Kentucky 2006: Safe Schools Data Project



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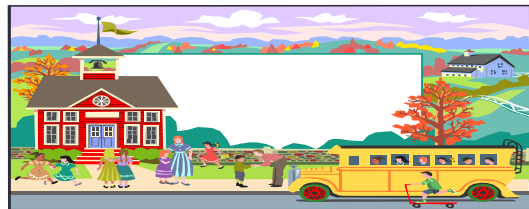


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Executive Summary

This is the seventh annual report produced by the Kentucky Center for School Safety and is cause for great celebration. Most importantly, a trend in law violations has emerged showing a five-year decline in:

- Total disciplinary actions for *Part I* offenses,
- Total disciplinary actions for *Part II* offenses,
- Disciplinary actions for the most serious offenses of aggravated assault, arson, larceny/theft and burglary, and
- Out-of-school suspensions.

Additionally, no reported criminal homicides or forcible rapes were reported for the same five-year period.

Furthermore, encouraging developments can be seen in:

- The 28.05% decrease in drug abuse incidents from the 2003-2004 peak in these incidents,
- A 3.03% decrease in suspensions for board policy violations from last year's total, and a 6.11% decrease from the 2003-2004 peak in these incidents; and
- A 4.6% decrease from last year in the number of days students were suspended from school and a 7.3% decrease from the 2003-2004 peak.
- A 7.3% decrease from the 2003-2004 peak in the total number of days missed by students for suspensions.

Due to enhanced data collection procedures, this year's report again provided information on board and law violations with regard to grade level, school type, socio-economic indicators, and drug use and distribution. This additional information offers a richer data base and affords advanced exploration of the complexities of student behavior.

These enhanced data collection procedures allowed us to identify distinct disciplinary action patterns by grade level board and law violations. These data reveal that disciplinary actions for both law and board violations increase dramatically between 5th and 6th grades and 8th and 9th grades. This pattern has held true for two years and supports a variety of anecdotal evidence that suggests these transition years are particularly difficult years and that transition may lead to these increases in disciplinary actions.

Maintaining and improving the safety of the Kentucky's students is the driving force behind the Kentucky Center for School Safety. However, for parents, for educators, and for community members, children must be our first priority. Consequently, the safety of Kentucky's school children is a shared responsibility. Let each of us make this responsibility a sacred trust with our future.

School safety is everyone's concern. Students perform at higher levels when they feel safe at school. Parents want schools to provide a secure place to send their children to learn. Educators want to facilitate learning by providing a safe and civil environment. Businesses want schools to be safe to attract good workers to the community. Government and social agencies want schools to be safe to reinforce the safety and security of the community.

School safety, however, is not only a concern for everyone in the community; it is also everyone's responsibility.

To this end, the Kentucky Center for School Safety (KCSS) provides this report of demographic data regarding disciplinary actions involving students in Kentucky's public schools. Every public school and school district in Kentucky contributed data to this report; ideally, schools, districts, and communities will use this information to maintain and improve the safety for all of Kentucky's school children.

I N T R O D U C T I O N

The purpose of this report is to provide schools with state, regional and district data for comparisons. In previous years, the “Using this Report” section has outlined basic data analysis and how to utilize the report in a comprehensive school safety plan. Refer to Appendix F for the full section in previous years.

Section I Using this Report

Although there were several changes with the data collection system for the 2004-2005 school year the data collection process for 2005-2006 remained unchanged from the previous year. This stability represents an indication of the confidence that we now have in the reliability of the data collection process. Consequently, a data base that is now more robust and reliable than previous years has provided additional information that was unavailable at the state level prior to 2004-2005. Given the confidence that we have in the reliability of the data, we present five-year trend data for the first time in this report. Given the additional data points now available, we feel that trends will be more easily recognizable and thus identifiable. As such, we feel this improvement will provide more helpful data for the users of this report.

While the additions have enriched the database for this reporting period and improved the usefulness of this report, the full impact of the data collection process could be further improved with the following changes recommended in each of the previous years' report:

- a. **Inclusion of a *special education* classification to disciplinary action distinctions.** Currently, gender, ethnicity, grade, and lunch status are identified for each disciplinary action. The only special education identification, however, is for students in self-contained special education classes. Since this represents only a small percentage of special education students, no comparisons can currently be made between regular and special education students.
- b. **Connecting each disciplinary action to a particular student through a unique identifier.** The discipline data are reported by infraction and disciplinary action. Although individual-level data (gender, ethnicity, grade, lunch type, special education classification, limited English proficiency, mobility, etc.) are available at the school level, we currently do not have access to that information which makes it impossible for us to match disciplinary actions with individuals. If we had that capability, data analysis could be more thorough and detailed. For example, examination of offender recidivism is currently not possible. This connection could assist schools in evaluating programs targeted to repeat offenders.

KCSS is committed to working with schools, districts and the Kentucky Department of Education to enhance the quality of the data report. Through a continuous process of review, assessment and modification, this report will continue to provide richer data to schools and districts in order that more effective interventions can be planned and implemented.

Data should always be reviewed in context. For example, a school with an increase in suspensions could be experiencing any or all of the following:

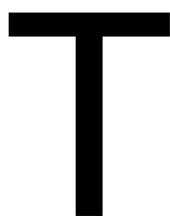
- 1. a rising level of student misbehavior and school disorder;**
- 2. an administrative emphasis on commission of offenses; or**
- 3. a building with physical plant or staffing problems.**

Conversely, a school with a decrease in suspensions could be experiencing any of the following:

- 1. a decrease in the level of student misbehavior and school disorder;**
- 2. a change in automatic suspension requirement for certain school offenses; or**
- 3. the assignment of additional personnel to the school.**

The context should drive the intervention plan.

We encourage school administrators to use the data presented in conjunction with their own school-level STI data to enhance their respective school safety plans. Helpful guidance in this area is included in Appendix F- Using the 2005-2006 Report.



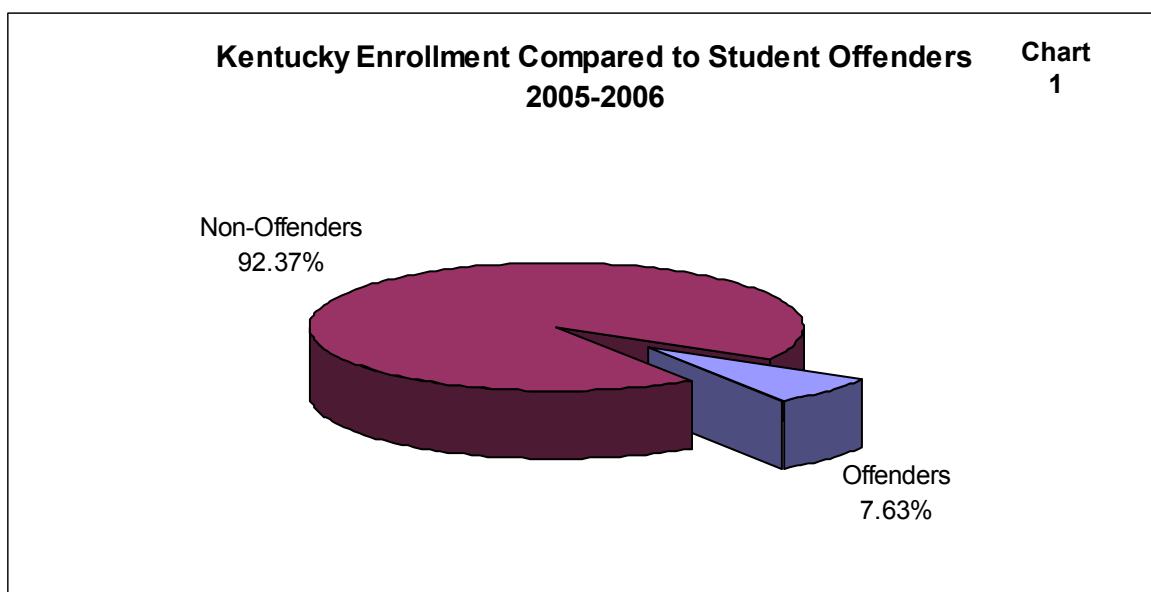
he Safe Schools Data Project collects data from all Kentucky public schools regarding the commission of law and school board violations that result in one of four

disciplinary actions:

- Suspension
- Corporal punishment
- Expulsion with services, and
- Expulsion without services.

Section II State Level Data

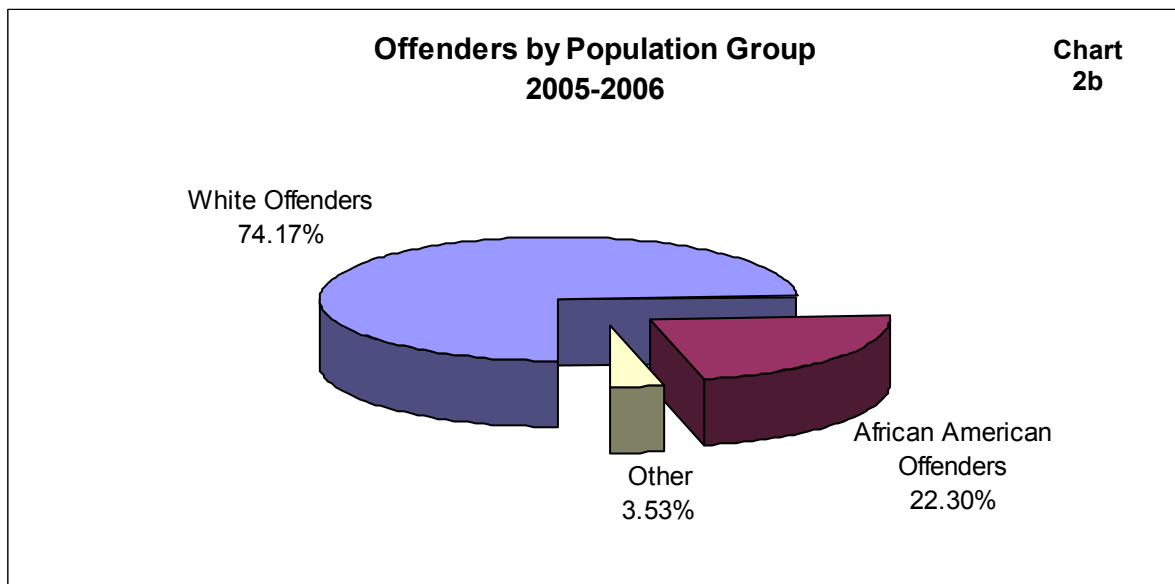
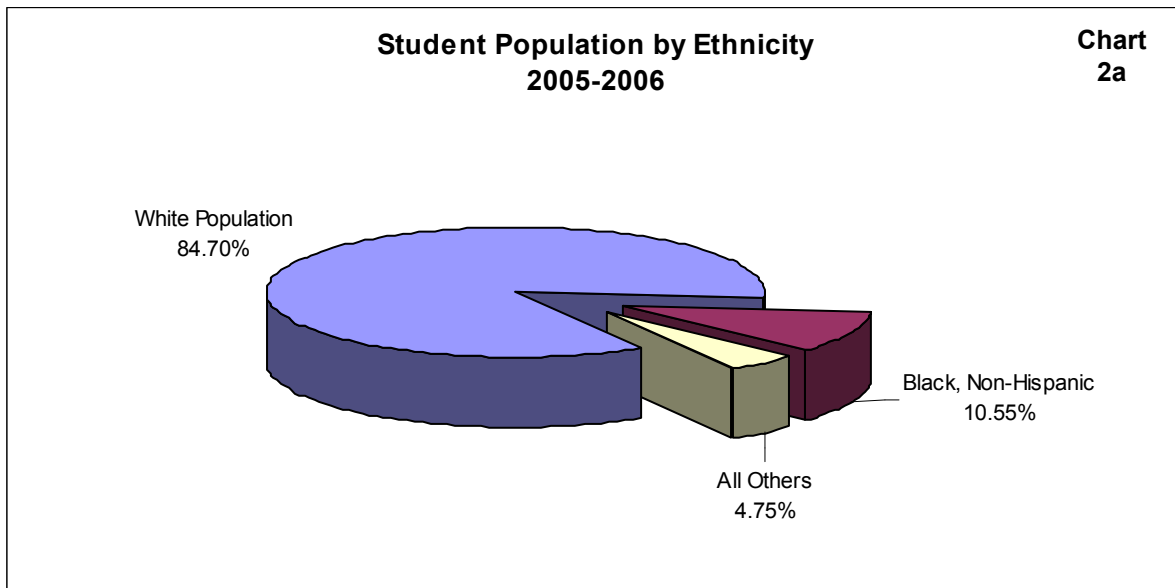
Kentucky's total public school population for 2005-2006 was 633,241 students. Of that total, only 48,345 students (7.63%) committed an offense that resulted in a suspension, corporal punishment, or an expulsion (with or without services). Lesser disciplinary responses, (e.g., parent conferences, detentions, in-school suspensions) are not reported to the Kentucky Department of Education and are not reflected in this report. In reviewing the upcoming data regarding commission of board and law violations, it is very important to keep in mind that 92.37% of Kentucky's students were **not** offenders and are not represented in the data as illustrated in **Chart 1**.



The term “offender” as used in Charts 1, 2a and 2b refers to an individual student involved in committing at least one incident of prohibited behavior as contained in this report. An offender, however, may commit multiple offenses.

Chart 2a illustrates Kentucky students by ethnicity while **Chart 2b** shows the percentage of offenders by population group. Although White students comprise 84.70% of the total student population, the percentage of white students in the offender group is only 74.17%. On the other hand, Black, non-Hispanic students make up just 10.55% of the total student population, but account for 22.30% of the student offenders.

Other ethnic groups represent 4.75% in the total student population and 3.53% of the offender group. The disproportionate representation of Black students in the offender group is consistent with previous Safe Schools Data reports and suggests the need for further study into reversing this trend.



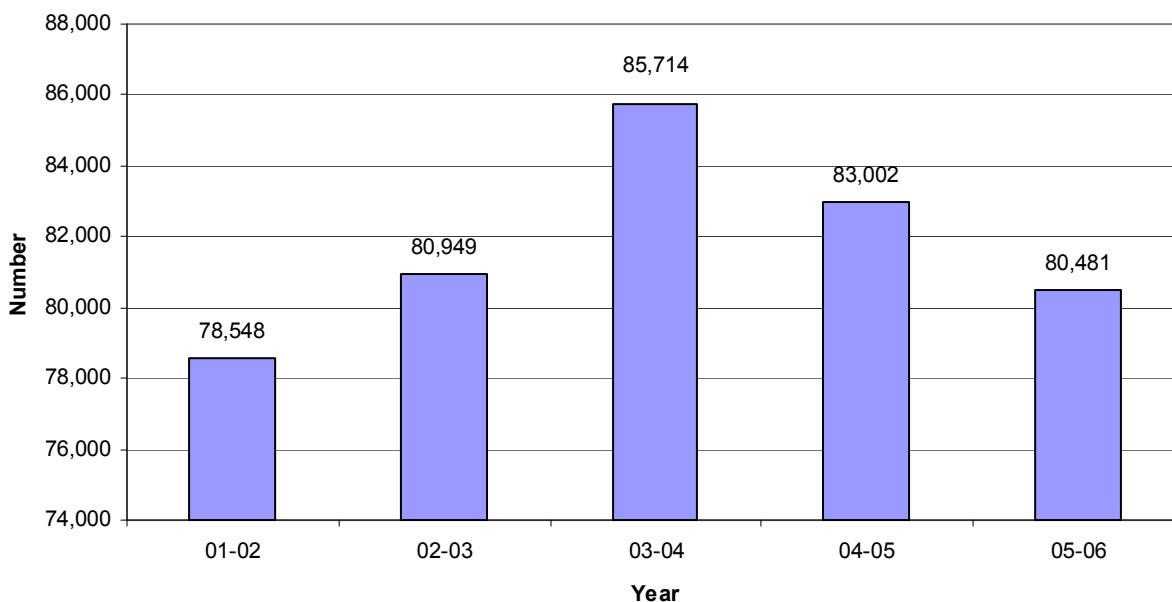
** The enrollment numbers used throughout this report were obtained from the Kentucky Department of Education's Superintendent's Annual Attendance Ethnic Membership Report. These figures best reflect the districts' most stable enrollments.*

Disciplinary Actions for Violations of Board Policy In Kentucky Schools

Chart 3 provides the total number of disciplinary actions for ten categories of school board policy violations for the past five years. The number of disciplinary actions for the 2005-2006 school year decreased 3.03%, or 2,521 actions from 2004-2005 totals, and 6.11%, or 5,233 actions from the 2003-2004 total. This decline is encouraging, as it appears that after a three-year climb in board violations from 2001-2002 to 2003-2004, a trend of declining board violations is now emerging.

Chart 4 depicts a categorical breakdown of disciplinary actions for board policy violations. The categories showing the biggest change from 2004-2005 were Defiance of Authority (with a 98.22% increase) and failure to attend detention and the “other”

category (25.36% decrease and 25.17% decrease, respectively). **In reviewing these results, bear in mind that the general “Defiance of Authority” category was removed from the 2004-2005 data recording, then reinstated for 2005-2006.** This probably played an important role in the dramatic increase in defiance of authority for 2005-2006, as well as the decrease in both Disturbing Class (16.30% decrease) and the “other” category discussed above. Because administrators must “force fit” all reportable violations into these ten categories, definitions of Defiance of Authority, Disturbing Class and Other are very broad and are often used interchangeably. With the exception of defiance of authority, disciplinary actions for all other categories decreased from 2004-2005 levels, including Fighting (2.92%), Inappropriate Sexual Behavior (15.65%), Profanity or Vulgarity (3.37%), Threat and Intimidation (5.78%), Tobacco violations (11.50%), and Dangerous Instruments- Carrying or Using (4.80%). The decrease in board violations across all categories (except defiance of authority) is an especially encouraging feature of the data.

For the first time, the charts presented in this report contain five years of data. As such, we are able to examine a longer period of time and thus more accurately identify any trend that has emerged. An analysis of these trends suggests that disciplinary actions for Failure to Attend Detention, Inappropriate Sexual Behavior, and Tobacco have decreased significantly over the five-year period (36.02%, 31.59%, and 15.80%) while Fighting, Profanity or Vulgarity, Threat and Intimidation, and Dangerous Instruments have remained relatively stable over the five-year period. A trend in disciplinary actions for Defiance of Authority and Disturbing Class has not yet emerged, although the number of disciplinary actions for Defiance of Authority in 2005-2006 is 52.27% lower than 2001-2002 numbers while the number of disciplinary actions for Disturbing Class is almost three times higher in 2005-2006 than 2001-2002 numbers.

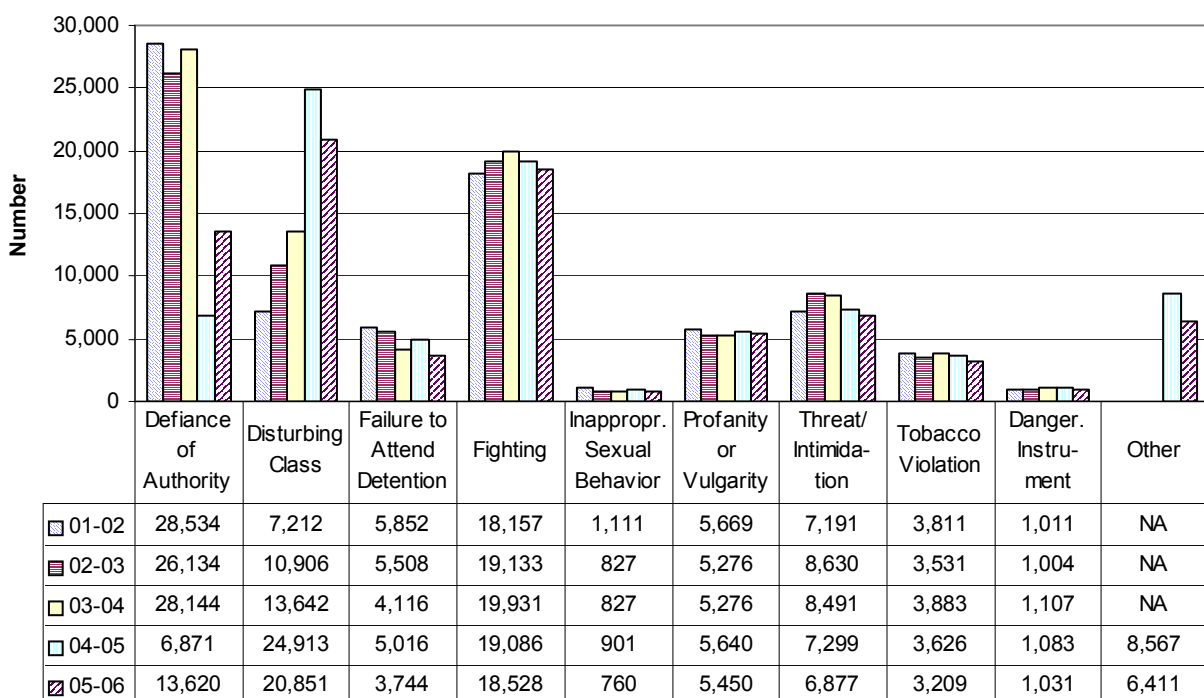
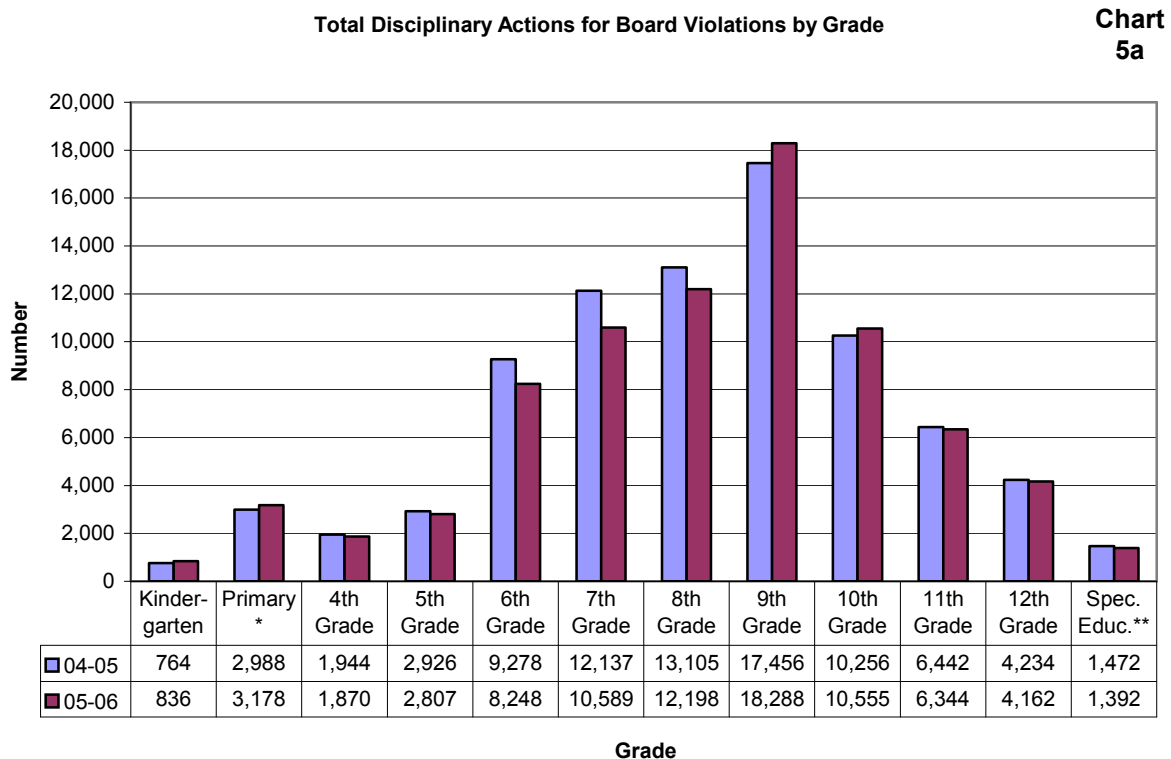


Chart 5a shows the distribution of board violations across grade levels. Because we were unable to collect grade-level data prior to 2004-2005, only two years of data are presented. The chart clearly illustrates the increasing number of disciplinary actions from Kindergarten through 9th grade with a concurrent decreasing number of actions from 10th grade through 12th grade in both 2004-2005 and 2005-2006. In 6th grade, which typically marks the transition from elementary to middle school, the number of disciplinary actions is approximately three times the number for 5th graders in both years. Another large increase (33.20% in 2004-2005 and 49.93% in 2005-2006) is noted at 9th grade, the typical transition year from middle to high school.



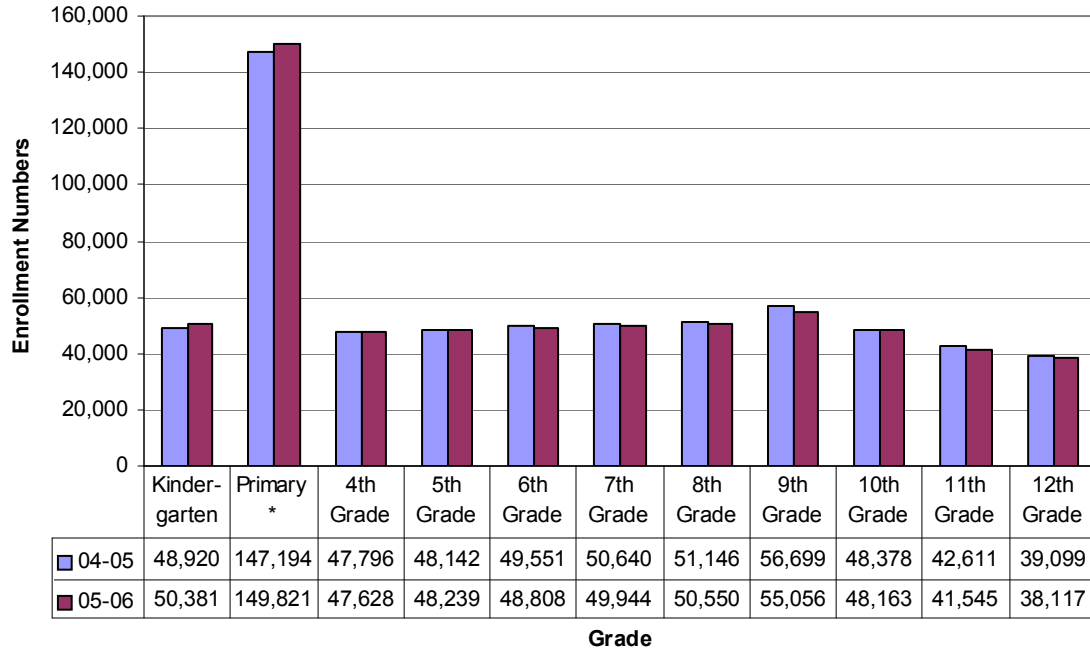

Chart 5b depicts the enrollment for grades 4-12 while **Chart 5c** shows the rate of violations per 100 for grades 4-12 for both 2004-2005 and 2005-2006. Part of the decrease in disciplinary actions from 10th through 12th grades is due to the declining population at each grade level; however, since the population of 6th through 9th grades remained relatively constant, the large increases during these grades are very troubling and suggest the need for more research into intervention strategies that will curtail this trend.

Total Enrollment by Grade

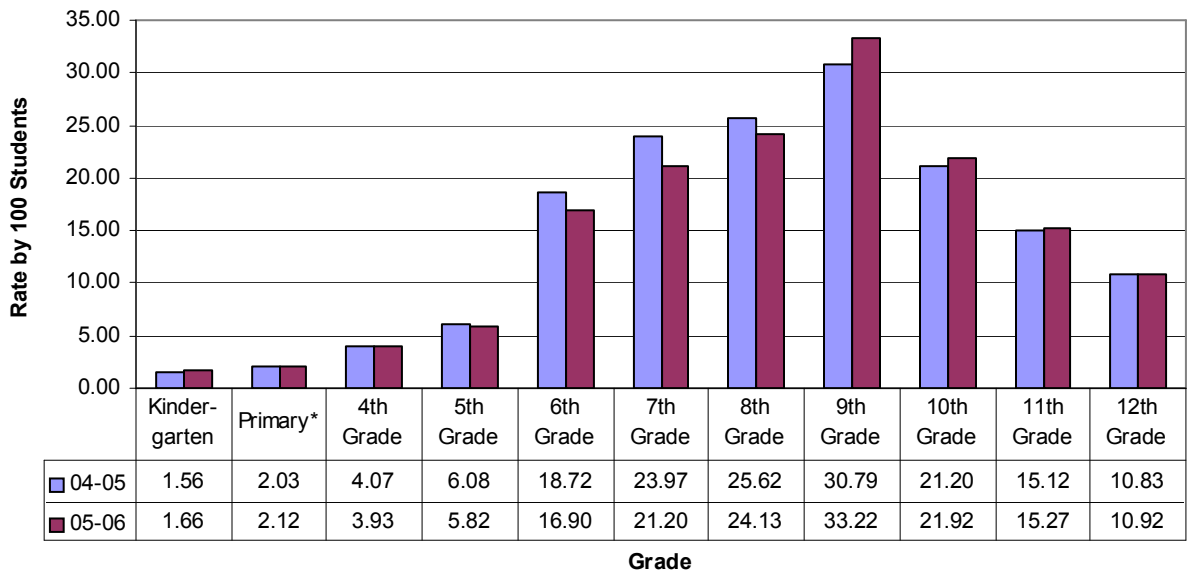

Chart 6 indicates that elementary schools represent 10.99% of the total board violations while disciplinary actions for board violations in middle and high school account for 39.25% and 49.76% of all disciplinary actions, respectively. Although the largest percentage of board violations occurs at the high school level, there are four

grades, 9th-12th, at the high school level and only three grades, 6th-8th, at the middle school level. Previously, **Chart 5a** specifies the violations by grade level, which shows that of the five grades with the highest violations, three were in middle school.

