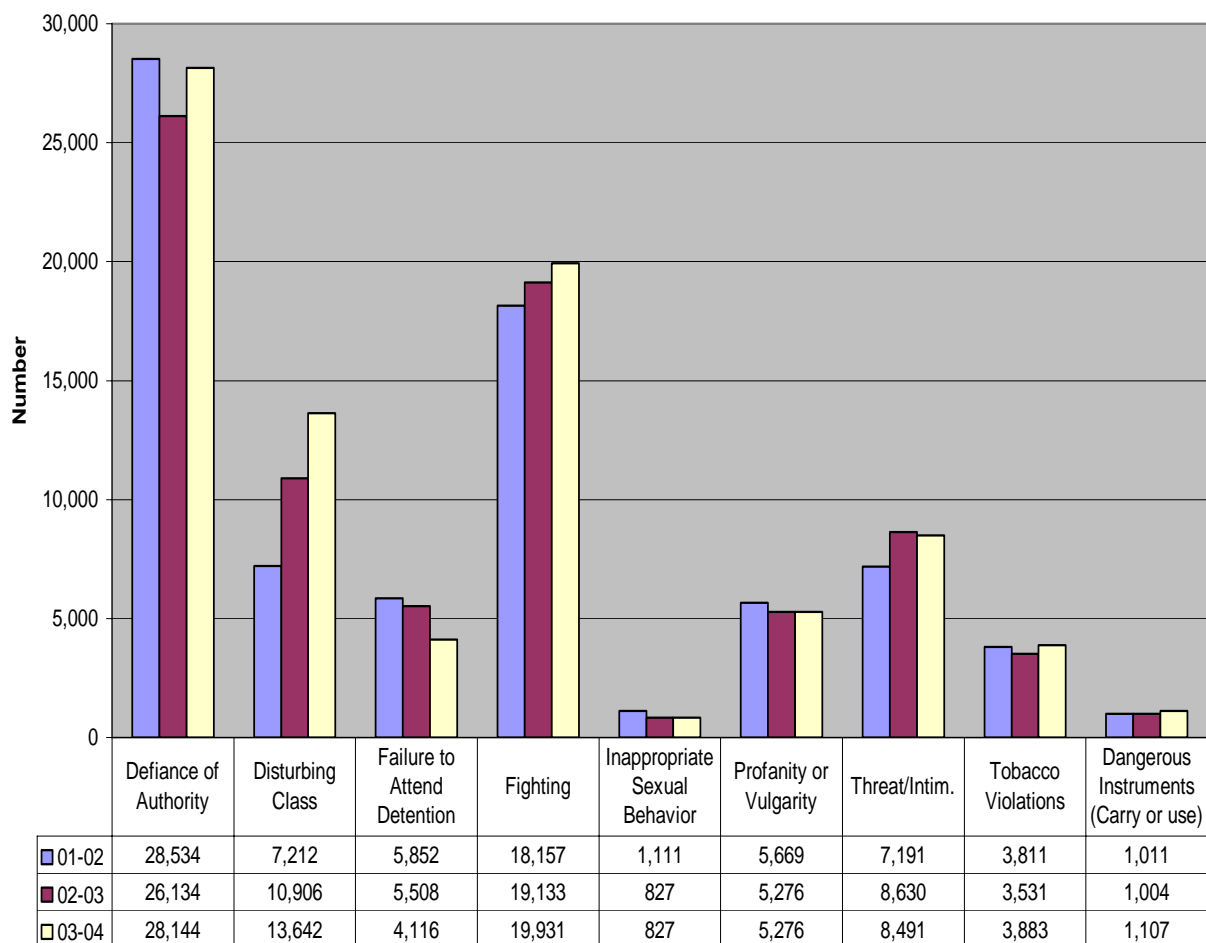

A categorical breakdown of disciplinary actions for board policy violations is depicted in **Chart 4**. Disciplinary actions for Failure to Attend Detention showed the most positive change, decreasing 29.67% over the three year period of 2001-2004 while total disciplinary actions for Disturbing Class changed most dramatically, increasing 89.16% during the same period. Disciplinary actions for Fighting increased from 2001-2002 and showed a 9.77% change. Although Threat and Intimidation increased substantially in 2002-2003 over 2001-2002, a modest decrease was noted this current year from last year's total. Inappropriate Sexual Behavior decreased last year, but 2003-2004 data showed no change. Dangerous Instruments, Tobacco Violations, Profanity or Vulgarity and Defiance of Authority showed little overall change during the three-year period.

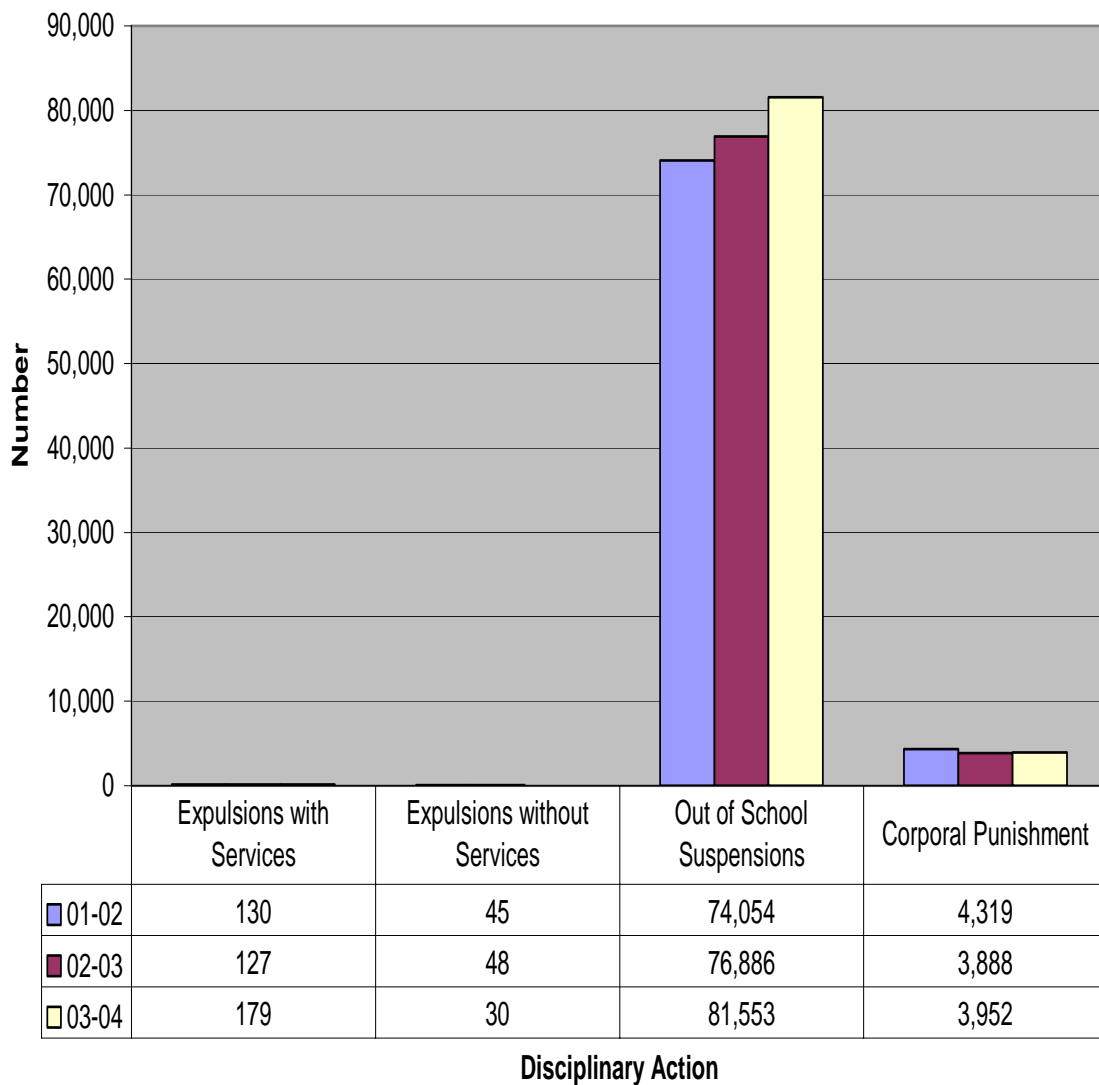
**Disciplinary Actions for Board Violations by Category**



With regard to specific disciplinary actions, the results presented in **Chart 5** indicate that the number of out-of-school suspensions has increased each of the three years reported. Suspensions in 2003-2004 increased 10.1% over the number reported in '01-02. The frequency of Expulsions with Services, while relatively small statewide, was 37.7% higher than in 2001-2002. Only 30 students statewide received Expulsions without Services during 2003-2004. Disciplinary actions involving Corporal Punishment, while up slightly from last year's total, are 8.5% lower than the total in 2001-2002.

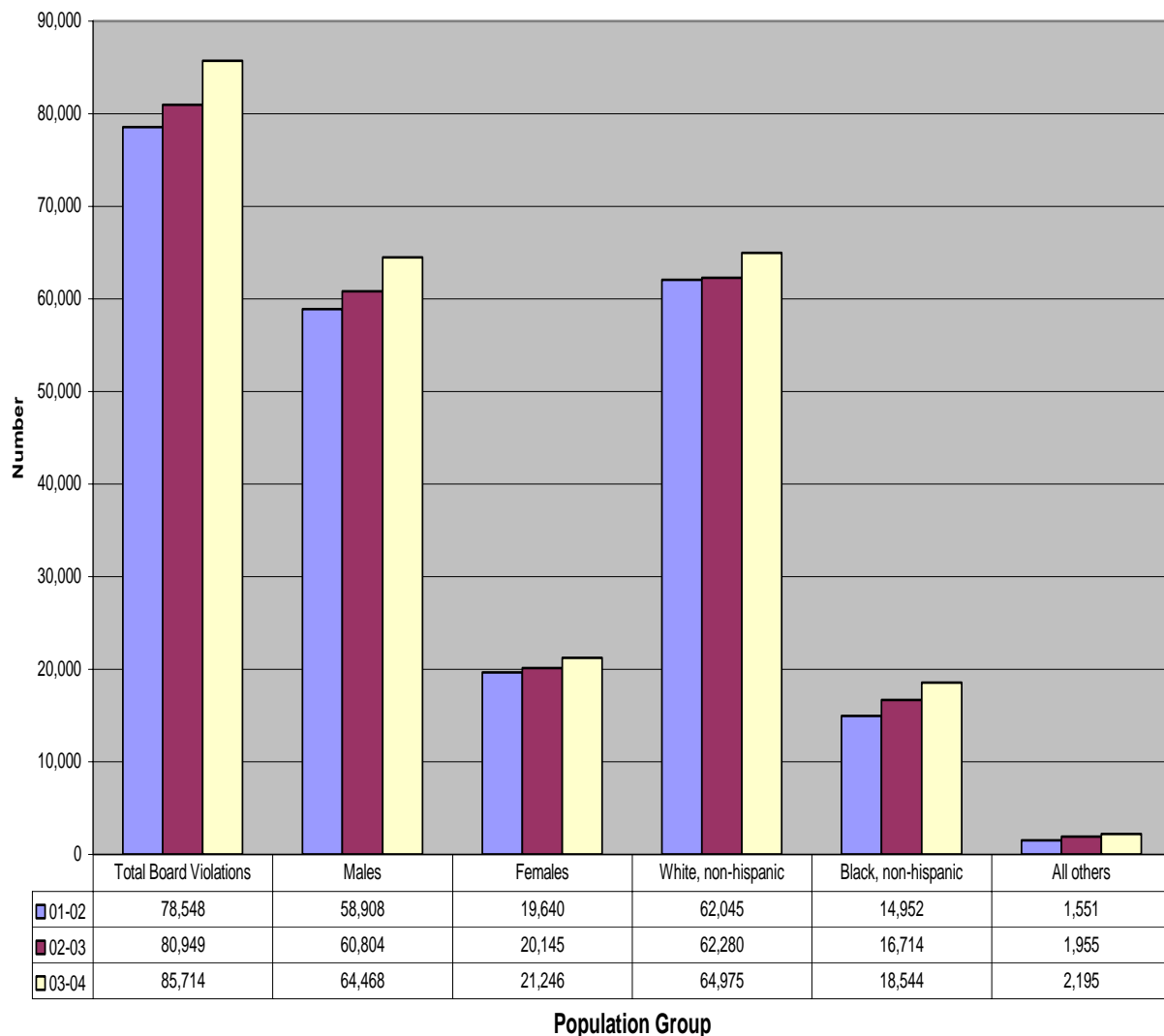
### Board Policy Violations Comparison of Disciplinary Actions



Disciplinary actions for board policy violations are disaggregated by gender and ethnicity and presented in **Chart 6**. The results indicate that the total number of disciplinary actions for board violations increased by 9.1% during the three-year reporting period. Likewise, all gender and ethnic categories increased, e.g., a.) males up 9.4% b.) females up 8.2%, c.) White, non-Hispanics up 4.7%, African-Americans up 24.0% and all other ethnicities up 41.5%.

## Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations in Kentucky Schools

The FBI Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Form was adopted at the beginning of this reporting process as a format for reporting law violations on school grounds or at school-related activities.

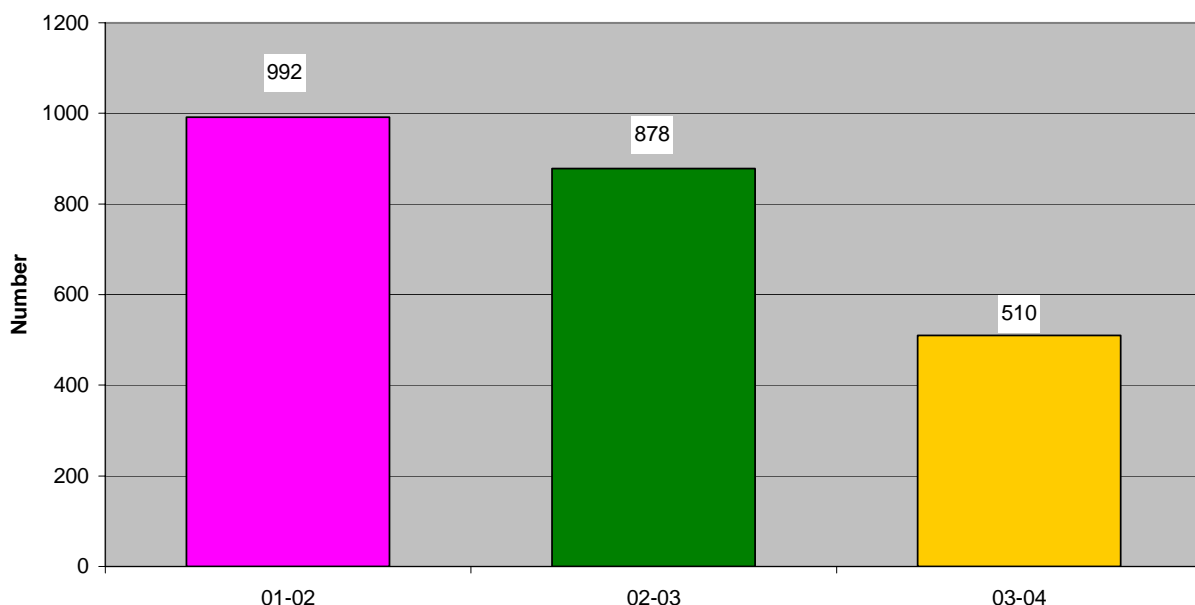
Under this system, *Part I* crimes involve an illegal act directed against a person or property and are generally considered to be more serious offenses.

*Part II* law violations may result in an arrest, but are considered less serious. Definitions of *Part I* and *Part II* crimes can be found in **Appendix A**. The following charts show the reported incidents of *Part I* and *Part II* law violations from 2001-2004.

Disciplinary actions for *Part I* law violations are depicted in **Chart 7**. The 2003-2004 data show that disciplinary actions for Part I law Violations decreased 48.6% from 2001-2002 to 2003-2004. When comparing the total number of disciplinary actions for Part I law violations in 2003-2004 to the total population, the 510 disciplinary actions represent only.08% of Kentucky's students. This decrease in the most serious of law violations is very positive.

Total Disciplinary Actions for Part I Law Violations



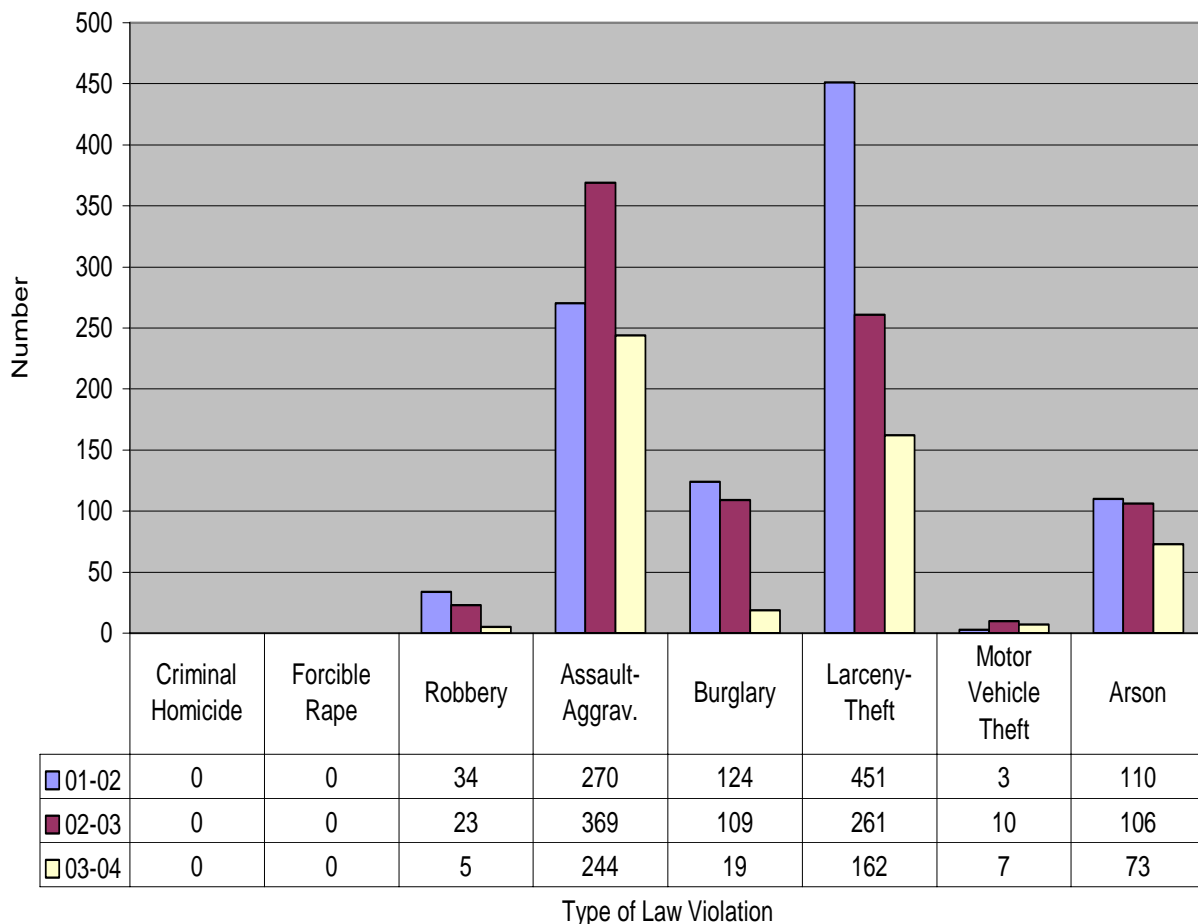
Part I law violations relate to acts against a person or property and are generally considered to be more serious offenses. Refer to Appendix A for definitions of *Part I* and *Part II* law violations.



Disciplinary actions in 2003-2004 for *Part I* law violations by category are shown in **Chart 8**. No incidents of criminal homicide and rape were reported for the three year period. The other six Part I categories showed a decrease in disciplinary actions from 2002-2003. Burglary, Robbery and Larceny-Theft disciplinary actions revealed sizeable changes with 84.6%, 85.2% and 64.1% decreases respectively over three years. The three-year period also revealed a 33.6% decrease in disciplinary actions for arson. Although Aggravated Assault increased in 2002-2003, the 2003-2004 total was 9.6% lower than 2001-2002. This overall decrease in the most serious law violations is an encouraging development.

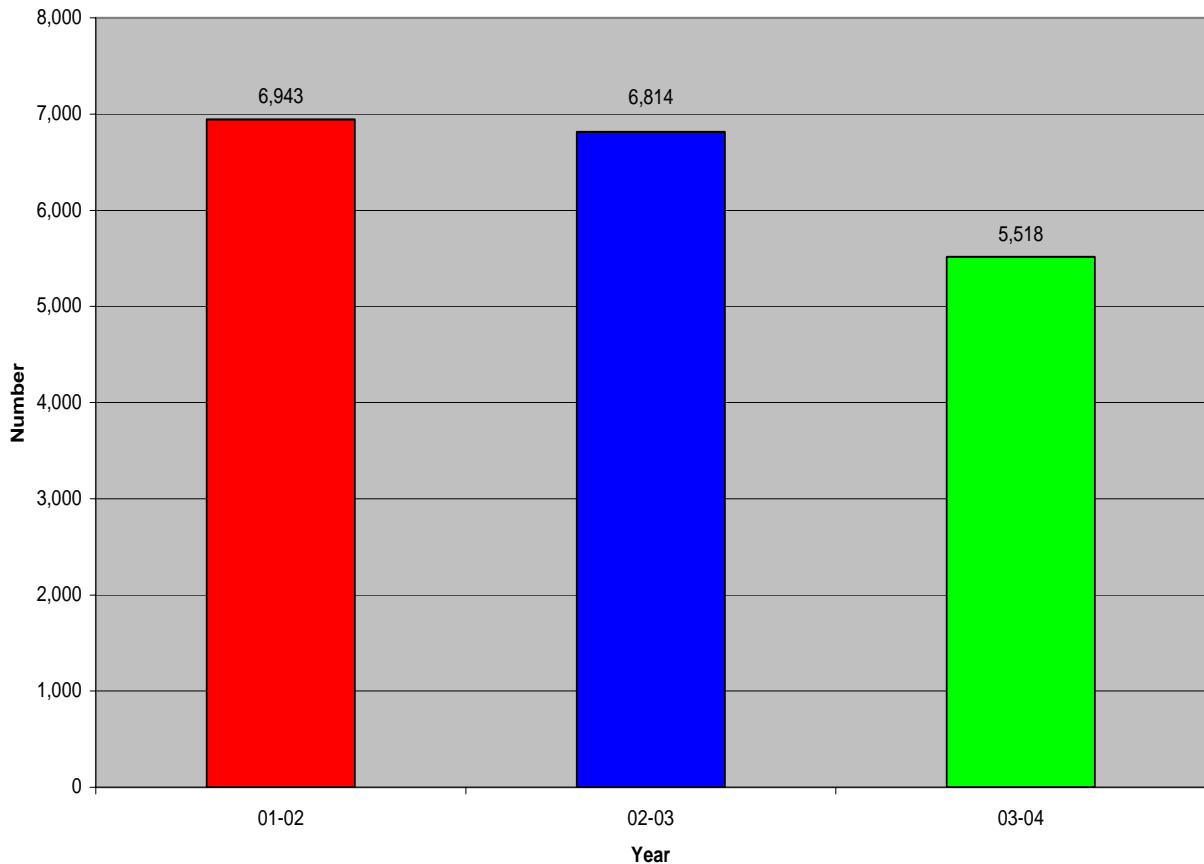
### Disciplinary Actions for Part I Law Violations by Category



Total disciplinary actions for Part II law violations are shown in **Chart 9**. The 2003-2004 data represent a 20.5% decrease from the total in 2001-2002. The bulk of the decrease was accomplished in the past year; however, having such a substantial change in this three-year period may indicate that a positive trend is emerging.

### Total Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations

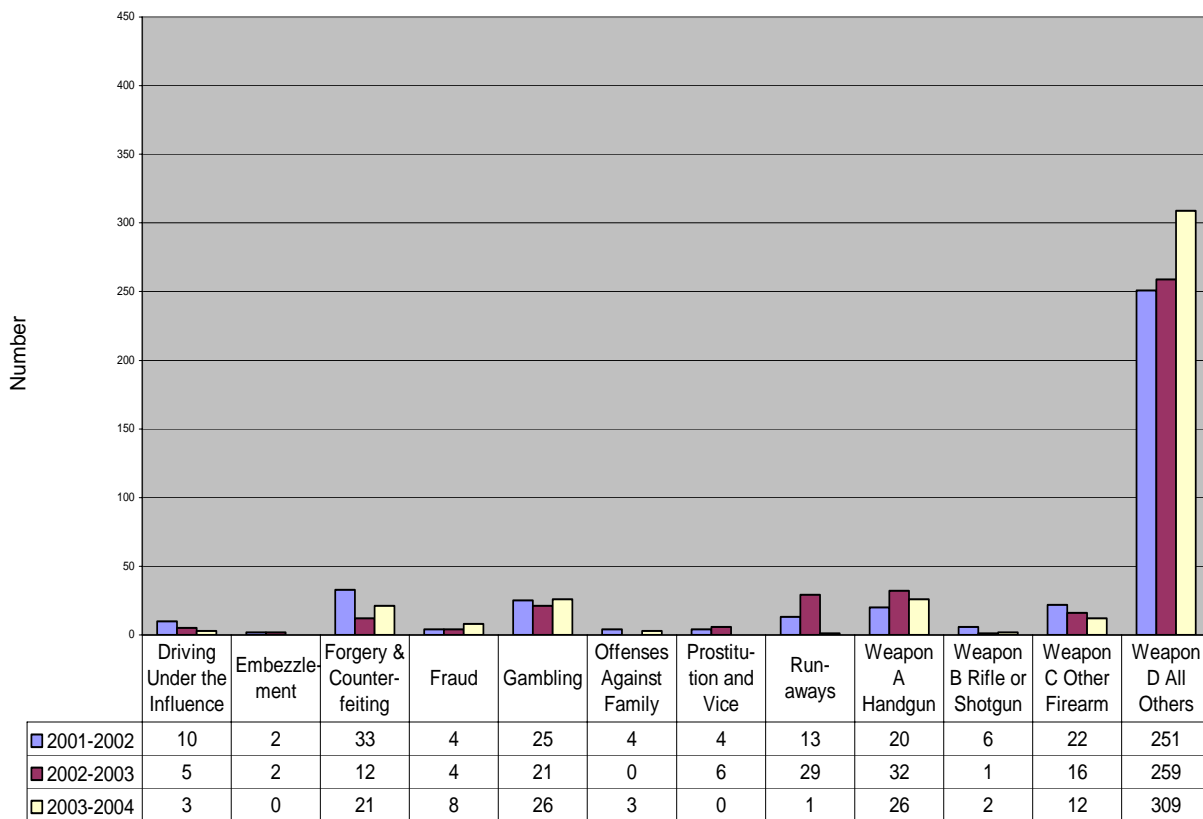


***Part II*** law violations may result in an arrest, but are considered to be less serious than ***Part I*** crimes. Refer to Appendix A for definitions of ***Part I*** and ***Part II*** law violations.