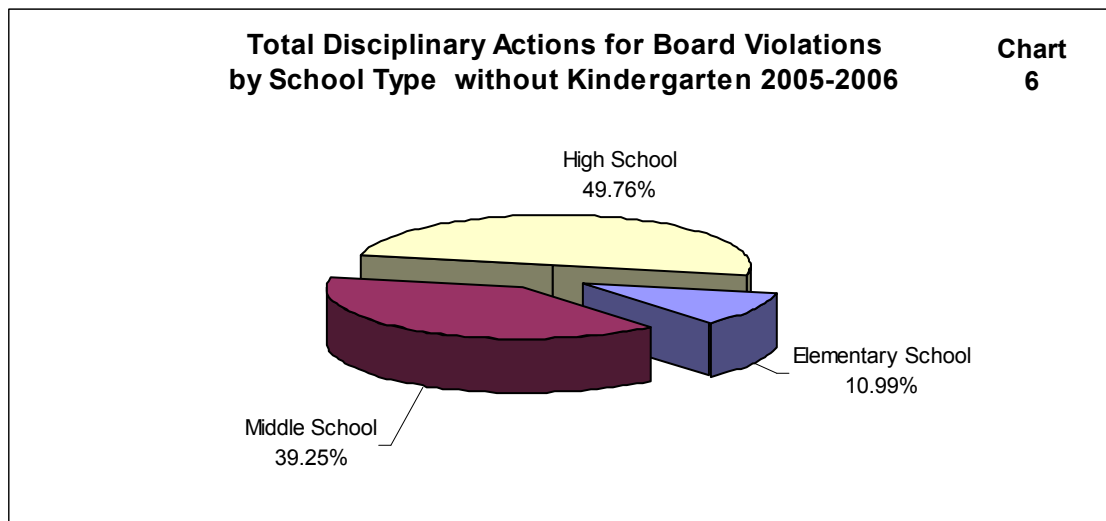
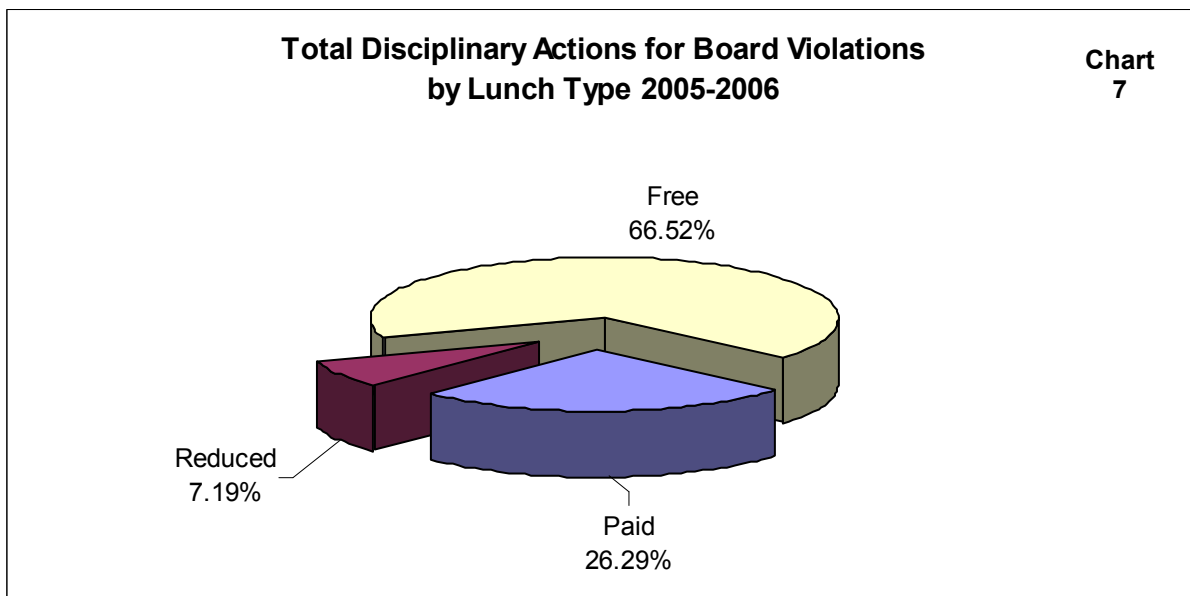


Chart 7 illustrates the total disciplinary actions for board violations by lunch type. Students who qualified for free lunch comprised 66.52% of the total disciplinary actions while students with paid and reduced lunches accounted for 26.29% and 7.19% respectively. For the 2005-2006 school year, approximately half of Kentucky's students received free or reduced lunches. Among the student offenders, the percentage of students who qualified for free or reduced lunch (73.71%, or the sum of 66.52% and 7.19% from Chart 7) is considerably higher than their representation in the total population and suggests that the link between poverty and school misbehavior is an area that needs additional study.

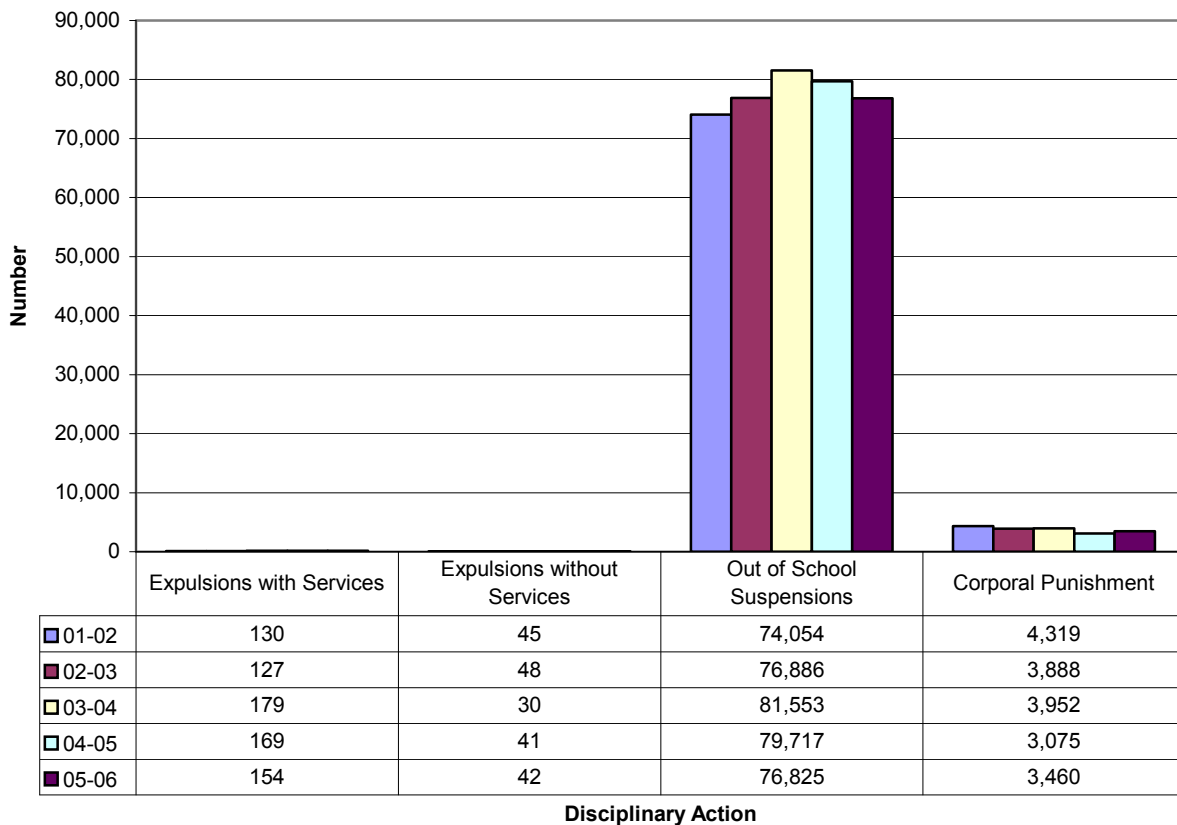


Total board violations are categorized by specific disciplinary actions in **Chart 8**. In 2005-2006, there were 2,892 fewer out-of-school suspensions than the previous year, a decrease of 3.63 percent. At the same time, there were 385 more incidents of corporal punishment (a 12.52% increase) and 15 fewer expulsions with services (an 8.88% decrease). Expulsions without services remained almost stable (an increase of one, or 2.43%); the total number of expulsions without services remains below 50 for the entire state.

Over the five-year period, the number of expulsions without services throughout the state has remained relatively stable (between 30 and 45). Additionally, two significant trends have emerged. First, both expulsions with services and out-of-school suspensions for board violations appear to have peaked in 2003-2004 and have now begun a steady decline (13.97% and 5.80%, respectively, over the past two years). Second, despite the 12.52% increase between 2004-2005 and 2005-2006, corporal punishments have declined 19.89% over the five-year period. Each of these findings is encouraging.

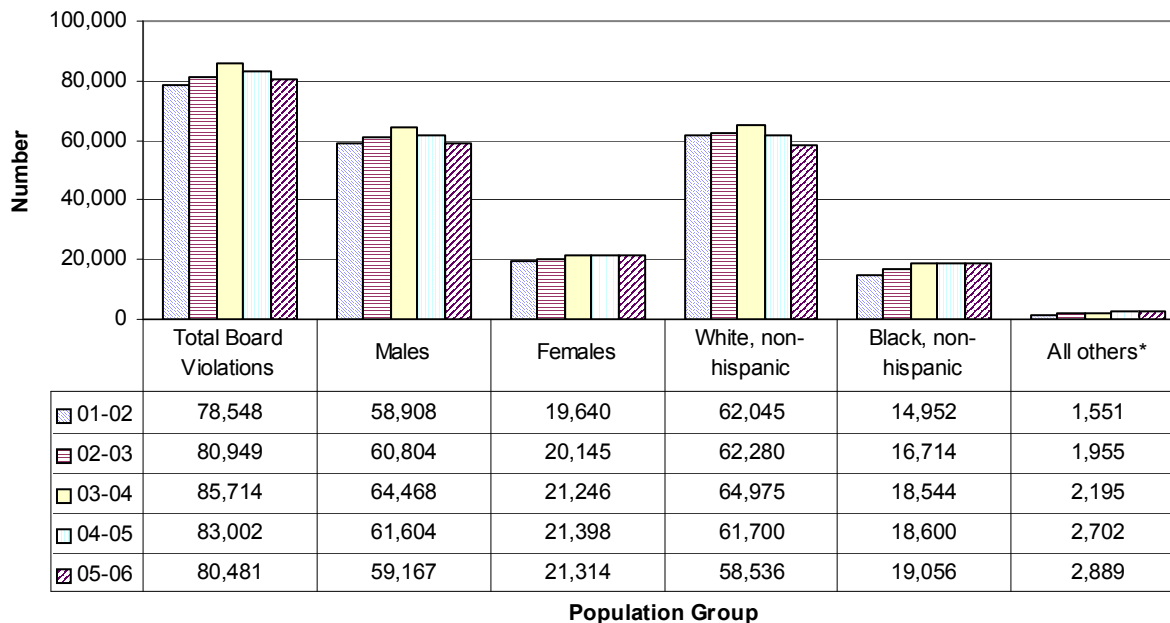


Comparisons of disciplinary actions by gender and ethnicity are made in **Chart 9**. Between 2004-2005 and 2005-2006, total disciplinary actions for board violations for both males (3.96%) and females (0.39%) declined, as did disciplinary actions for White, non-Hispanics (5.13%). During that time period, disciplinary actions for both non-Hispanic Blacks (2.45%) and All Others (6.92%) increased slightly. The ratio of male violations to female violations is approximately 3:1 and is consistent with previous data.

A comparison of disciplinary actions over the five-year period suggests several trends. First, total disciplinary actions for board violations, disciplinary actions for males, and disciplinary actions for White, non-Hispanics appear to have peaked in 2003-2004 and have now begun a downward trend (decreases of 6.11%, 8.22%, and 9.91% from 2003-2004 to 2005-2006, respectively). Secondly, disciplinary actions for females have increased slightly over the five-year period (8.52%). Finally, disciplinary actions for both Black, non-Hispanic (27.44%) students and students of all races other than White or Black (86.27%) have increased sharply over the five-year period.

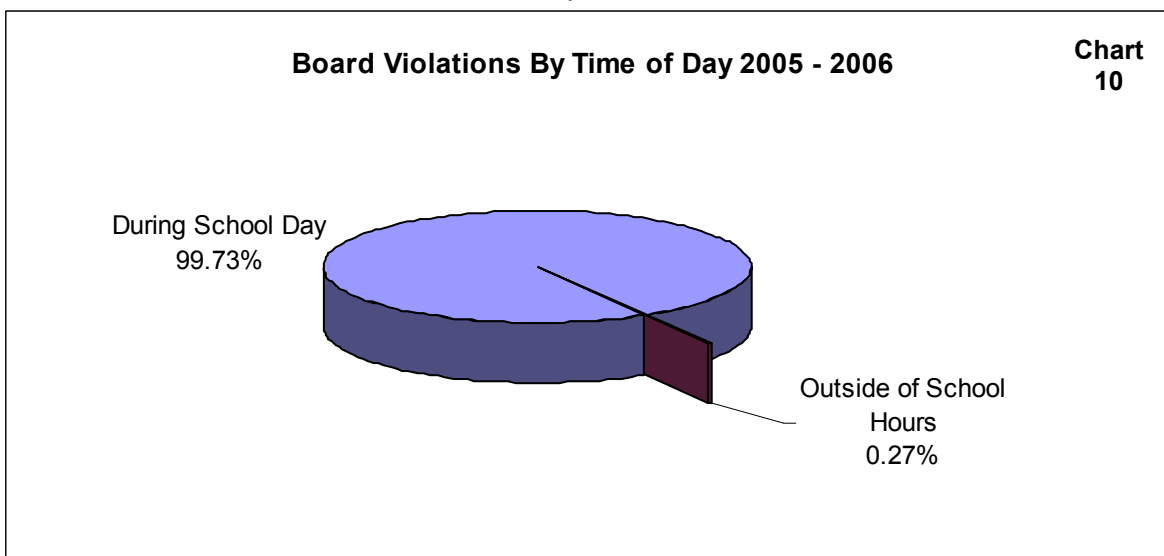


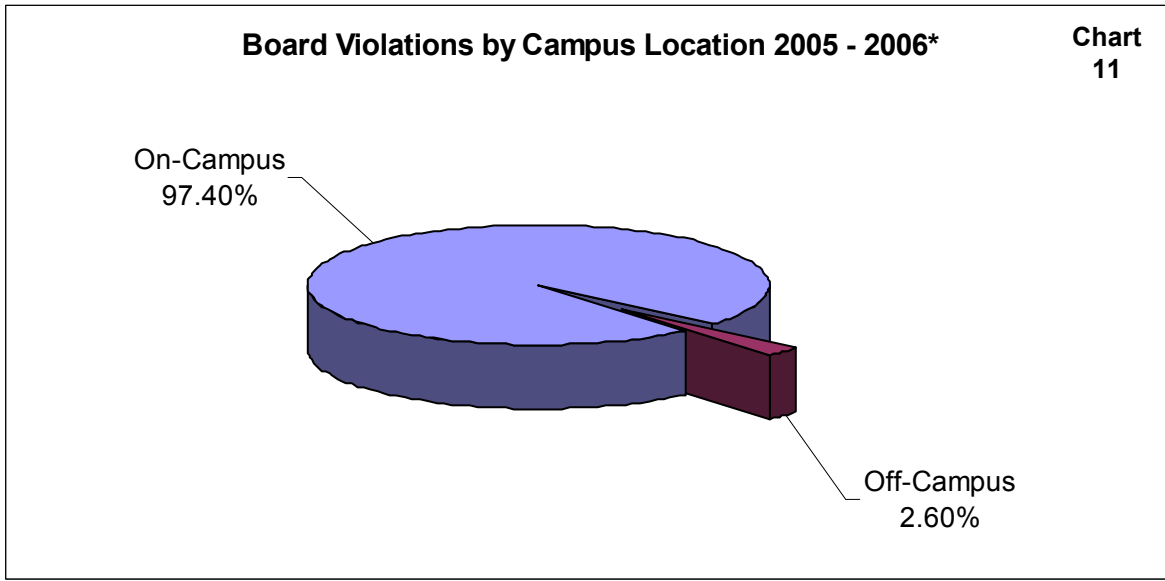

Charts 10 and 11 depict the time of day and location of board policy violations. The charts reflect that 99.73% of board violations are committed during the school day and 97.40% are committed on school campus.

Board Violations By Time of Day 2005 - 2006

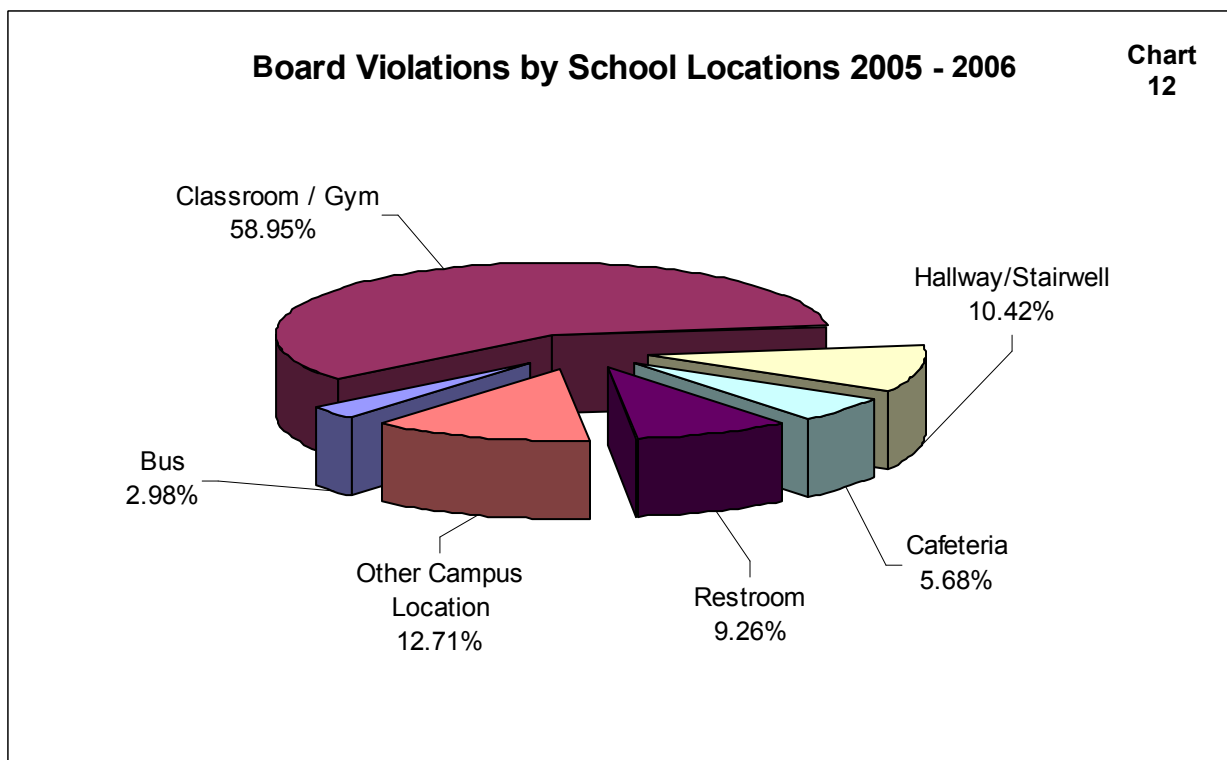

The location of the commission of board policy violations is further separated in **Chart 12**. The classroom/gym is the site of the vast majority of board violations, 58.95%. The remaining board violations are committed in other campus locations (12.71%), hallways/stairwells (10.42%), restrooms (9.26%), the cafeteria (5.68%), and on the bus (2.98%). Because the classroom and gymnasium are vastly different environments, separating these two locations in the future will further clarify violations by location.



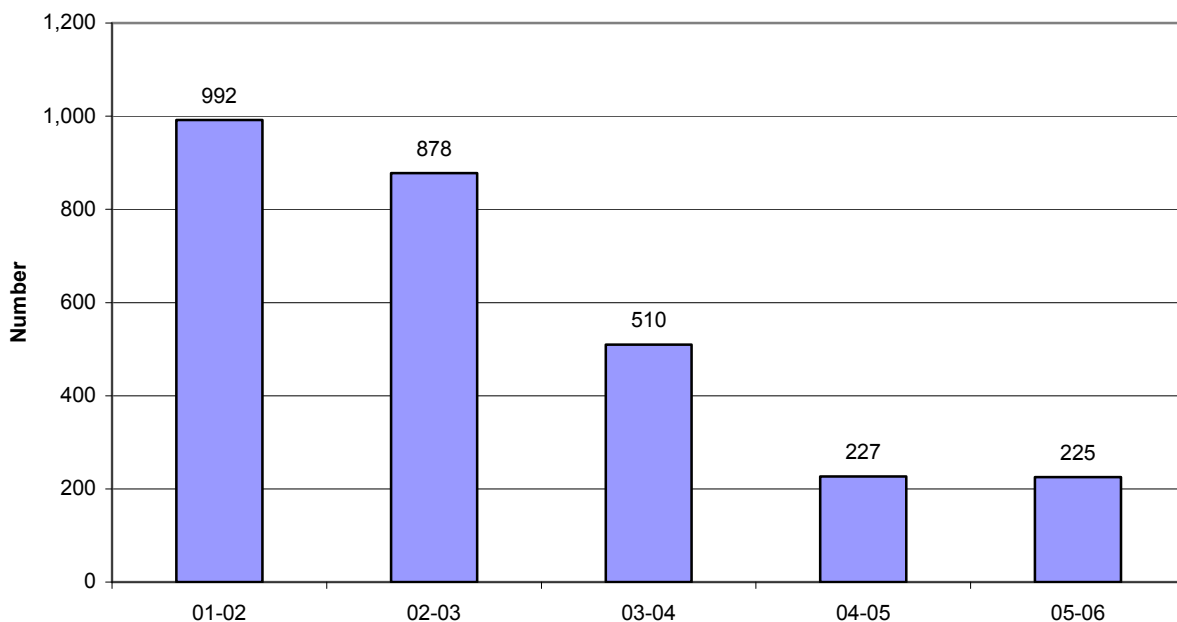
Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations in Kentucky Schools

At the beginning of this reporting process, the Kentucky Department of Education adopted the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Form as a format for reporting law violations on school grounds and at school-related activities. Under this system, *Part I* crimes involve an illegal act directed against a person or property and are generally considered to be more serious offenses. *Part II* law violations may result in an arrest, but are considered less serious. Definitions of *Part I* and *Part II* crimes can be found in **Appendix A**. The following charts show the reported incidents of *Part I* and *Part II* law violations from 2002-2006.

Chart 13 illustrates a dramatic five-year decline in disciplinary actions for *Part I* law violations. Despite remaining relatively unchanged between 2004-2005 and 2005-2006, disciplinary actions declined 77.12% between 2001-2002 and 2005-2006. Because *Part I* law violations are considered more serious than *Part II* law violations, the tremendous decrease is encouraging and suggests that fewer serious law violations are being committed at school.

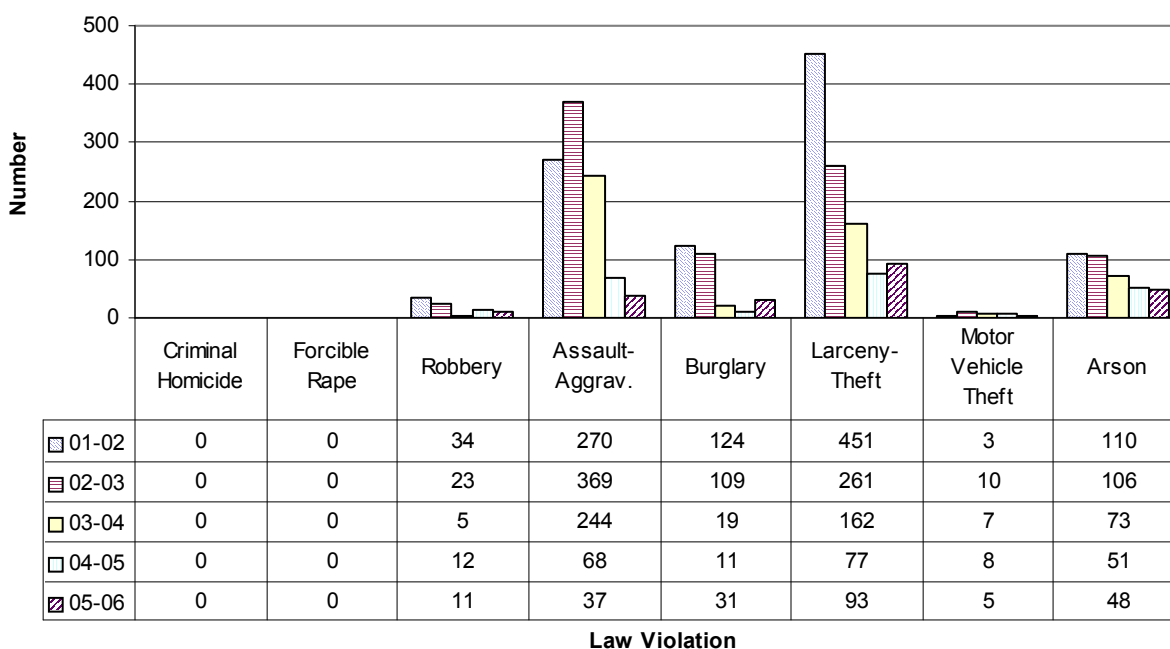

Disciplinary actions for *Part I* law violations by category are shown in **Chart 14**. Over the five-year period, burglary (75.00%), aggravated assaults (86.30%), larceny-theft (79.40%), robbery (67.65%), and arson (56.36%) decreased dramatically. Disciplinary actions for motor-vehicle theft fluctuated during the five-year period, but remained at ten or less incidents throughout the state during the entire time period. An important feature of the data is the extremely large decreases in robbery, aggravated assault, and arson. The downward trend in the most aggressive behaviors (coupled with the fact that there were no criminal homicides or forcible rapes reported over the five-year period) is a promising development and is even more encouraging when combined with the concurrent decrease in aggressive behaviors (i.e., fighting, threat/intimidation, and Dangerous Instruments) noted in disciplinary actions for board policy violations (**Chart 4**).

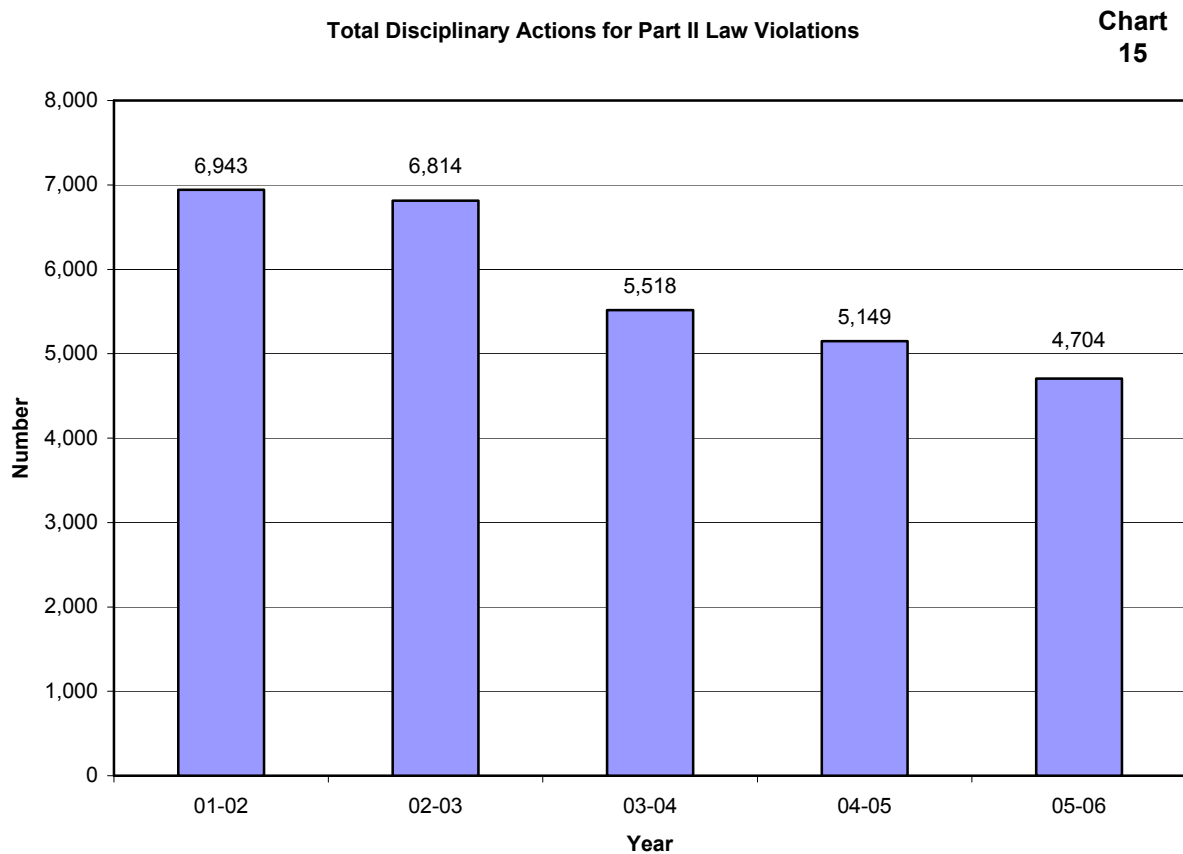

Note that relatively minor changes in single or double digit numbers can have a dramatic impact on percentages.

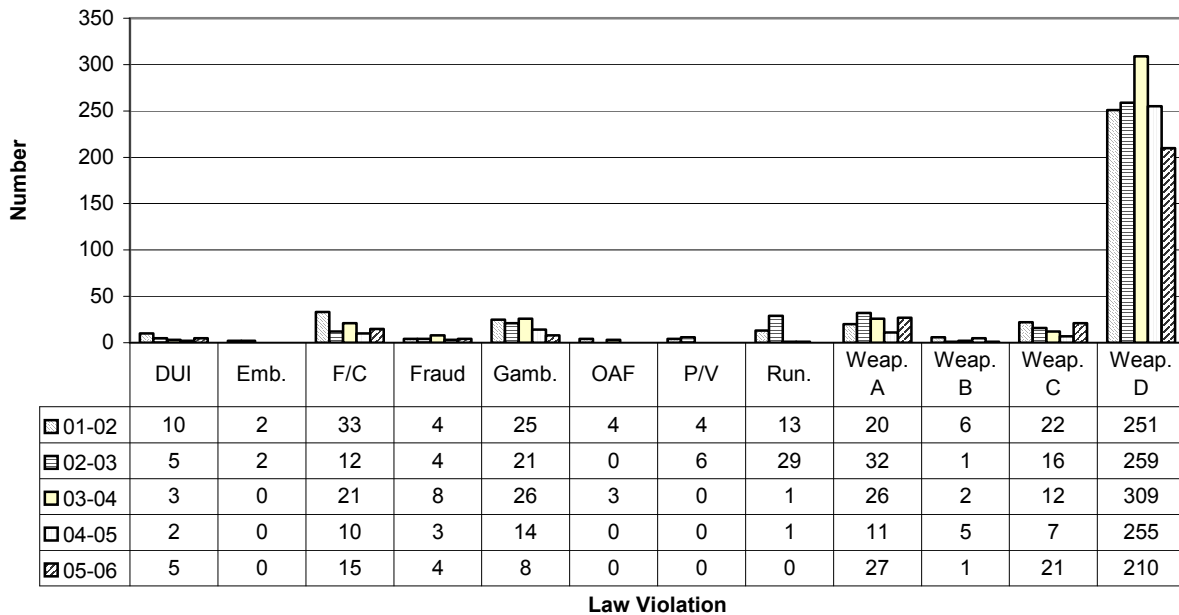
Chart 15 shows the decline in *Part II* law violations. Disciplinary actions for *Part II* law violations decreased by 32.25% over the five-year period. While this is a more modest decrease in percentage than reported for *Part I* violations, the total cases of *Part II* law violations in 2005-2006 is over 20 times the number of *Part I* law violations for the same year. The declining number of disciplinary actions for *Parts I* and *II* law violations over the three-year period is a promising trend.



The report of *Part II* law violations by category requires two charts to display results. **Chart 16** reveals disciplinary actions for twelve categories of *Part II* law violations. With the exception of fraud (where numbers remained relatively stable), the results reveal that, over the five-year period, all disciplinary actions that did not involve weapons declined significantly. Disciplinary actions for Fraud, Weapon A- Handguns, and Weapon C- Other Firearms remained relatively stable over the five-year period while disciplinary actions for Weapon B- Rifles and Weapon D- All Other Weapons declined slightly over the five-year period. Relatively few disciplinary actions occur annually for each of these categories.

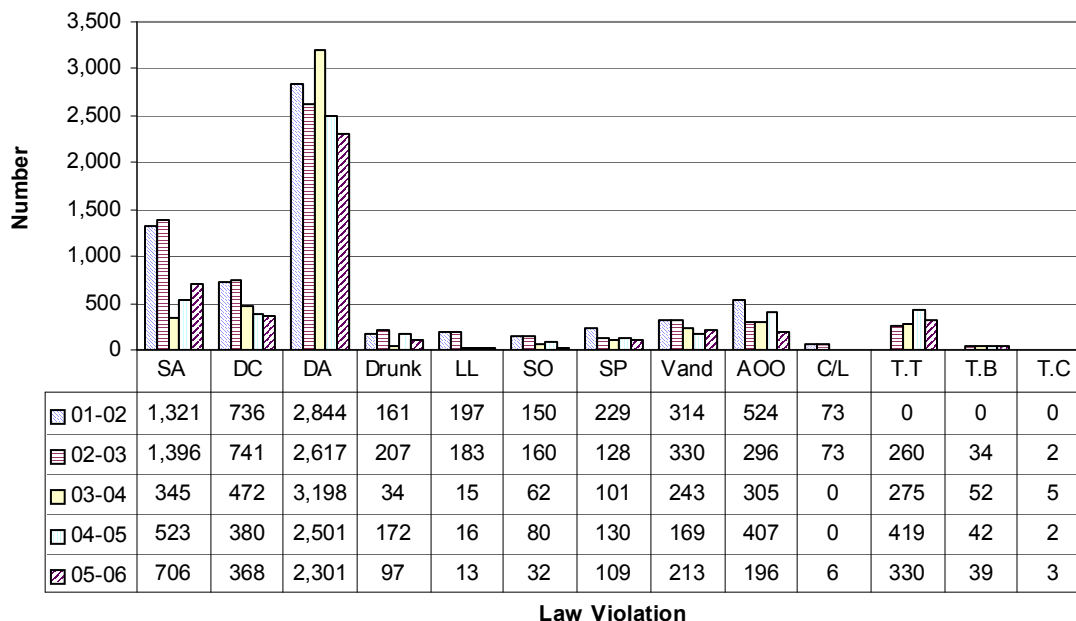

Chart 17 depicts disciplinary actions for the remaining 13 categories of *Part II* law violations. During the five-year reporting period, there were significant decreases in a number of disciplinary actions for law violations, including Disorderly Conduct (50.00%), Drunkenness (39.75%), Liquor Law Violations (93.40%), Sex Offenses (78.67%), Receiving Stolen Property (52.40%), Vandalism (32.17%), Curfew and Loitering (91.78%), and All Other Violations (62.60%). Simple Assault declined 46.56% over the five-year period but increased 35.00% from 2004-2005 to 2005-2006. Disciplinary actions for Drug Abuse violations increased slightly from 2001-2002 to 2003-2004 then appear to have peaked and begun a steady decline (28.05% over the two-year period since 2003-2004). Terroristic threatening increased 26.92% over the four-year period for which we have collected data and may be related to the decrease in Threat/Intimidation incidents in board policy violations discussed earlier. With the relatively new Kentucky law regarding Terroristic Threatening, some incidents formerly defined as Threat/Intimidation may now be defined as a law violation.

Beginning in 2004-2005, changes to the data collection process allowed us to disaggregate (1) drug possession/use and distribution of illegal drugs and (2) by type of drug for which disciplinary actions were received. **Charts 18 and 19** display the number of disciplinary actions reported for nine drug categories for 2004-2005 and 2005-2006. Overall, disciplinary actions for drug possession/use decreased 9.23% from 2004-2005. Despite the fact that disciplinary actions for marijuana/hashish possession accounted for over half of all disciplinary actions for drug possession/use (56.09%), disciplinary actions for Marijuana/hashish possession/use (8.60%) and Other Drugs (28.47%) declined slightly. The category “Other” refers to substances not otherwise specified, for example, “designer” drugs such as Ecstasy, or “look-alikes” and comprises 16.02% of the total possession and use violations. Thus, disciplinary actions for the two categories that make up the largest percentage of the total drug possession/use category both declined over the two-year period. Although disciplinary actions for alcohol violations increased 12.04%, this finding may be partly due to coding changes, as this increase was accompanied by a 43.60% decrease in disciplinary actions for drunkenness (see

Chart 17). Barbiturates, amphetamines, cocaine/crack, hallucinogenics, and heroin together make up only 1.37% of drug abuse violations and disciplinary actions for these drugs fluctuated slightly over the two-year period, although none of these drugs had more than seven disciplinary actions in 2005-2006. Disciplinary actions for prescription drug possession/use remained relatively unchanged over the two-year period (increased 0.51% over the two-year period).

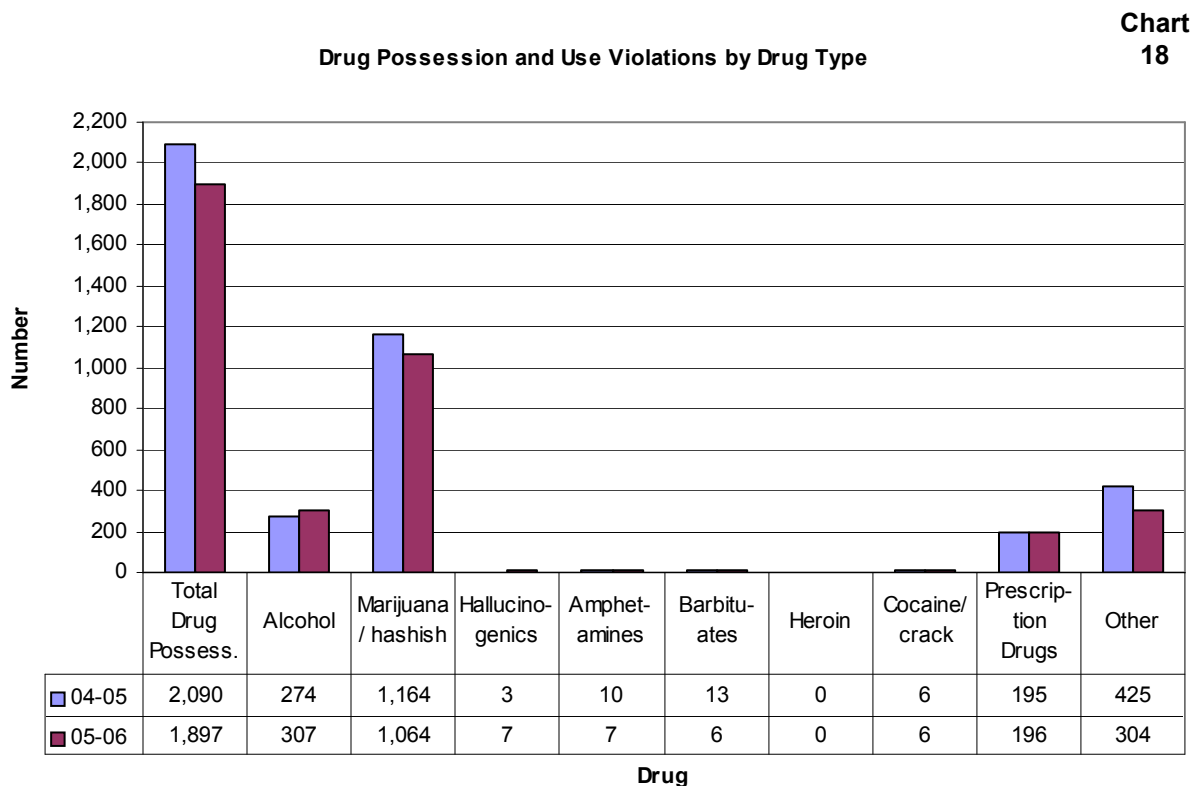
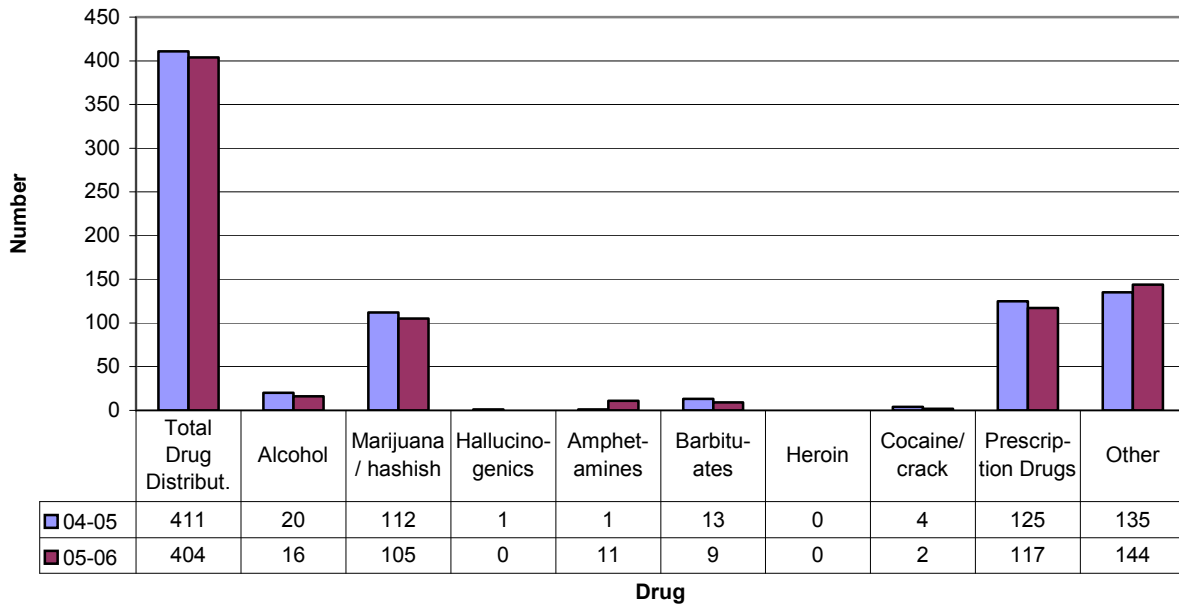


Chart 19 reveals the number of disciplinary actions for drug distribution for the 2004-2005 and 2005-2006 school years. Disciplinary actions for drug distribution declined slightly (1.70%) over the two-year period; this trend was also reflected in slight decreases in disciplinary actions for distribution of Alcohol (20.0%), Marijuana/Hashish (6.25%), Barbiturates (30.77%), and Prescription Drugs (6.40%). These types of drugs comprise 61.14% of the disciplinary actions for drug distribution. Disciplinary actions for Other Drugs increased slightly (6.67%) over the two-year period and comprise 35.64% of the total disciplinary actions for drug distribution. The most dramatic change in disciplinary actions for drug violations occurred in the Amphetamines category, as the number of disciplinary actions for distribution of Amphetamines increase from a single disciplinary action in 2004-2005 to 11 disciplinary actions in 2005-2006. While disciplinary actions for distribution of Amphetamines constitute only 2.72% of the total disciplinary actions for drug distribution, this increase is a trend that bears further exploration.

Drug Distribution Violations by Drug Type

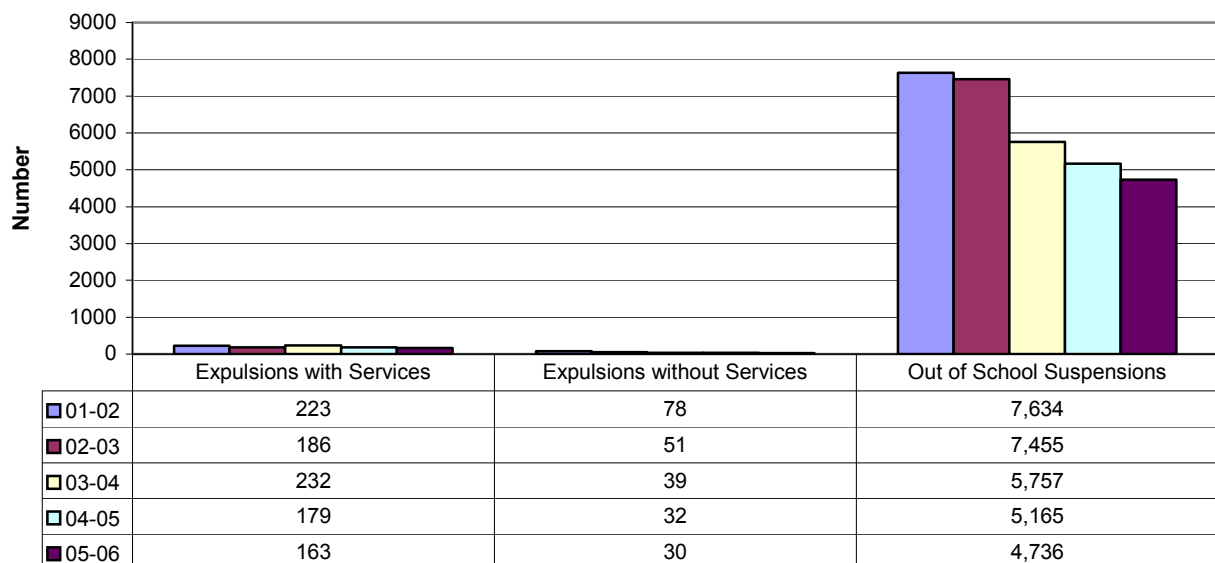

The types of disciplinary actions for law violations are compared in **Chart 20**. Out of School Suspensions for law violations decreased 38.00% over the five-year period while Expulsions with Services decreased 26.90% and Expulsions without Services decreased 61.54%. Each of these findings is encouraging and indicates a substantial decrease in the number of law violations occurring on school property over the last five years. Behaviors that result in disciplinary actions for law violations are typically of a more serious nature than those that result in disciplinary actions for board violations. As a result, principals tend to have more discretion with disciplinary actions for board violations. Consequently, this decrease in disciplinary actions for law violations over the five-year period represents a real change in behaviors and is particularly encouraging.

Law Violations Comparison of Disciplinary Actions

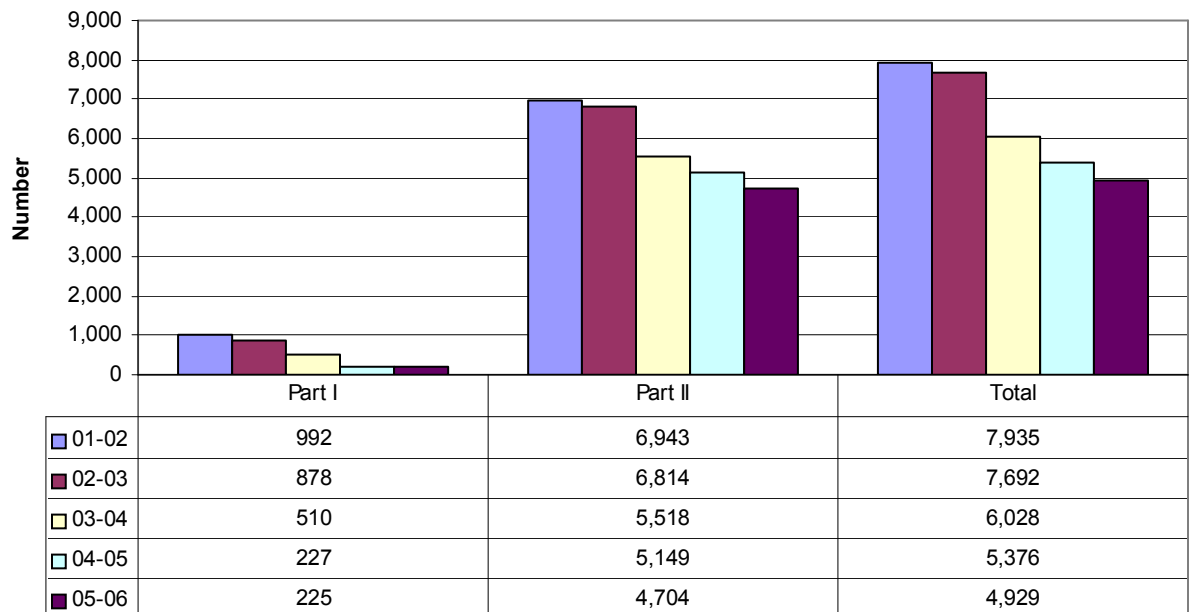

Disciplinary actions for all law violations, *Part I* and *II*, are depicted in **Chart 21**. Disciplinary actions for both Part I Law violations (77.32%) and Part II Law violations (32.25%) decreased steadily and significantly over the five years under study; the fact that this decrease was particularly large for Part I Law violations (the most serious offenses) is especially notable and a positive outcome for schools in Kentucky.

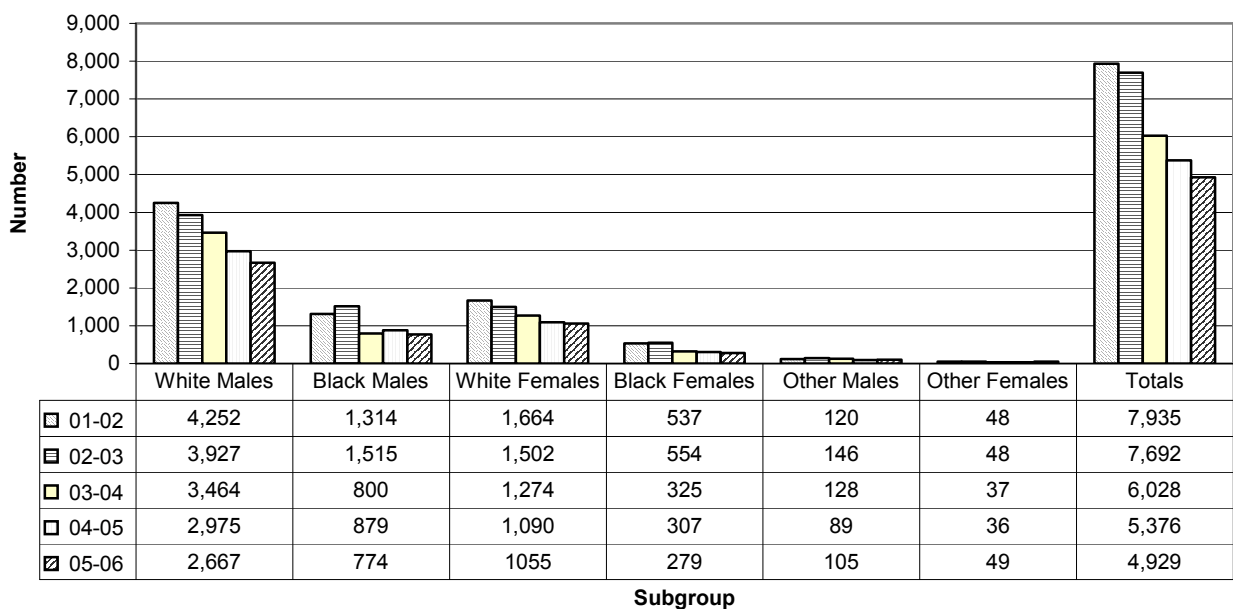
Total Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations

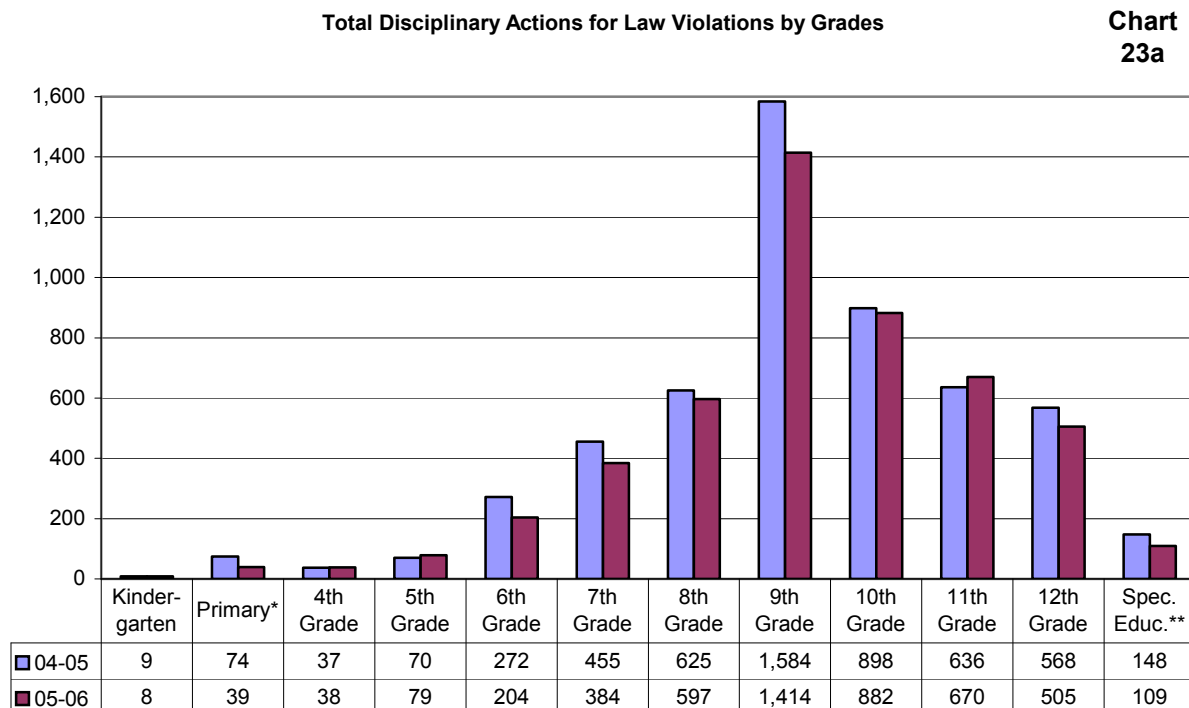
Comparison of Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations by Race and Gender Subgroups

Race and gender comparisons are made in **Chart 22**. With the exception of females of races other than White or Black (where disciplinary actions for law violations remained relatively stable over the five-year period), disciplinary actions for law violations declined for each of the race/gender subgroups. The fact that disciplinary actions for law violations by white males (37.28%), black males (41.10%), white females (36.60%), black females (48.04%), other males (12.50%) all showed fairly large decreases over the five-year period again provides further evidence that this decline in law violations is a significant trend that cuts across all public school students in Kentucky.

Grade level comparisons for law violations are displayed in **Chart 23a**. The profile of escalating law violations from Kindergarten through 9th grade with a decrease thereafter is similar to the profile presented in board policy violations. Because we were unable to collect grade-level data prior to 2004-2005, only two years of data are presented.

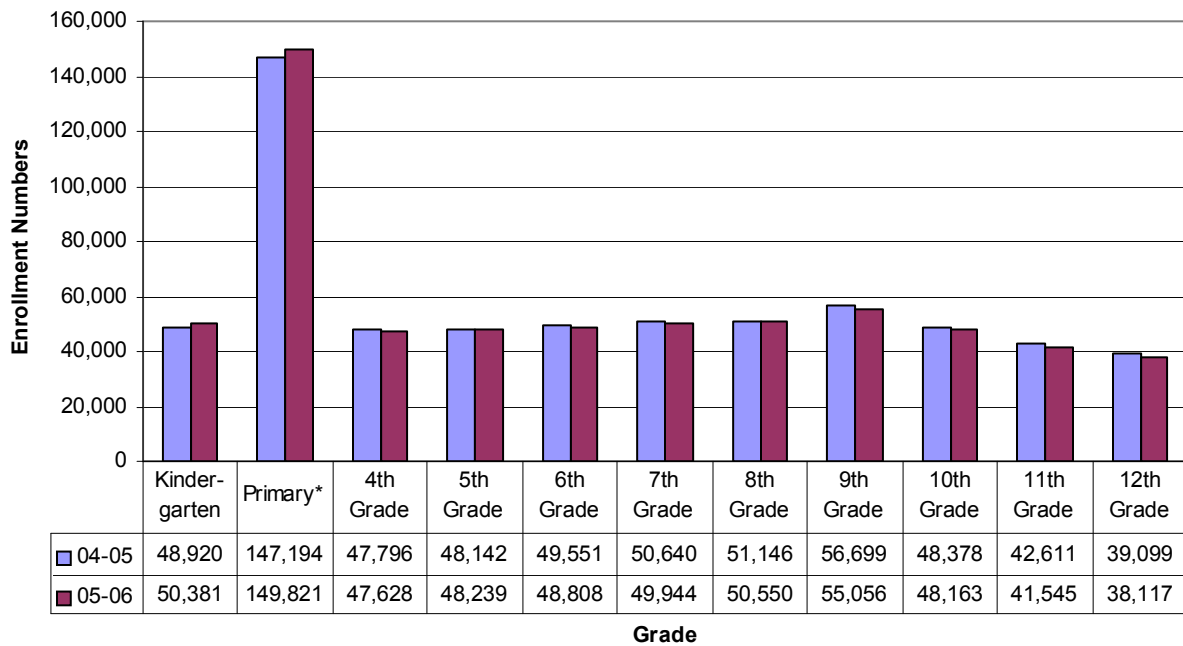

Chart 23b reflects the total enrollment for grades 4-12 while **Chart 23c** depicts the rate of law violations for each grade 4-12. As with disciplinary actions for board violations, the conversion to rates by student enrollment makes the increase in disciplinary actions from 8th grade to 9th grade appear less dramatic. Nevertheless, Chart 23c suggests a significant increase in the amount of disciplinary actions for law violations between middle school and high school, as each of the highest rates of disciplinary actions for law violations occurs in the high school grade levels, led by 9th grade (2.57 disciplinary actions per 100 students), 10th grade (1.83), 11th grade (1.61),

and 12th grade (1.32). This finding suggests that disciplinary actions for law violations are a greater concern for high school students than for middle school students.

Total Enrollment by Grades

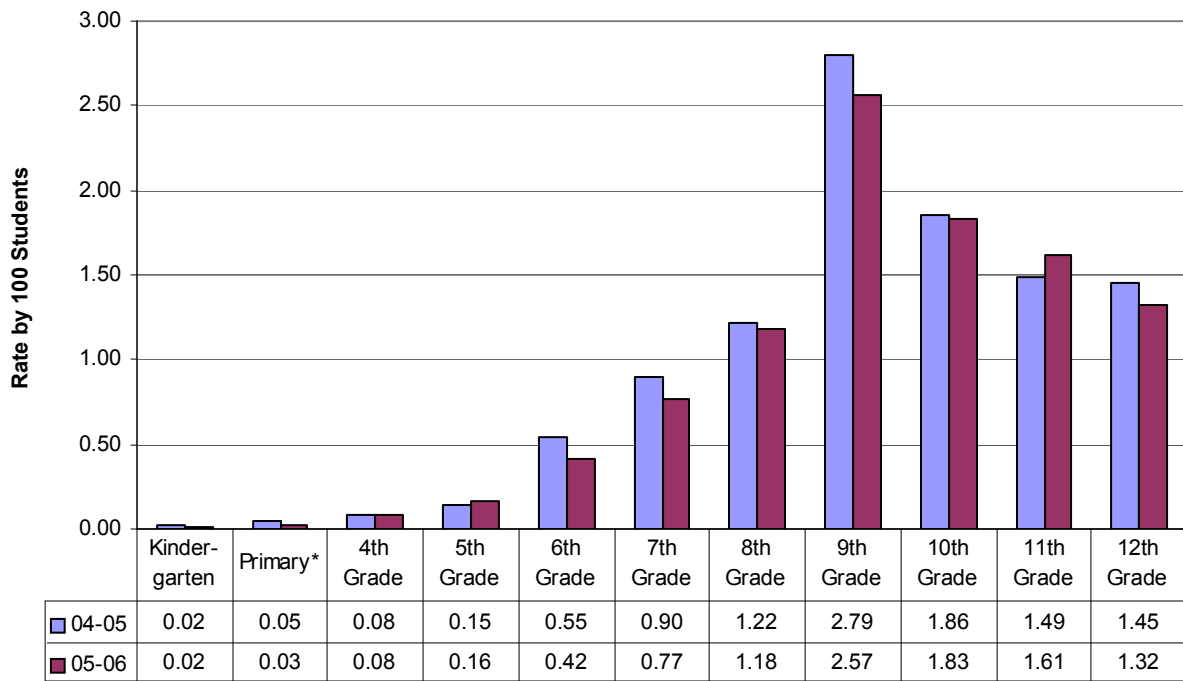

Chart 24 further echoes this finding as it illustrates that the vast majority (72.01%) of disciplinary actions for law violations occur at high schools while 24.59% and 3.40% of disciplinary actions for law violations take place at middle and elementary schools, respectively. Because middle and high school percentages of board policy violations were more similar (39.25% for middle vs. 49.76% for high school), it is possible that a considerable number of middle school offenders of board policy develop into offenders of the law by high school. This suggests additional research into the pattern of behavior of offenders in the earlier grades is needed.