**Charts 10 and 11** depict disciplinary actions for *Part II* law violations by category. In **Chart 10**, disciplinary actions for driving under the influence and embezzlement decreased during the three-year period depicted. Weapons A (handguns) and Weapons C (other firearms) decreased from 2002-2003 to 2003-2004 while all other weapons (Weapons B and D) increased. Although runaways appear to have decreased notably, state law changed during this period and runaways are no longer classified as a status offense, thus the change is not necessarily due to a behavioral change. Other categories either fluctuated between loss and increase or remained essentially the same.

### Total Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations

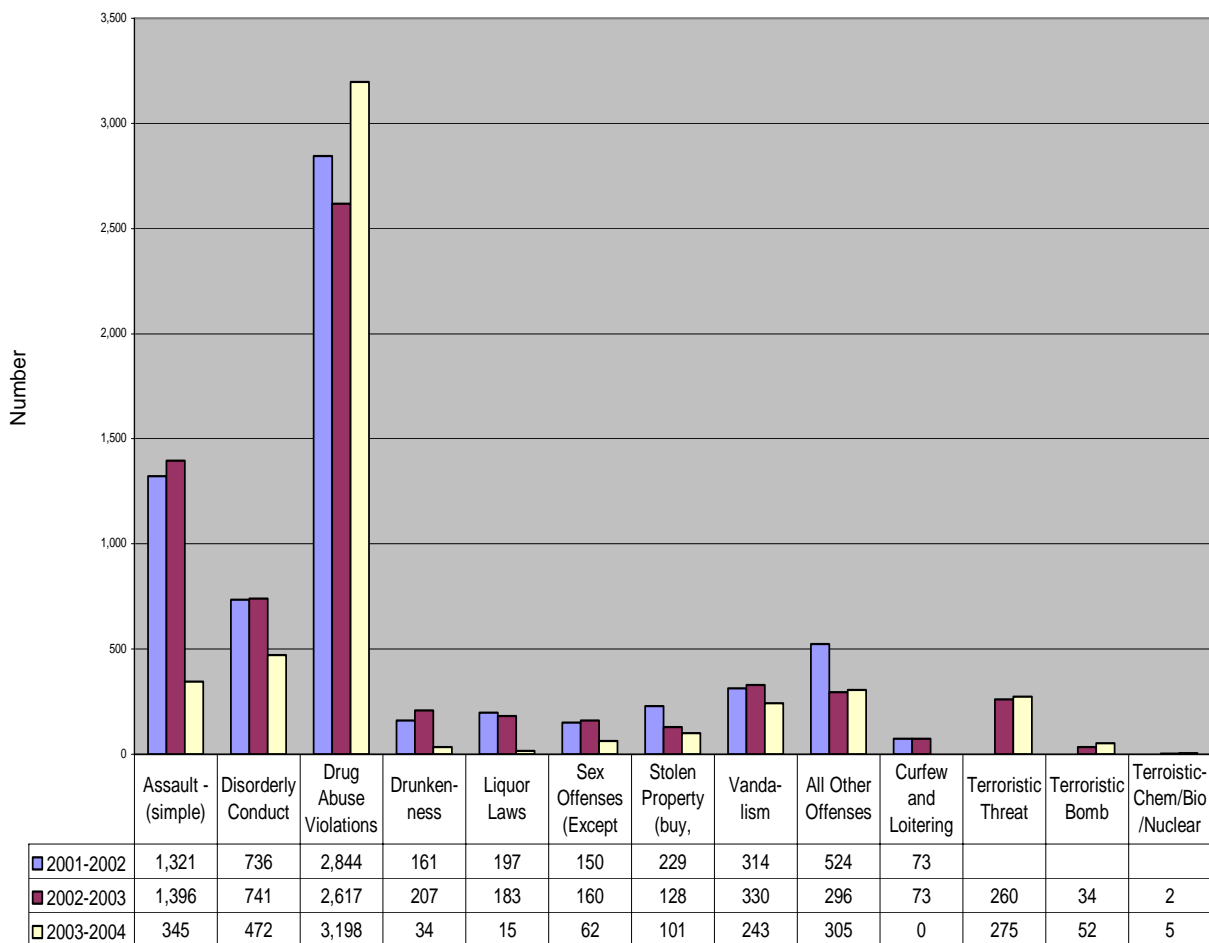


Note: Relatively minor changes in single or double digit numbers can have a dramatic impact on percentages.

Disciplinary actions for assaults (simple) showed a dramatic drop, 75.3%, from 2002-2003, **Chart 11**. When simple and aggravated assaults are combined, a total decrease of 66.6% is realized. With the exception of drug abuse violations, assaults account for the largest number of disciplinary actions for Part I and II law violations. A decrease of this magnitude is very encouraging and bears close scrutiny in the future to determine whether the decrease is an anomaly or the beginning of a trend. Liquor Law Violations, Stolen Property (buying, receiving or possessing) and Disorderly Conduct decreased over the three years by 92.4%, 55.9% and 35.9%, respectively. Reported for the first time in 2002-2003, disciplinary actions for terrorist offenses increased by 12.2% in the 2003-2004 school year. Other categories of Part II law violations depicted in **Chart 11** fluctuated during the three-year period and no clear trend is evident.

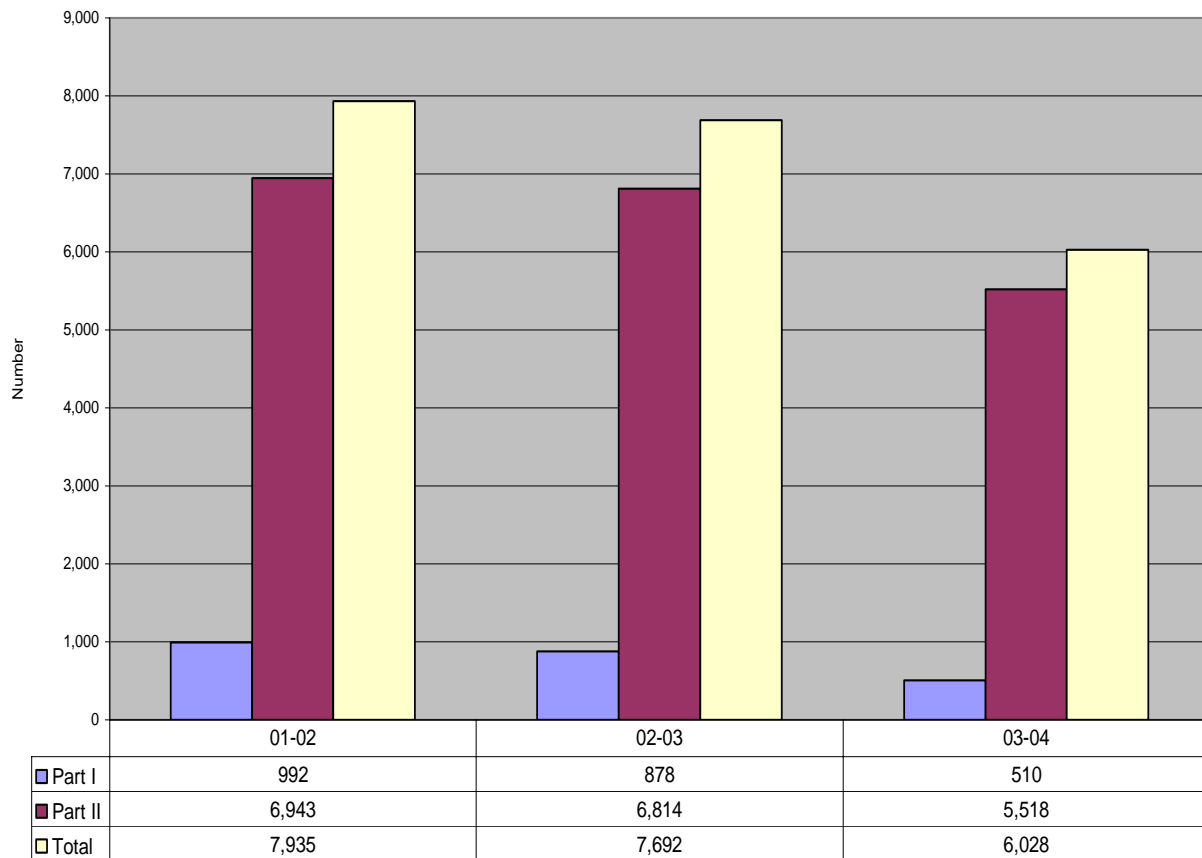
### Total Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations



Total disciplinary actions for *Part I* and *Part II* law violations are reported below in **Chart 12**. Law violations are showing a decided downward trend in the three years of reported data with an overall decrease in disciplinary actions of 24.0%. Although the increase in board violations is troubling, the downward trend in law violations, which are more serious offenses, provides a measure of comfort.

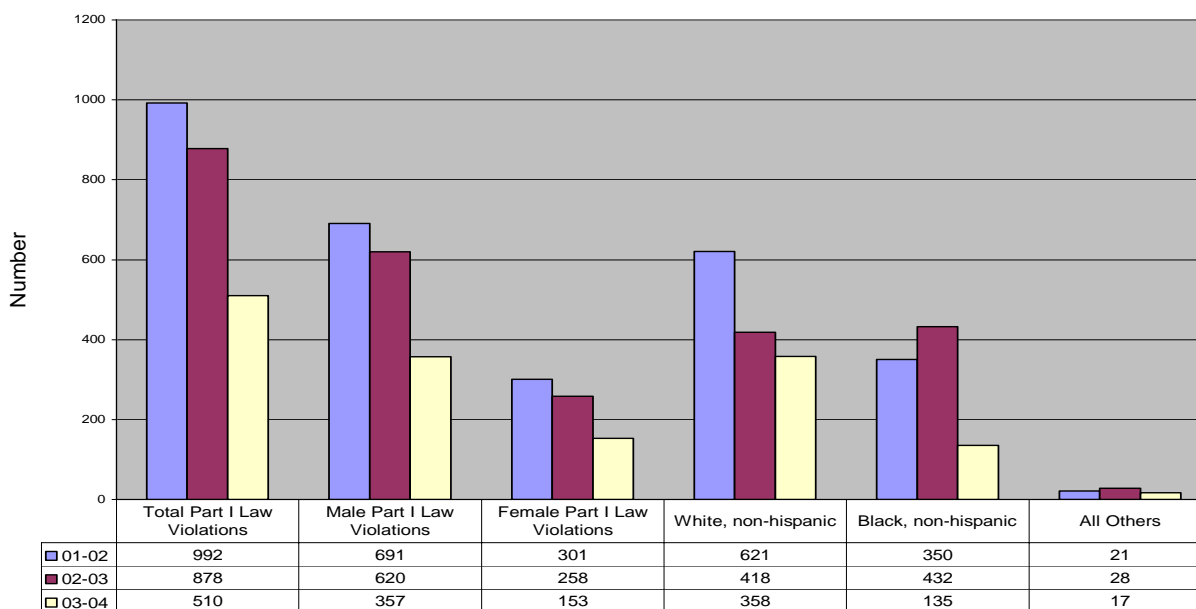
## Total Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations



Disciplinary actions for *Part I* and *Part II* law violations are reported by ethnicity and gender in **Charts 13** and **14**. Representation of African-Americans in disciplinary actions for *Part I* and *Part II* law violations for '03-04 is 26.5% and 17.9%, respectively. The over-representation of African-Americans in law violations is consistent with national data collected by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Crime in the United States – 2003. However, the proportion of disciplinary actions of African-Americans in 2002-2003 was 49.2% for *Part I* violations and 24.0% for *Part II* violations. This suggests that the downward trend in law violations is in part due to fewer disciplinary actions for African-Americans.

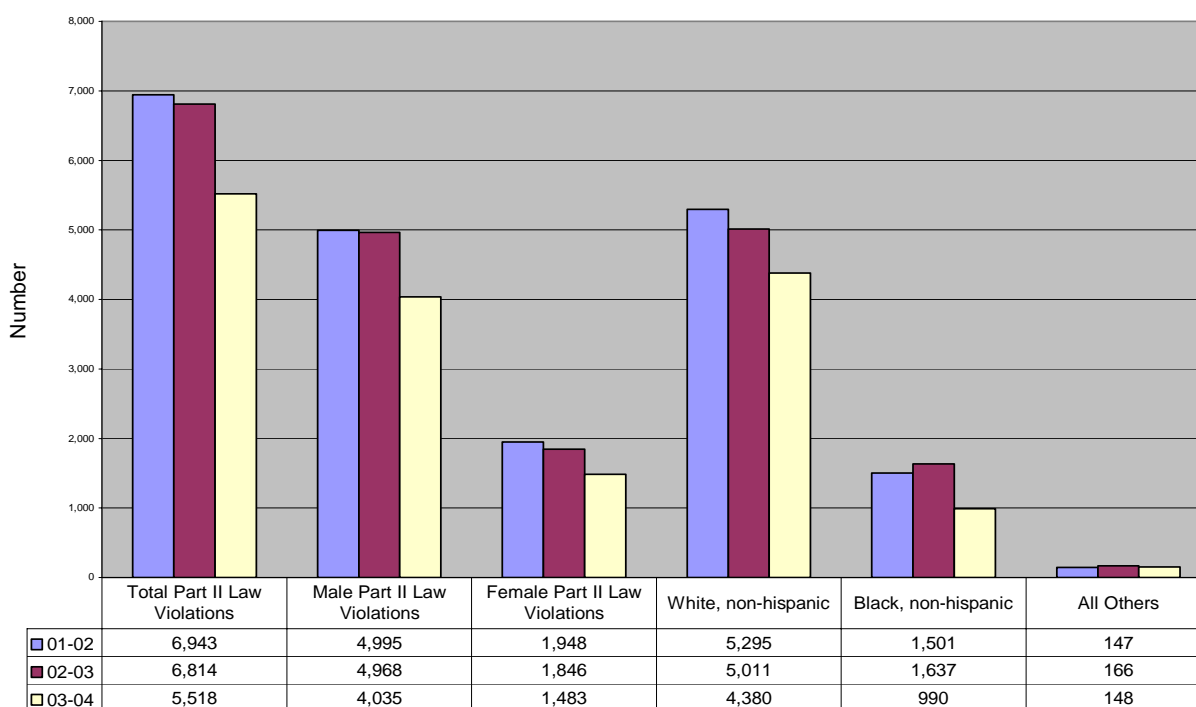

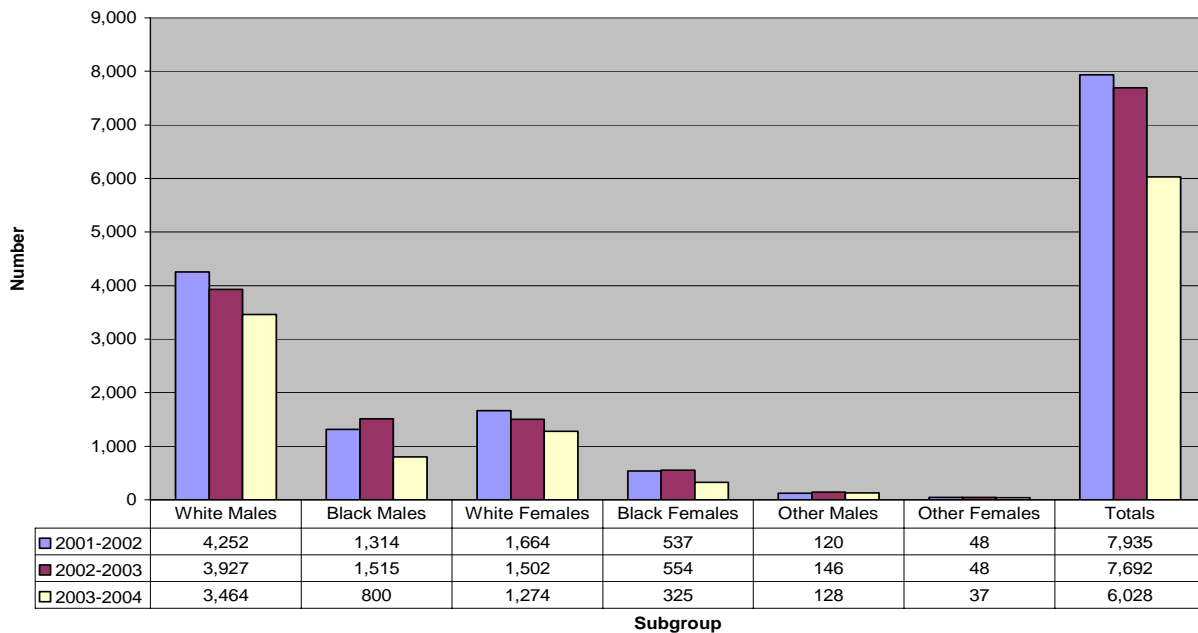
**Total Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations by Gender and Ethnicity**



A further comparison of disciplinary actions for law violations by race and gender subgroups is depicted in **Chart 15**. Disciplinary actions for all subgroups declined during the 2003-2004 school year; however, the most dramatic reduction occurred with black males and black females.

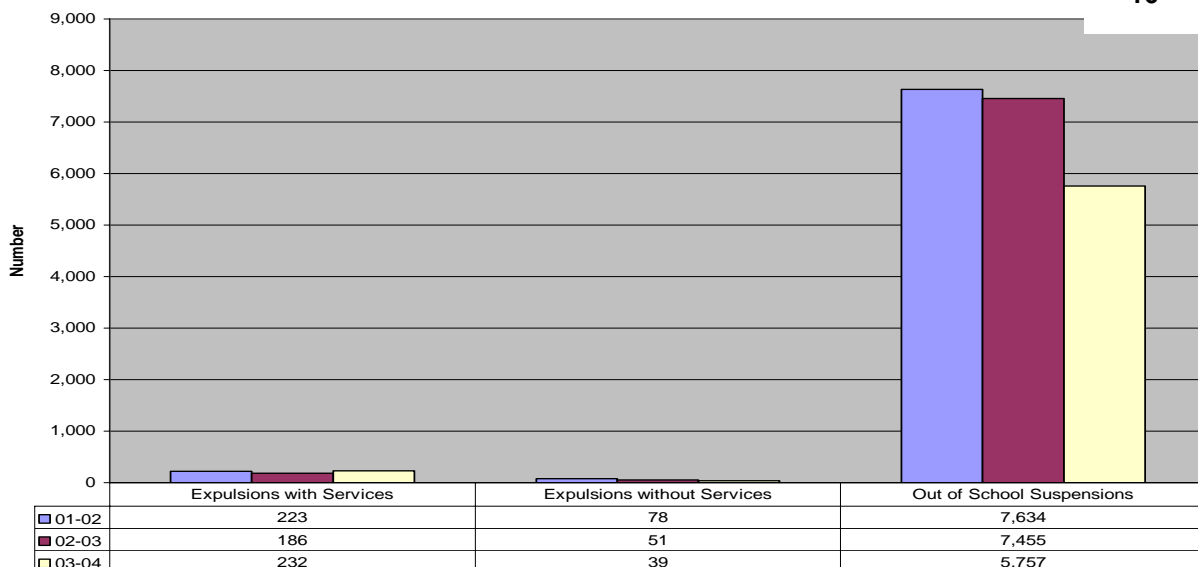
**Comparison of Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations by Race and Gender Subgroups**



Disciplinary actions for all law violations are depicted in **Chart 16**. Expulsions with Services increased in 2003-2004 from previous years while Expulsions without Services decreased by 50%. Unlike board violations, suspensions for law violations decreased 24.5%.

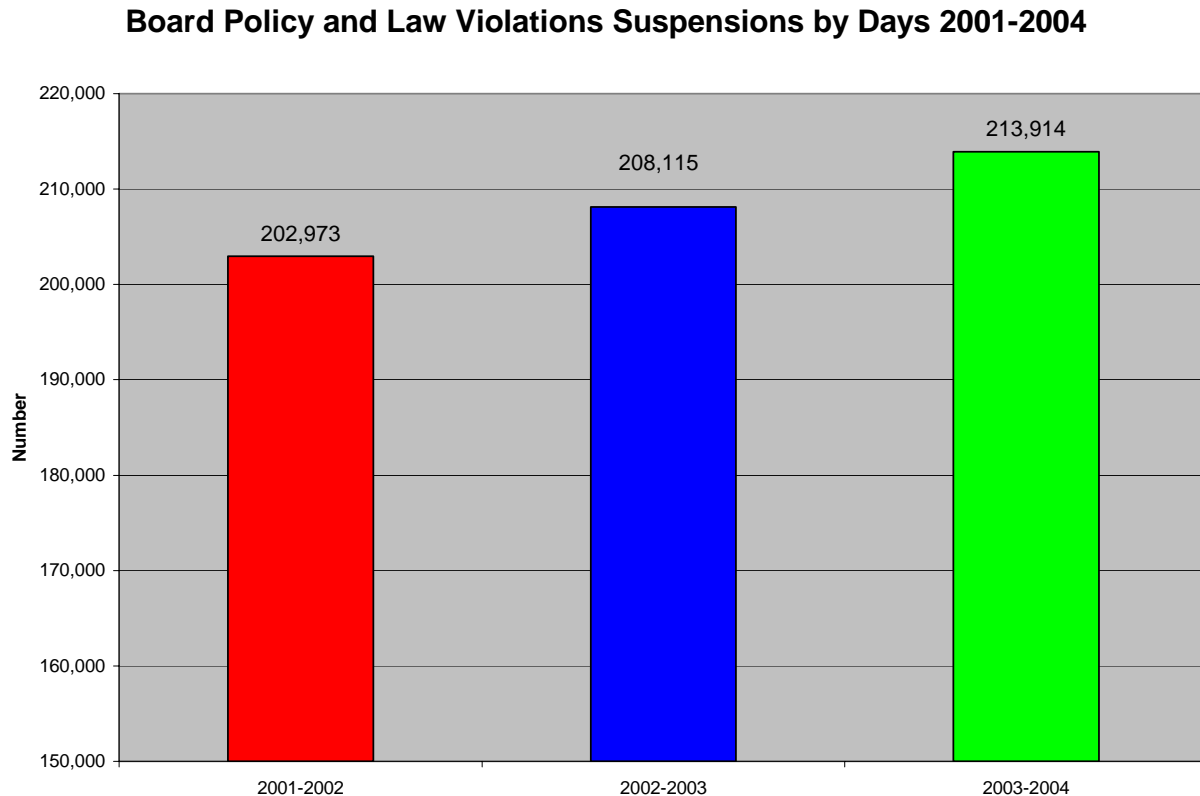

**Chart 17** illustrates the numbers of school days that students were suspended for board policy and law violations during a three-year period. The number of suspension days increased 10,941 days from the 2001-2002 school year to the 2003-2004 school year for a total percentage increase of 5.4%. With suspensions increasing so dramatically for board violations, this increase in days of suspension is to be expected.

Note that Kentucky's public school population for 2003-2004 was 632,130. A school year is equivalent to 175 days. Therefore, taken in context, the 213,914 suspension days comprised less than 1% of the total number of school days.



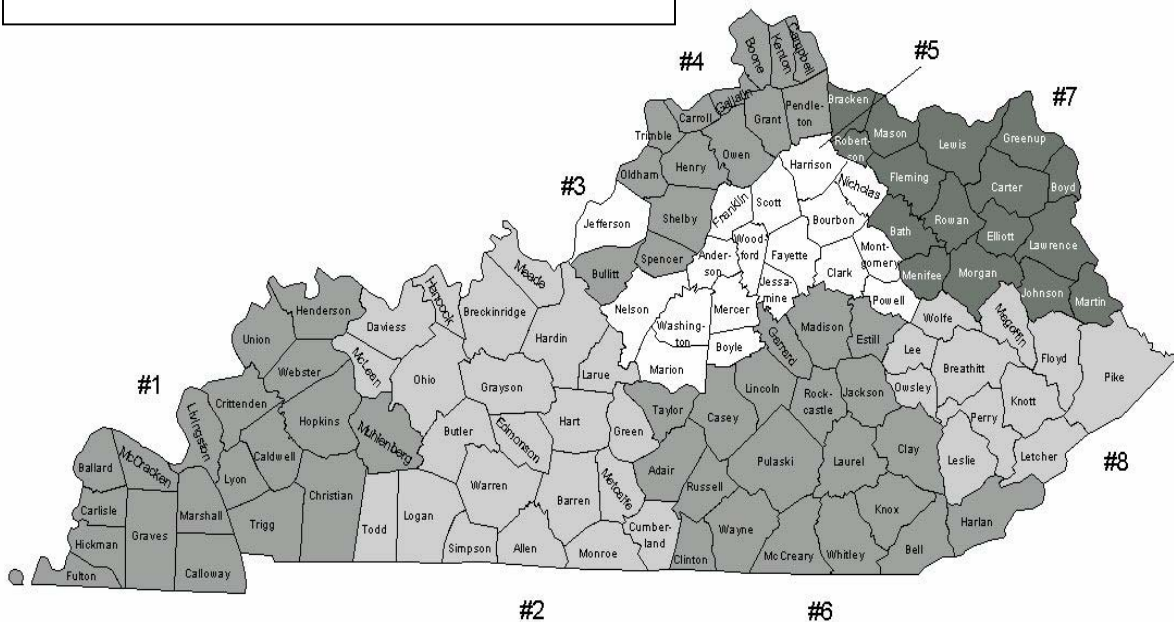
**K**CSS has divided the state into eight geographic regions (**Map 1**) to maintain consistency with past reporting. This section of the report will disaggregate the school safety data by these geographical regions to examine regional differences in disciplinary actions of board policy and law violations.