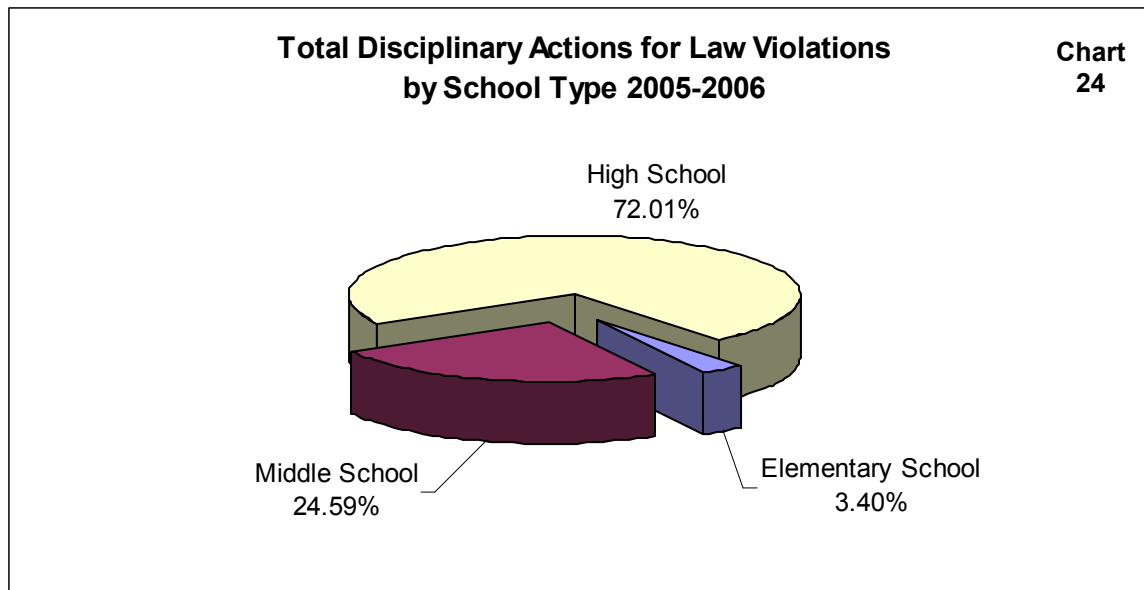
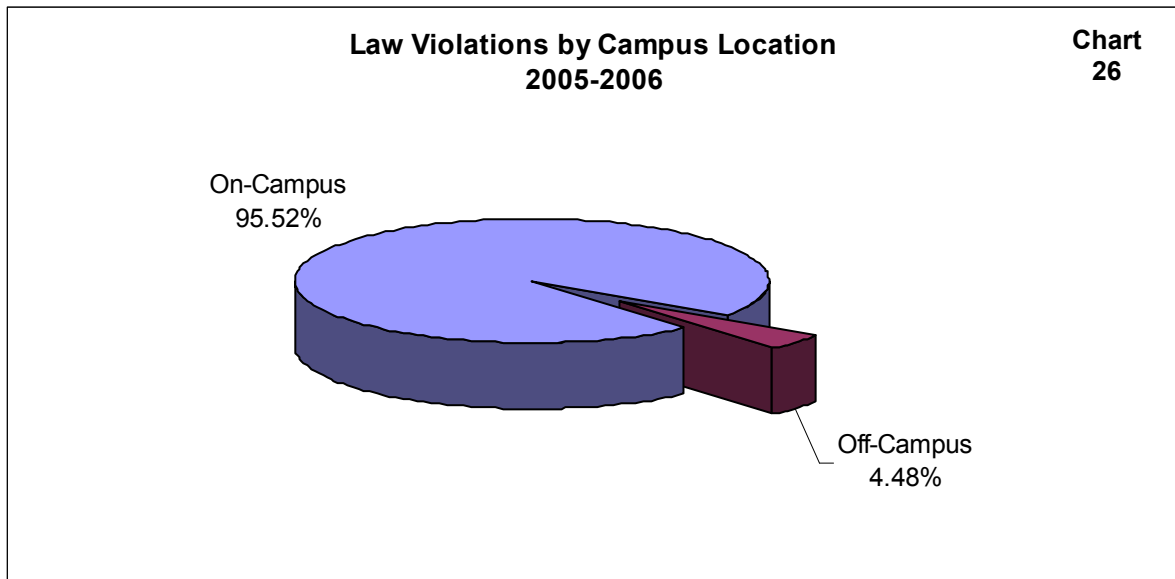


Chart 25 indicates the time of day that law violations were committed. With regard to law violation time, 97.46% occurred during schools hours while only 2.54% happened after school hours.



Chart 26 compares on-campus and off-campus commission of law violations. On-campus violations comprise 95.52% of all law violations while off-campus law violations make up the remaining 4.48%. **Charts 25 and 26** clearly indicate that the preponderance of law violations occur during school hours and on school campus.



Note: Public schools are legally responsible for the behavior and safety of students from the moment they leave their homes to go to school until the moment they return to their homes after their school day is over.

Law violations that are committed by a student outside of the school day are subject to consequences imposed by the justice system.

Law violations committed during the school day are subject to consequences imposed by the school district. When the law violation during the school day is of a severe nature, the justice system may also be involved.

The locations at which law violations occur are further divided in **Chart 27**. Most (42.06%) law violations occur in the classroom/gym. The remaining 57.94% of law violations take place in other campus locations (25.57%), in the hallway/stairwell (12.52), in the restroom (9.36%), in the cafeteria (6.07%), and on the bus (4.42%).

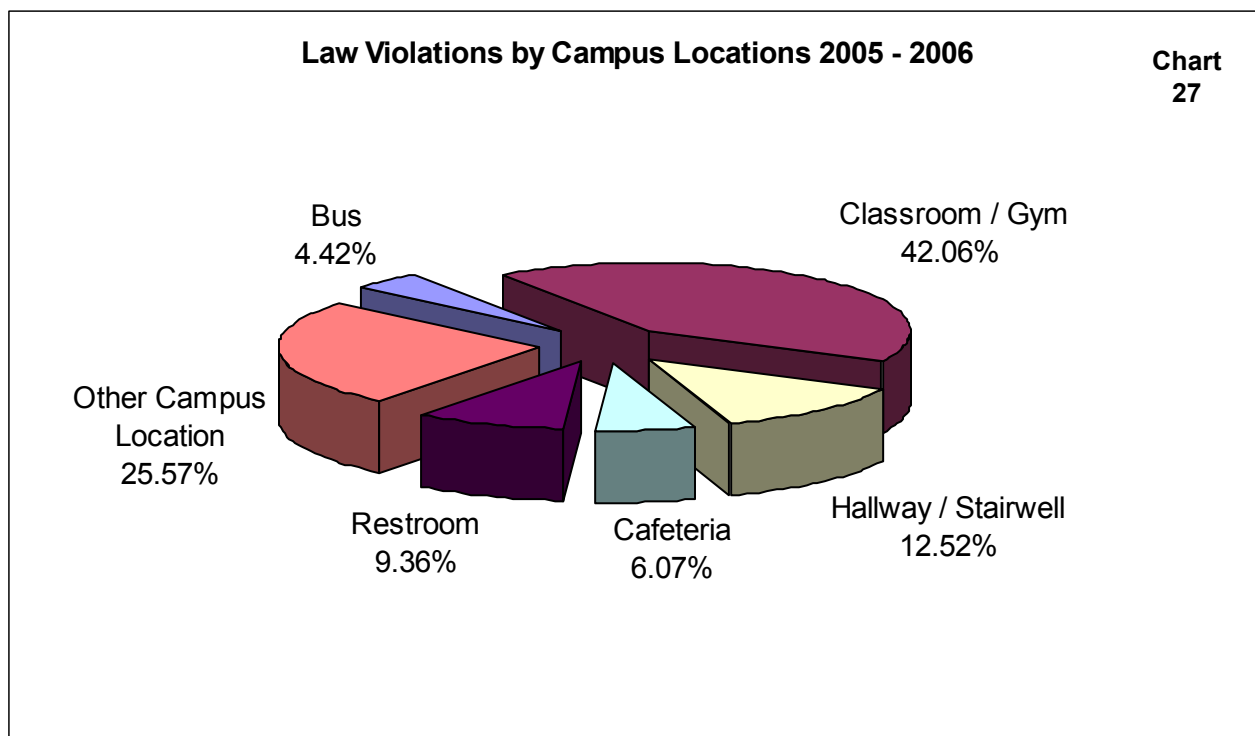


Chart 28 illustrates the total disciplinary actions for law violations by lunch type. Students who received free lunch made up 51.80% of the total disciplinary actions. Students who paid or received reduced lunch account for 40.90% and 7.30%, respectively. Comparing disciplinary actions for board policy and law violations by lunch type indicates that students who qualified for free lunch constituted a lower percentage of total disciplinary actions for law violations than for board policy violations (51.80% vs. 66.52%). Although the proportion of students (59.10%) who qualified for free or reduced lunches is greater than the 49% representation in the general student population, this proportion is considerably lower than the proportion of students receiving disciplinary actions for board violations that qualify for free or reduced lunch (73.71%). Combined with an over-representation of Black, non-Hispanic students in disciplinary actions, further study into the relationship among poverty, race and disciplinary action, particularly for board violations, is needed.

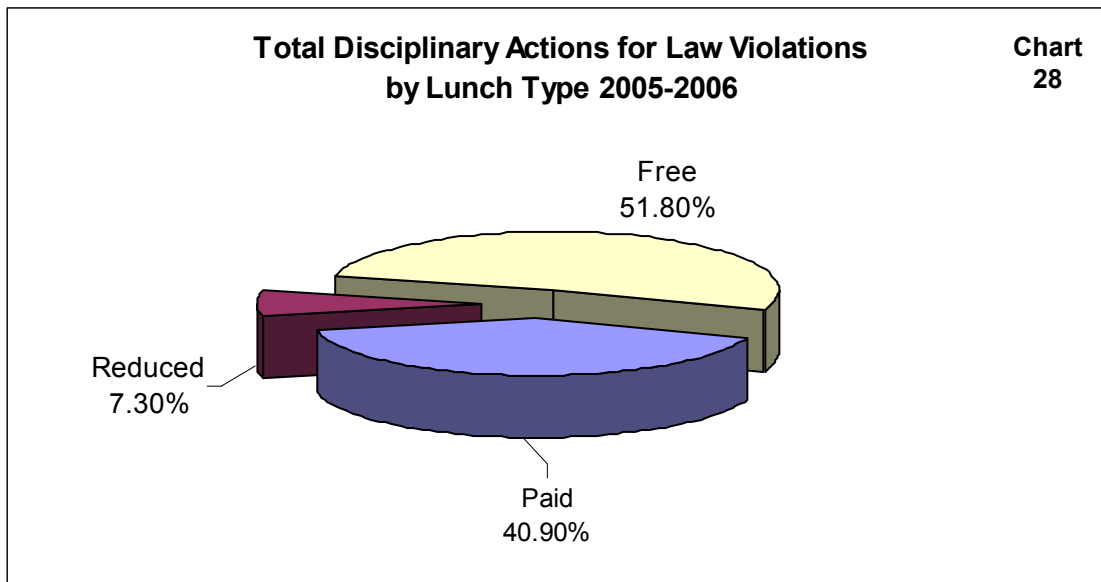
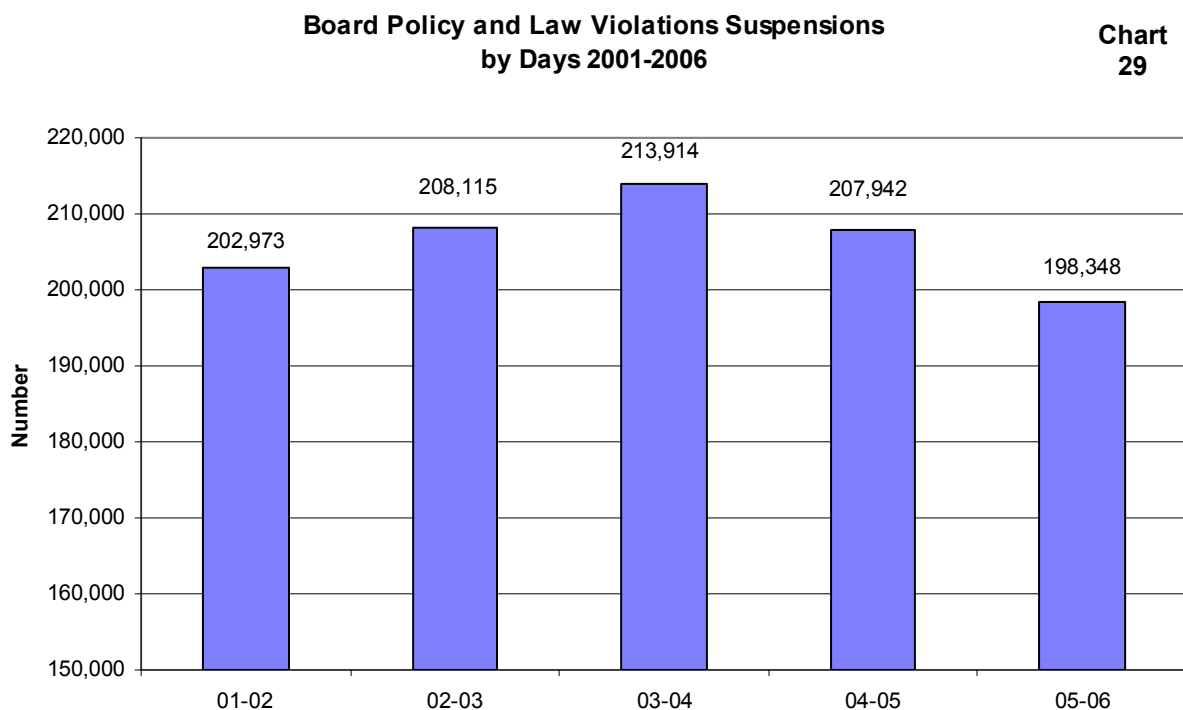


Chart 29 illustrates the number of school days that students were suspended from the 2001-2002 school year through 2005-2006 for board policy and law violations. As with other data presented throughout the report, the total number of days missed by students for suspensions appears to have peaked in 2003-2004 and has declined steadily since (7.28% decrease from 2003-2004 to 2005-2006). Given the relationship between school attendance and educational achievement, this is particularly encouraging news for the state of Kentucky as well.

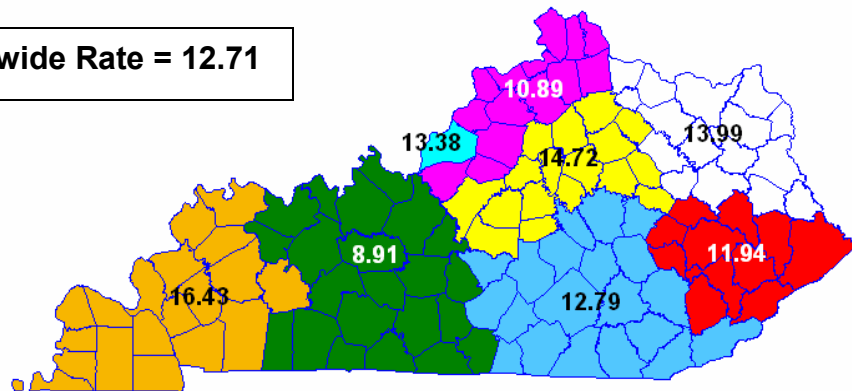

Map 2 shows the regional rate of **disciplinary actions for board policy violations** for all students. The Southwest region reports the lowest rate, 8.91 per 100, which is 29.90% below the statewide rate of 12.71 disciplinary actions per 100 students. The West and Central regions report the highest rate, 16.43 and 14.72, respectively. The rates in the other five regions range from 10.89 to 13.99.

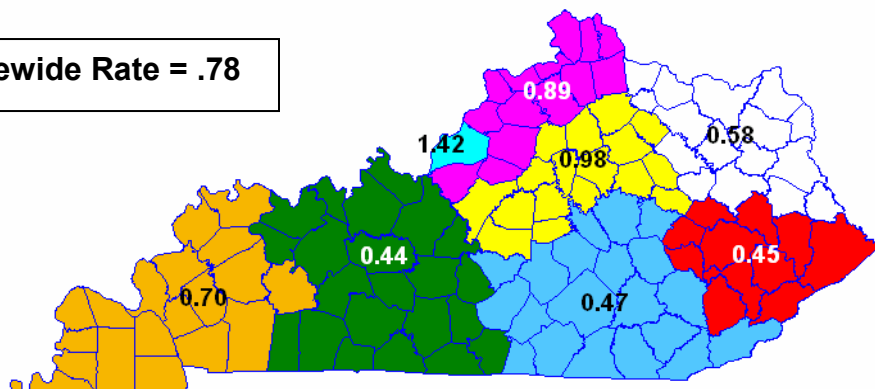


Map 3 depicts **disciplinary actions for law violations** for all students. The lowest rate for law violations occurred in the Southwest region, 0.44, while the highest rate occurred in Jefferson County, 1.42. Although Jefferson County has consistently reported the highest rate for law violations, the difference in all eight regions is little more than 1 student per 100.

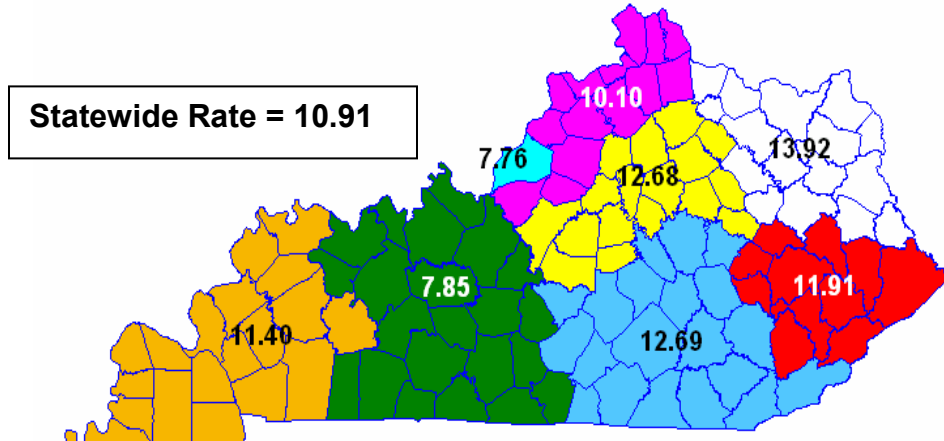

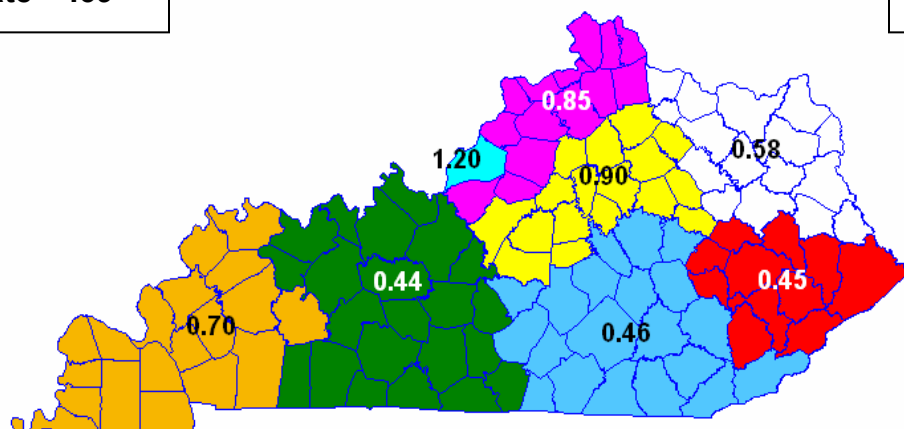

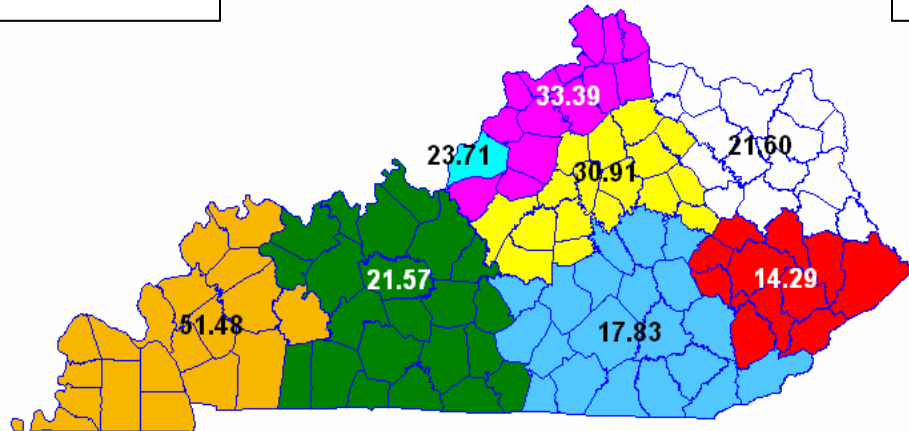


Map 6 suggests that the statewide rate for **disciplinary actions for board policy violations for African-American students** is almost three times the rate for white students 28.52 v. 10.91. The West region reports the highest rate (51.48) while the South Central reports the lowest rate (14.29). While Jefferson County's rate (23.71) is below the statewide rate of 28.52, Jefferson County's student population is 35.5% African-American.

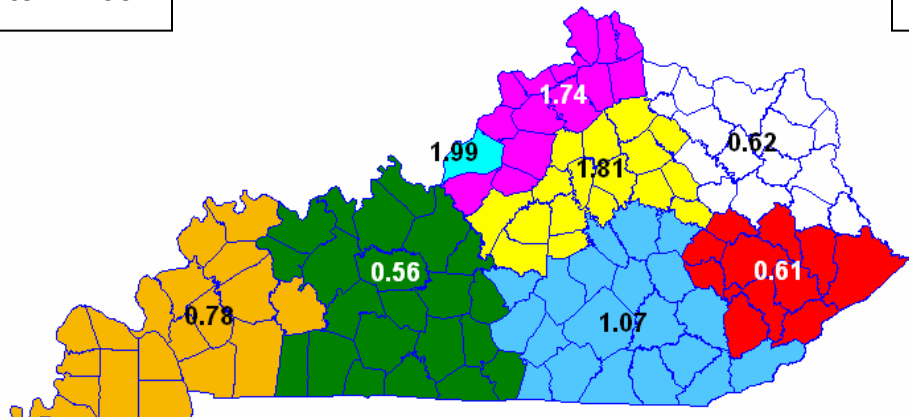


The results presented in **Map 7** reflect the **disciplinary actions for law violations for African-American students**. The Southeast region reported the lowest rate (0.56) of disciplinary actions for law violations for African-American students while Jefferson County reported the highest rate (1.99). As noted with disciplinary actions for board policy violations for African-American students, the statewide rate is more than double the rate for white students, 1.58 v 0.69 per 100 students.

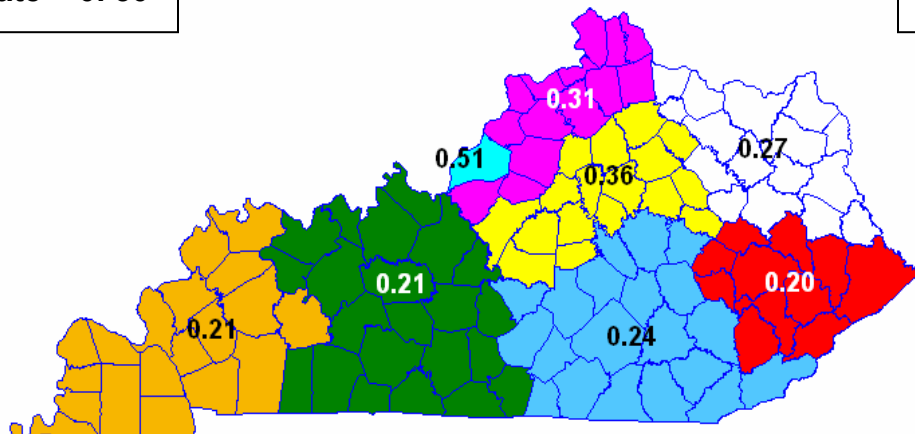

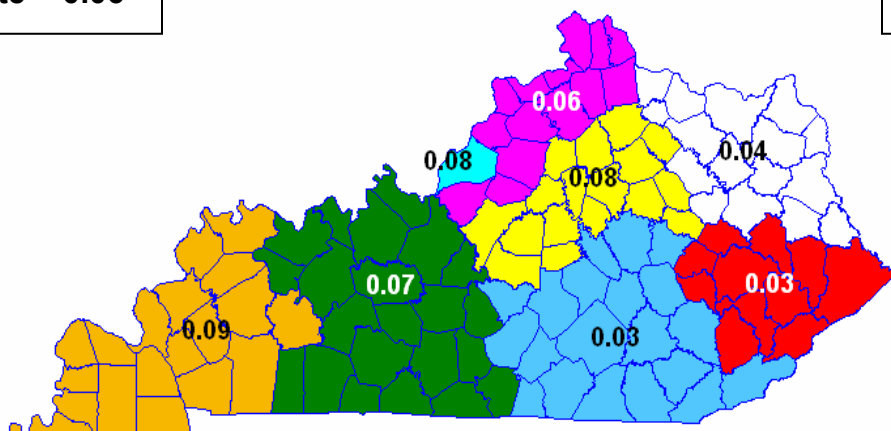

Districts are encouraged to examine their data over the three years of reporting. Additionally, districts are encouraged to make comparisons to other districts of similar size, to their region, and to the state. Similar comparisons can be made between building level data to other schools in their district as well as comparisons to their district, region, and the state. Keep in mind that data should be reviewed in context to understand the full meaning of the data and to avoid misinterpretation.

Section IV District Level Data

Occurrence of School District Disciplinary Consequences for Law and Board Violations

Table I reports the number of disciplinary actions for law and board violations for each Kentucky school district from the 2001-2002 school year until the 2005-2006 school year. County districts (in bold type) are organized alphabetically with independent school districts shown beneath the county school district they adjoin. The data in this table represent the raw number of reported disciplinary consequences associated with specific incidents. Attendance data collected by the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) are shown in the enrollment column. Membership data are collected once yearly and are the most accurate snapshot of a district's total number of students.

Note: Local school boards are responsible for determining what disciplinary consequences are permissible in their schools. Some school boards have enacted policies prohibiting the use of corporal punishment; therefore, the data contained in the following table under corporal punishment reflect only those districts where it is allowed.

Standard Scale of Measurement

The following tables utilize a standard scale of measurement, rate per 100, to facilitate comparison between districts of dissimilar sizes. Therefore, the rate listed indicates how many incidents occurred in relation to every 100 students in the given districts. Districts are grouped by size to allow for more meaningful comparisons and due to the small number of expulsions across the state,

expulsions with and without services are combined in these tables. District rates for disciplinary actions for all students are shown in **Table 2**. The same data are shown in **Tables 3** and **4**, but have been disaggregated to show the rates for white and African-American students.

Note: A relatively small number of incidents can have a more dramatic effect on the rate per 100 in very small districts and in districts with a small number of African-Americans which may distort interpretation.

Districts **not found** in **Tables 3** and **4** were not reported at the district level because the number of African-American students was so small that reporting the numbers might make them “personally identifiable” in violation of federal privacy laws (Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act, FERPA). Because their numbers were so small in most counties, the concern for violating the privacy laws also results in the omission entirely of Asian, Hispanic, American Indian, and other racial groups from the tables.

Appendix A

Definitions of Law Violations

Important:

This guide is to serve as clarification for school personnel when coding law violations upon school property. These definitions are not legally binding and should only be used to assist school personnel in coding law violations at their school for Safe Schools data collection purposes. For any questions that arise regarding the legal definition of a student action, please consult with your School Board Attorney or local law enforcement representative.

Code Description

11 Criminal Homicide- A person is guilty of criminal homicide when he causes the death of another human being under circumstances which constitute murder, manslaughter in the first degree, manslaughter in the second degree, or reckless homicide.

20 Forcible Rape/Forcible Sodomy- A person is guilty of forcible rape when he engages in sexual intercourse/deviate sexual intercourse with another person by forcible compulsion; or he engages in sexual intercourse/deviate sexual intercourse with another person who is incapable of consent because he: is physically helpless; or is less than twelve (12) years old. "Deviate sexual intercourse" means any act of sexual gratification involving the sex organs of one person and the mouth or anus of another; or penetration of the anus of one person by a foreign object manipulated by another person (other than generally recognized health-care practices). Sexual intercourse means sexual intercourse in its ordinary sense and includes penetration of the sex organs of one person by a foreign object manipulated by another person.

30 Robbery- The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force and/or putting the victim in fear.

50 Burglary- A person is guilty of burglary when, with the intent to commit a crime, he knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in a building. A building, in addition to its ordinary meaning, means any structure, vehicle, watercraft or aircraft where any person lives or where people assemble for purposes of business, government, education, religion, entertainment or public transportation. Thus, breaking into a bus and stealing something from the bus would be counted as burglary.

60 Larceny/Theft – The intentional taking of the property of another.

70 Motor Vehicle Theft- The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

90 Arson – Any intentional burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle, or aircraft.

100 Forgery and Counterfeiting– Occurs when a person, with intent to defraud, deceive or injure another, falsely makes, completes or alters a written instrument (e.g., checks, transcripts, official identification, currency).

110 Fraud is obtaining money or property by false pretenses.

120 Embezzlement – Misappropriating or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control, to include altering or forging financial records.

130 Stolen Property (Receiving) violations include buying, receiving, possessing of stolen property.

140 Vandalism (Criminal Mischief) – The intentional destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property without consent of the owner or person having custody or control (i.e., by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, or covering with filth)

151 Weapon A - Handgun – A handgun is any pistol or revolver originally designed to be fired by the use of a single hand, or any other firearm originally designed to be fired by the use of a single hand. A firearm is any weapon that will expel a projectile by the action of an explosive. This offense encompasses manufacture, sale, or possession of handguns on school property or at a school function. By Kentucky law(KRS 527.070), this excludes students 18 years of age and older who have these firearms in their automobile on school property.

152 Weapon B - Rifle- A rifle is a weapon designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the shoulder and designed or redesigned and made or remade to use the energy of the explosive in a fixed metallic cartridge to fire only a single projectile through a rifled bore for each single pull of the trigger. This category also includes **shotguns**. This offense encompasses sale or possession of rifles or shotguns on school property or at a school function. By Kentucky law, this excludes students 18 years of age and older who have these firearms in their automobile on school property.

153 Weapon C - Other Firearms – Weapons other than handguns, rifles, or shotguns that will expel a projectile by the action of an explosive. Examples of other firearms include air guns (that use pneumatic pressure or pressurized cartridges to fire a projectile) also known as BB guns; and other homemade firearms. By Kentucky law, this excludes students 18 years of age and over who have these firearms in their automobile on school property.

154 Weapon D - Other- any object capable of being readily used by one person to inflict severe bodily injury upon another person. Examples include (but are not limited to) knives, artificial knuckles, club, baton, nunchaku karate sticks. This offense encompasses manufacture, sale, or possession of these types of weapons on school property or at a school function. By Kentucky law, this excludes students 18 years of age and over who have these weapons in their automobile on school property.

160 Prostitution/Vice – a person is guilty of prostitution something of value when he or she engages or agrees or offers to engage in sexual conduct with another person in return for a fee. Also includes keeping a bawdy house, procuring, or transporting women for immoral purposes.

For the definitions included below, “...a word importing the masculine gender only may extend and be applied to females as well as males” (KRS 446.020). Thus, any reference to “he” in the descriptions below also includes females as well.

170 Sex Offense- Includes the following offenses defined below: indecent exposure, statutory rape, sexual assault/abuse, and other sexual offenses.

Indecent Exposure- A person is guilty of indecent exposure when he or she intentionally exposes his or her genitals under circumstances in which he or she knows or should know that his or her conduct is likely to cause affront or alarm to another person on school grounds or at a school function. This is not to be confused with violation 175.

Statutory Rape – A person is guilty of statutory rape (in KY, rape in the second degree) when: (a) Being eighteen (18) years old or more, he or she engages in sexual intercourse with another person less than fourteen (14) years old; or (b) He engages in sexual intercourse with another person who is mentally incapacitated; (c) Being twenty-one (21) years old or more he engages in sexual intercourse with another person less than sixteen (16) years old.

Sexual Assault (Abuse) – a person is guilty of sexual assault when: (a) He subjects another person to sexual contact (touching intimate parts) by forcible compulsion; or (b) He subjects another person to sexual contact who is incapable of consent because he: is physically helpless; less than twelve (12) years old; or is mentally incapacitated.

Other Sexual Offenses- a person is guilty of other sexual offenses when they engage in some type of sexual activity not covered above on school grounds or at a school function. (e.g., sexual intercourse or deviate sexual intercourse not covered within other listed offenses)

Each of the codes in the 180 series includes possession and/or distribution of the drug in question on school property or at a school-sponsored function.

180 Other Drug Abuse – Includes possession and/or distribution of controlled substances or unauthorized possession of over-the-counter drugs not specifically listed elsewhere.

181 Alcohol - Includes possession and/or distribution of a liquor, brew, or mixture containing alcohol. Examples include beer, whiskey, and wine.

182 Marijuana - Includes possession and/or distribution of marijuana.

183 Hallucinogenics – Includes possession and/or distribution of a psychoactive drug that induces hallucinations or altered sensory experiences (e.g., LSD, PCP).

184 Amphetamines – Includes possession and/or distribution of amphetamine or methamphetamine.

185 Barbiturates – Includes possession and/or distribution of barbiturates. Barbiturates are organic compounds that produce sedative and hypnotic effects (e.g., Nembutal, Luminal, Seconal, Pentothal).

186 Heroin- Includes possession and/or distribution of heroin.

187 Cocaine/Crack – Includes possession and/or distribution of cocaine or crack.

188 Prescription drugs – unauthorized possession and/or distribution of medications that are available only with prescriptions from a doctor or dentist to a pharmacist.

190 Gambling – staking or risking something of value upon the outcome of a contest, game, gaming scheme, or gaming device which is based upon an element of chance, in accord with an agreement or understanding that someone will receive something of value in the event of a certain outcome, on school property or at a school-sponsored event. This does not include schoolsanctioned activities of chance.

200 Offenses Against Family– All charges of non-support and neglect or abuse of family and children, such as desertion, abandonment, or non-support of spouse or child; neglect or abuse of spouse or child; and/or nonpayment of alimony.

210 Driving under the influence— Operating a motor vehicle with alcohol concentration of or above 0.08 for those above 21 and 0.02 for those under age 21, or while under the influence of alcohol or other substance which impairs driving ability.

220 Liquor Law – Any state and/or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving under the influence. Includes underage consumption. Possession and distribution of alcohol are covered under Codes 1811 and 1812.

230 Drunkenness – Includes all offenses of intoxication with the exception of driving under the influence. In Kentucky, this offense equates to alcohol intoxication and/or public intoxication, which occurs when a person appears in a public place manifestly under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance, or other intoxicating substance.

240 Disorderly Conduct – Committing a breach of the peace. In Kentucky, a person is guilty of disorderly conduct when in a public place and with intent to cause public inconvenience, annoyance or alarm, or creating a risk thereof, he: (a) Engages in fighting or in violent, tumultuous or threatening behavior; or (b) Makes unreasonable noise; or (c) Refuses to obey an official order to disperse issued to maintain public safety in dangerous proximity to a fire, hazard or other emergency; or (d) Creates a hazardous or physically offensive condition by any act that serves no legitimate purpose.

260 All Other Offenses – To include (but not limited to) blackmail and extortion; criminal anarchism; criminal syndicalism; and kidnapping.

280 Curfew and Loitering- (Loitering)
There is no curfew law in the state of Kentucky.

Loitering- A person is guilty of loitering when he:
(a) Loiters or remains in a public place for the purpose of gambling with cards, dice or other gambling paraphernalia, or (b) Loiters or remains in a public place for the purpose of unlawfully using a controlled substance; or (c) Loiters or remains in or about a school, college or university building or grounds, not having any reason or relationship involving custody of or responsibility for a pupil or student or any other specific legitimate reason for being there and not having written permission from anyone authorized to grant the same

290 Runaways – A person can be taken into protective custody in Kentucky when they have been a habitual runaway from his parent or person exercising custodial control or supervision of the child. School personnel cannot take runaways into custody. This code should not be used.

301 Assault in the First Degree

Definition from KRS 508.010:

(1) A person is guilty of assault in the first degree when:

- a. He intentionally causes serious physical injury to another person by means of a deadly weapon or a dangerous instrument; or*
- b. Under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life he wantonly engages in conduct which creates a grave risk of death to another and thereby causes serious physical injury to another person.*

(2) Assault in the first degree is a Class B Felony.

For purposes of the school setting, an individual who intentionally uses a deadly weapon, dangerous instrument, or other means to cause **serious physical injury** to another is guilty of Assault in the first degree. This is the most serious assault; its code should be reserved for situations when the intent of the offender is to cause death or serious injury.

To meet these criteria, the victim has to incur potential life threatening injury, serious disfigurement, or prolonged loss of the use of a body part from the incident.

302 Assault in the second degree

Definition from KRS 508.020:

(1) A person is guilty of assault in the second degree when:

- a. He intentionally causes serious physical injury to another person; or*
- b. He intentionally causes physical injury to another person by means of a deadly weapon or a dangerous instrument; or*
- c. He wantonly causes serious physical injury to another person by means of a deadly weapon or a dangerous instrument.*

(2) Assault in the second degree is a Class C felony.

For purposes of the school setting, an individual who intentionally causes physical injury to another person with a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument or intentionally causes serious injury to another person will be coded as Assault in the 2nd degree.

310, 320, and 330 Terroristic threatening, Bomb Threat, and Chemical/Biological/Nuclear Threats

(1) A person is guilty of one of these offenses when he or she:

- (a) Intentionally makes false statements that he or she or another person has placed weapon of mass destruction on:*
 - 1. The real property or any building of any public or private elementary or secondary school, vocational school, or institution of postsecondary education;*

2. A school bus or other vehicle owned, operated, or leased by a school;
 3. The real property or any building public or private that is the site of an official school sanctioned function; or
 4. The real property or any building owned or leased by a government agency; or
- (2) Intentionally and without lawful authority, places a counterfeit weapon of mass destruction at any location or on any object specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection.
- (3) Intentionally:
- (a) With respect to a school function, threatens to commit any act likely to result in death or serious physical injury to any student group, teacher, volunteer worker, or employee of a public or private elementary or secondary school, vocational school, or institution of postsecondary education, or to any other person reasonably expected to lawfully be on school property or at a school-sanctioned activity, if the threat is related to their employment by a school, or work or attendance at school, or a school function. A threat directed at a person or persons or at a school does not need to identify a specific person or persons or school in order for a violation of this section to occur;
 - (b) Makes false statements that he or she has placed a weapon of mass destruction at any location other than one specified in KRS 508.075; or
 - (c) Without lawful authority places a counterfeit weapon of mass destruction at any location other than one specified in KRS 508.075.
 - (d) He threatens to commit any crime likely to result in death or serious physical injury to another person or likely to result in substantial property damage to another person; or
 - (e) He intentionally makes false statements for the purpose of causing evacuation of a building, place of assembly, or facility of public transportation.

Note: Activating fire alarms would be included in category 310 for reporting purposes.

Note: Bomb threats or threats of other explosive devices will be reported under category 320.

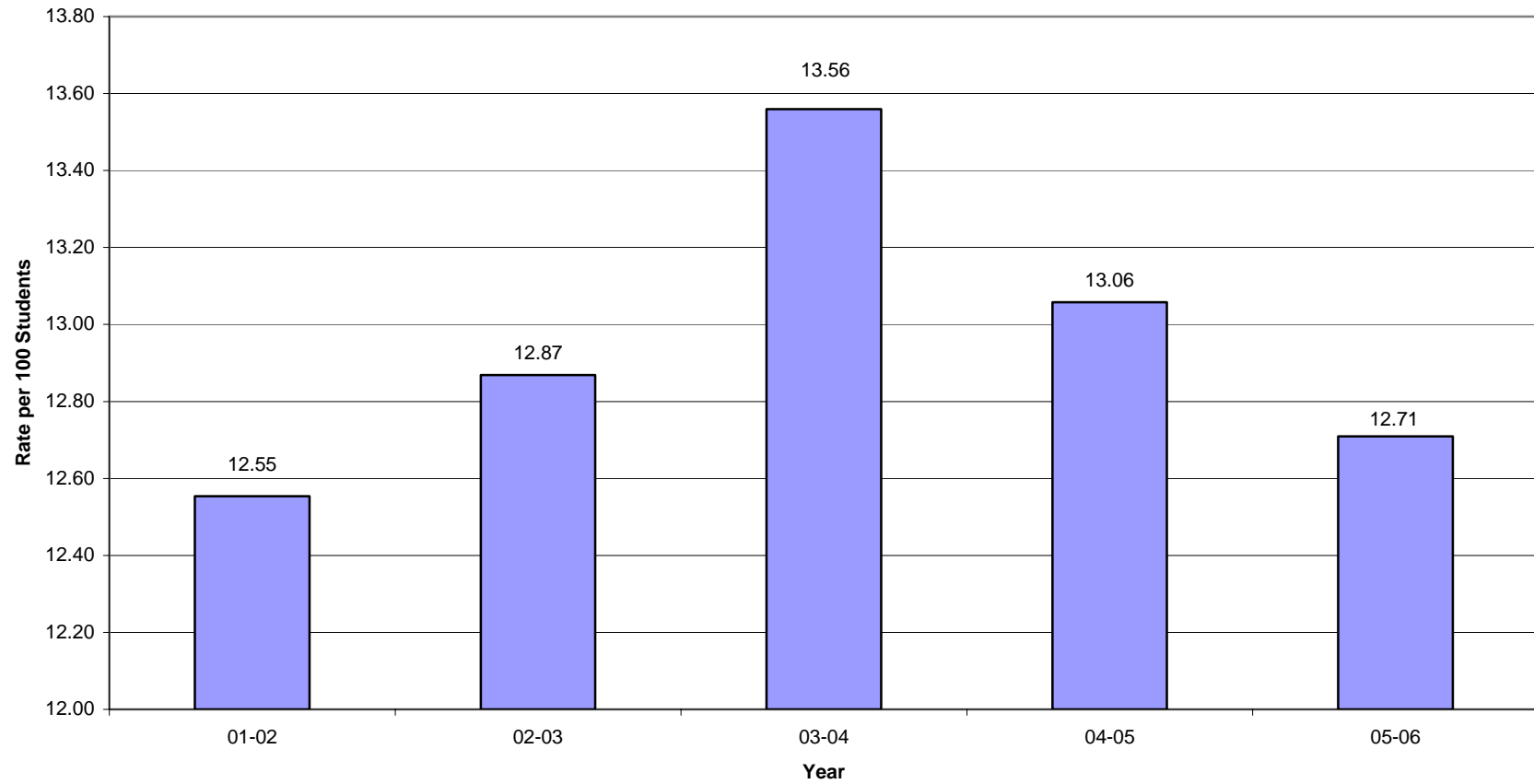

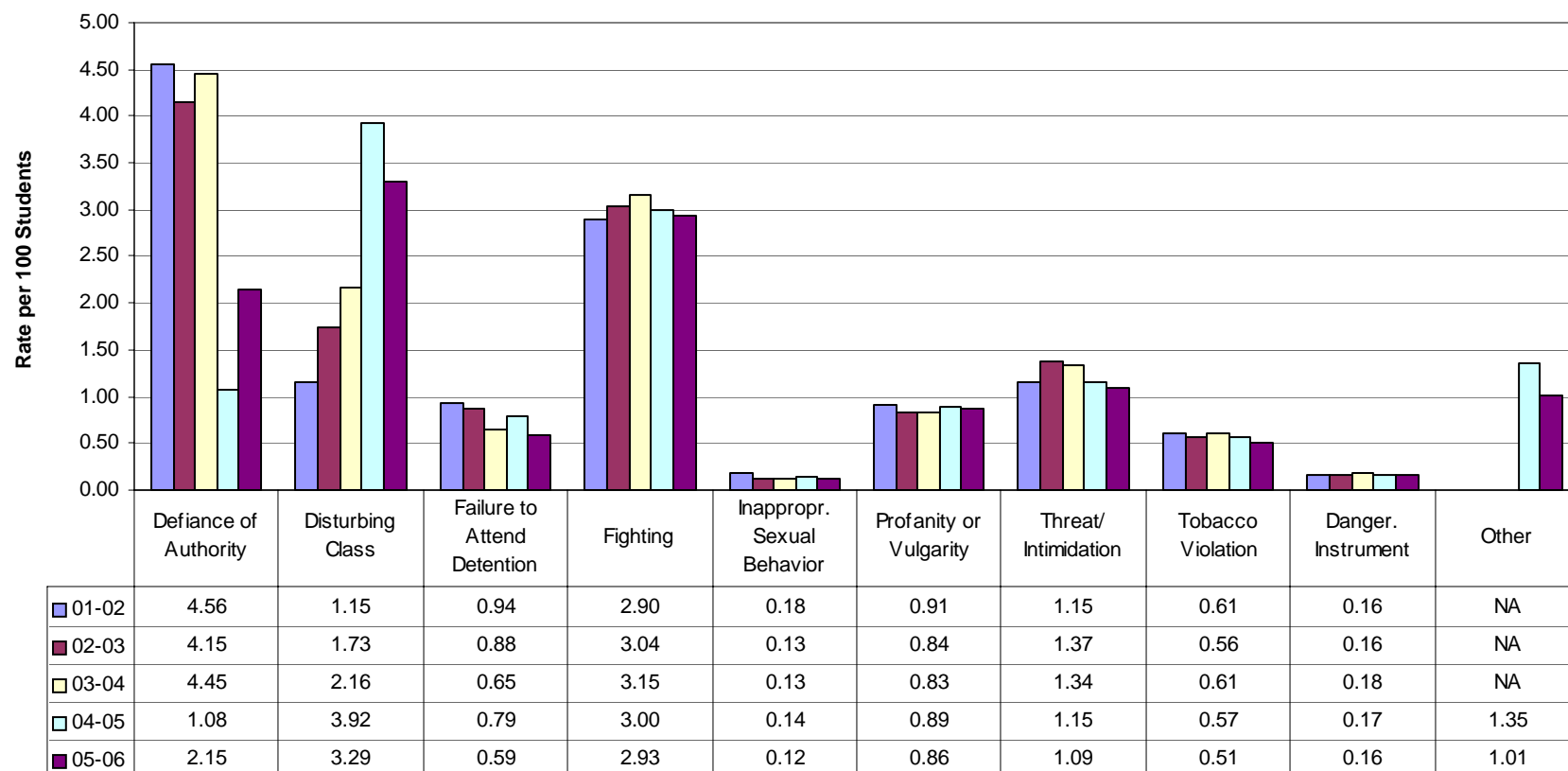
Rate of Total Disciplinary Actions for Board Violations

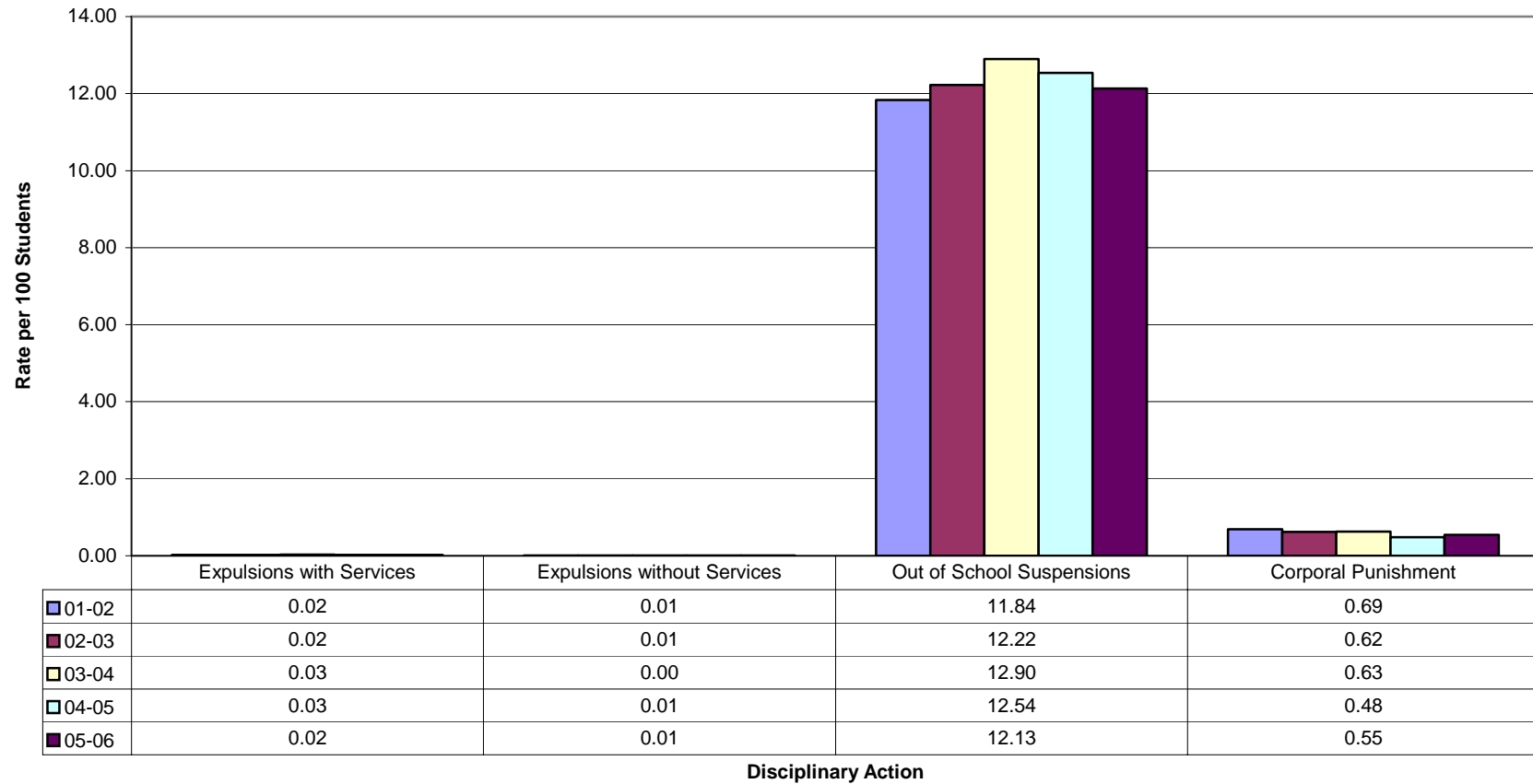
Rate of Disciplinary Actions for Board Violations by Category

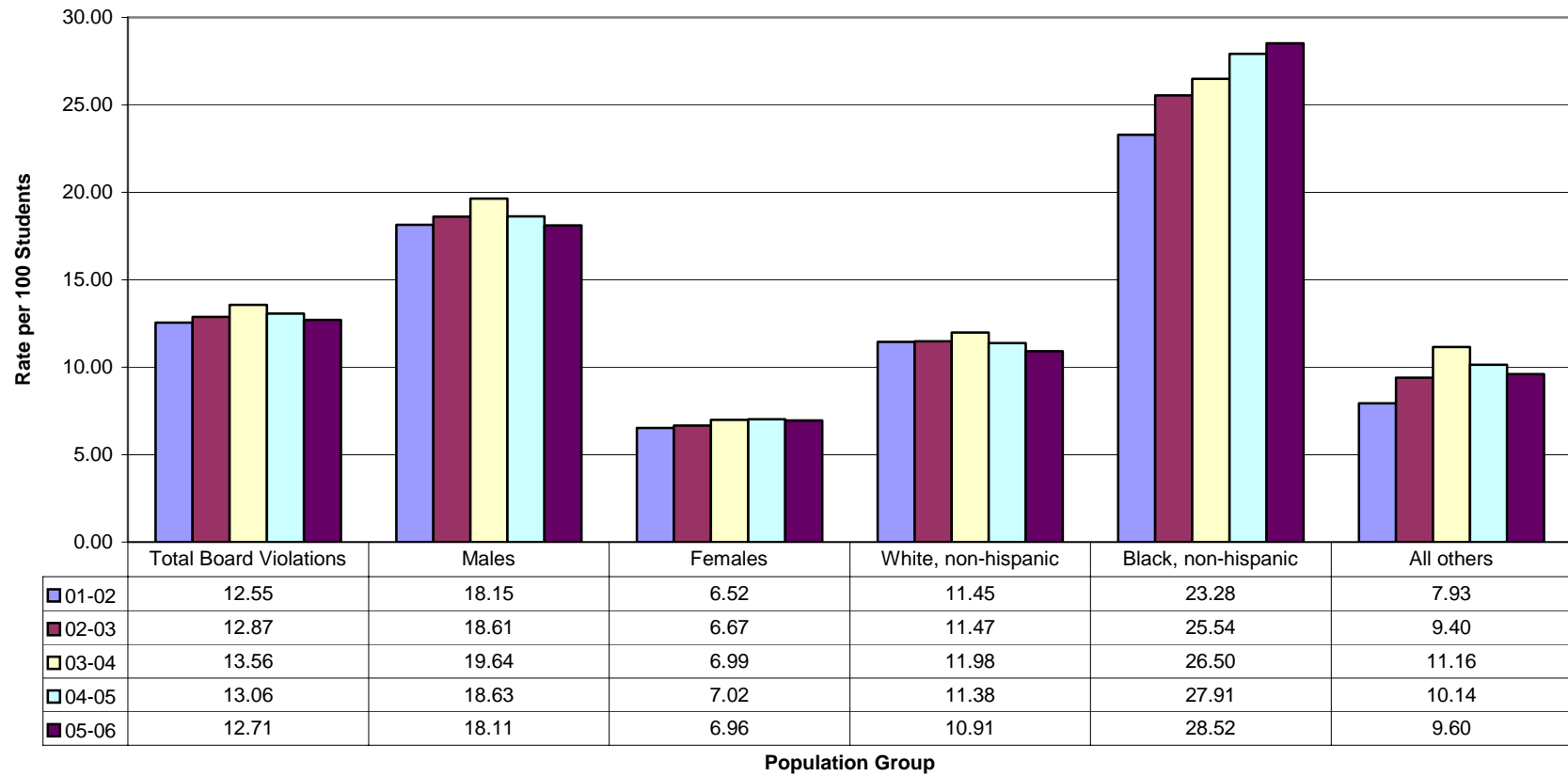
Rate of Board Policy Violations Comparison of Disciplinary Actions

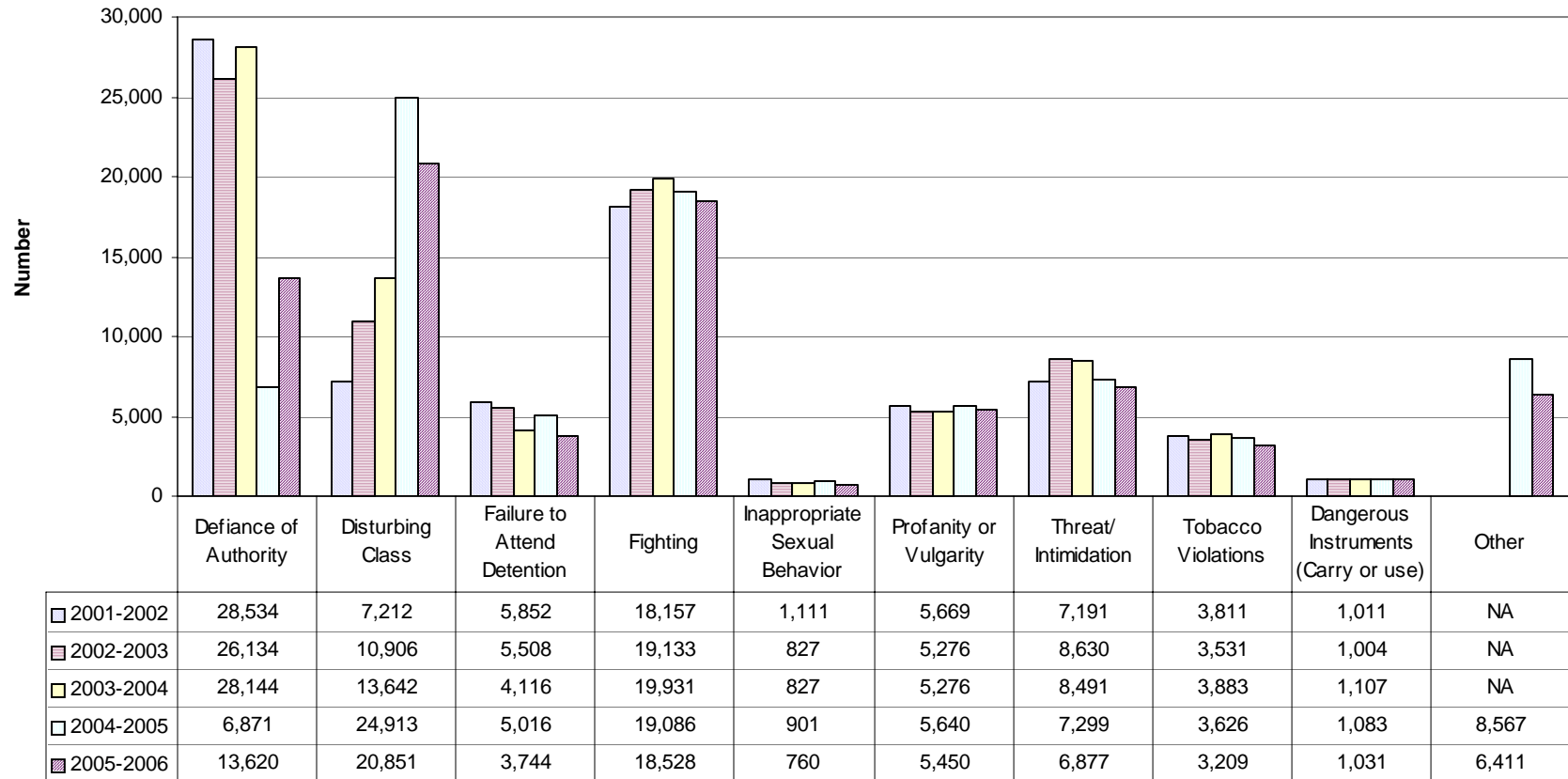
Rate of Board Violations by Population Group

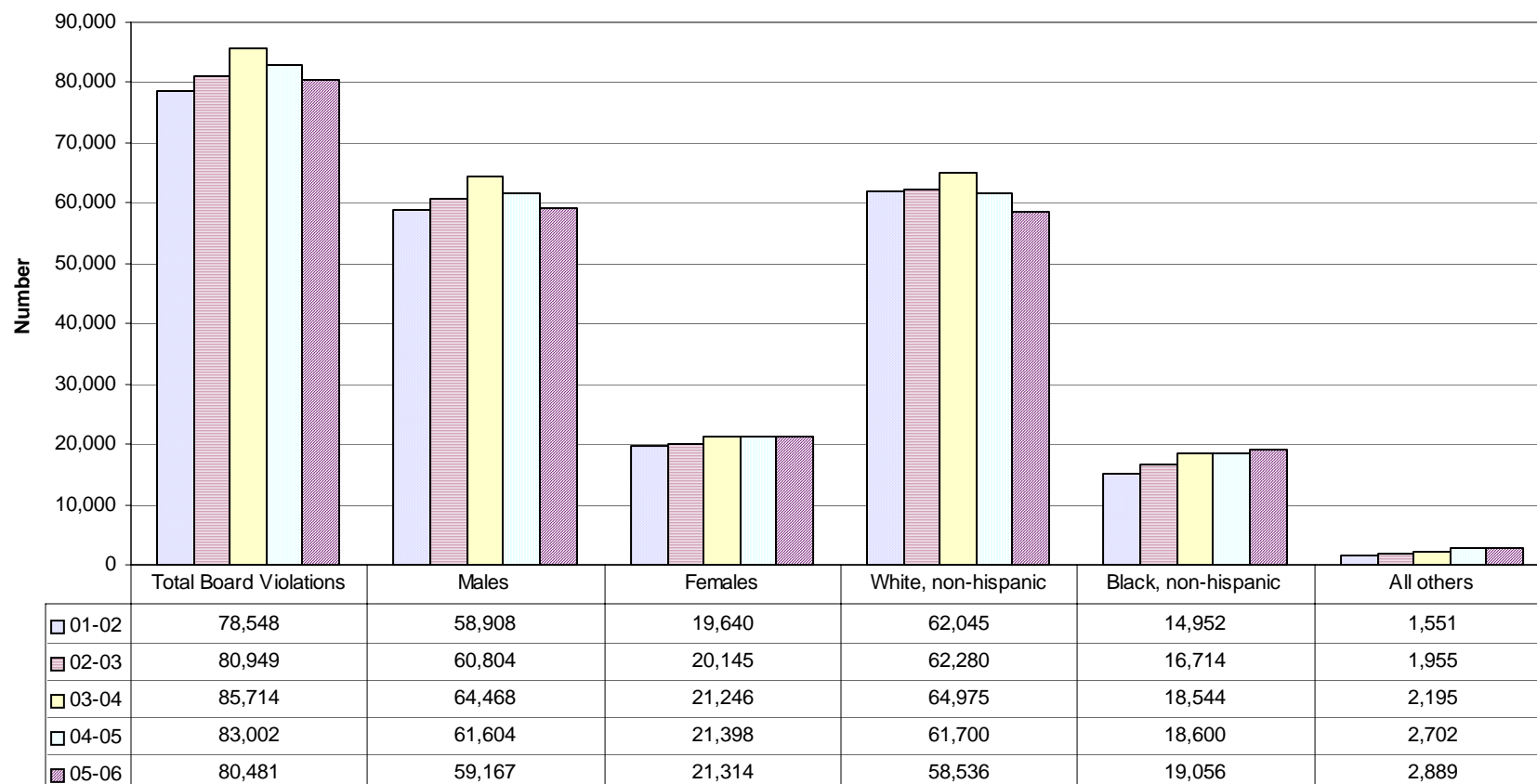

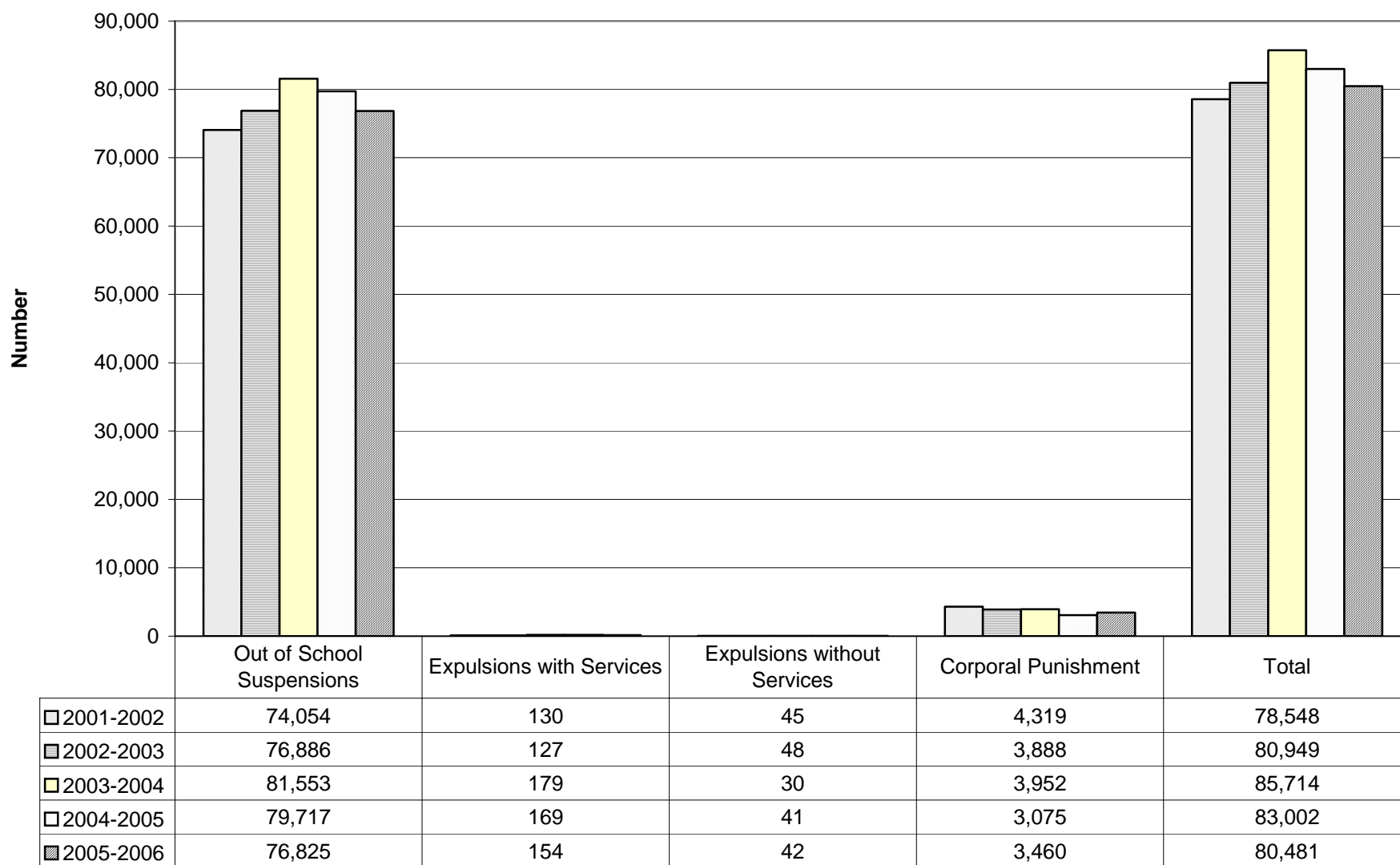

Total Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations by Population Group