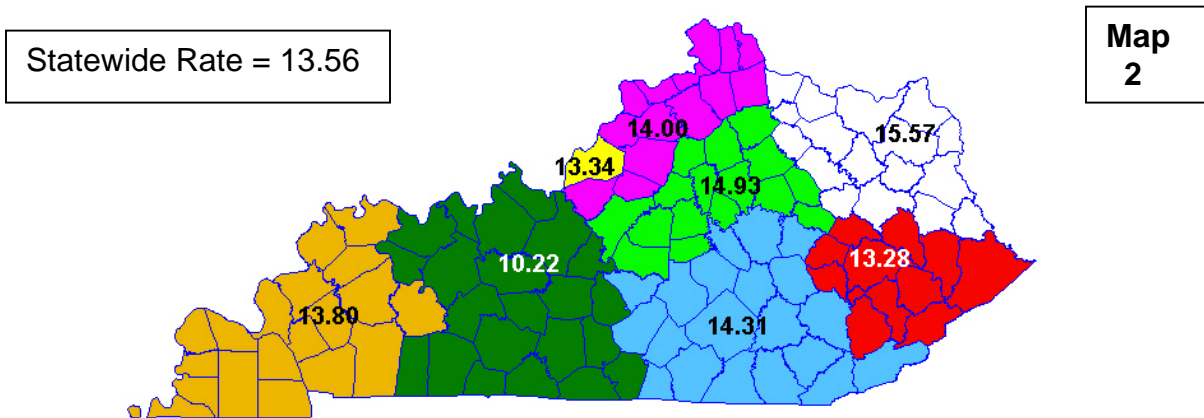

To facilitate comparisons between regions, the standardized measurement of rate per 100 is used on the following maps. The rate listed indicated how many incidents of disciplinary actions occurred in relation to every 100 students in the region.

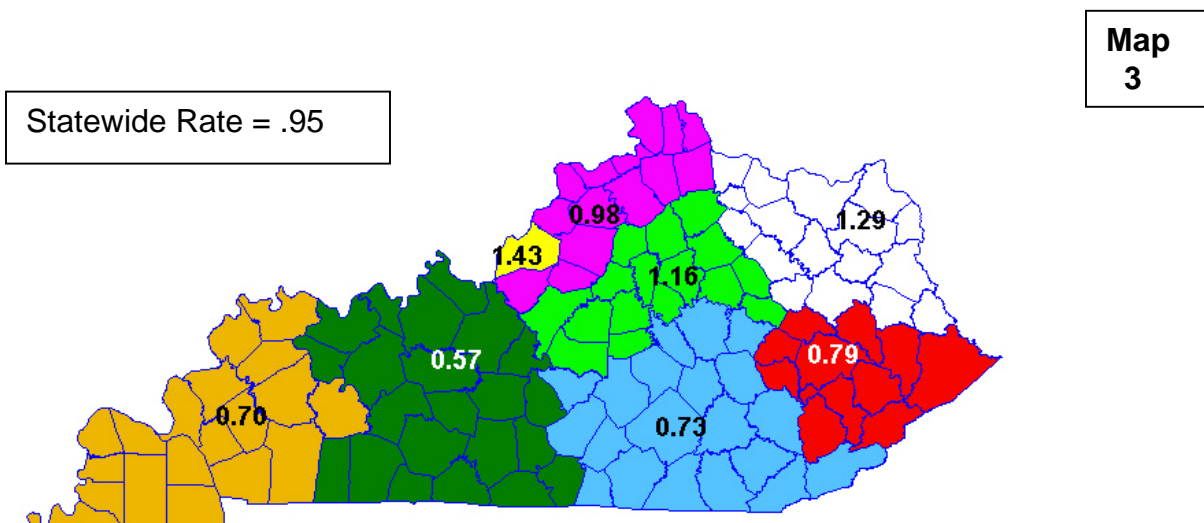
**Map 2** shows the regional rate of **disciplinary actions for board policy violations** for all students. The Southwest region reports the lowest rate, 10.22 per 100, for board policy violations and the Northeast region the highest, 15.57. Rates for the other regions range from 13.28, East region, to 14.93, Central region.

### Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations 2003-2004 – All Students



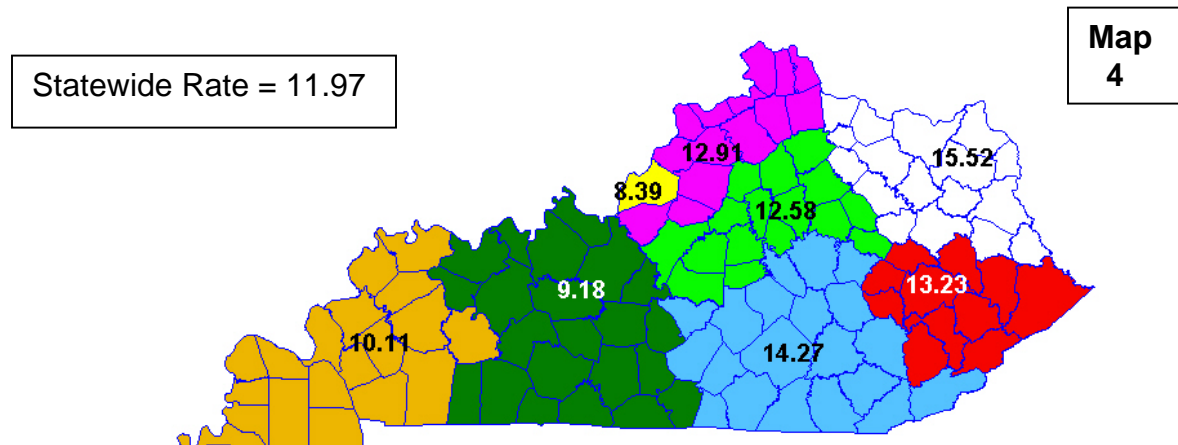
**Disciplinary actions for law violations** are shown on **Map 3**. The Southwest region reports the lowest rate at .57 per 100 and Jefferson County at 1.43 reports the highest rate. Note that the difference between the lowest rate and the highest rate is less than 1.

### Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations 2003-2004 – All Students



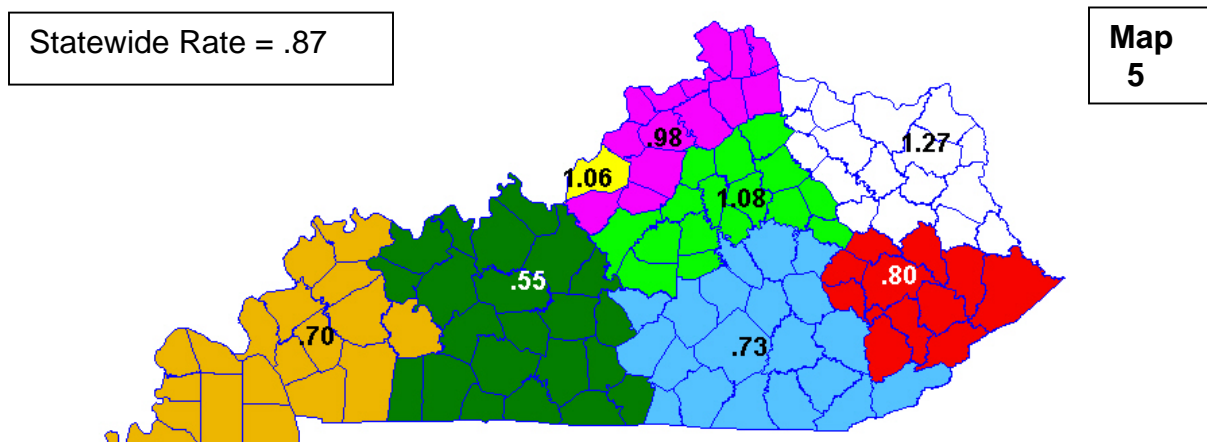
**Map 4** depicts Jefferson County reporting the lowest rate, 8.39 per 100, for **disciplinary actions of white students for board violations** while the South Central region reports the highest rate, 14.27.

### Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations 2003-2004 – White Students



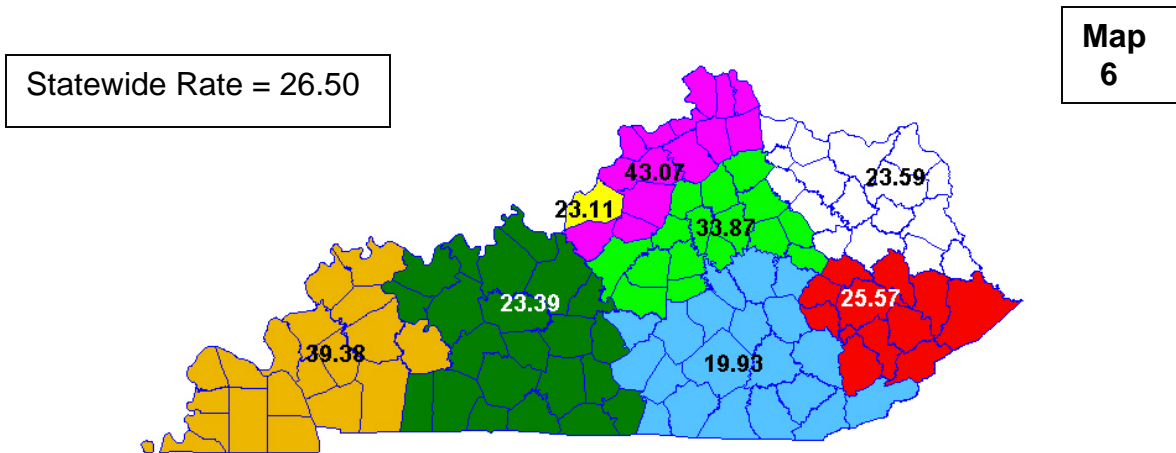
The Southwest region reported the lowest rate of **disciplinary actions of white students for law violations (Map 5)**, .55 per 100, while the Northeast region reported the highest rate, 1.27. The range between the highest and lowest region is .72.

### Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations 2003-2004 – White Students



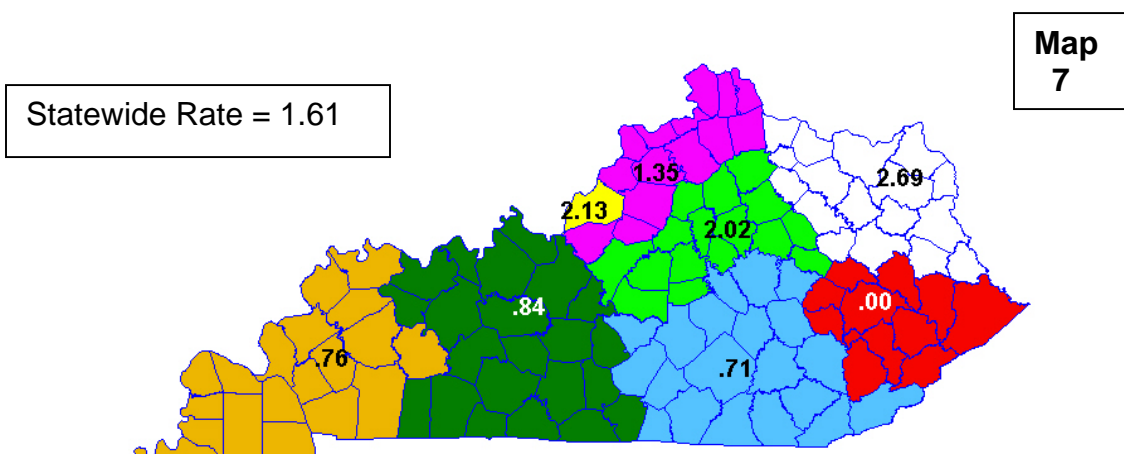
The South Central region reports a rate of 19.93 per 100 **disciplinary actions for African-American students for board policy violations** during the '03-04 school year. The highest rate, 43.07, was reported from the north region. (**Map 6**).

The southeast region reports the lowest rate, .00, of **disciplinary actions for African-American students for law violations** while the Northeast region has the highest rate at 2.69 per 100 as shown in **Map 7**.

**D**istricts are encouraged to examine their data over the three years of reporting. Additionally, districts are encouraged to make comparisons to other districts of similar size, to their region, and to the state. Similar comparisons can be made between building level data to other schools in their district as well as comparisons to their district, region and the state. Keep in mind that data should be reviewed in context to understand the full meaning of the data and to avoid misinterpretation.

## Section IV District Level Data

### Occurrence of School District Disciplinary Consequences for Law and Board Violations

**T**able I reports the number of disciplinary actions for law and board violations for each Kentucky school district from the 2001-2002 school year until the 2003-2004 school year. County districts (in bold type) are organized alphabetically with independent school districts shown beneath the county school district they adjoin. The data in this table represent the raw number of reported disciplinary consequences associated with specific incidents. Attendance data collected by the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) are shown in the enrollment column. Membership data are collected once yearly and are the most accurate snapshot of a district's total number of students.

**Note: Local school boards are responsible for determining what disciplinary consequences are permissible in their schools. Some school boards have enacted policies prohibiting the use of corporal punishment; therefore, the data contained in the following table under corporal punishment reflect only those districts where it is allowed.**

## Standard Scale of Measurement

The following tables utilize a standard scale of measurement, rate per 100, to facilitate comparison between districts of dissimilar sizes.

Therefore, the rate listed indicates how many incidents occurred in relation to every 100 students in the given districts. Districts are grouped by size to allow for more meaningful comparisons and due to the small number of expulsions across the state, expulsions with and without services are combined in these tables. (District rates for disciplinary actions for all students are shown in **Table 2**. The same data are shown in **Tables 3** and **4**, but have been disaggregated to show the rates for white and African-American students.)

***Note: A relatively small number of incidents can have a more dramatic effect on the rate per 100 in very small districts and in districts with a small number of African-Americans which may distort interpretation.***

Districts **not found** in **Tables 3** and **4** were not reported at the district level because the number of African-American students was so small that reporting the numbers might make them “personally identifiable” in violation of federal privacy laws (Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act, FERPA). Because their numbers were so small in most counties the concern for violating the privacy laws also results in the omission entirely of Asian, Hispanic, American Indian and other racial groups from the tables.

**W**hile school safety cannot be summarized with a data report alone, the data provide a measuring stick that schools can use to determine the effectiveness of current practices. The sixth annual report demonstrated that many of our schools' efforts to reduce school crime have succeeded as the data showed a clear downward trend in disciplinary actions for law violations. In particular, disciplinary actions for *Part I* law violations in 2003-2004 were reduced by almost half from the number of disciplinary actions in 2001-2002. The total number of disciplinary actions for *Part II* law violations decreased from 6,943 in 2001-2002 to 5,518 in 2003-2004. The 1,425 fewer disciplinary actions for 2004 represented a 20.5% decrease. The substantial reduction in law violations is very encouraging.

## Section V Summary

Board violations show an opposite trend as disciplinary actions continue to rise each year. Aggressive behaviors, such as fighting, some forms of defiance of authority and threatening conduct, account for the bulk of the increase in board violations while offenses that have decreased are non-aggressive, (i.e., Failure to Attend Detention, Tobacco Violations and Profanity or Vulgarity.) School leaders may want to examine programs that have demonstrated effectiveness in reducing aggression in children and adolescents.

School administrators are always concerned when students are out of school due to misbehavior. KCSS strives to assist school leaders to provide additional, creative options to out-of-school suspensions. For example, the KCSS Community Service projects are demonstrating promising results in keeping students involved in educational pursuits while providing natural consequences for misbehavior.

Diligence to maintaining safe schools in Kentucky remains the primary focus for the Kentucky Center for School Safety. # APPENDIX A

Definitions of  
Law Violations

**Important:**

**This guide is to serve as clarification for school personnel when coding law violations upon school property. These definitions are not legally binding and should only be used to assist school personnel in coding law violations at their school for Safe Schools data collection purposes. For any questions that arise regarding the legal definition of a student action, please consult with your School Board Attorney or local law enforcement representative.**

Code Description

**11 Criminal Homicide-** A person is guilty of criminal homicide when he causes the death of another human being under circumstances which constitute murder, manslaughter in the first degree, manslaughter in the second degree, or reckless homicide.

**20 Forcible Rape/Forcible Sodomy-** A person is guilty of forcible rape when he engages in sexual intercourse/deviate sexual intercourse with another person by forcible compulsion; or he engages in sexual intercourse/deviate sexual intercourse with another person who is incapable of consent because he: is physically helpless; or is less than twelve (12) years old. "Deviate sexual intercourse" means any act of sexual gratification involving the sex organs of one person and the mouth or anus of another; or penetration of the anus of one person by a foreign object manipulated by another person (other than generally recognized health-care practices). Sexual intercourse means sexual intercourse in its ordinary sense and includes penetration of the sex organs of one person by a foreign object manipulated by another person.

**30 Robbery-** The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force and/or putting the victim in fear.

**50 Burglary-** A person is guilty of burglary when, with the intent to commit a crime, he knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in a building. A building, in addition to its ordinary meaning, means any structure, vehicle, watercraft or aircraft where any person lives or where people assemble for purposes of business, government, education, religion, entertainment or public transportation. Thus, breaking into a bus and stealing something from the bus would be counted as burglary.

**60 Larceny/Theft** – The intentional taking of the property of another.

**70 Motor Vehicle Theft-** The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

**90 Arson** – Any intentional burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle, or aircraft.

**100 Forgery and Counterfeiting**— Occurs when a person, with intent to defraud, deceive or injure another, falsely makes, completes or alters a written instrument (e.g., checks, transcripts, official identification, currency).

**110 Fraud** is obtaining money or property by false pretenses.

**120 Embezzlement** – Misappropriating or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control, to include altering or forging financial records.

**130 Stolen Property (Receiving)** violations include buying, receiving, possessing of stolen property.

**140 Vandalism (Criminal Mischief)** – The intentional destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property without consent of the owner or person having custody or control (i.e., by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, or covering with filth)

**151 Weapon A - Handgun** – A handgun is any pistol or revolver originally designed to be fired by the use of a single hand, or any other firearm originally designed to be fired by the use of a single hand. A firearm is any weapon that will expel a projectile by the action of an explosive. This offense encompasses manufacture, sale, or possession of handguns on school property or at a school function. By Kentucky law (KRS 527.070), this excludes students 18 years of age and older who have these firearms in their automobile on school property.

**152 Weapon B - Rifle**- A rifle is a weapon designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the shoulder and designed or redesigned and made or remade to use the energy of the explosive in a fixed metallic cartridge to fire only a single projectile through a rifled bore for each single pull of the trigger. This category also includes **shotguns**. This offense encompasses sale or possession of rifles or shotguns on school property or at a school function. By Kentucky law, this excludes students 18 years of age and older who have these firearms in their automobile on school property.

**153 Weapon C - Other Firearms** – Weapons other than handguns, rifles, or shotguns that will expel a projectile by the action of an explosive. Examples of other firearms include air guns (that use pneumatic pressure or pressurized cartridges to fire a projectile) also known as BB guns; and other homemade firearms. By Kentucky law, this excludes students 18 years of age and over who have these firearms in their automobile on school property.

**154 Weapon D - Other-** any object capable of being readily used by one person to inflict severe bodily injury upon another person. Examples include (but are not limited to) knives, artificial knuckles, club, baton, nunchaku karate sticks. This offense encompasses manufacture, sale, or possession of these types of weapons on school property or at a school function. By Kentucky law, this excludes students 18 years of age and over who have these weapons in their automobile on school property.

**160 Prostitution/Vice** – a person is guilty of prostitution something of value when he or she engages or agrees or offers to engage in sexual conduct with another person in return for a fee. Also includes keeping a bawdy house, procuring, or transporting women for immoral purposes.

**For the definitions included below, “...a word importing the masculine gender only may extend and be applied to females as well as males” (KRS 446.020).**

Thus, any reference to “he” in the descriptions below also includes females as well.

**170 Sex Offense- Includes the following offenses defined below: indecent exposure, statutory rape, sexual assault/abuse, and other sexual offenses.**

**Indecent Exposure-** A person is guilty of indecent exposure when he or she intentionally exposes his or her genitals under circumstances in which he or she knows or should know that his or her conduct is likely to cause affront or alarm to another person on school grounds or at a school function. This is not to be confused with violation 175.

**Statutory Rape** – A person is guilty of statutory rape (in KY, rape in the second degree) when: (a) Being eighteen (18) years old or more, he or she engages in sexual intercourse with another person less than fourteen (14) years old; or (b) He engages in sexual intercourse with another person who is mentally incapacitated; (c) Being twenty-one (21) years old or more he engages in sexual intercourse with another person less than sixteen (16) years old.

**Sexual Assault (Abuse)** – a person is guilty of sexual assault when: (a) He subjects another person to sexual contact (touching intimate parts) by forcible compulsion; or (b) He subjects another person to sexual contact who is incapable of consent because he: is physically helpless; less than twelve (12) years old; or is mentally incapacitated.

**Other Sexual Offenses-** a person is guilty of other sexual offenses when they engage in some type of sexual activity not covered above on school grounds or at a school function. (e.g., sexual intercourse or deviate sexual intercourse not covered within other listed offenses)

**Each of the codes in the 180 series includes possession and/or distribution of the drug in question on school property or at a school-sponsored function.**

**180 Other Drug Abuse** – Includes possession and/or distribution of controlled substances or unauthorized possession of over-the-counter drugs not specifically listed elsewhere.

**181 Alcohol** - Includes possession and/or distribution of a liquor, brew, or mixture containing alcohol. Examples include beer, whiskey, and wine.

**182 Marijuana** - Includes possession and/or distribution of marijuana.

**183 Hallucinogenics** – Includes possession and/or distribution of a psychoactive drug that induces hallucinations or altered sensory experiences (e.g., LSD, PCP).

**184 Amphetamines** – Includes possession and/or distribution of amphetamine or methamphetamine.

**185 Barbiturates** – Includes possession and/or distribution of barbiturates. Barbiturates are organic compounds that produce sedative and hypnotic effects (e.g., Nembutal, Luminal, Seconal, Pentothal).

**186 Heroin**- Includes possession and/or distribution of heroin.

**187 Cocaine/Crack** – Includes possession and/or distribution of cocaine or crack.

**188 Prescription drugs** – unauthorized possession and/or distribution of medications that are available only with prescriptions from a doctor or dentist to a pharmacist.

**190 Gambling** – staking or risking something of value upon the outcome of a contest, game, gaming scheme, or gaming device which is based upon an element of chance, in accord with an agreement or understanding that someone will receive something of value in the event of a certain outcome, on school property or at a school-sponsored event. This does not include school-sanctioned activities of chance.

**200 Offenses Against Family**– All charges of non-support and neglect or abuse of family and children, such as desertion, abandonment, or non-support of spouse or child; neglect or abuse of spouse or child; and/or nonpayment of alimony.

**210 Driving under the influence**– Operating a motor vehicle with alcohol concentration of or above 0.08 for those above 21 and 0.02 for those under age 21, or while under the influence of alcohol or other substance which impairs driving ability.

**220 Liquor Law** – Any state and/or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving under the influence. Includes underage consumption. Possession and distribution of alcohol are covered under Codes 1811 and 1812.

**230 Drunkenness** – Includes all offenses of intoxication with the exception of driving under the influence. In Kentucky, this offense equates to alcohol intoxication and/or public intoxication, which occurs when a person appears in a public place manifestly under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance, or other intoxicating substance.

**240 Disorderly Conduct** – Committing a breach of the peace. In Kentucky, a person is guilty of disorderly conduct when in a public place and with intent to cause public inconvenience, annoyance or alarm, or creating a risk thereof, he:

- (a) Engages in fighting or in violent, tumultuous or threatening behavior; or
- (b) Makes unreasonable noise; or
- (c) Refuses to obey an official order to disperse issued to maintain public safety in dangerous proximity to a fire, hazard or other emergency; or
- (d) Creates a hazardous or physically offensive condition by any act that serves no legitimate purpose.

**260 All Other Offenses** – To include (but not limited to) blackmail and extortion; criminal anarchism; criminal syndicalism; and kidnapping.

**280 Curfew and Loitering-** (Loitering)

*There is no curfew law in the state of Kentucky.*

**Loitering-** A person is guilty of loitering when he:

- (a) Loiters or remains in a public place for the purpose of gambling with cards, dice or other gambling paraphernalia, or
- (b) Loiters or remains in a public place for the purpose of unlawfully using a controlled substance; or
- (c) Loiters or remains in or about a school, college or university building or grounds, not having any reason or relationship involving custody of or responsibility for a pupil or student or any other specific legitimate reason for being there and not having written permission from anyone authorized to grant the same

**290 Runaways** – A person can be taken into protective custody in Kentucky when they have been a habitual runaway from his parent or person exercising custodial control or supervision of the child. School personnel cannot take runaways into custody. This code should not be used.

### 301 Assault in the First Degree

#### Definition from KRS 508.010:

- (1) A person is guilty of assault in the first degree when:
  - (a) He intentionally causes serious physical injury to another person by means of a deadly weapon or a dangerous instrument; or*
  - (b) Under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life he wantonly engages in conduct which creates a grave risk of death to another and thereby causes serious physical injury to another person.**
- (2) Assault in the first degree is a Class B Felony.*

For purposes of the school setting, an individual who intentionally uses a deadly weapon, dangerous instrument, or other means to cause **serious physical injury** to another is guilty of Assault in the first degree. This is the most serious assault; its code should be reserved for situations when the intent of the offender is to cause death or serious injury.