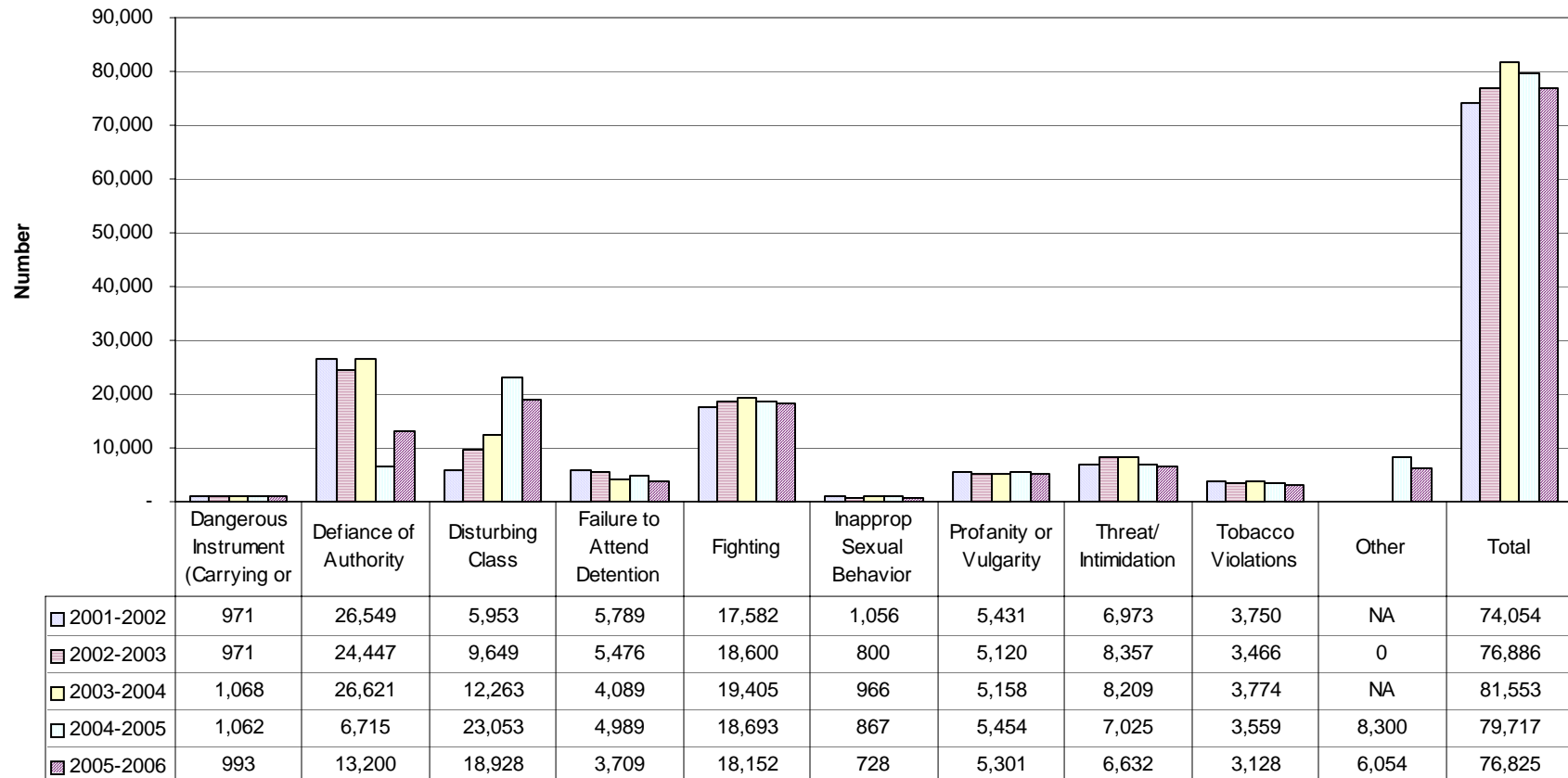


Board Policy Violations Comparison of Disciplinary Actions



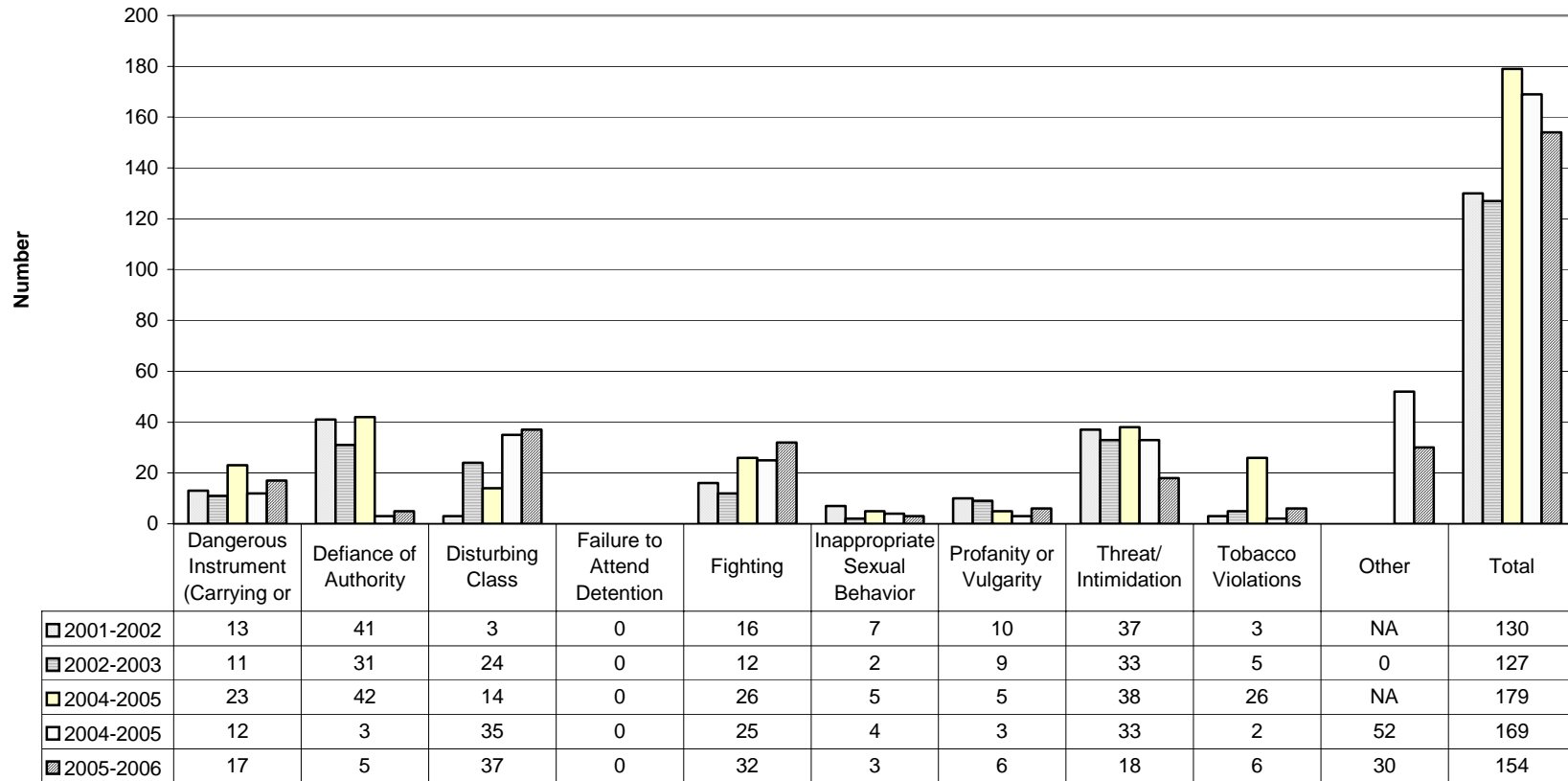

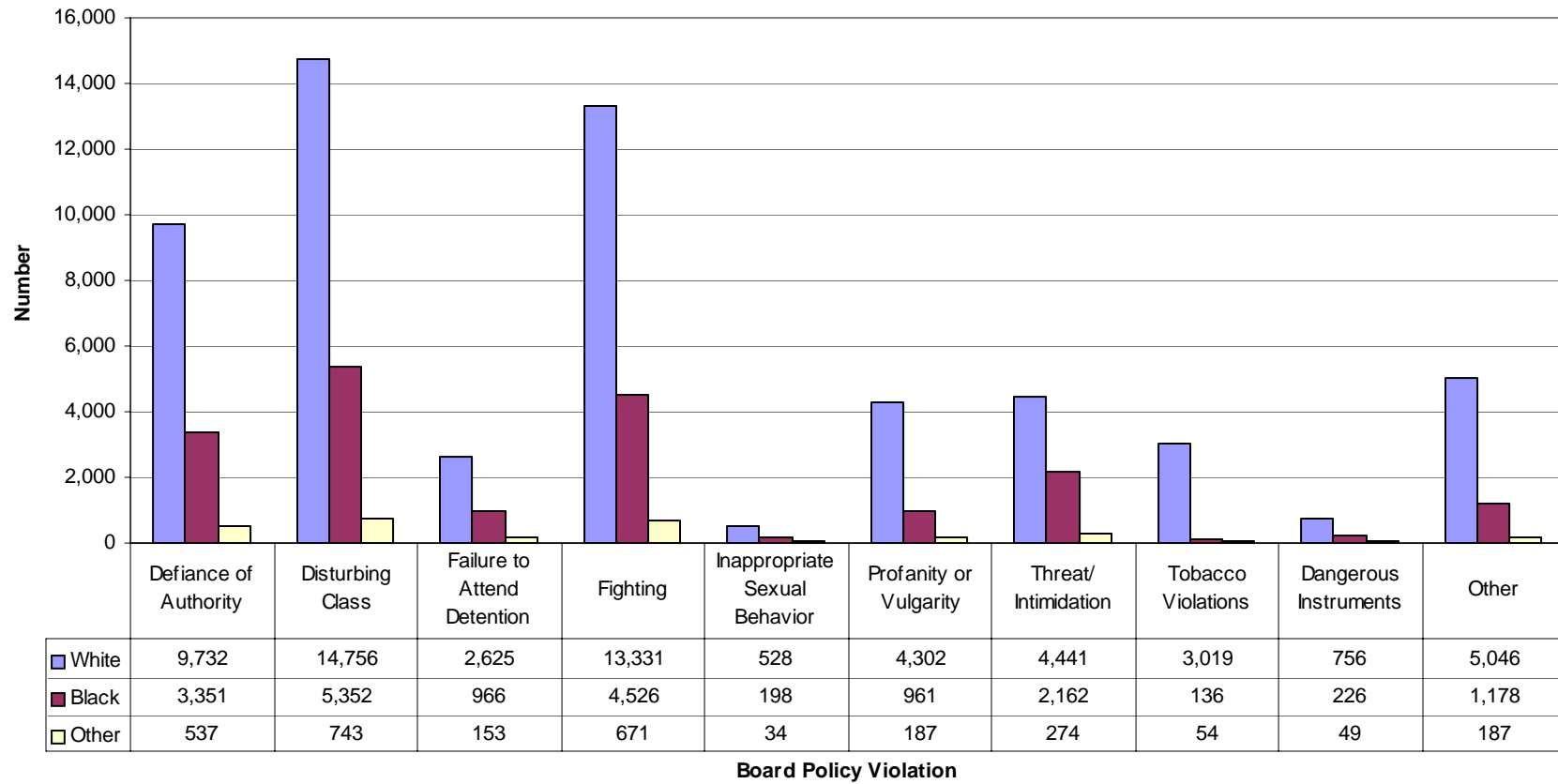
Board Policy Violations Corporal Punishments



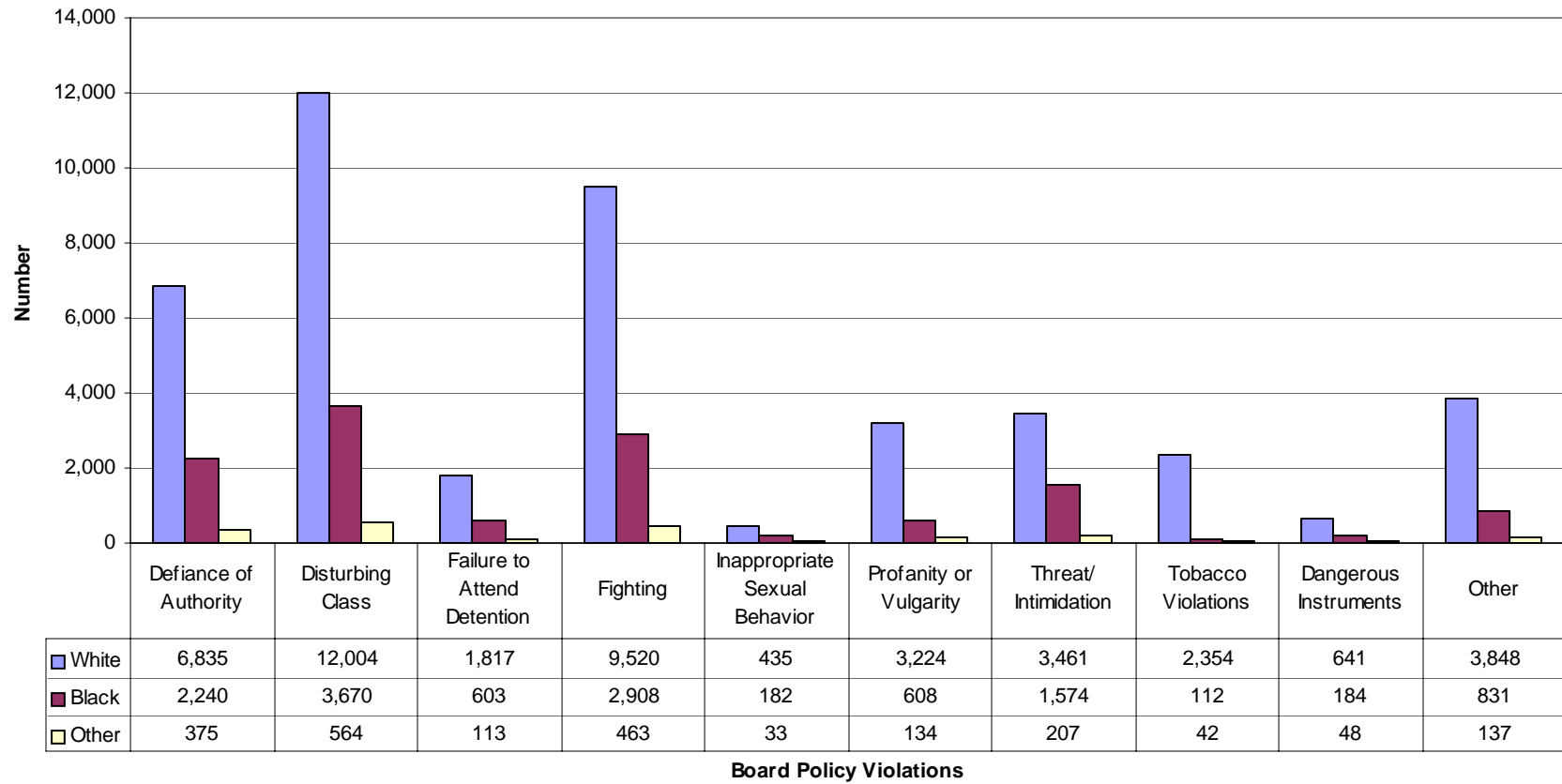
Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations by Gender 2005-2006



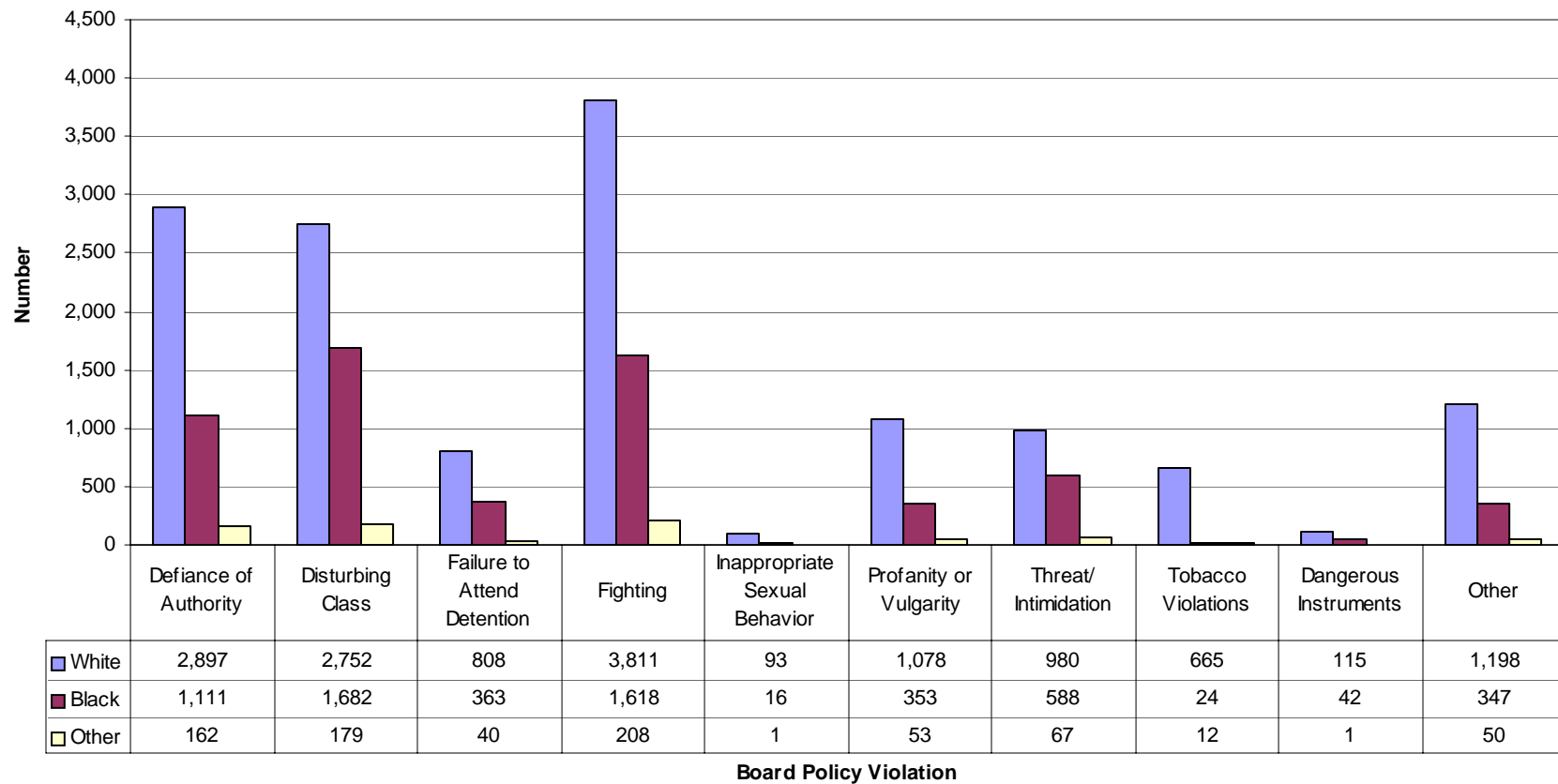
Disciplinary Actions for Board Policy Violations by Race 2005-2006