To meet these criteria, the victim has to incur potential life threatening injury, serious disfigurement, or prolonged loss of the use of a body part from the incident.

### 302 Assault in the second degree

#### Definition from KRS 508.020:

- (1) A person is guilty of assault in the second degree when:
  - (a) He intentionally causes serious physical injury to another person; or*
  - (b) He intentionally causes physical injury to another person by means of a deadly weapon or a dangerous instrument; or*
  - (c) He wantonly causes serious physical injury to another person by means of a deadly weapon or a dangerous instrument.**
- (2) Assault in the second degree is a Class C felony.*

For purposes of the school setting, an individual who intentionally causes physical injury to another person with a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument or intentionally causes serious injury to another person will be coded as Assault in the 2<sup>nd</sup> degree.

### **310, 320, and 330 Terroristic threatening, Bomb Threat, and Chemical/Biological/Nuclear Threats**

- (1) A person is guilty of one of these offenses when he or she: (a) Intentionally makes false statements that he or she or another person has placed a weapon of mass destruction on:
  1. The real property or any building of any public or private elementary or secondary school, vocational school, or institution of postsecondary education;
  2. A school bus or other vehicle owned, operated, or leased by a school;
  3. The real property or any building public or private that is the site of an official school sanctioned function; or
  4. The real property or any building owned or leased by a government agency; or
- (2) Intentionally and without lawful authority, places a counterfeit weapon of mass destruction at any location or on any object specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection.
- (3) Intentionally:
  - (a) With respect to a school function, threatens to commit any act likely to result in death or serious physical injury to any student group, teacher, volunteer worker, or employee of a public or private elementary or secondary school, vocational school, or institution of postsecondary education, or to any other person reasonably expected to lawfully be on school property or at a school-sanctioned activity, if the threat is related to their employment by a school, or work or attendance at school, or a school function. A threat directed at a person or persons or at a school does not need to identify a specific person or persons or school in order for a violation of this section to occur;
  - (b) Makes false statements that he or she has placed a weapon of mass destruction at any location other than one specified in KRS 508.075; or
  - (c) Without lawful authority places a counterfeit weapon of mass destruction at any location other than one specified in KRS 508.075.
  - (d) He threatens to commit any crime likely to result in death or serious physical injury to another person or likely to result in substantial property damage to another person; or
  - (e) He intentionally makes false statements for the purpose of causing evacuation of a building, place of assembly, or facility of public transportation.

**Note: Activating fire alarms would be included in category 310 for reporting purposes.**

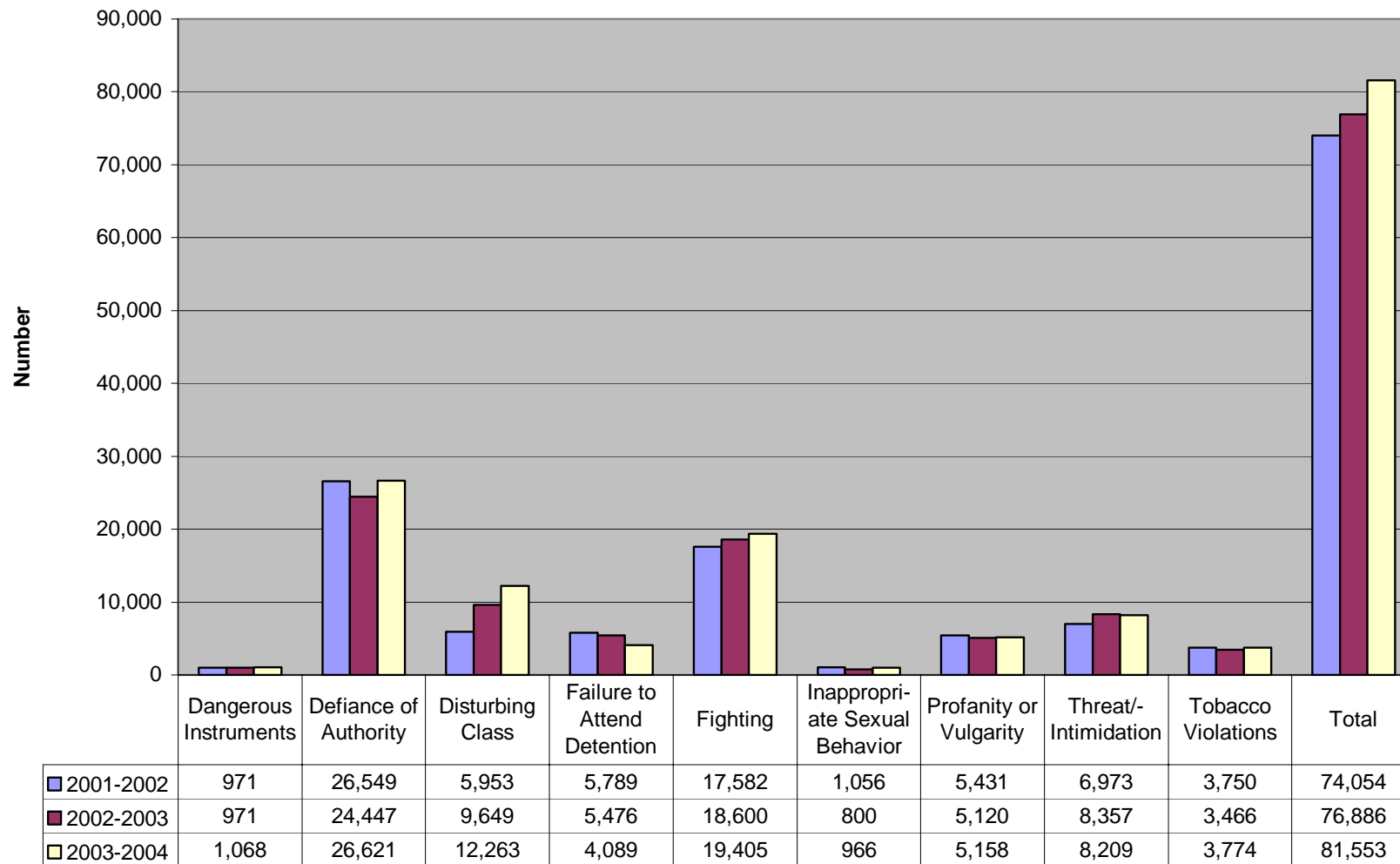

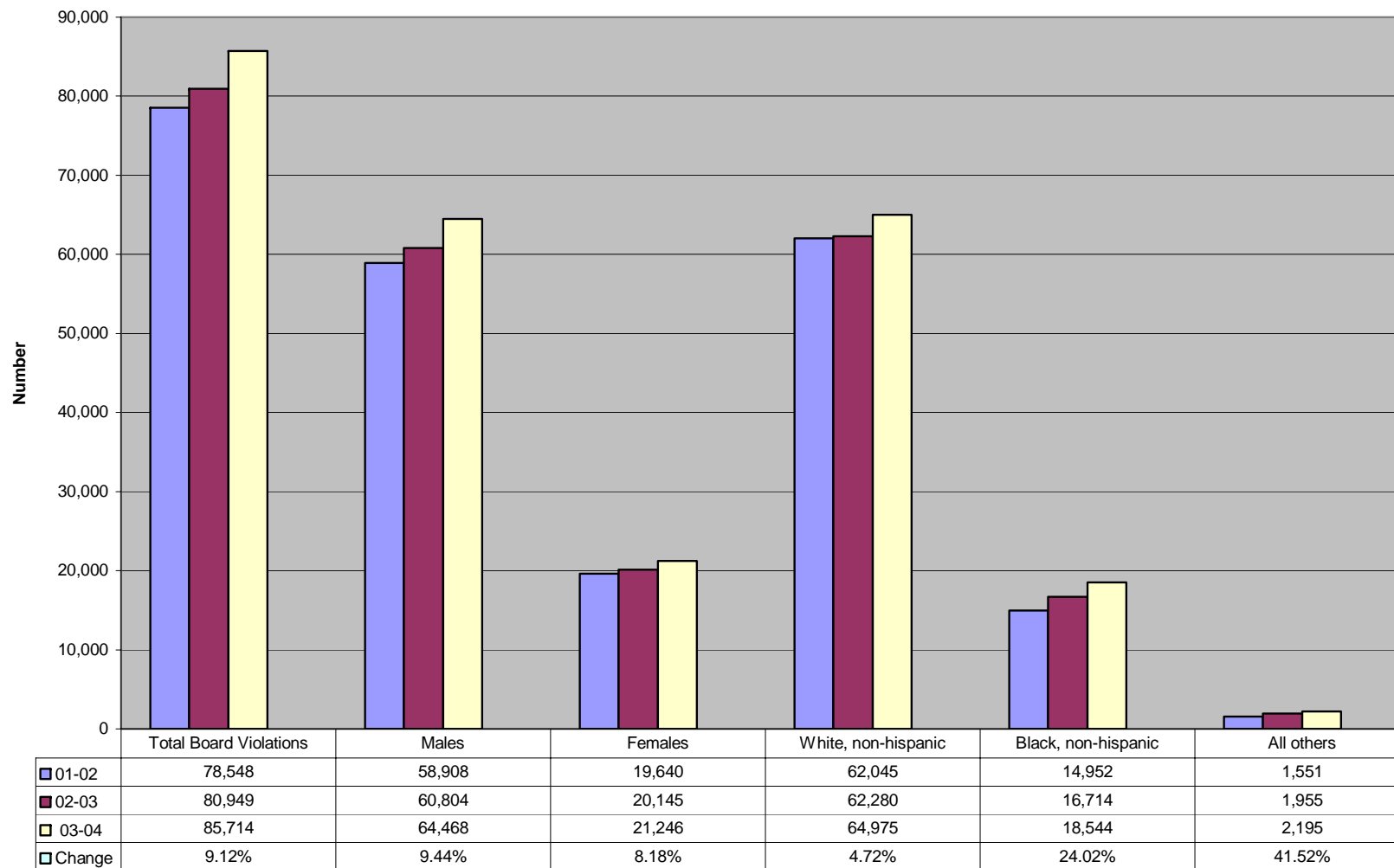

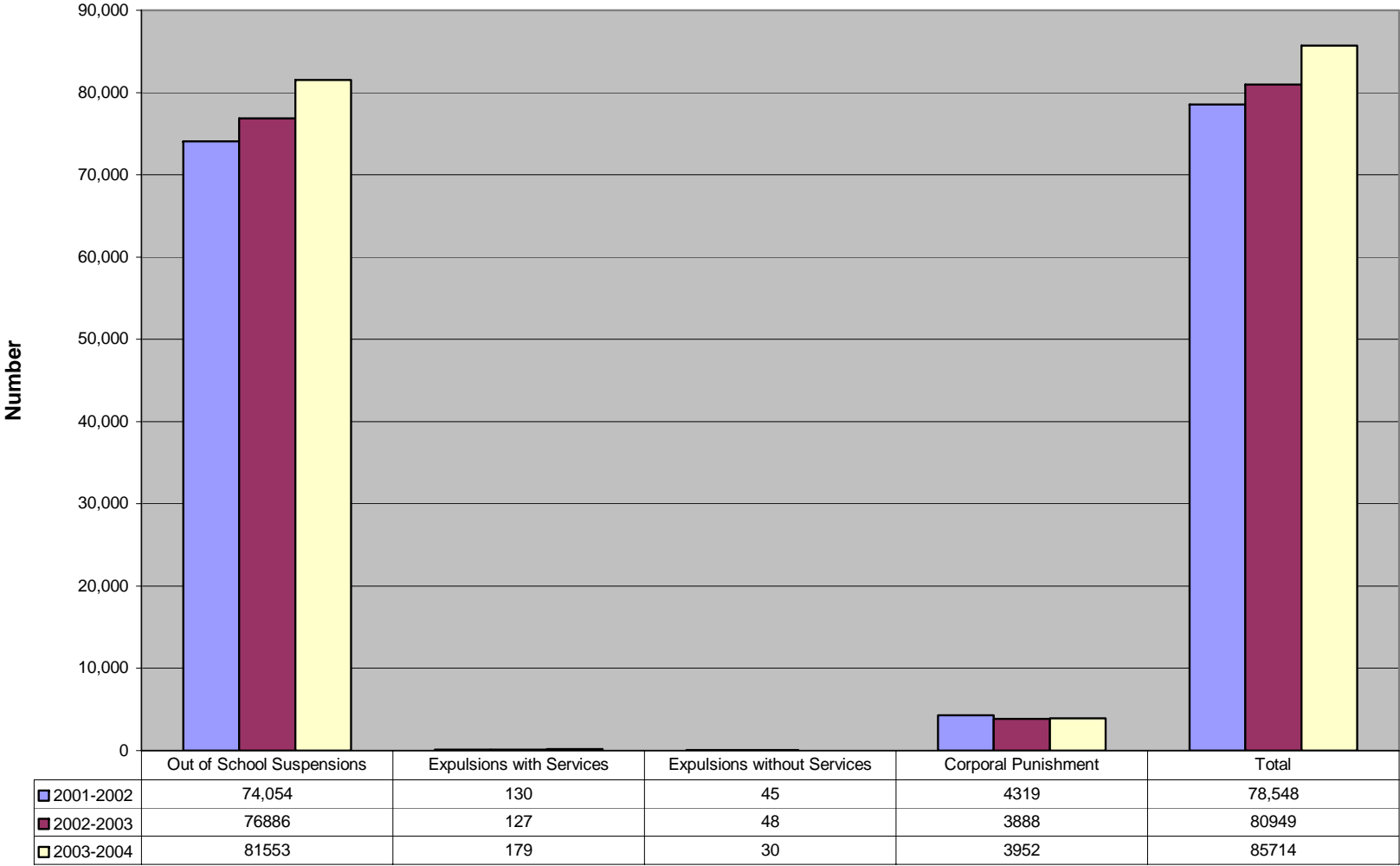


Total Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations by Population Group

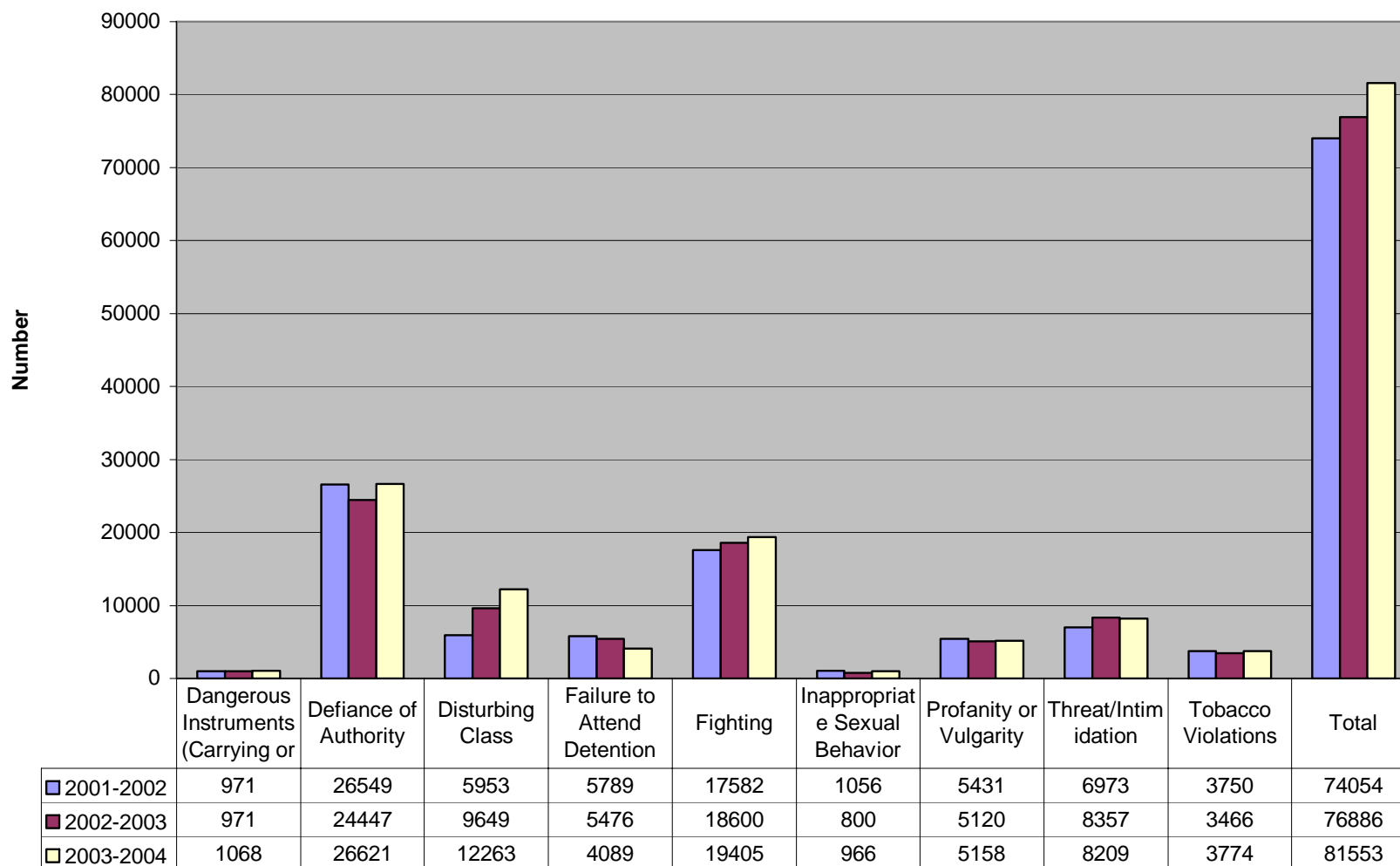

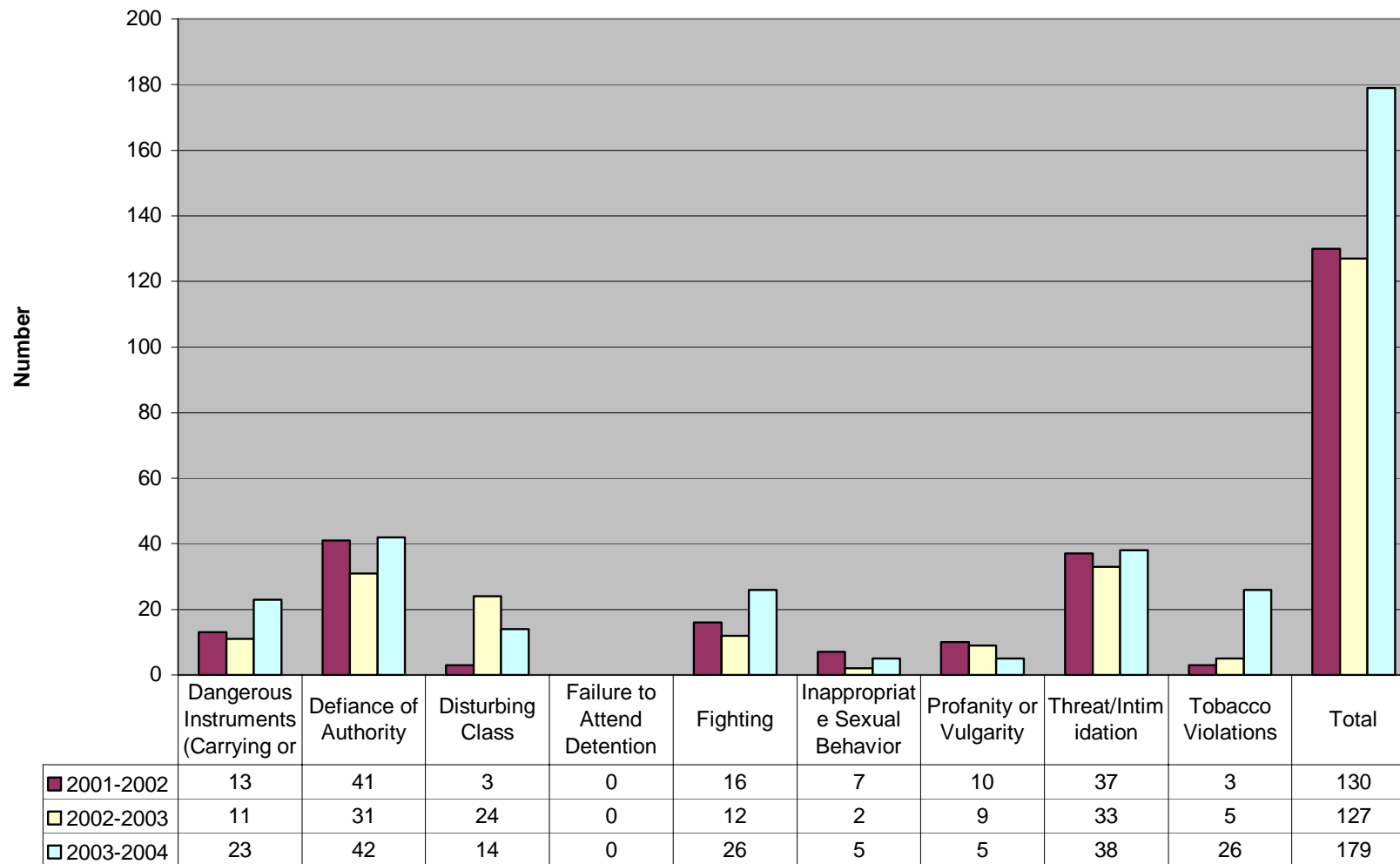

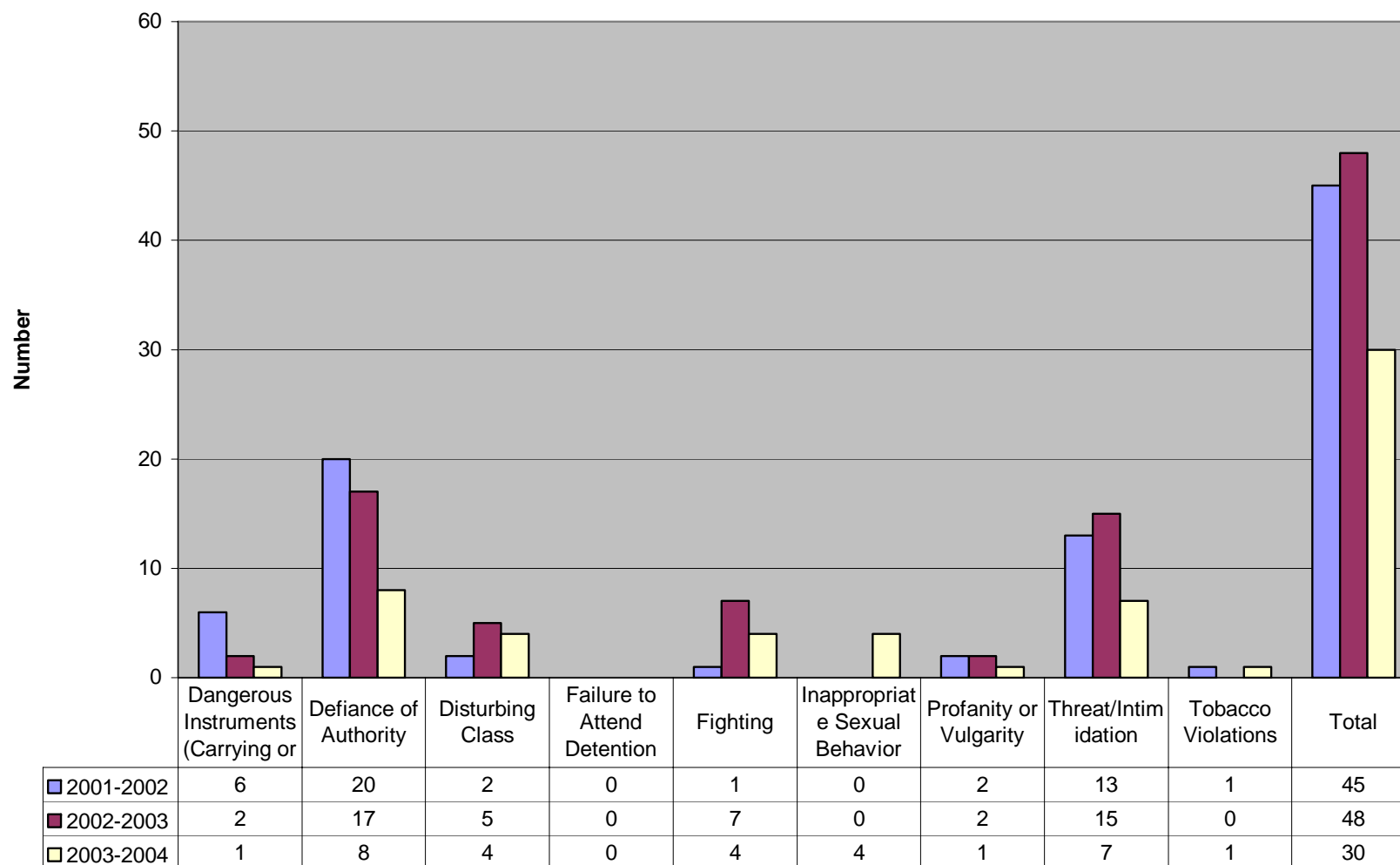
### Board Policy Violations Out-of-School Suspensions



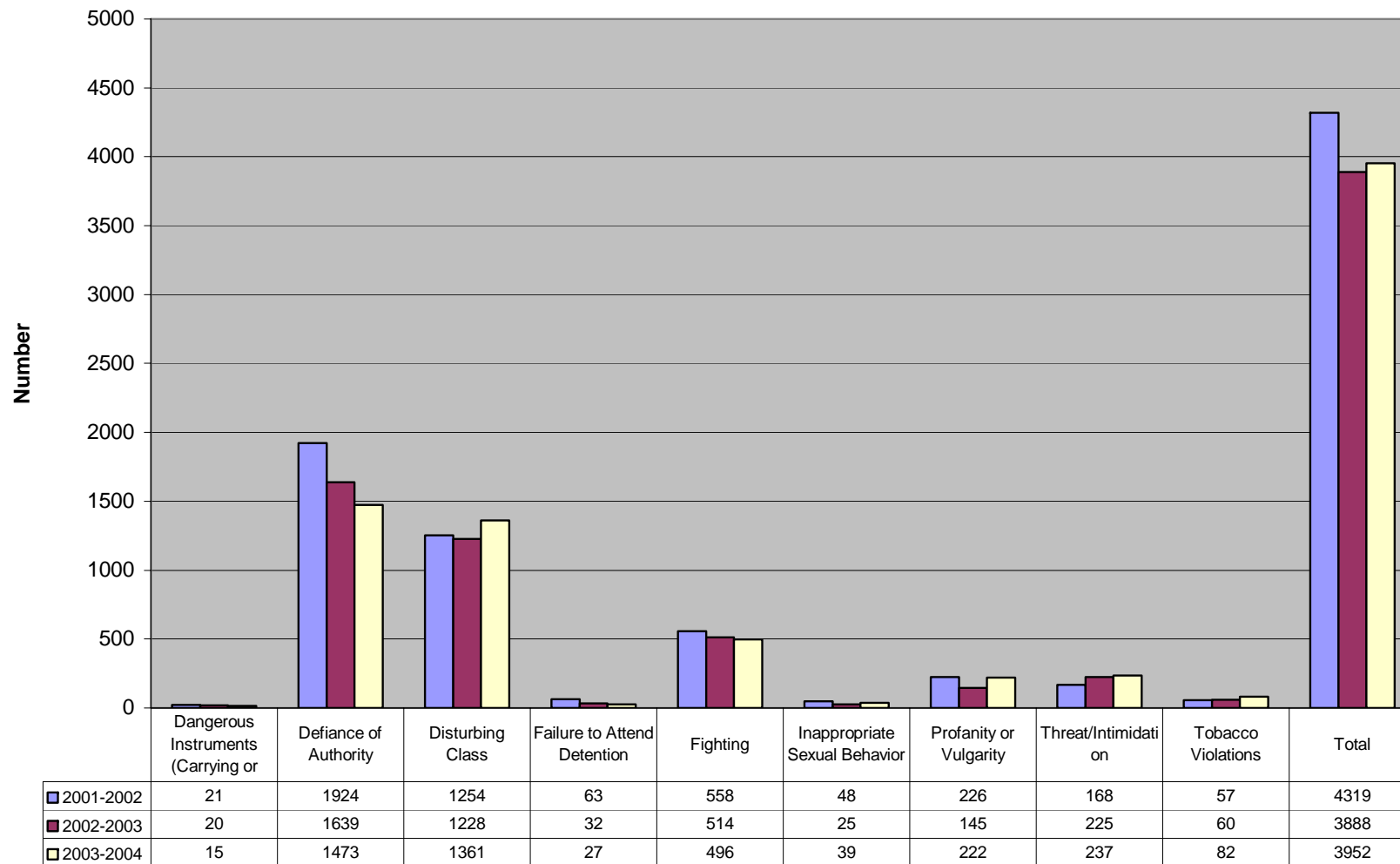
### Board Policy Violations Expulsions with Services

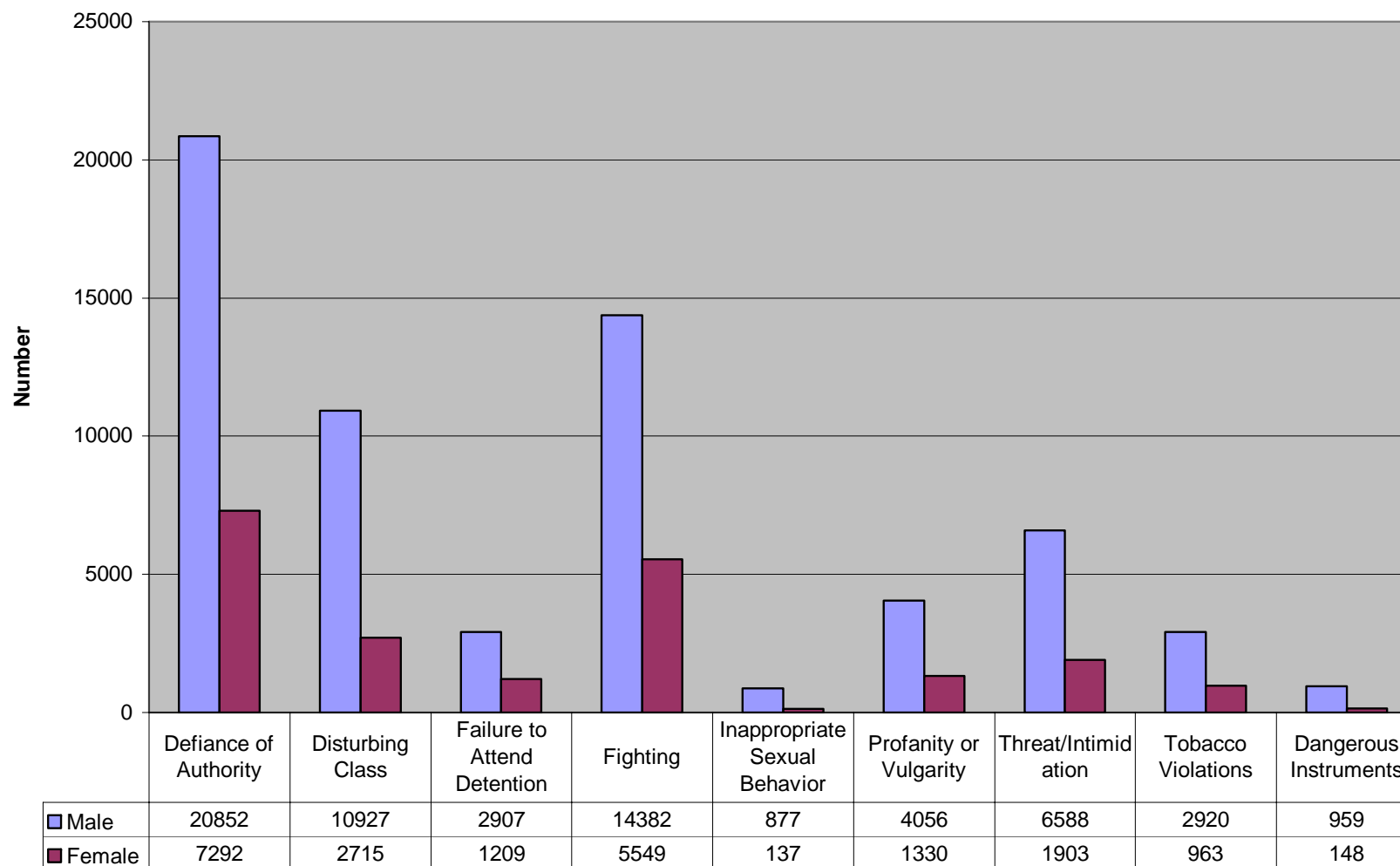

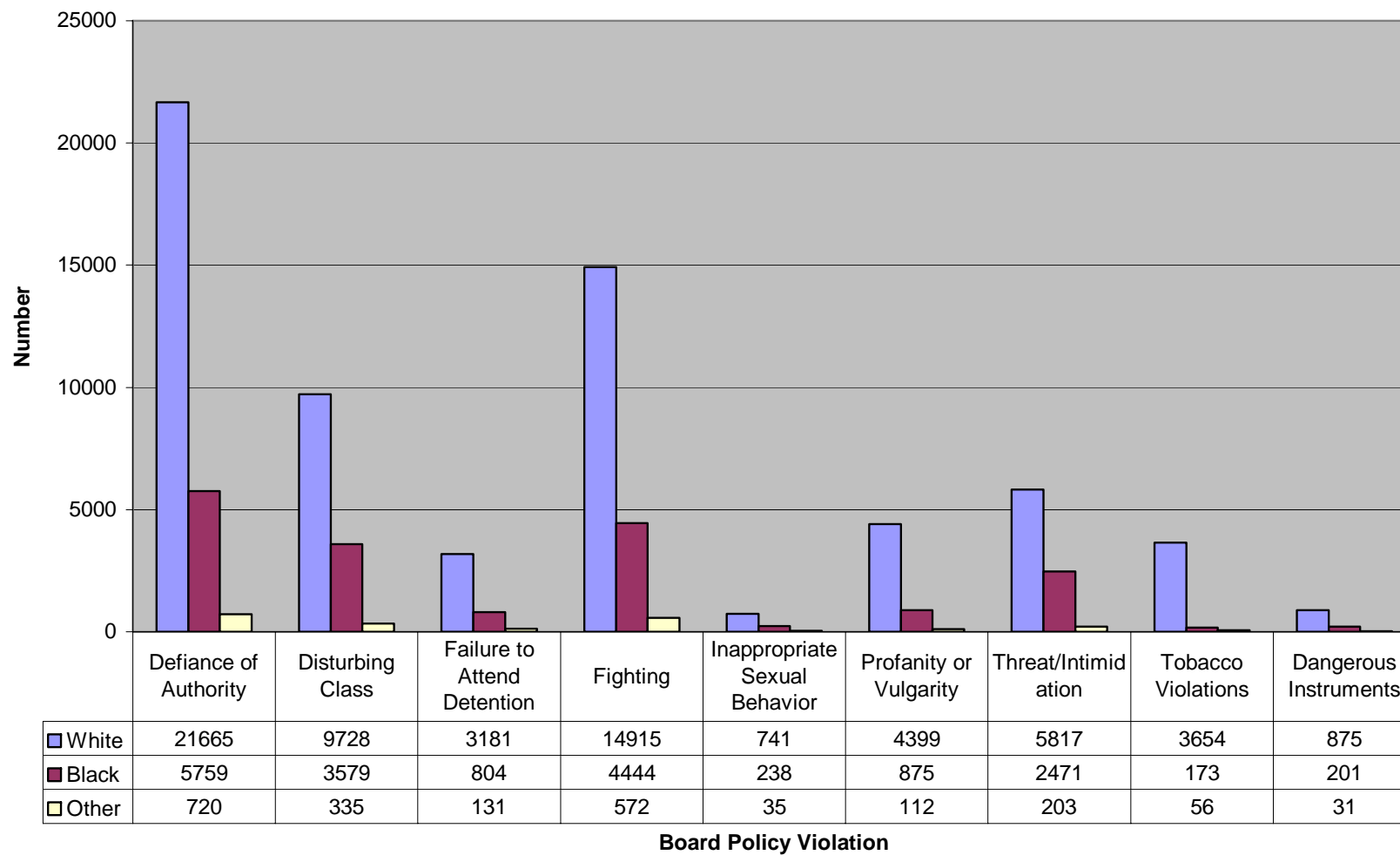




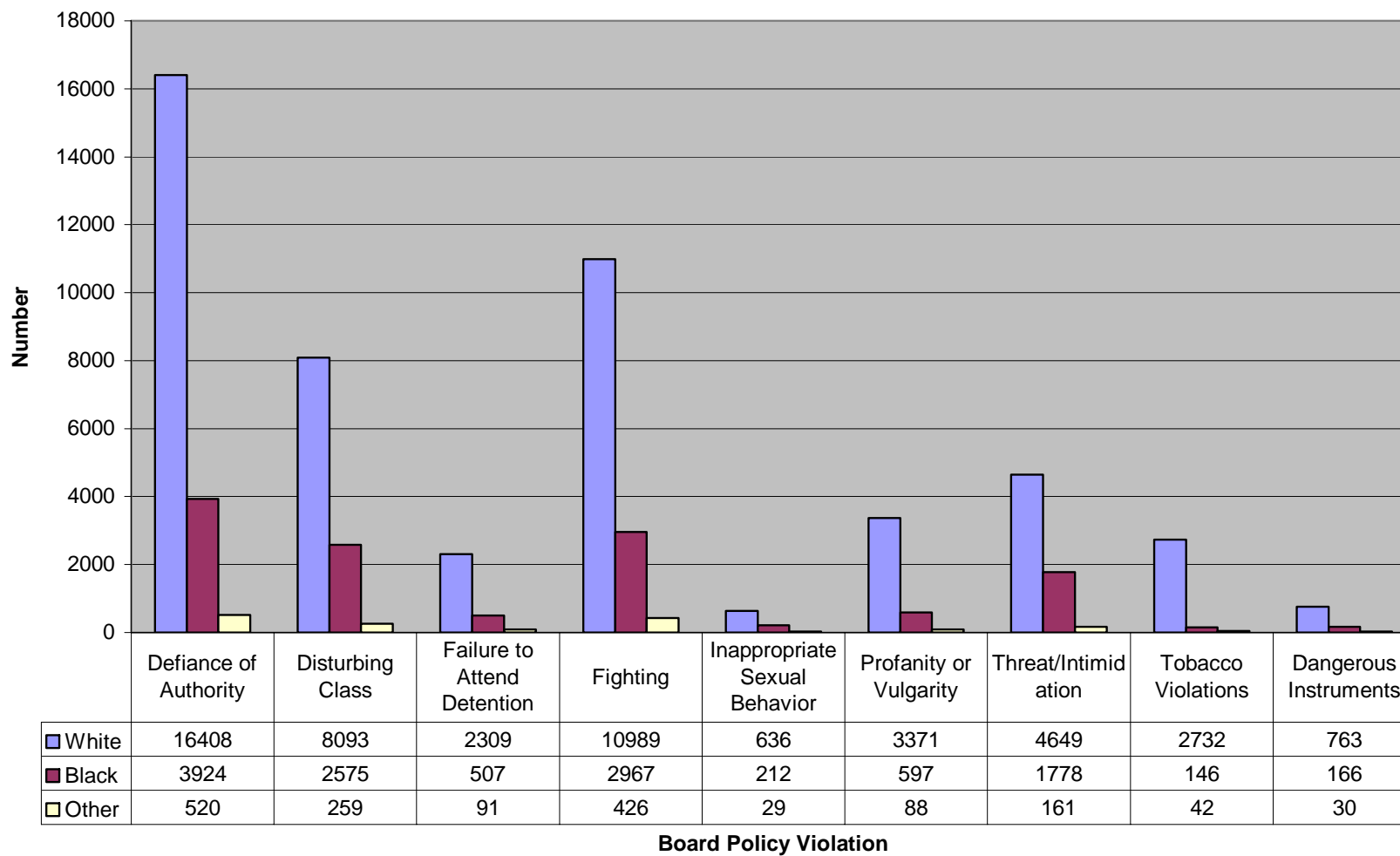
# Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations by Gender 2003-2004



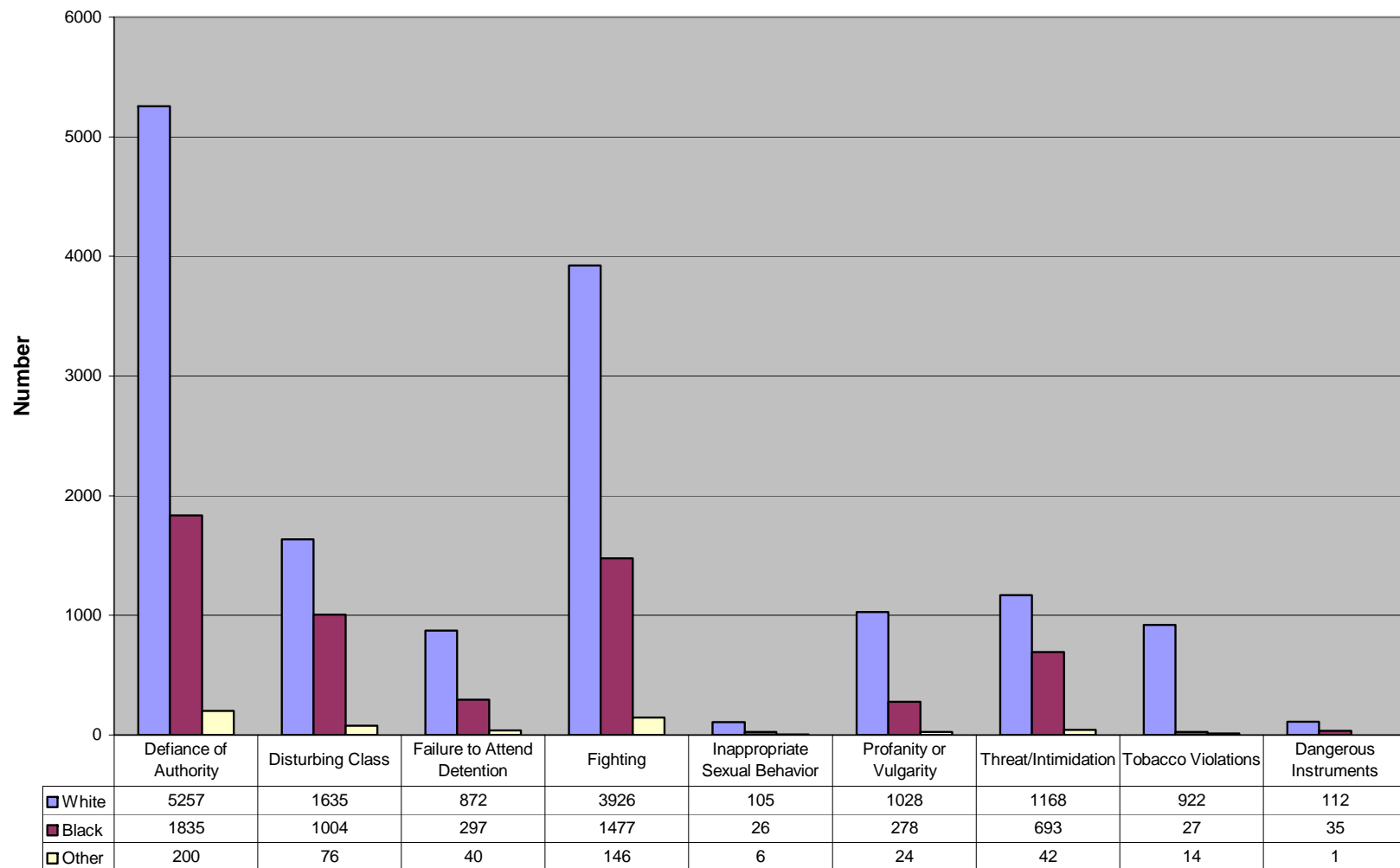
### Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations by Race 2003-2004



### Disciplinary Actions for Males for Board Policy Violations by Race 2003-2004

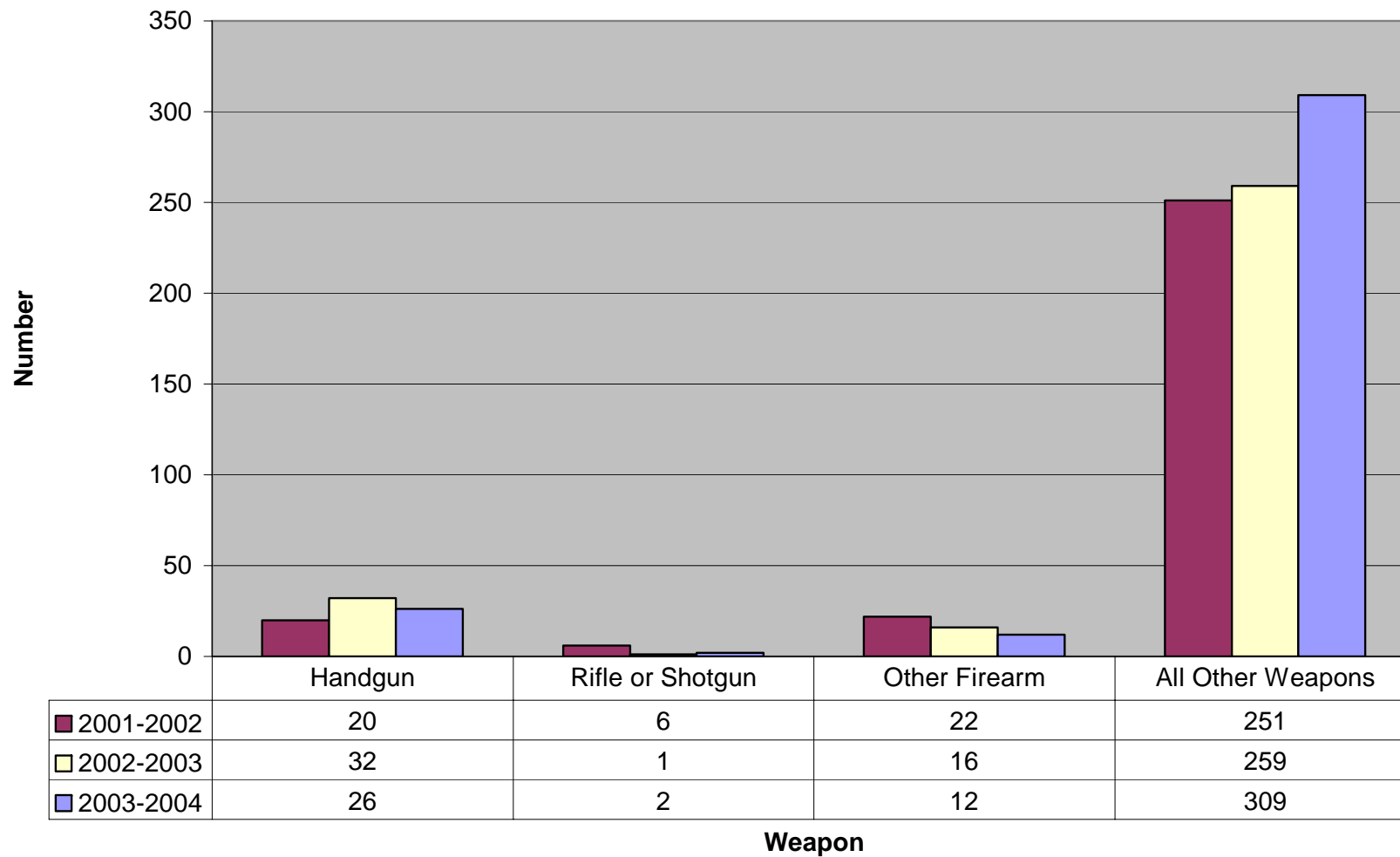


Disciplinary Actions for Female Board Policy Violations by Race 2003-2004

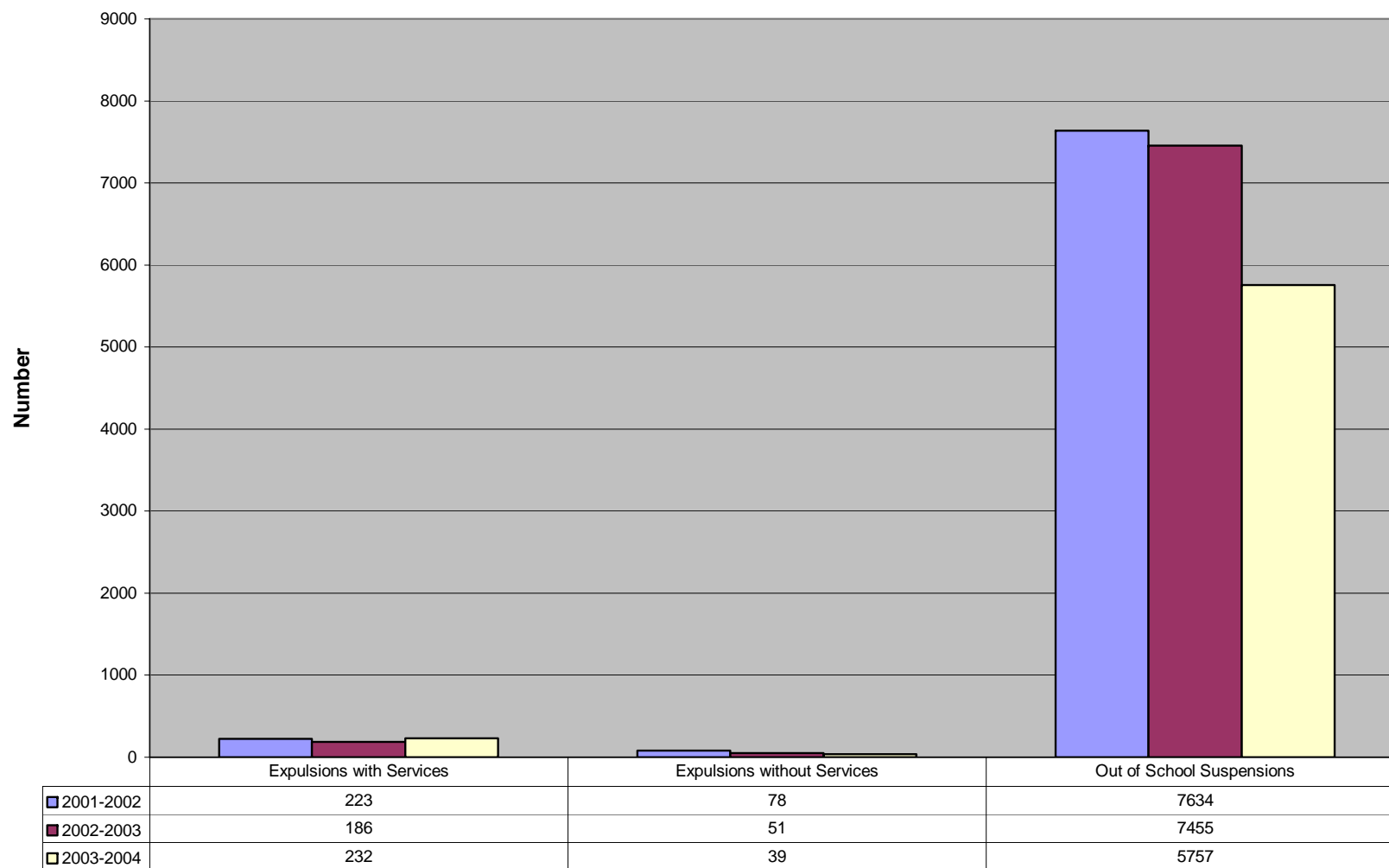

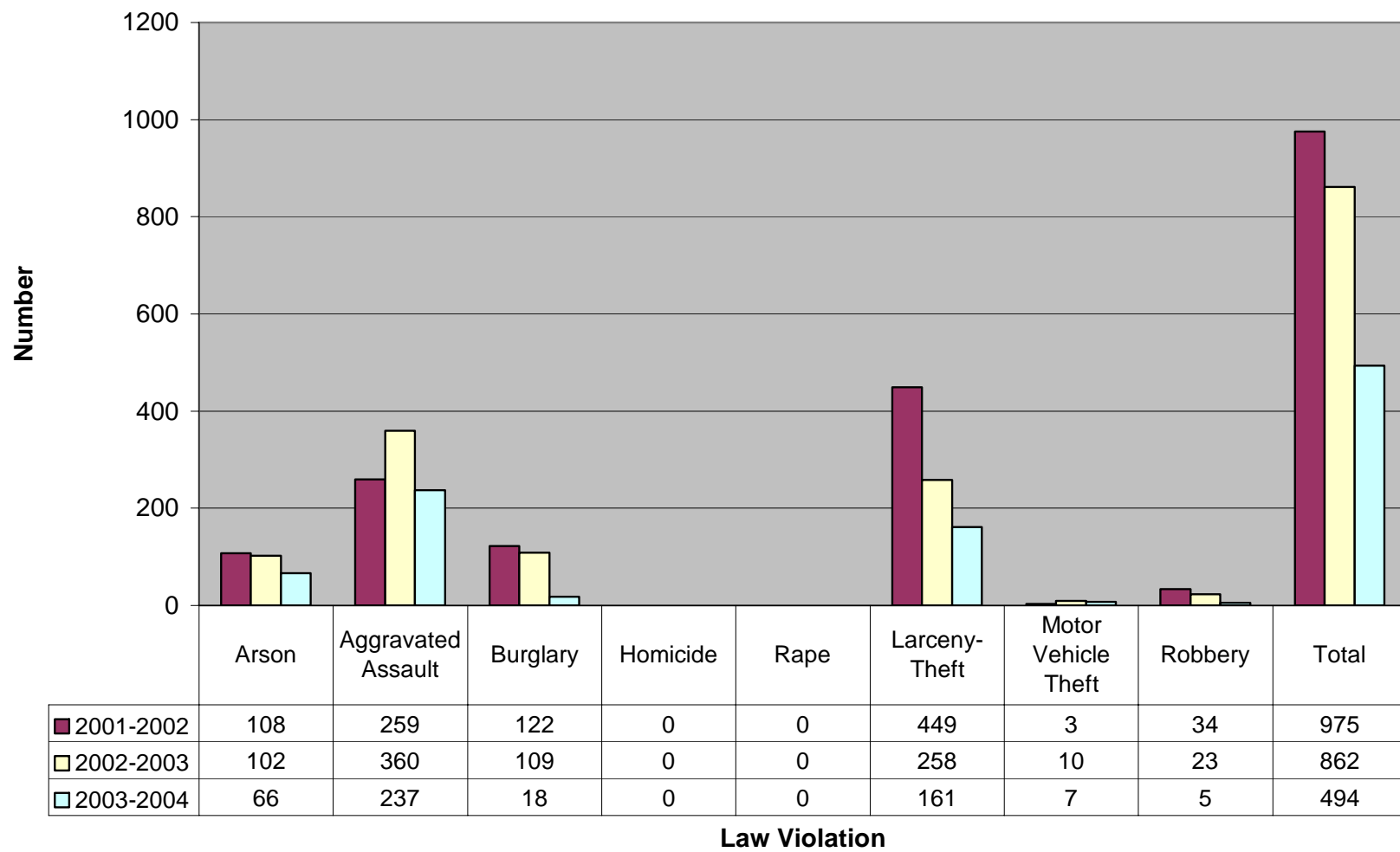
### Disciplinary Actions for Incidents Involving Weapons