Disciplinary Actions for Males for Board Policy Violations by Race 2005-2006



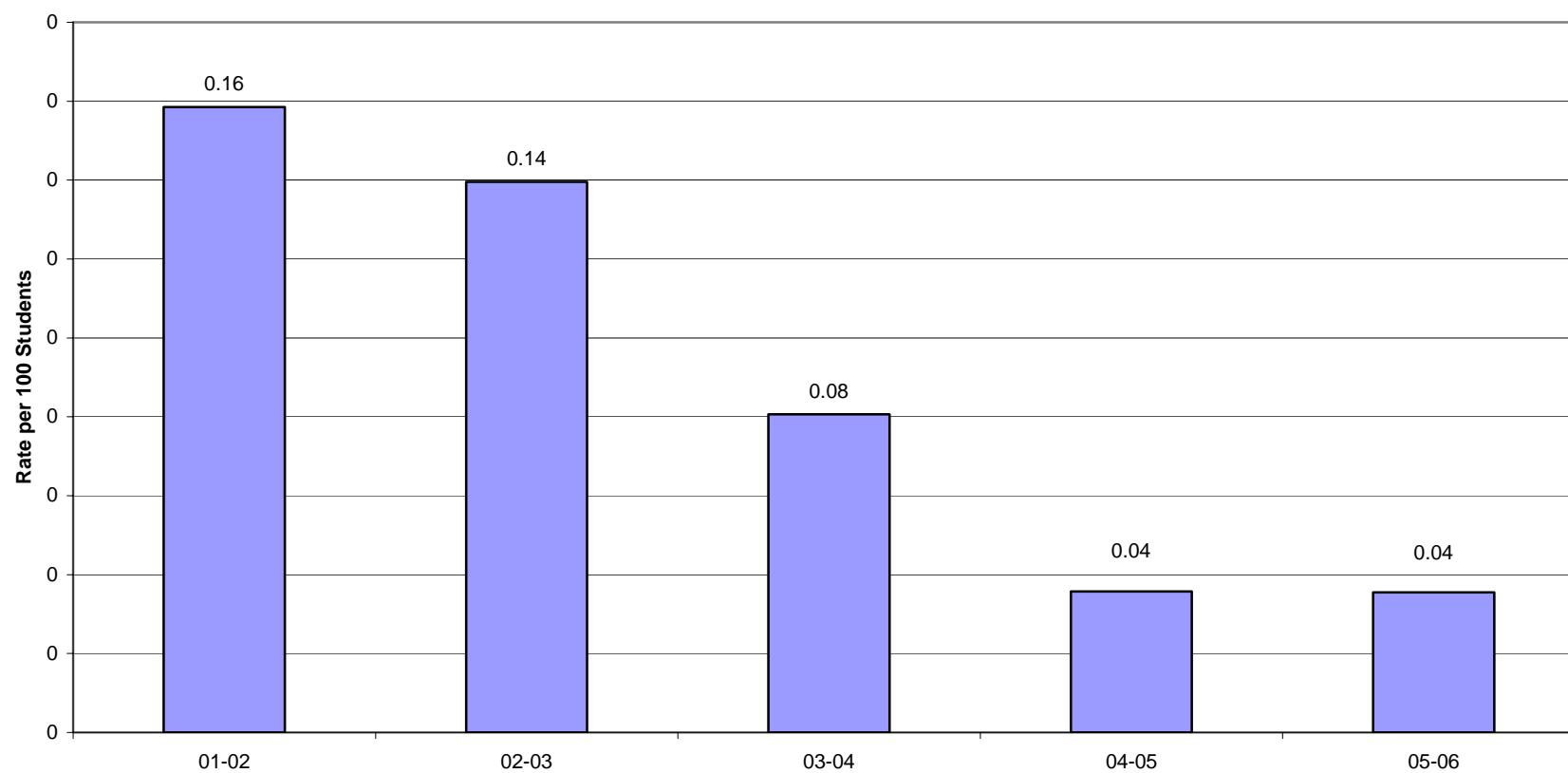

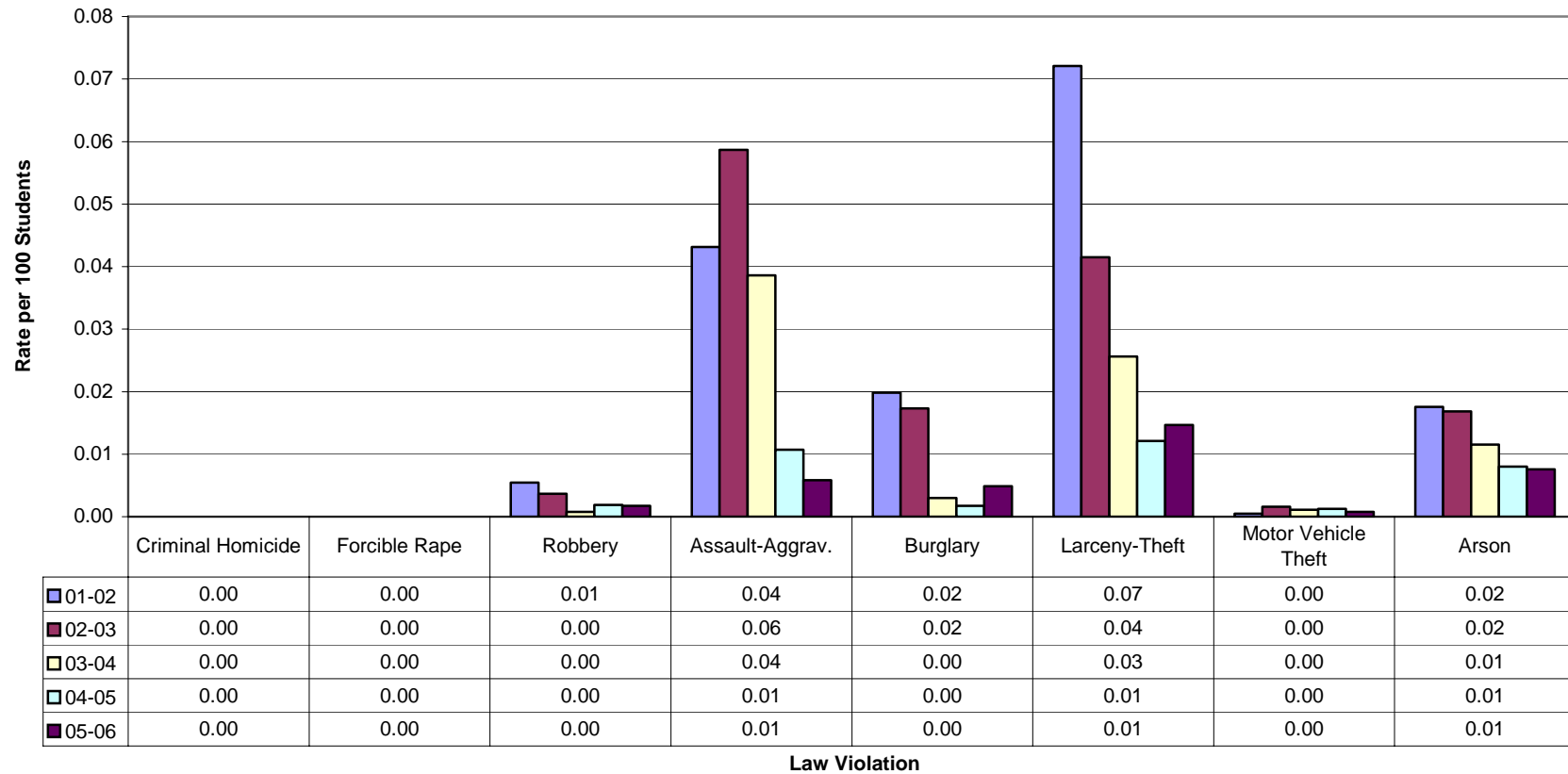

Rate of Total Disciplinary Actions for Part I Law Violations

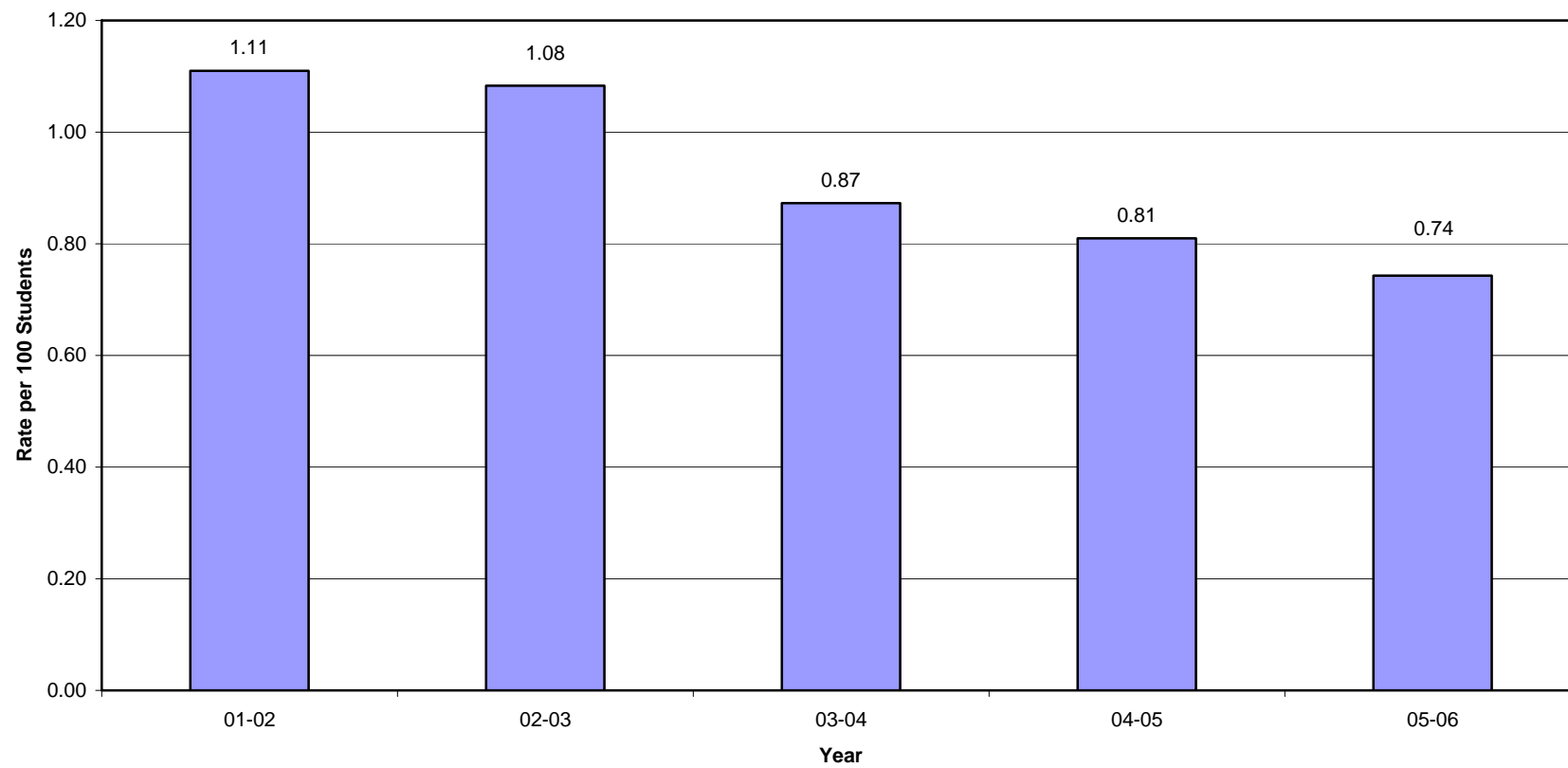


Rate of Disciplinary Actions for Part I Law Violations by Category

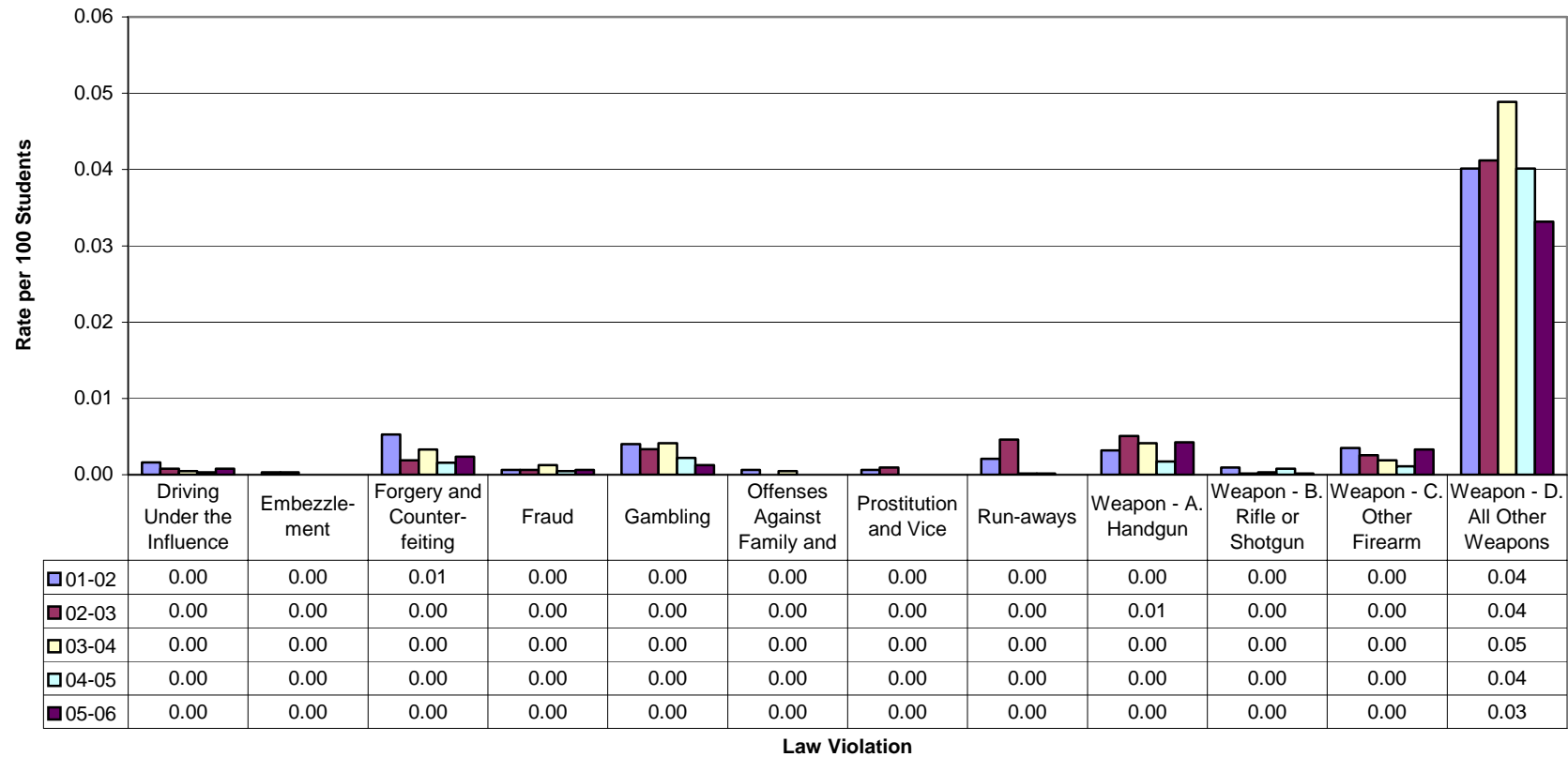


Rate of Total Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations



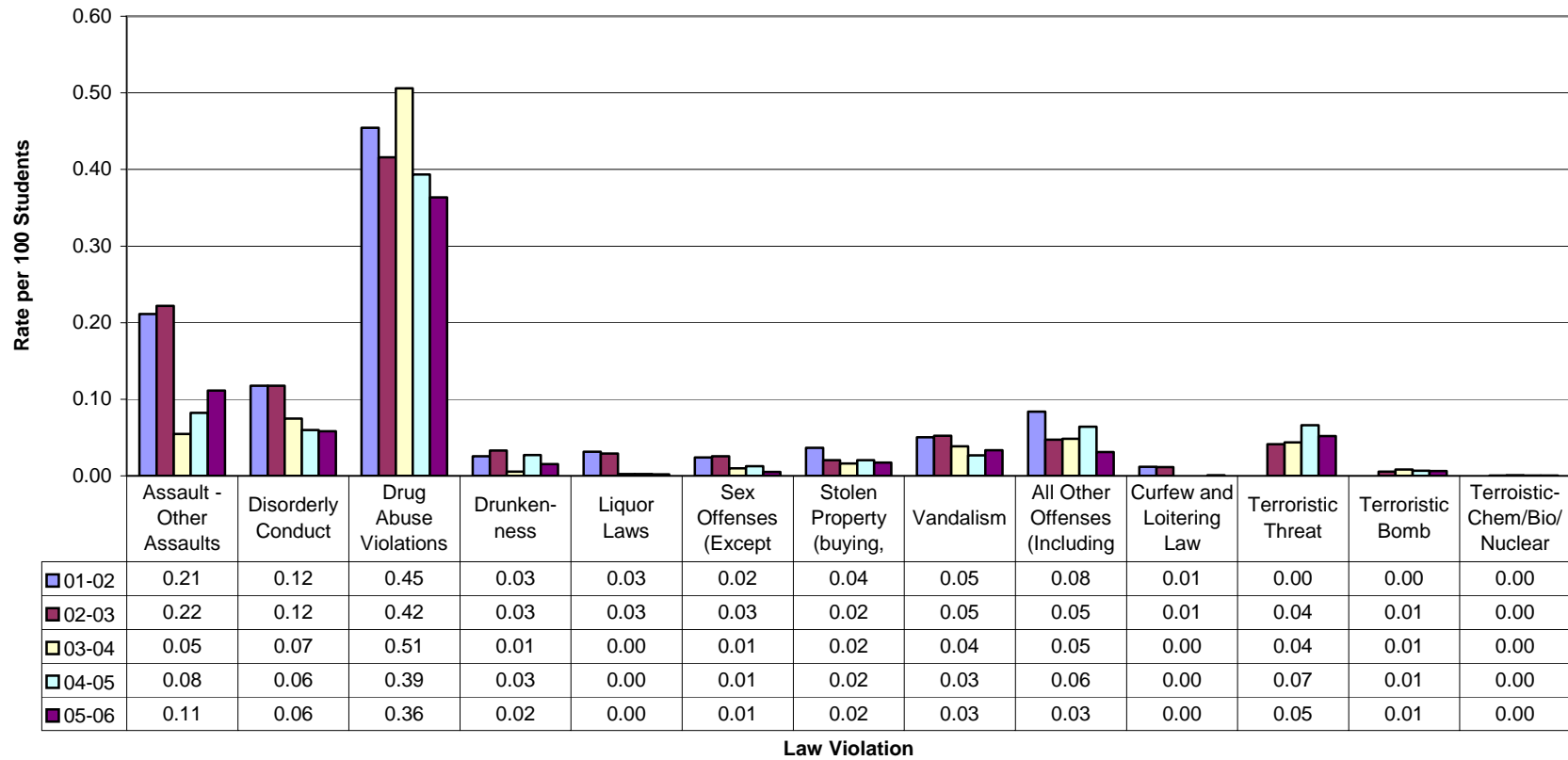

Rate of Total Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations



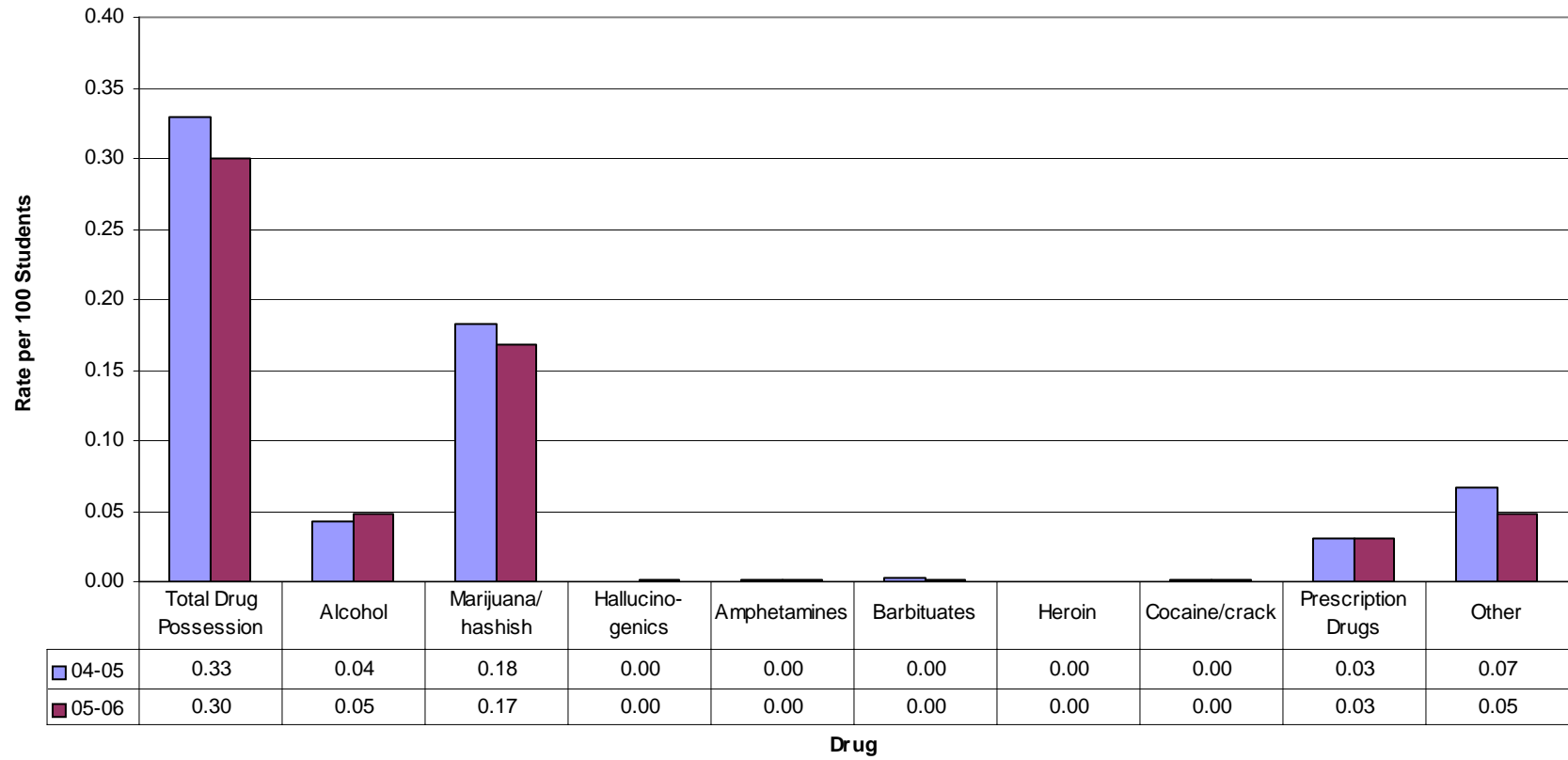
Rate of Total Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations

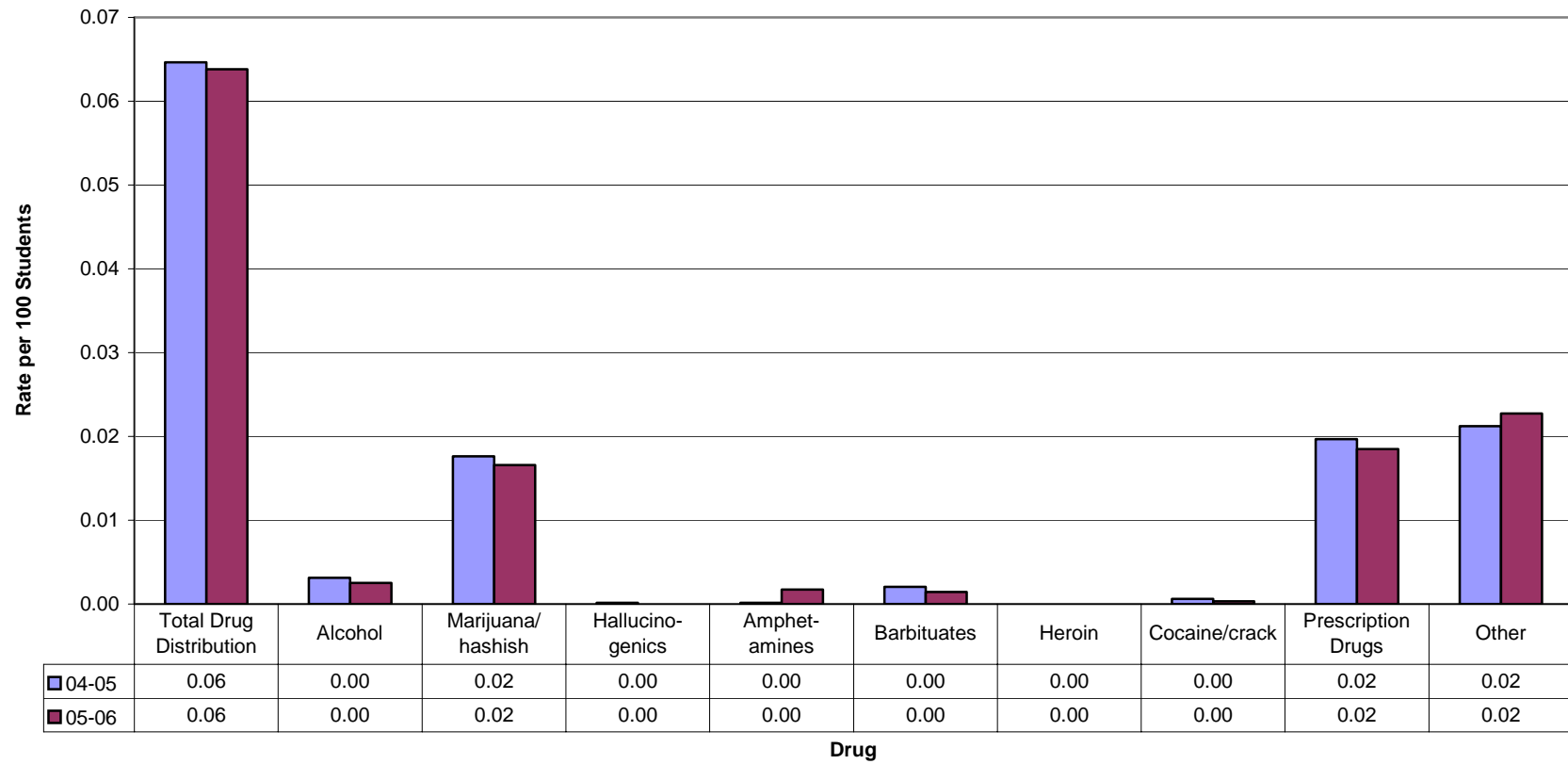


Rate of Drug Possession and Use Violations by Drug Type

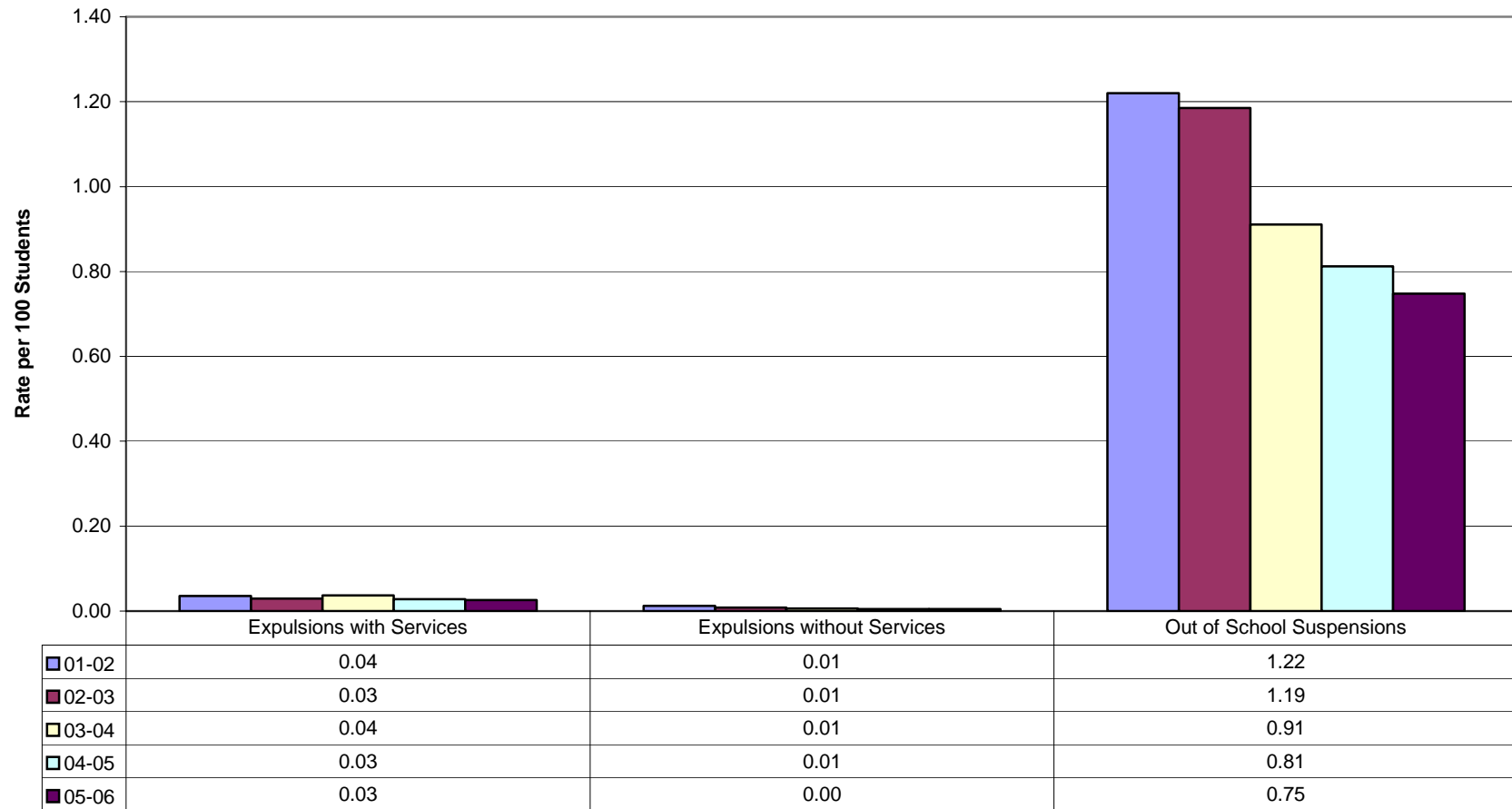


Rate of Drug Distribution Violations by Drug Type



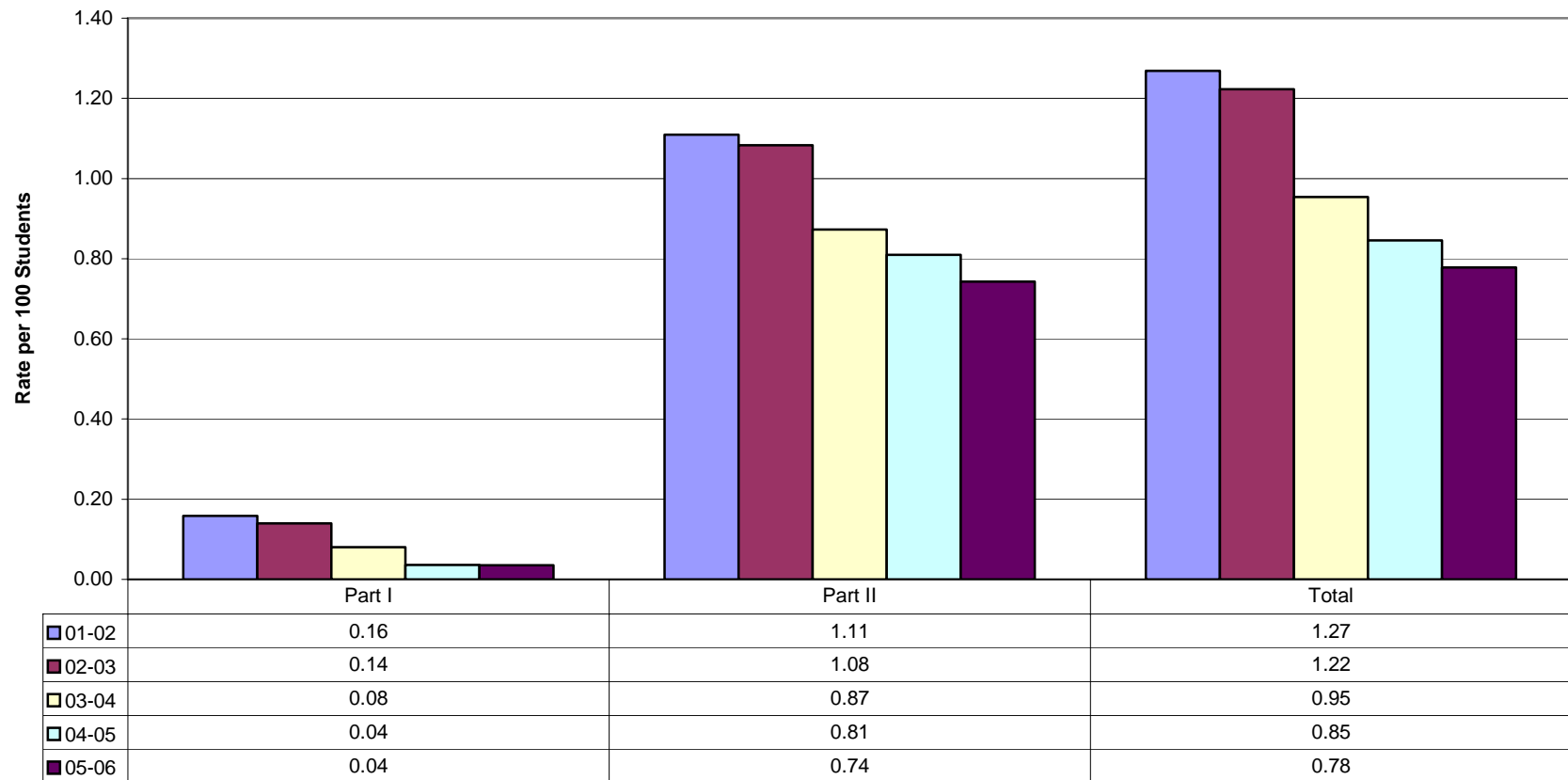
Rate of Law Violations Comparison of Disciplinary Actions