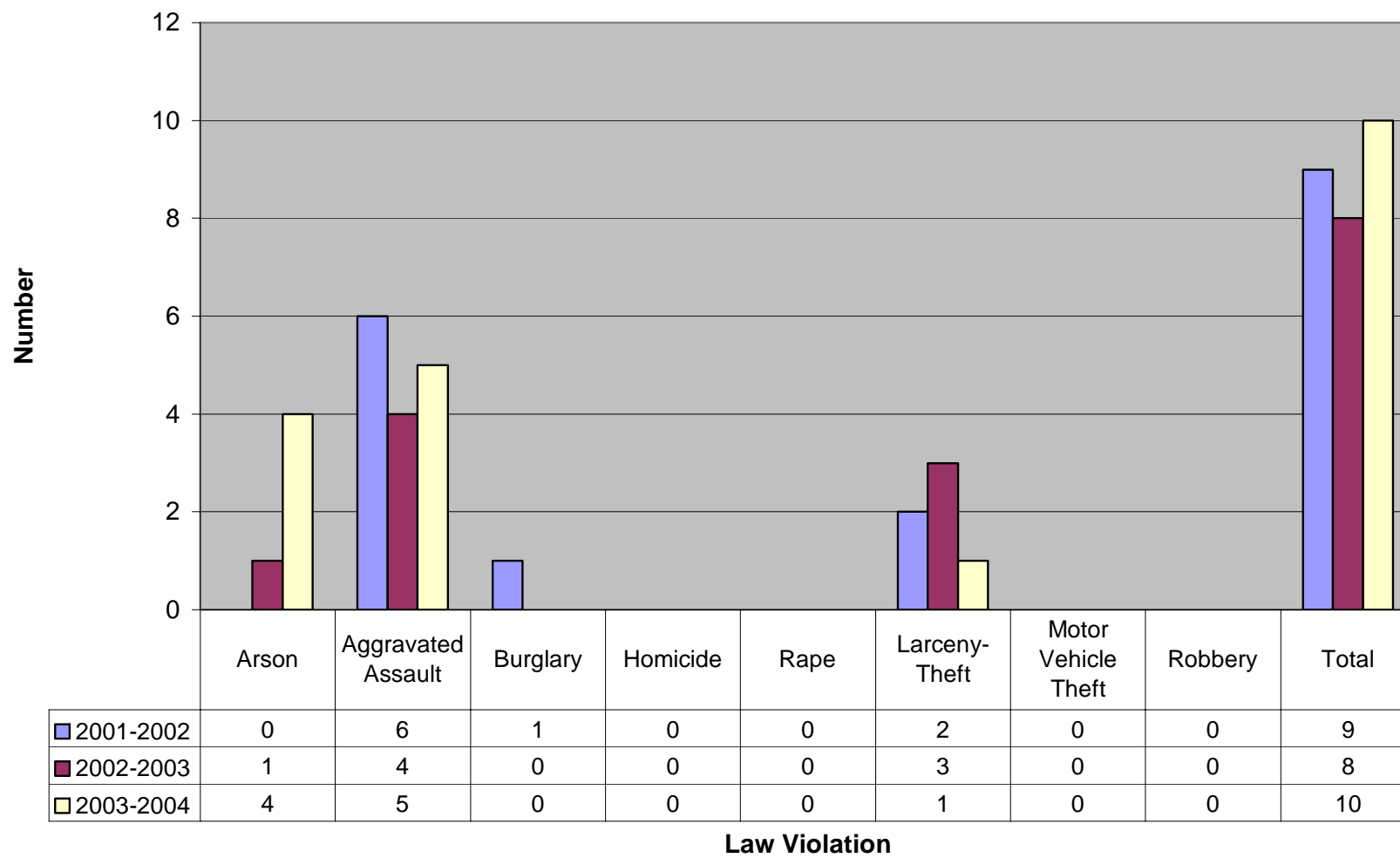

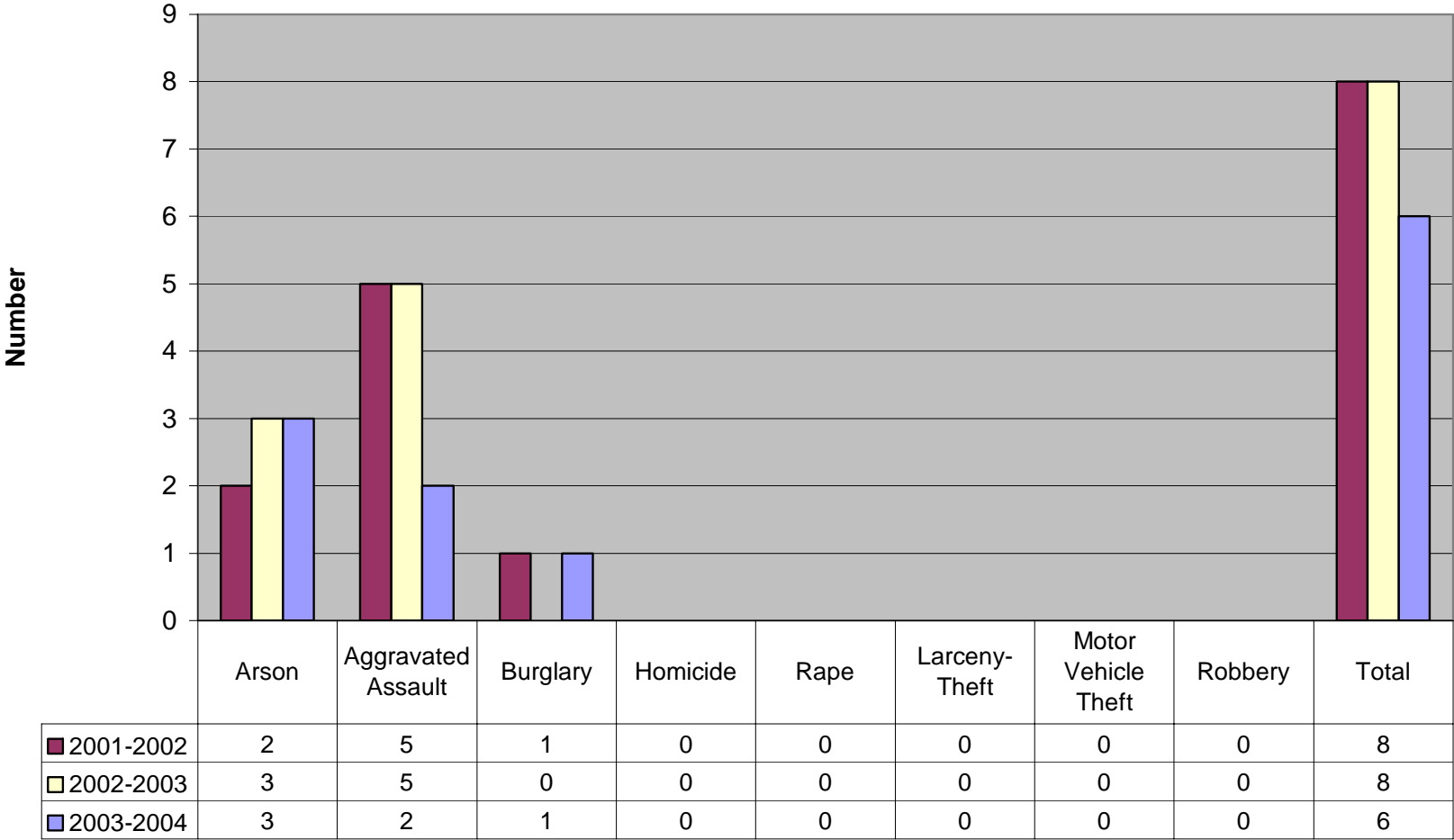


## Part I Law Violations Expulsions with Services



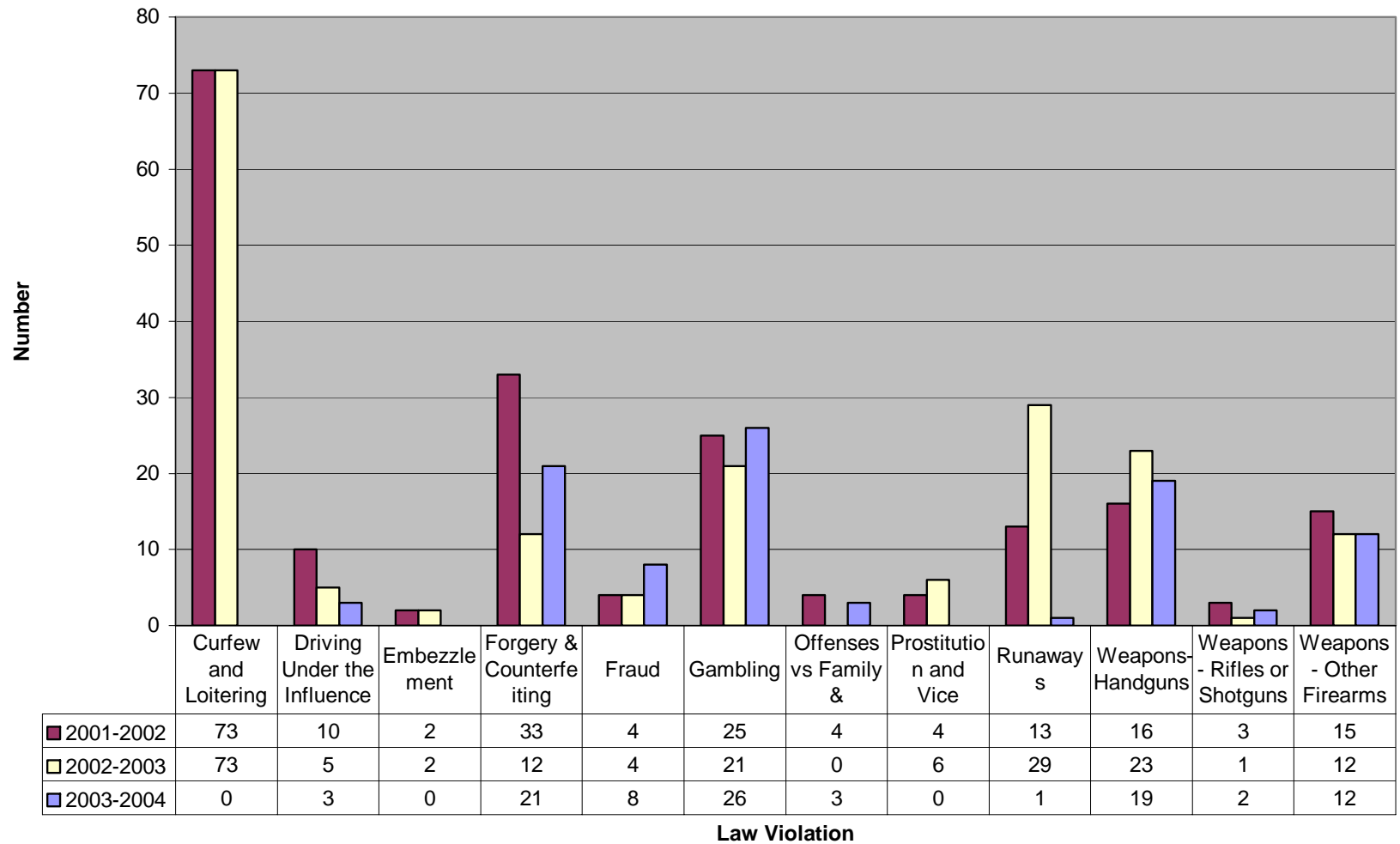

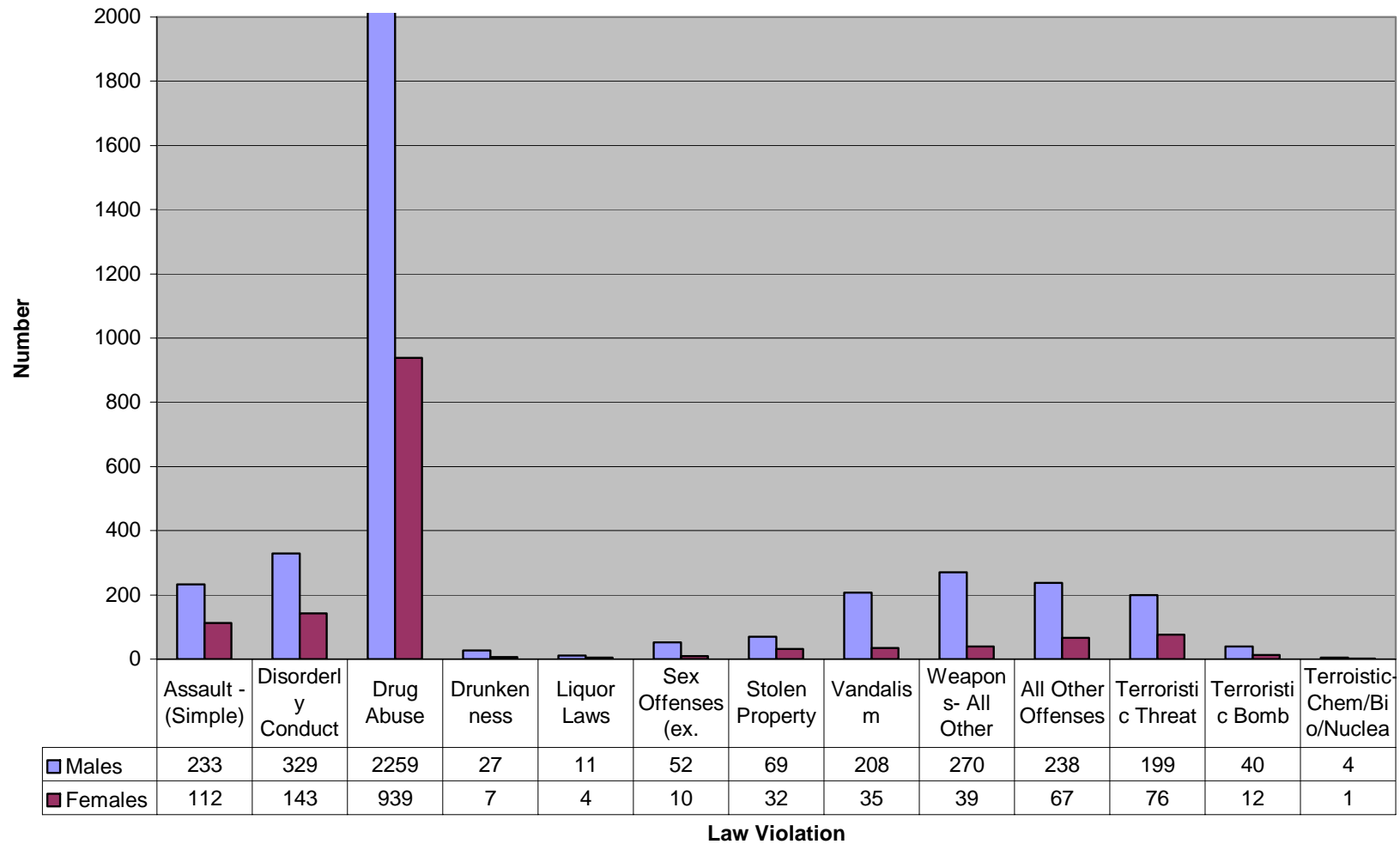
### Disciplinary Actions for Part I Law Violations by Gender 2003-2004

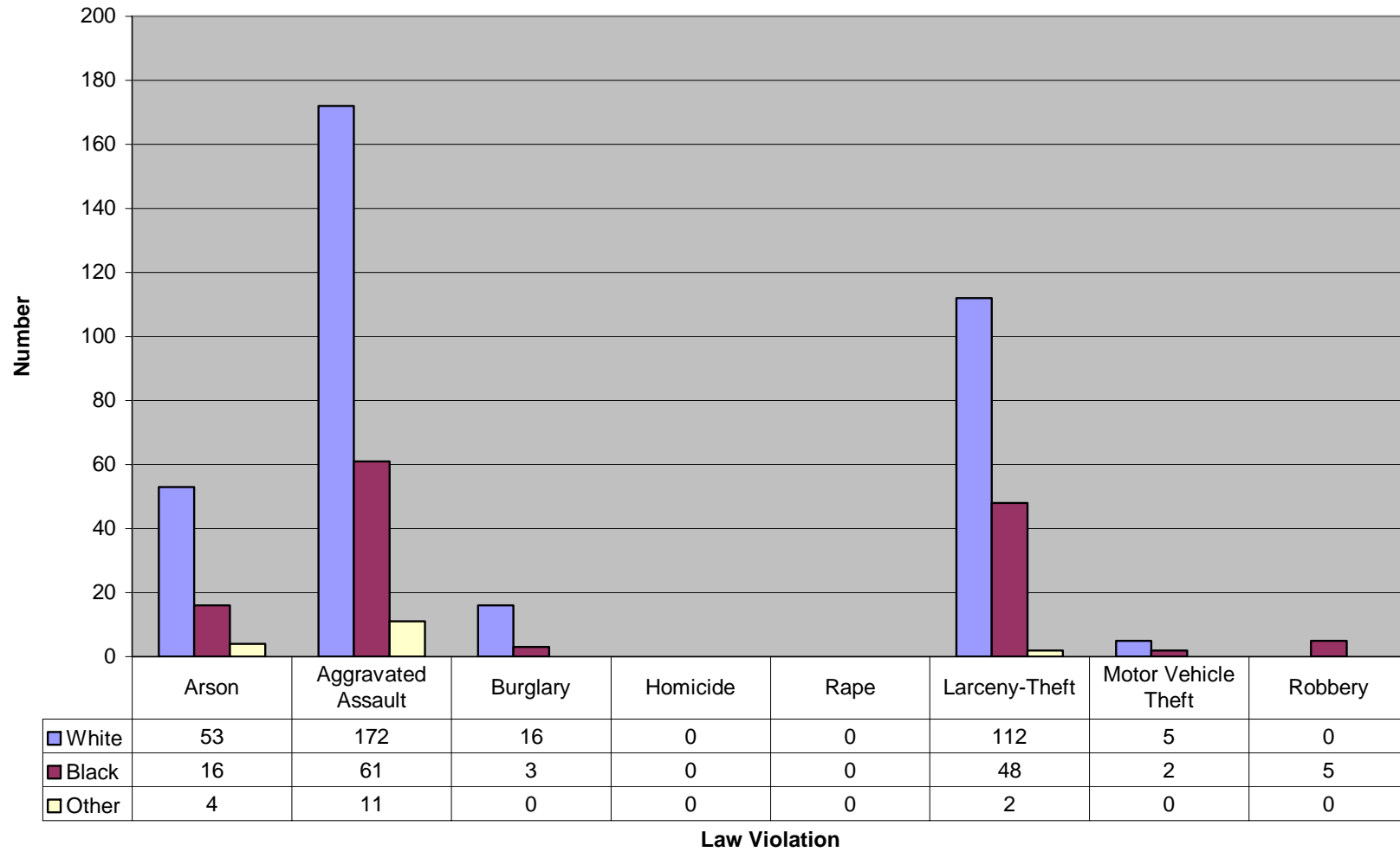

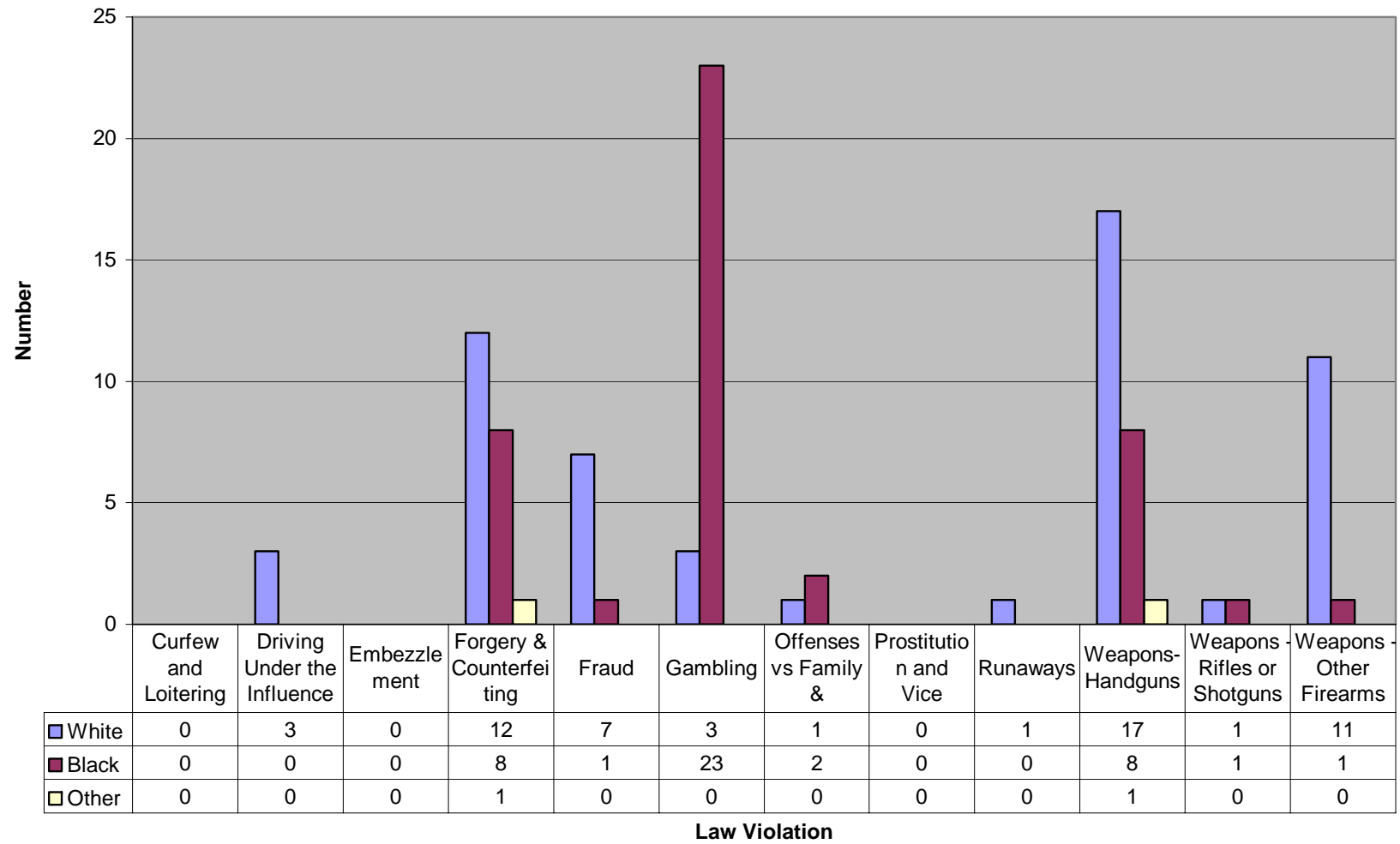




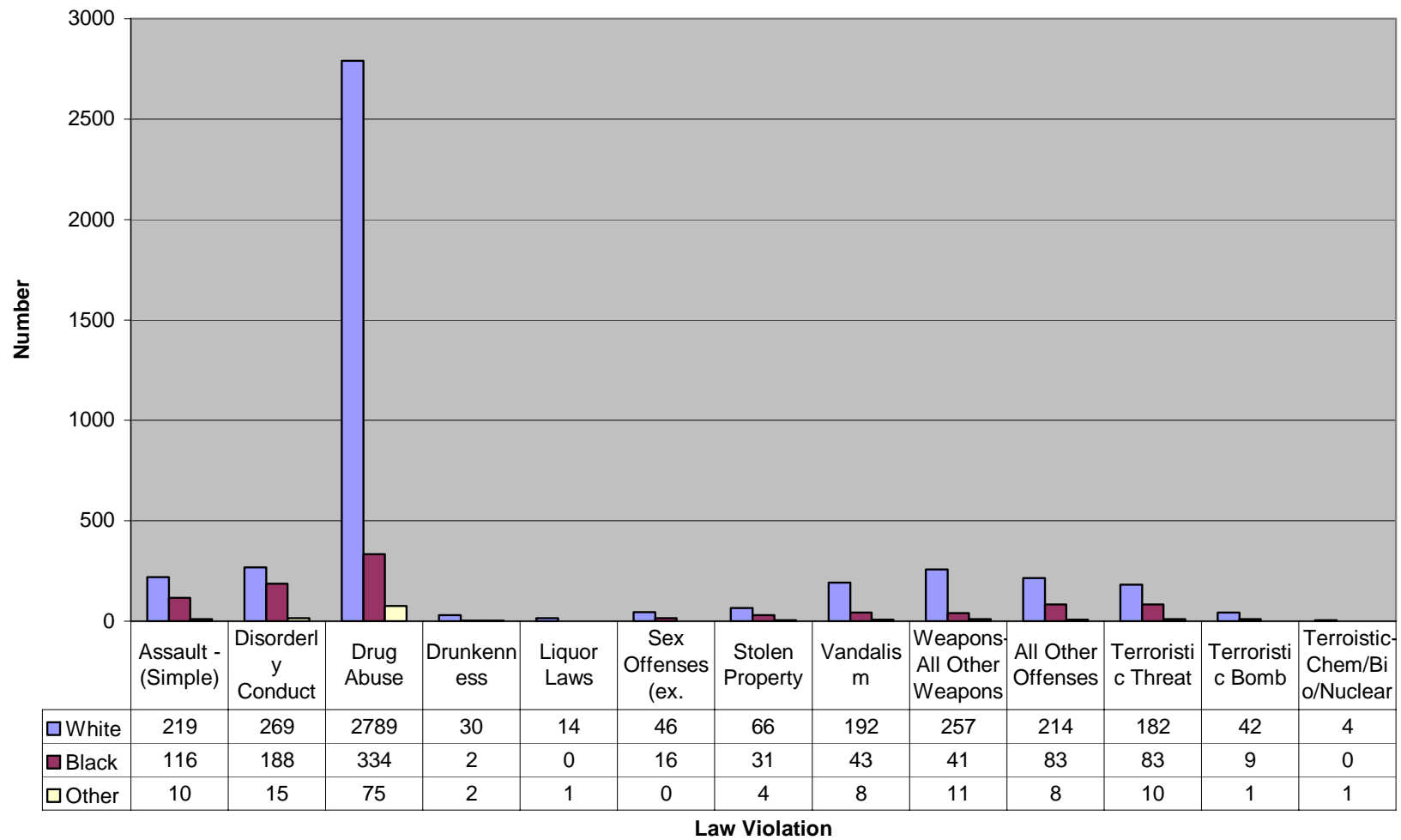
### Disciplinary Actions for Part I Law Violations by Race 2003-2004

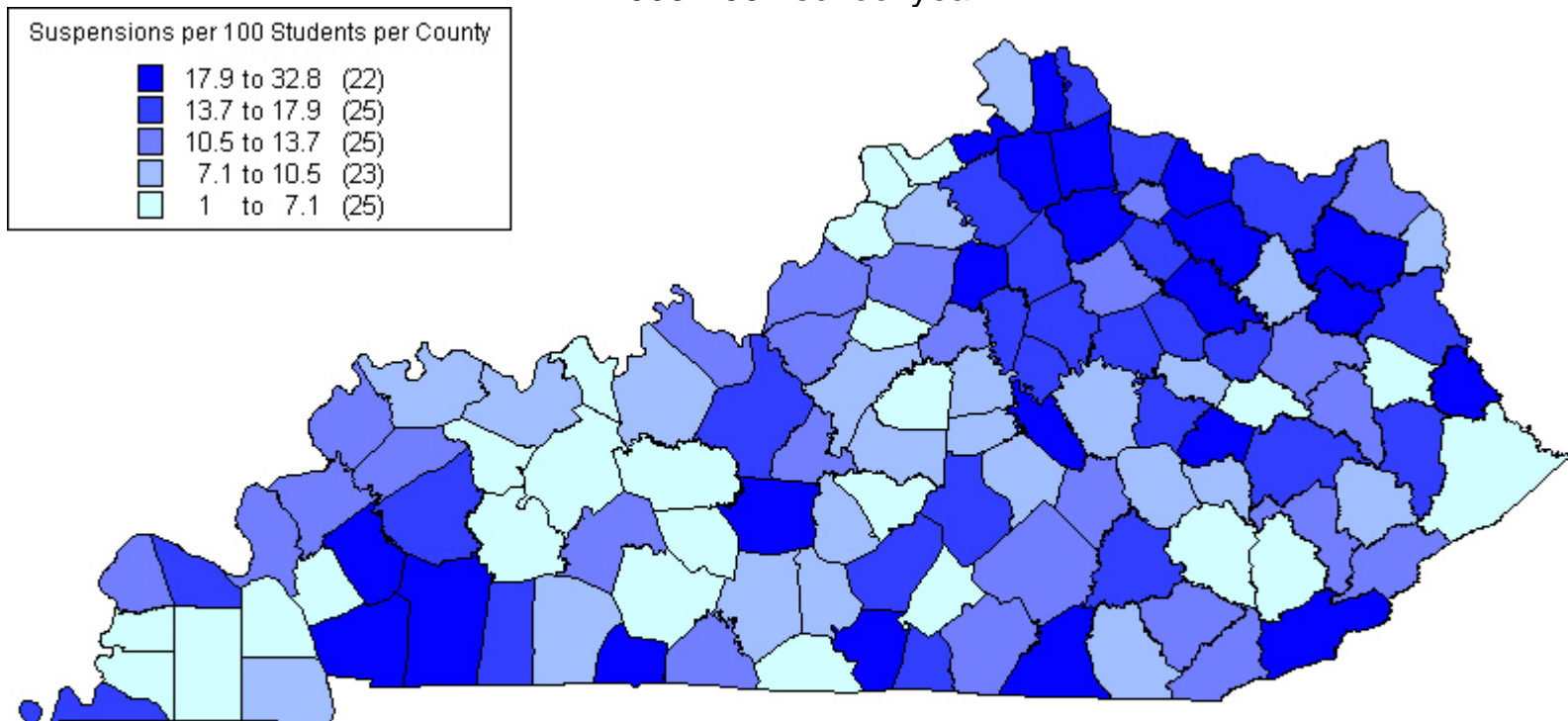

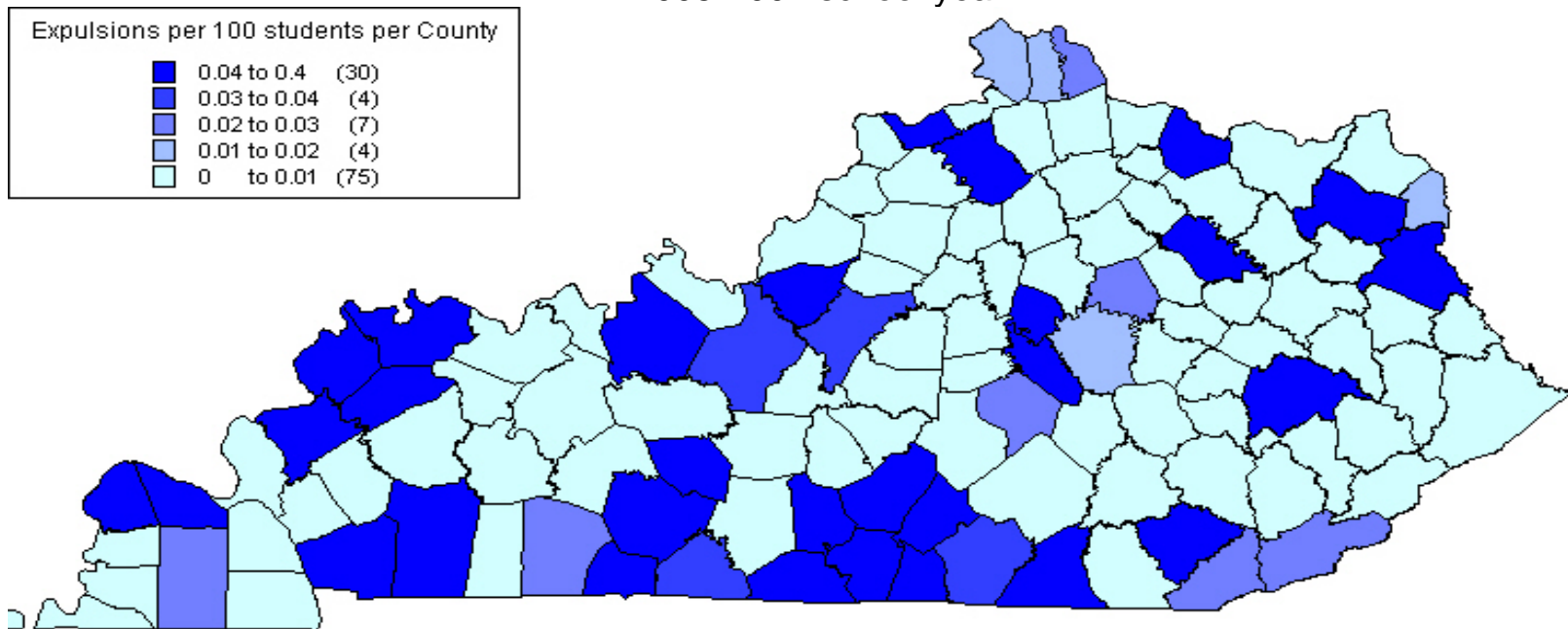
## Suspensions for Violations of School Board Rule Rates per 100 Students

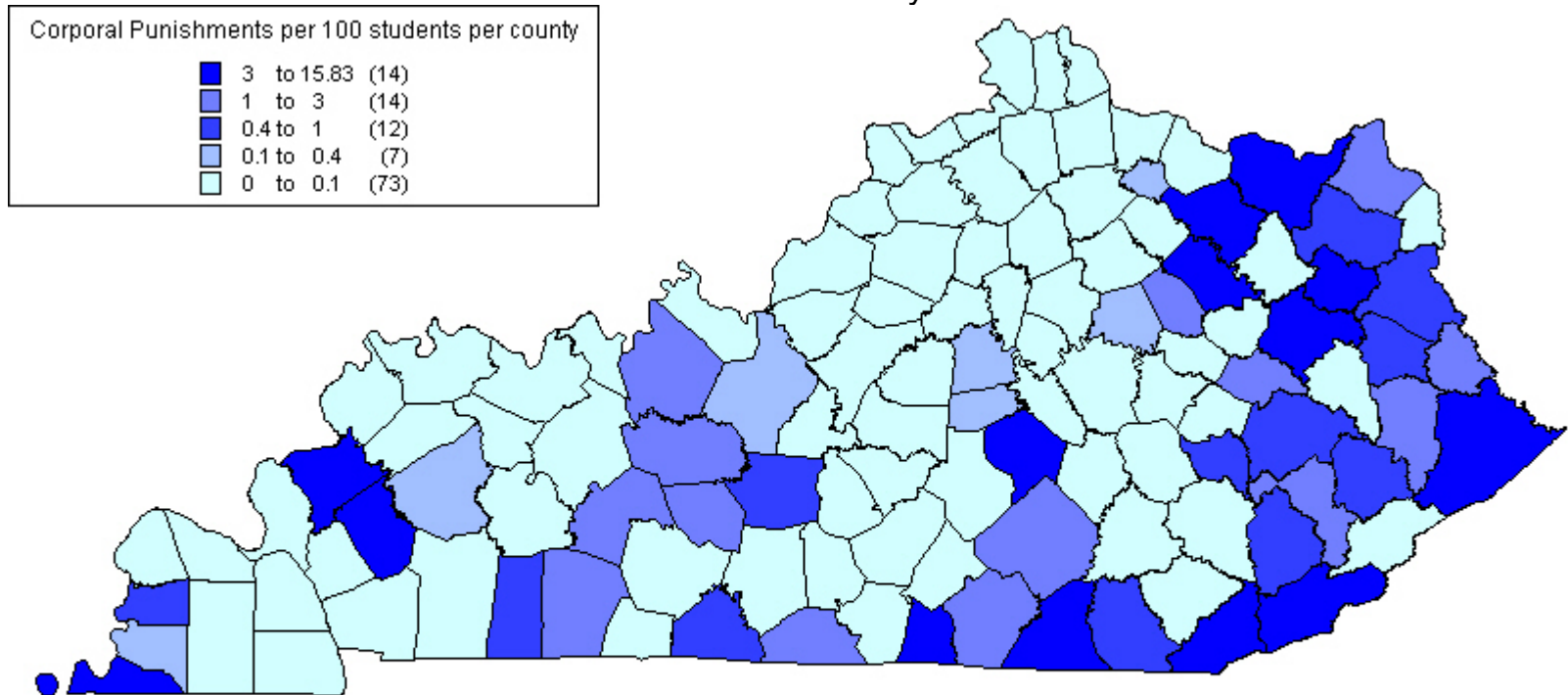

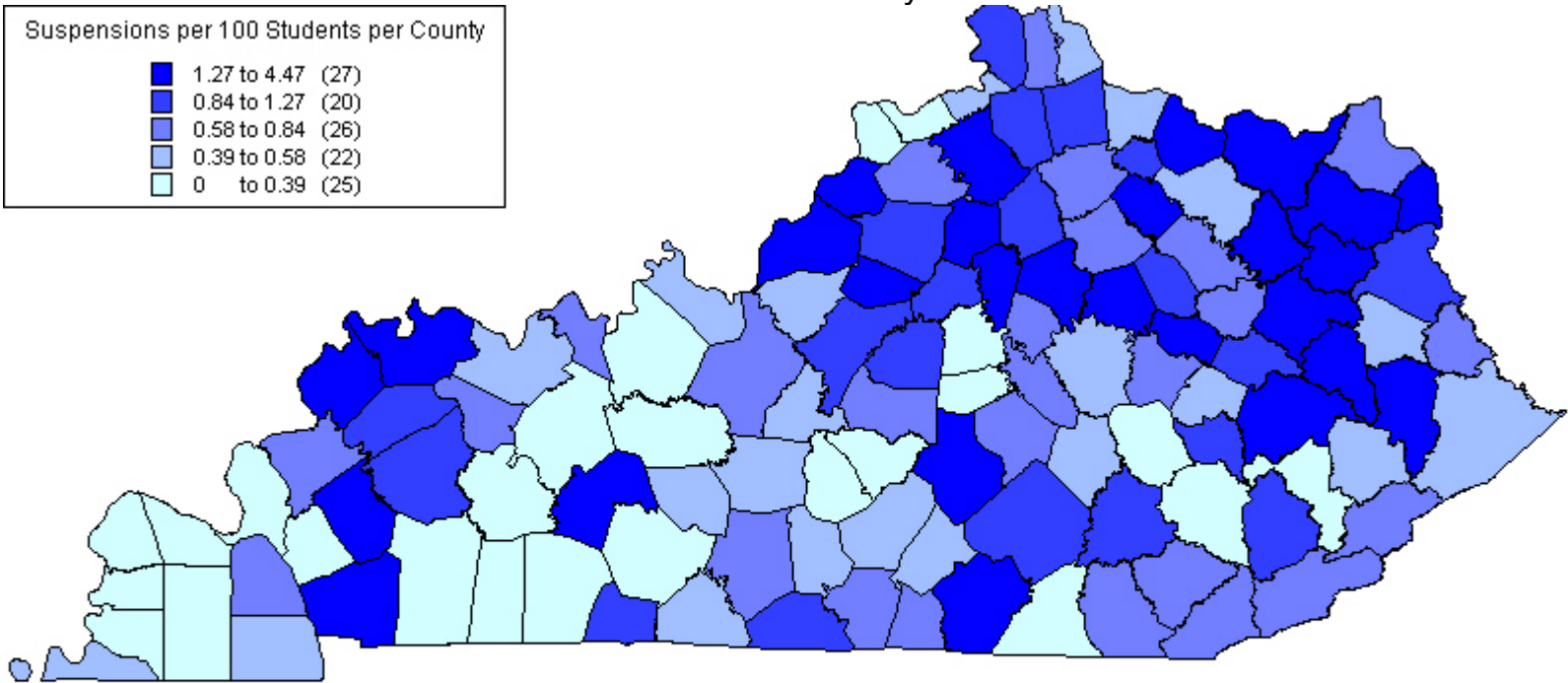
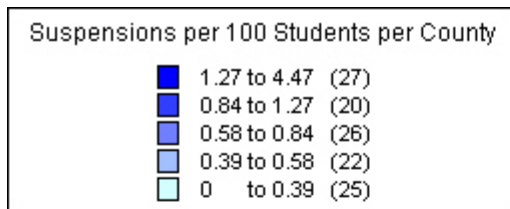


**Corporal Punishments for Violations of School Board Rule Rates per 100 Students**

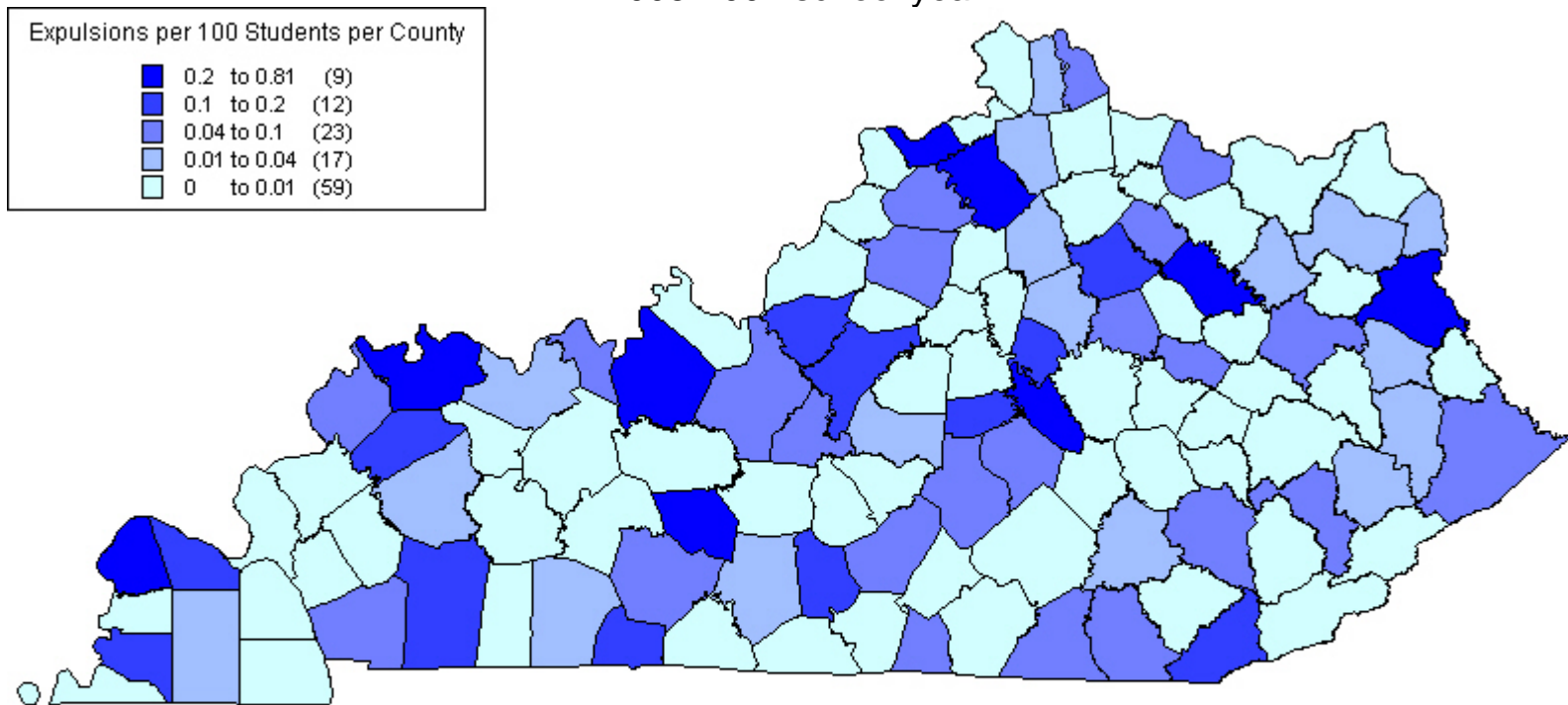

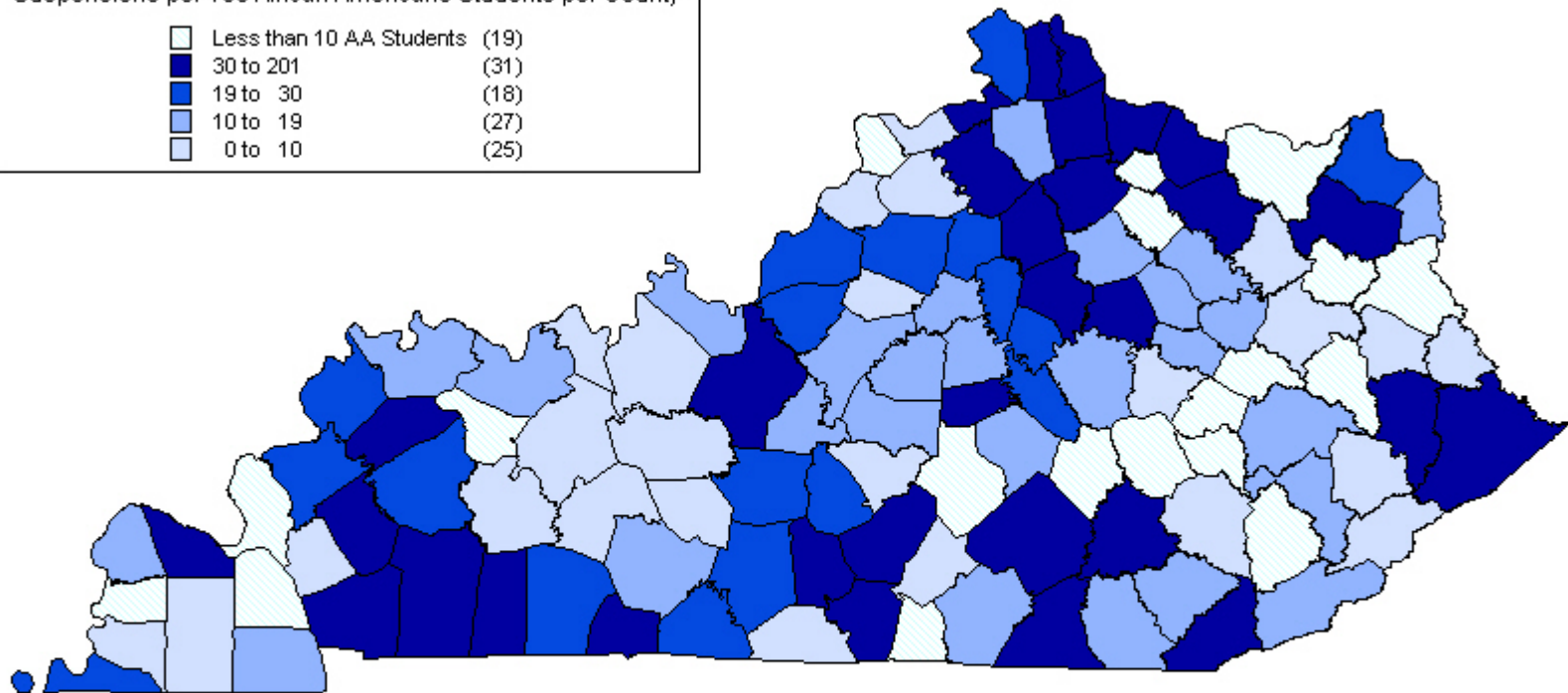
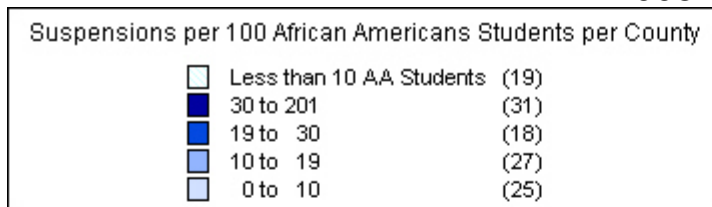
## Expulsions (with and without services) for Law Violations Rates per 100 Students

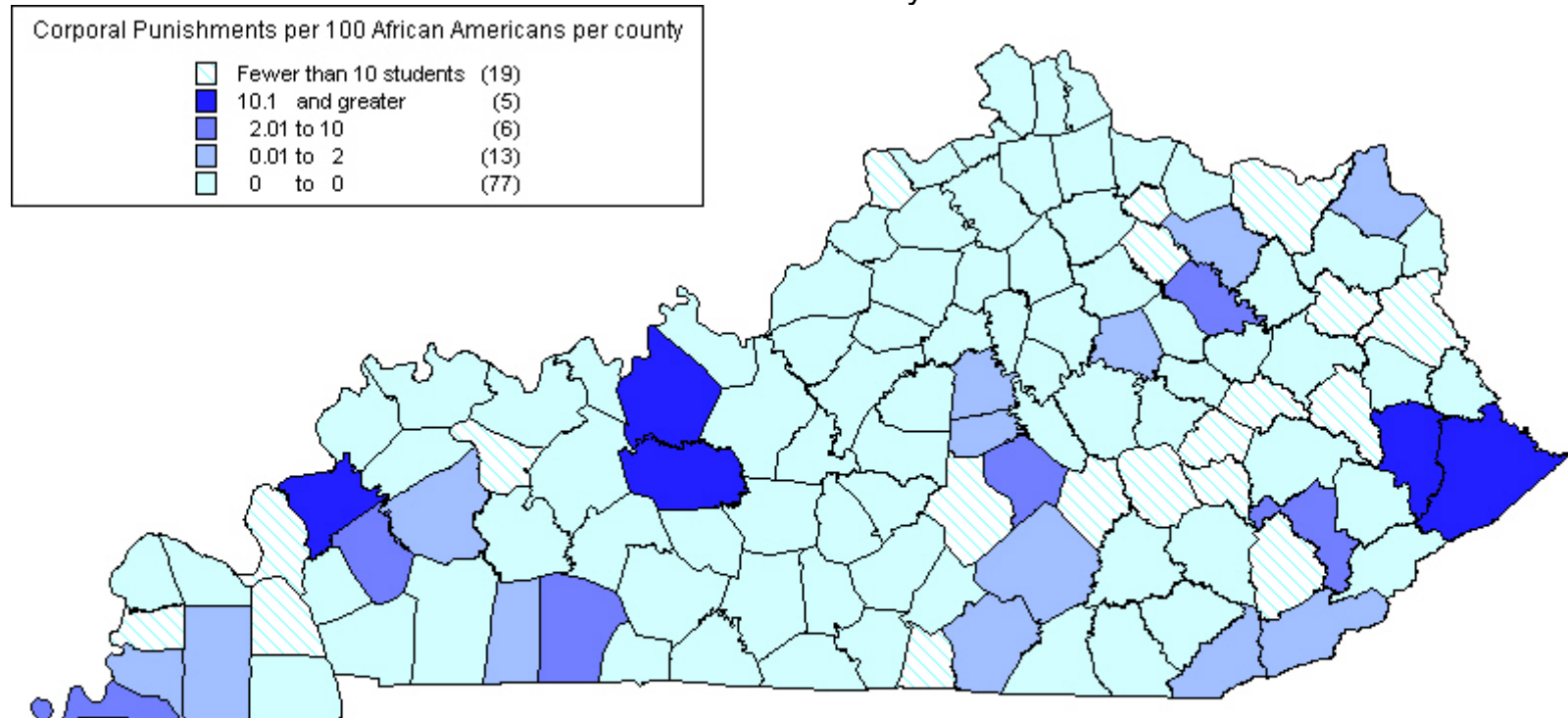
## Suspensions of African-American Students for Board Violations Rates per 100 Students

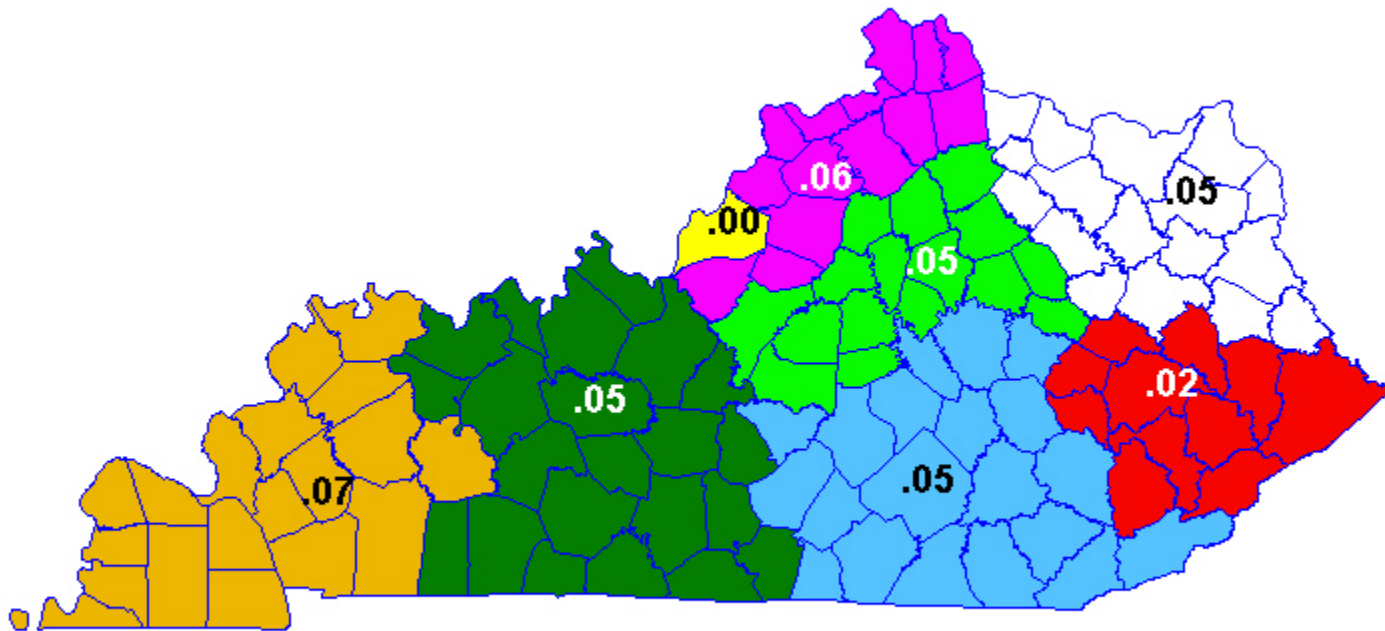
## African-American Corporal Punishment for Board Violation Rates per 100 Students

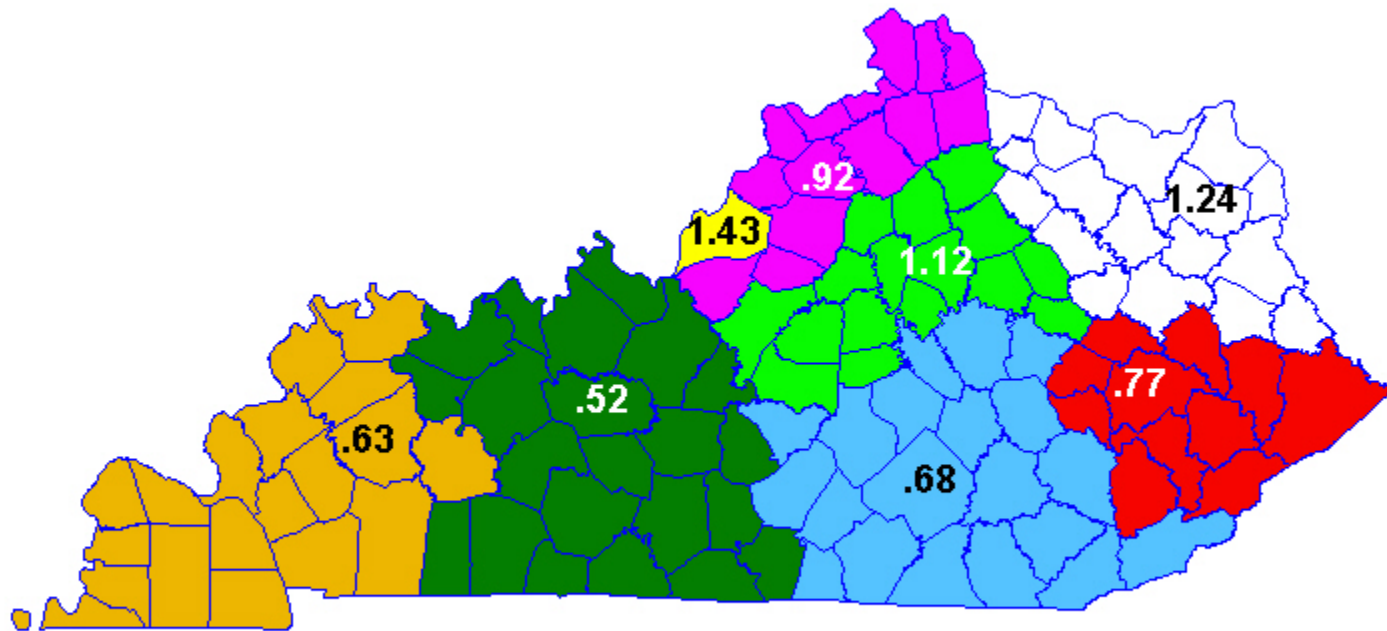

2003-2004 School year**



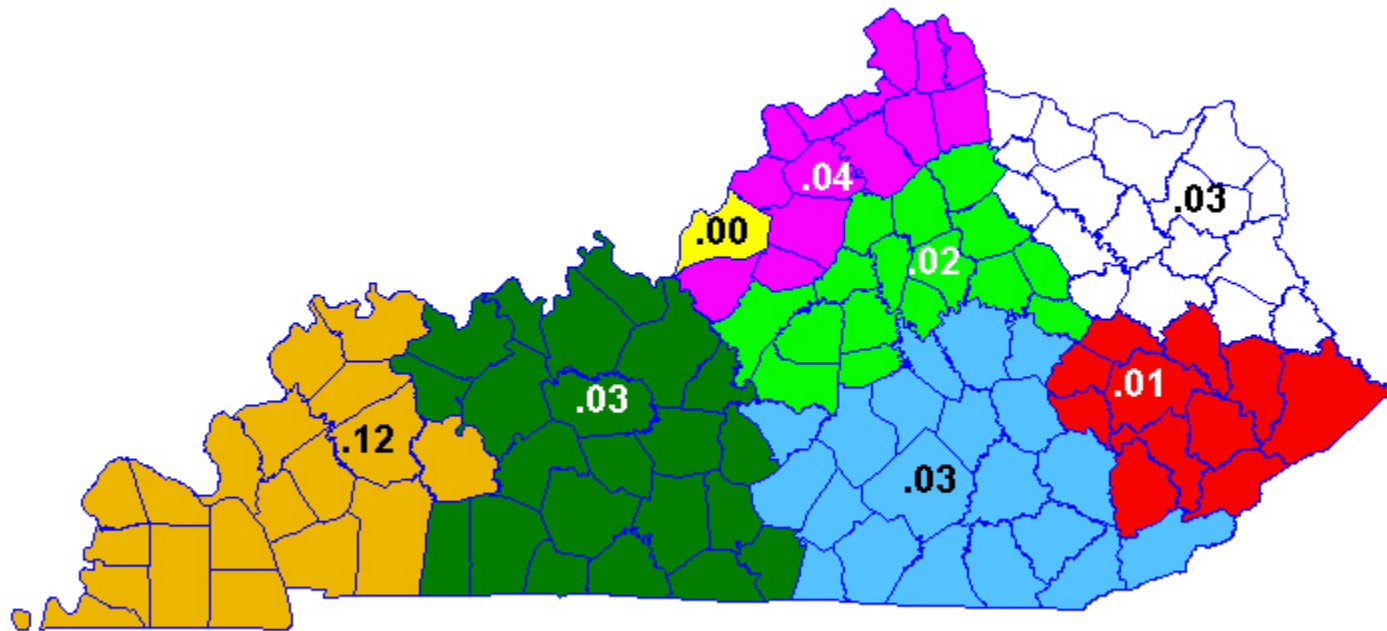

2003-2004 School year**



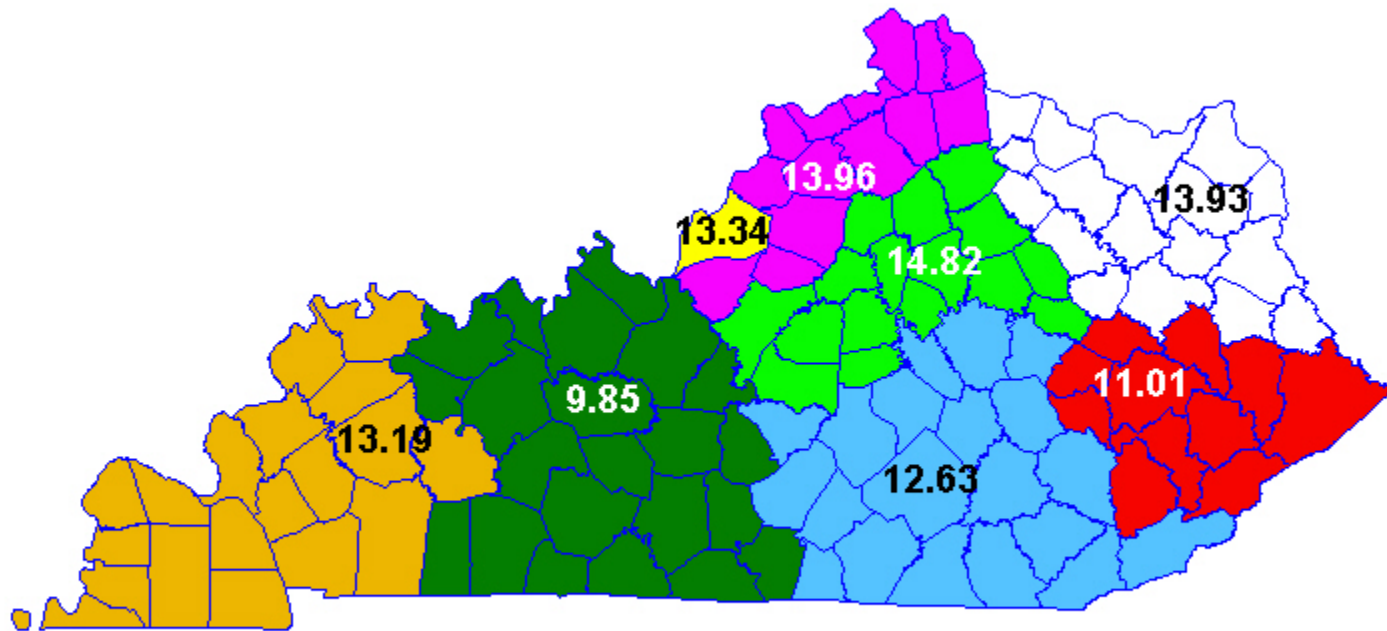

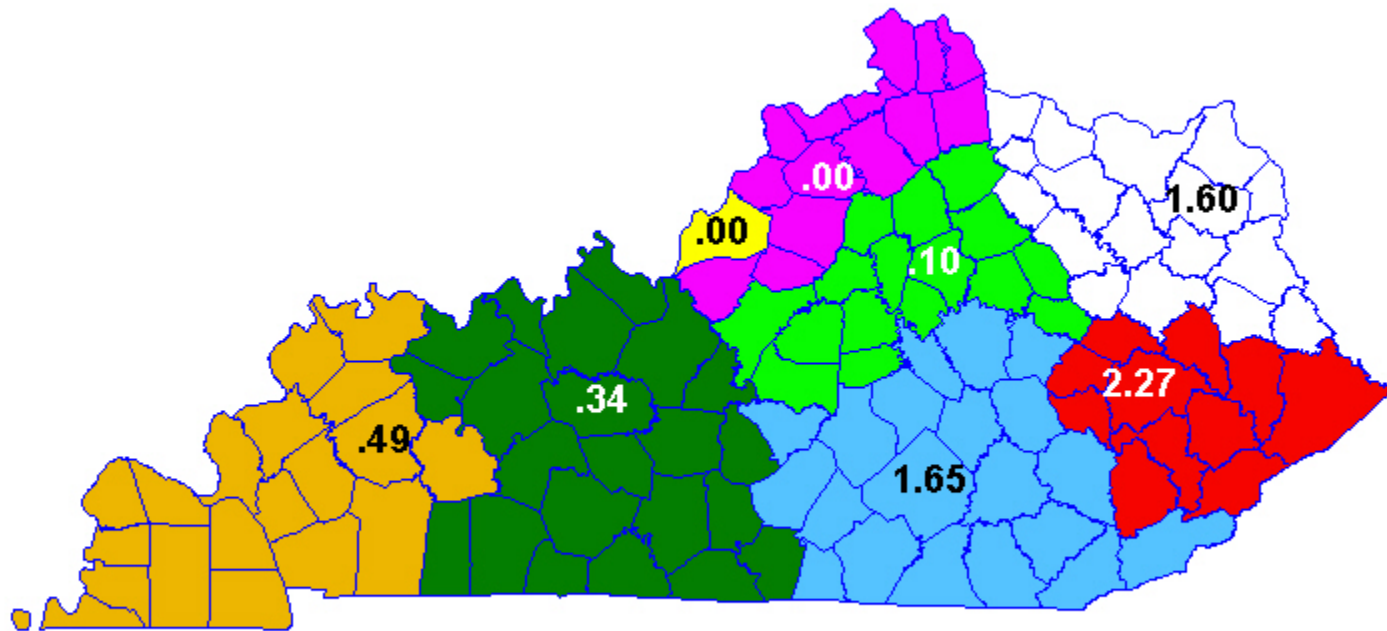
**Suspensions for Board Violations:

2003-2004 School year**



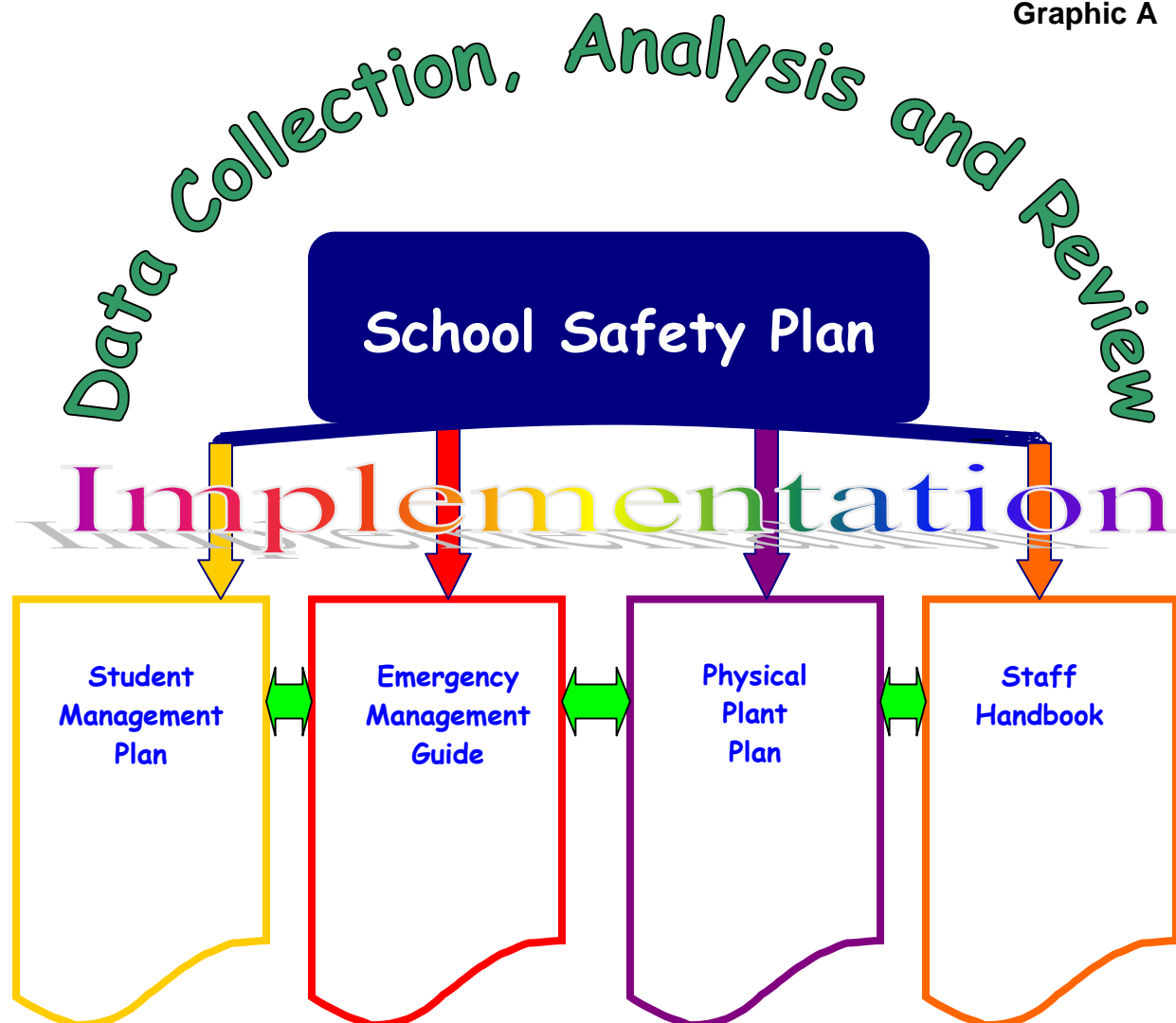

# APPENDIX F

The passage of HB330 in 1998 not only created the Kentucky Center for School Safety, but also required all Kentucky public schools to create a school safety plan. Additionally, schools were mandated to report all discipline data to the Kentucky Department of Education. While the bill does not specifically link these two activities, a school safety plan cannot be considered comprehensive unless there is a direct link between the data collection and the planning processes.

Let's consider what is essential in a comprehensive school safety plan. Graphic A illustrates that four components are necessary for a school safety plan to be considered comprehensive, i.e., Student Management Plan, Emergency Management Plan, Physical Plant Plan and Staff Handbook. However, the over-arching representation of data symbolizes the necessity for data to be collected, analyzed and reviewed at each step of the planning process.

## **DATA COLLECTION, ANALYSIS AND REVIEW**

First and foremost, a school safety plan must begin with the collection of data. A school should begin the development of a school safety plan with the collection and/or consolidation of several types of data. A school should use the data collected for this report as a starting point. Data regarding suspension, expulsion and corporal punishment, as well as other discipline responses that occurred as a result of an office discipline referral should be compiled. Next, a format similar to the one below should be used to analyze the data:

1. Collect other forms of data, i.e., observational and student, staff and parent surveys, and combine with discipline data.
2. Sort the data by location, month, time, gender, ethnicity and type. Depict the data graphically or pictorially.
3. Analyze the data by posing several questions:
  - 3.1. What are the most frequent infractions?
  - 3.2. Where and when are they occurring?
  - 3.3. What are your least frequent infractions?
  - 3.4. Where and when are they occurring?
  - 3.5. Who are your most frequent offenders?
  - 3.6. Is there a common denominator among repeat offenders, type of infraction occurring most frequently, and location and time of most infractions?
4. Sort the data into four categories for possible changes: Structural, Organizational, Instructional and Rules and Policies.

***The goal with the data collection and analysis is to produce information that drives planning and decision-making.***

**Student Management Plan:** Every school should clearly articulate the rules and expectations for positive student behavior. Frequently schools call this a Discipline Plan or Code of Conduct; however, rather than a list of “Thou Shall Nots”, the plan should clearly specify expectations for student behavior that will result in student success. An approach to developing the Student Management Plan is to:

1. Use the school data to direct the development of a pro-active student management plan that acts as a guide for positive student behavior and sets the stage for student success.
2. Include the school’s mission and a philosophy of behavior management that treats students with respect and dignity while placing the responsibility for behavior squarely on the shoulders of the student.
3. Address misbehavior in the plan. Rather than give a finite listing of infractions with a corresponding consequence, construct a menu of disciplinary consequences for misbehavior. This will provide staff the opportunity to consider the degree and frequency of the misbehavior before choosing an appropriate consequence.

**Emergency Management Guide:** In a natural or man-made disaster, events occur that necessitate the coordination and delivery of crisis intervention and response services. Consequently, schools must be prepared with a plan of action, which is really a set of plans rather than one overall plan. For every possible emergency situation, a school should have a plan that addresses readiness, response and recovery and identifies the responsibilities of each staff for each stage. For example, responding to a fire in a school is very different than responding to a tornado; therefore, a plan for each is necessary. Practice drills are necessary to ensure that staff and students know how to respond to emergency situations. Check the KCSS website, [www.kysafeschools.org](http://www.kysafeschools.org), and the United States Department of Education's Office of Safe and Drug-Free Schools website, [www.ed.gov/admins/lead/safety/emergencyplan/index.html](http://www.ed.gov/admins/lead/safety/emergencyplan/index.html) for additional information in developing emergency management and crisis procedures.

**Physical Plant Plan:** Creating a safe and healthy learning environment necessitates maintaining an appropriate physical setting. The plan should require that a complete safety inspection of the building and grounds be conducted annually. Additionally, requisite monthly safety checks should be implemented as mitigating unsafe conditions may arise in short periods of time. All staff members should be made aware of the process for reporting potentially unsafe conditions to the principal for a timely response to remedy the unsafe conditions.

**Staff Handbook:** A staff handbook is a vital tool for not only the new teacher, but the seasoned teacher as well. A staff handbook should include everything a teacher needs to know about school rules, routines and procedures. While the rules, routines and procedures are preventive in nature, a major portion of the handbook should address positive student management and extend the student discipline plan to include staff instructional responsibilities. For example, during student arrival, the handbook will clearly identify staff responsibilities for supervision while different responsibilities may be identified for dismissal. Additionally, the handbook should outline a plan for instructing students regarding the student management and emergency management plans.

**Data should always be reviewed in context. For example, a school experiencing a suspension increase could be experiencing any or all of the following:**

- (1) a rising level of student misbehavior and school disorder**
- (2) an administrative accentuation on commission of offenses**
- (3) a building with physical plant or staffing problems**

**The context should drive the intervention plan.**