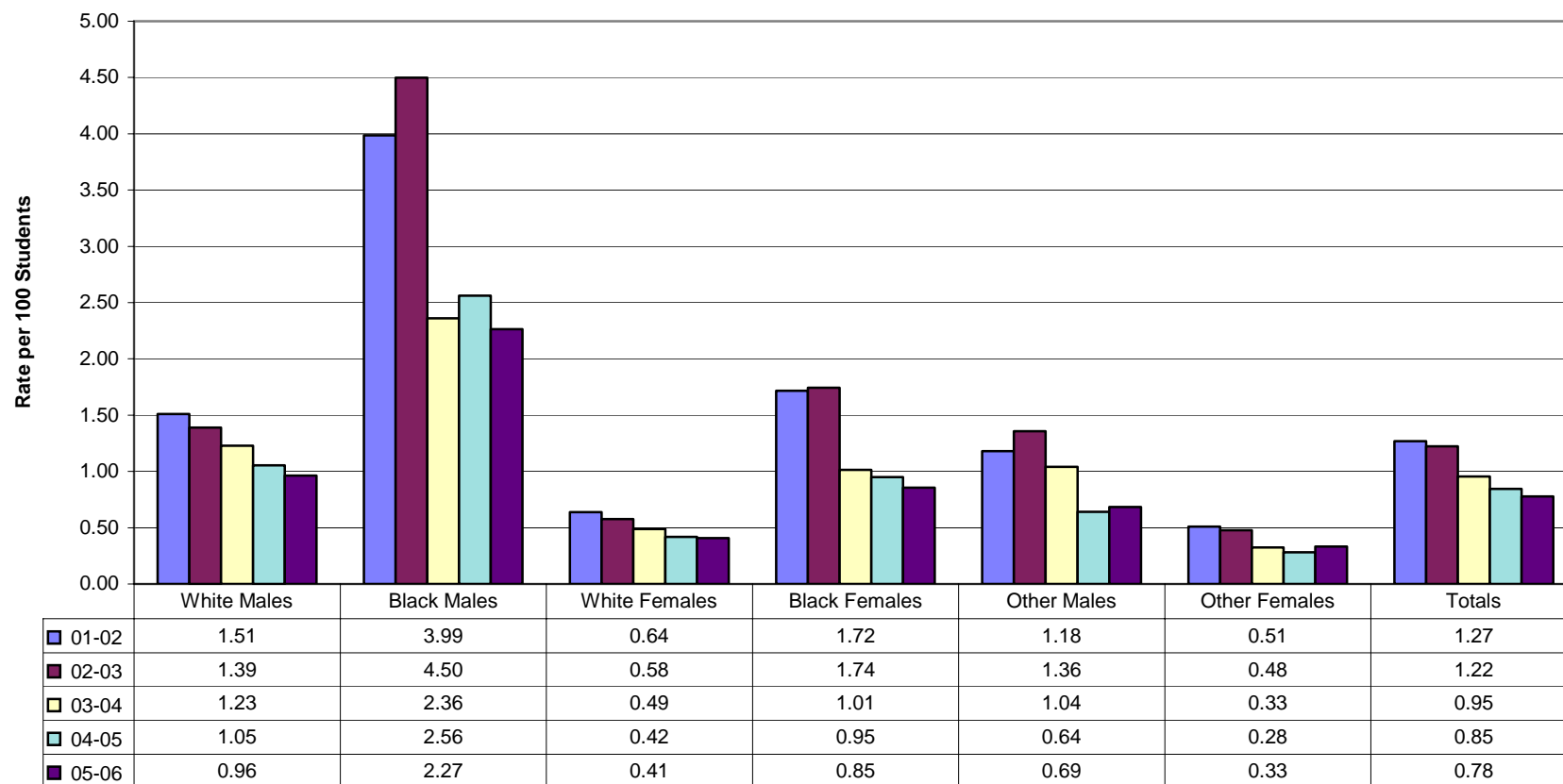


Rate of Disciplinary Actions for Law Violation

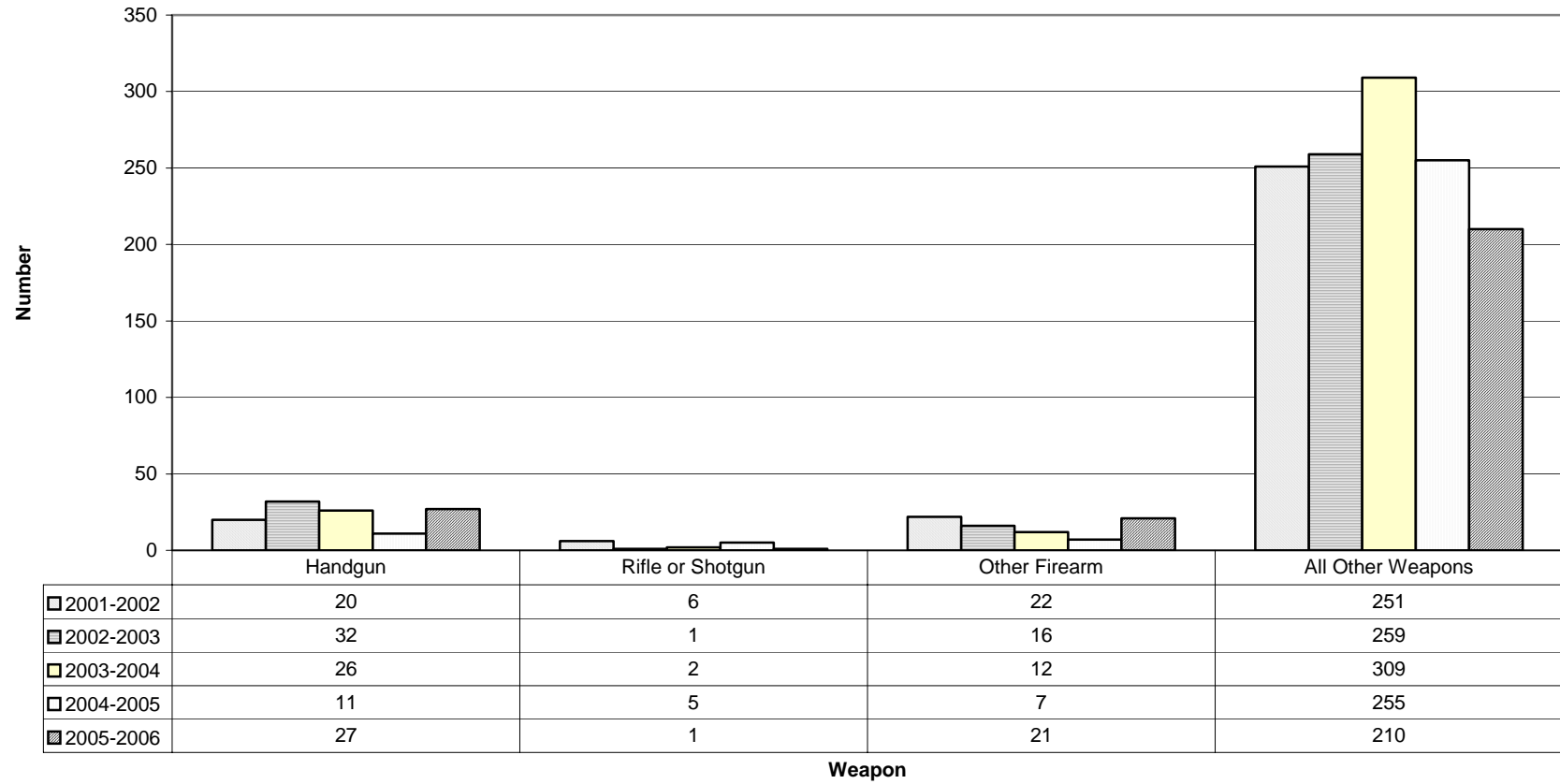


Rate of Disciplinary Actions for Law Violations by Race and Gender

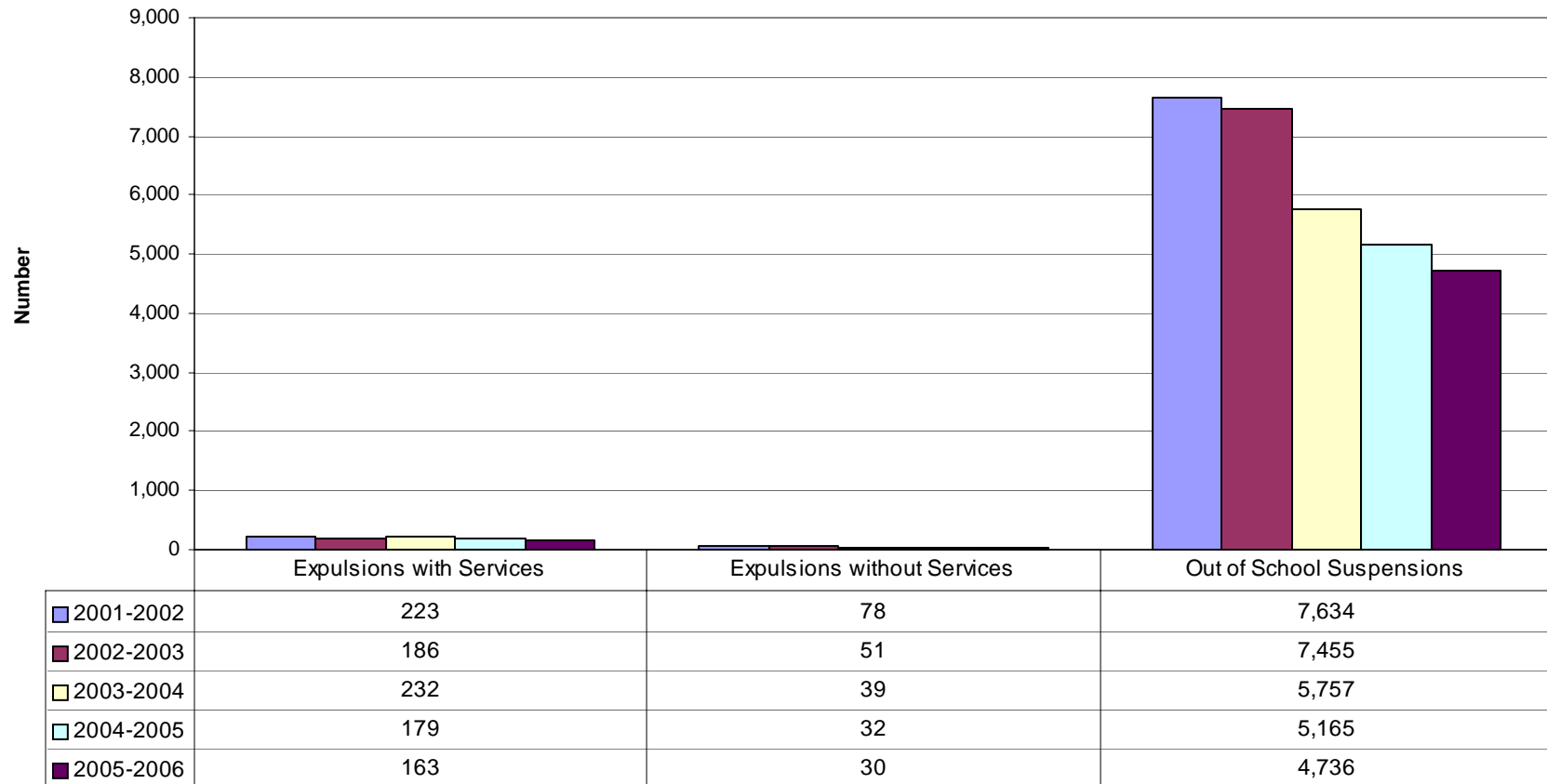

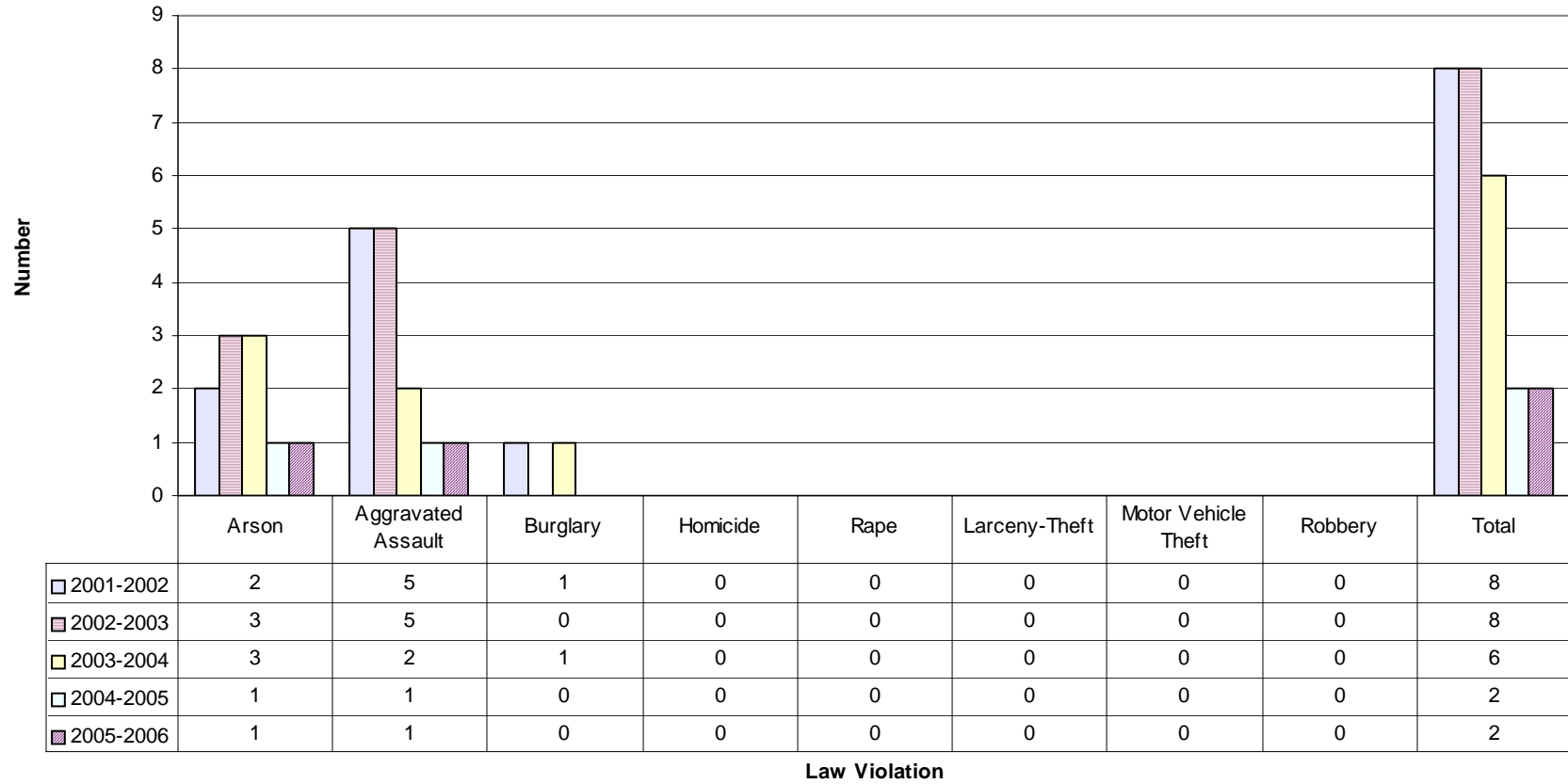


Part I Law Violations Expulsions with Service

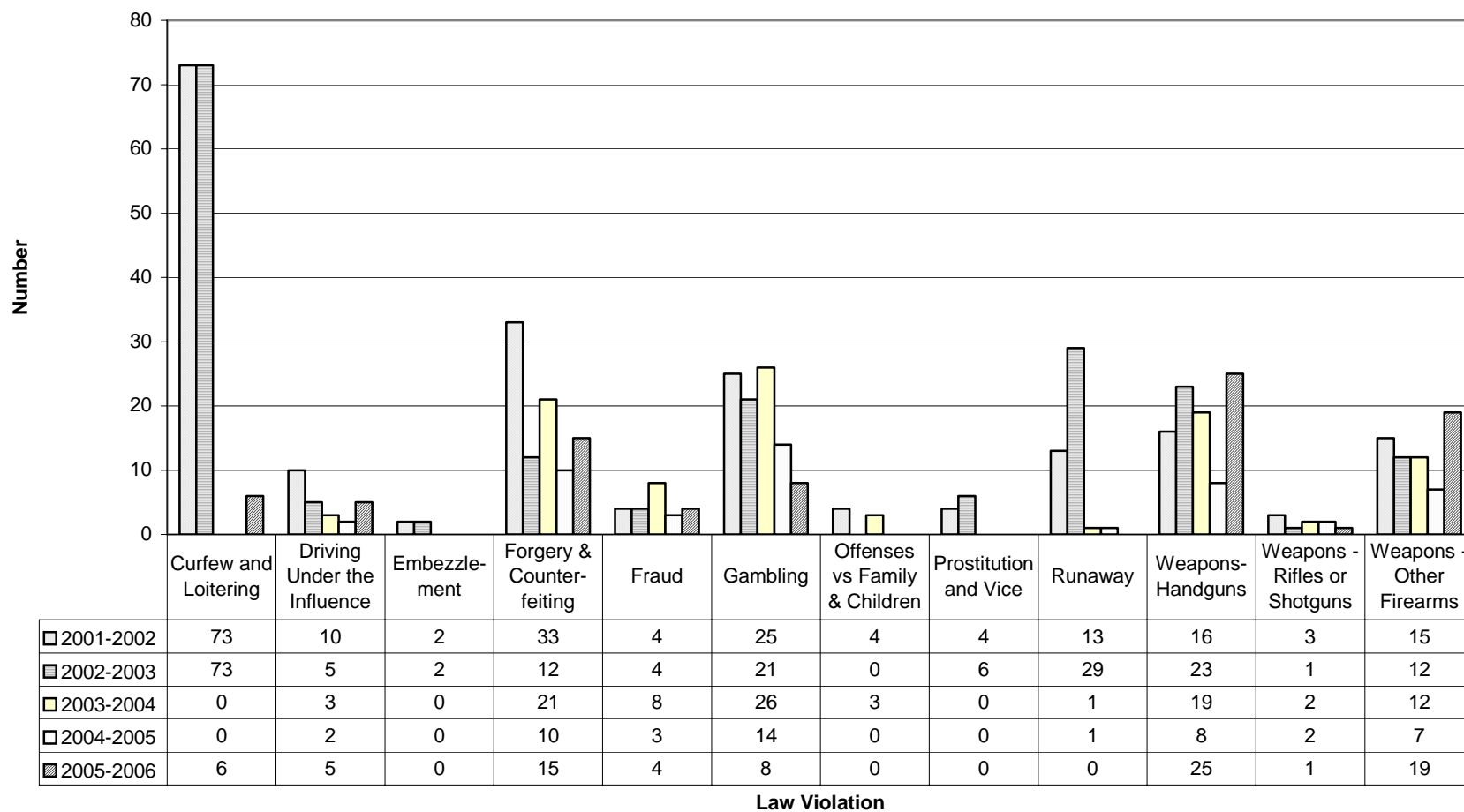

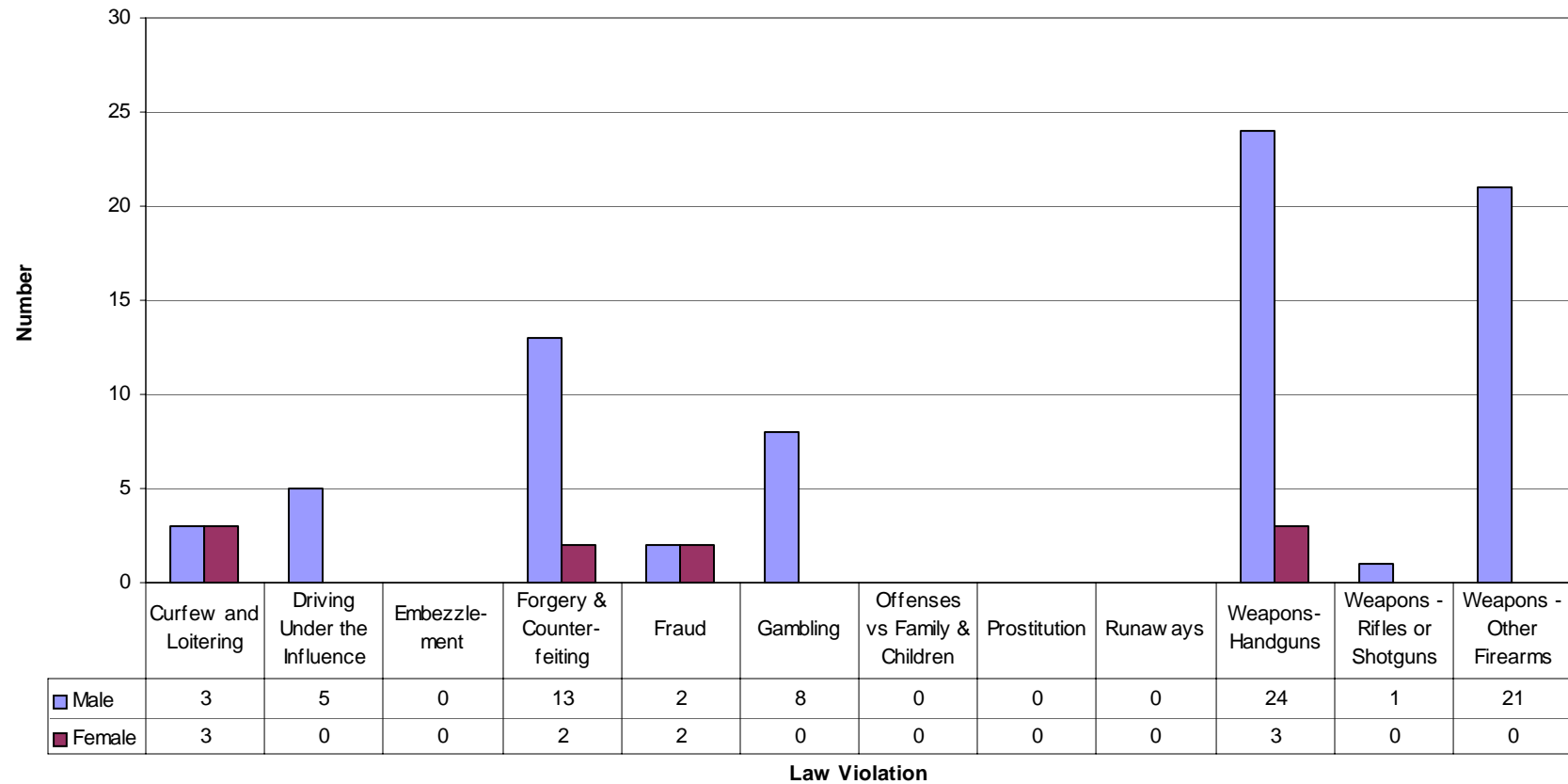
Disciplinary Actions for Part I Law Violations by Gender 2005-2006

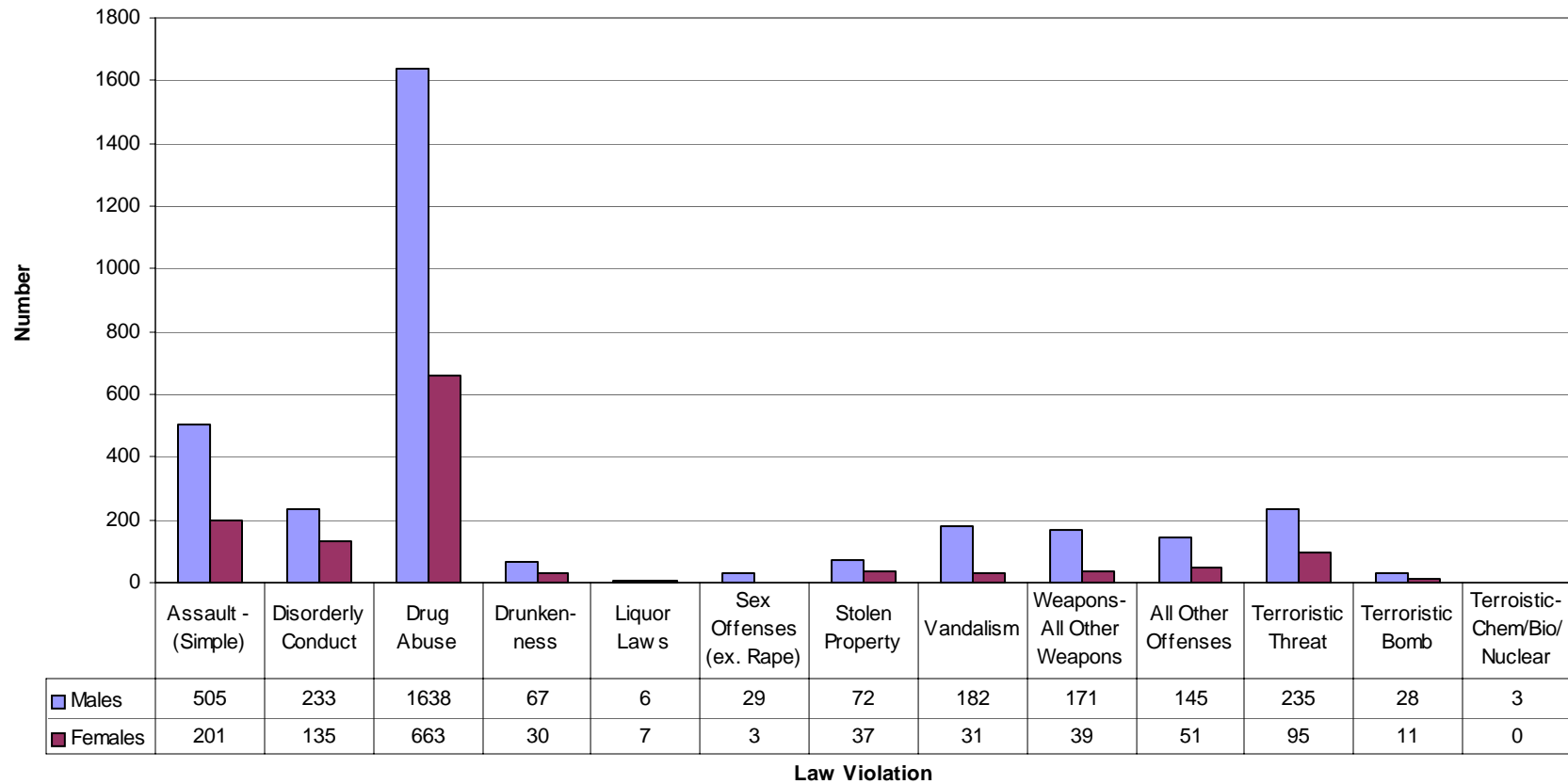
Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations by Gender 2005-2006

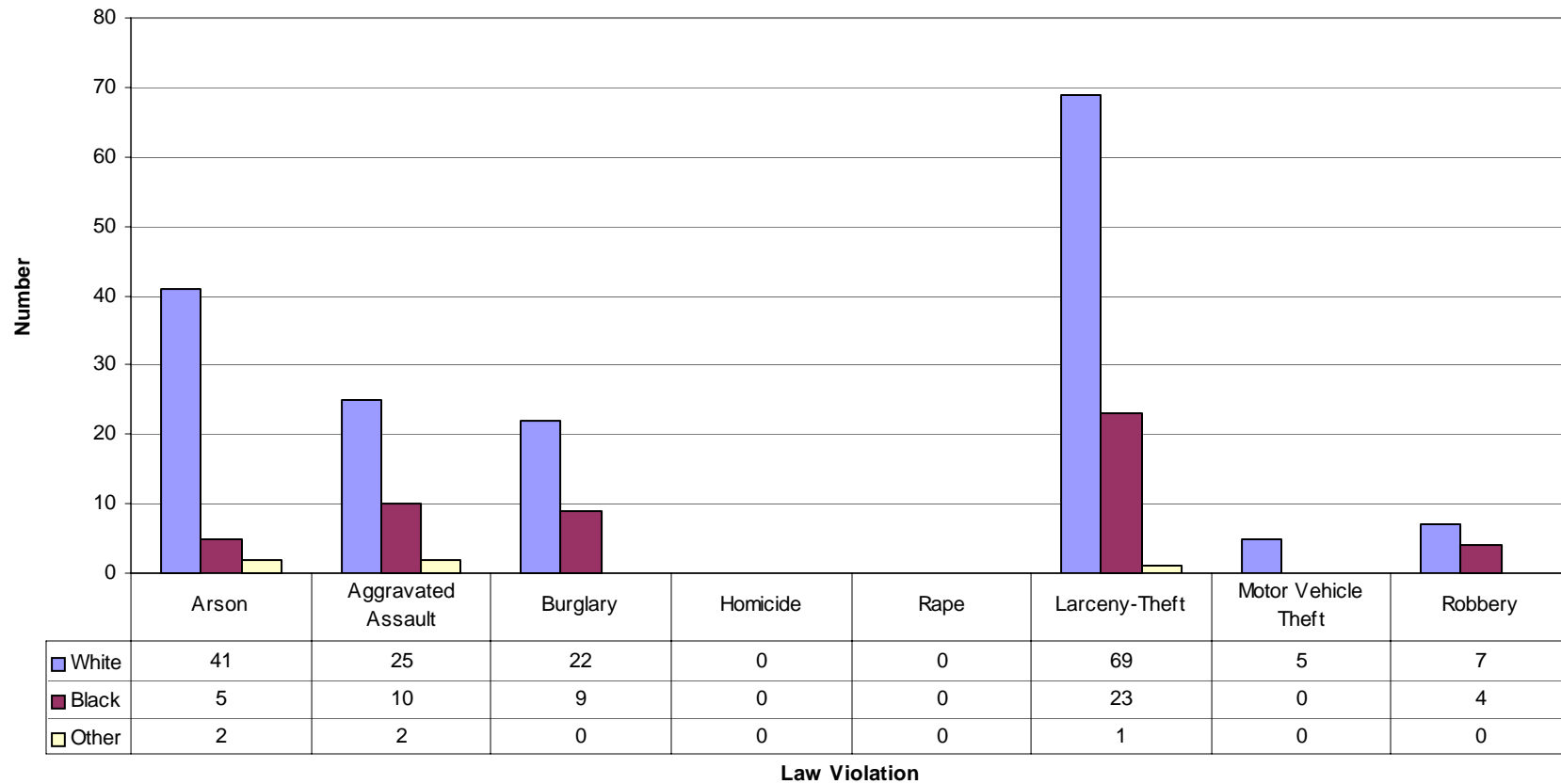


Disciplinary Actions for Part II Law Violations by Gender 2005-2006

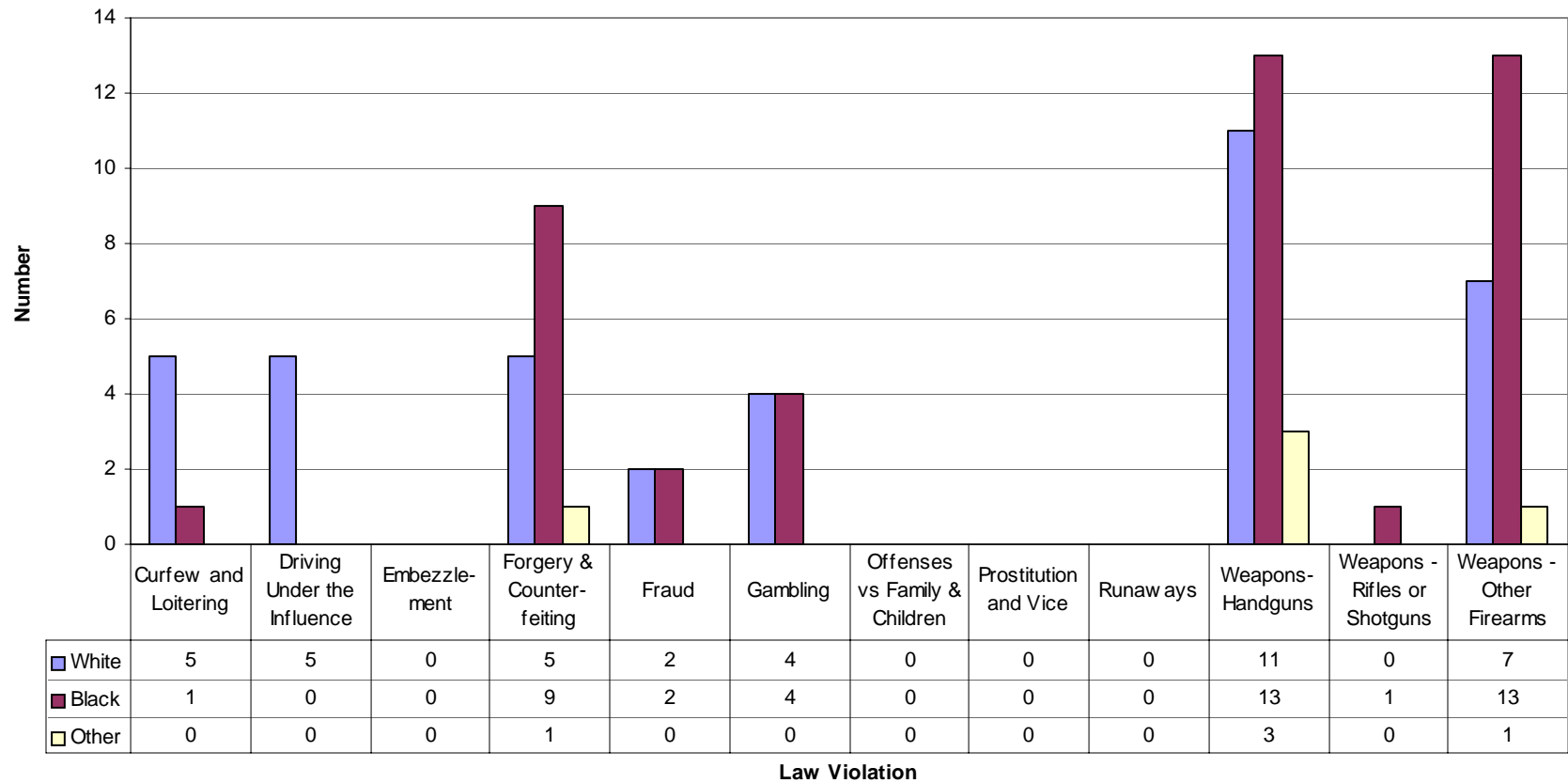


Disciplinary Actions for Part I Law Violations by Race 2005-2006



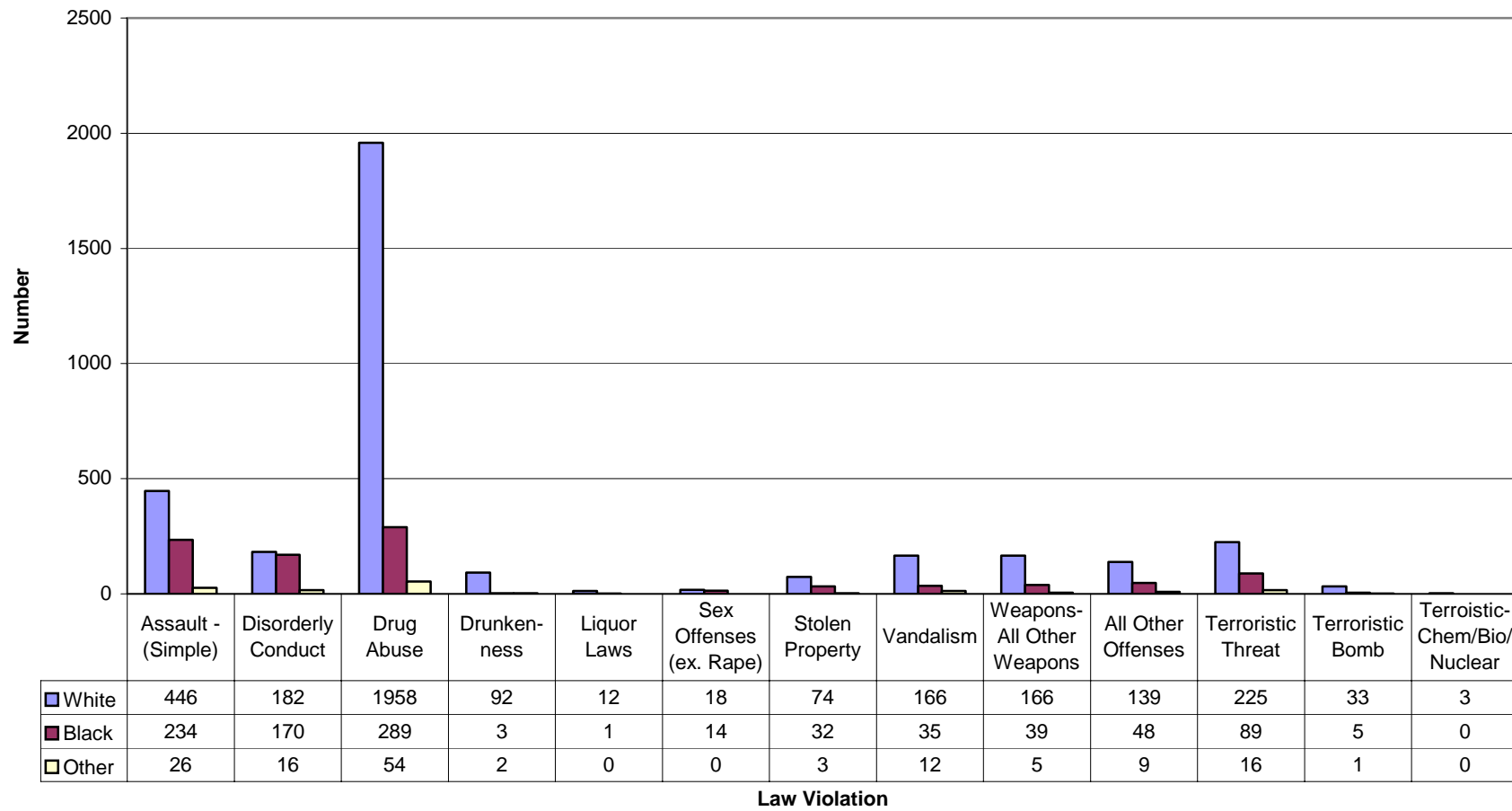

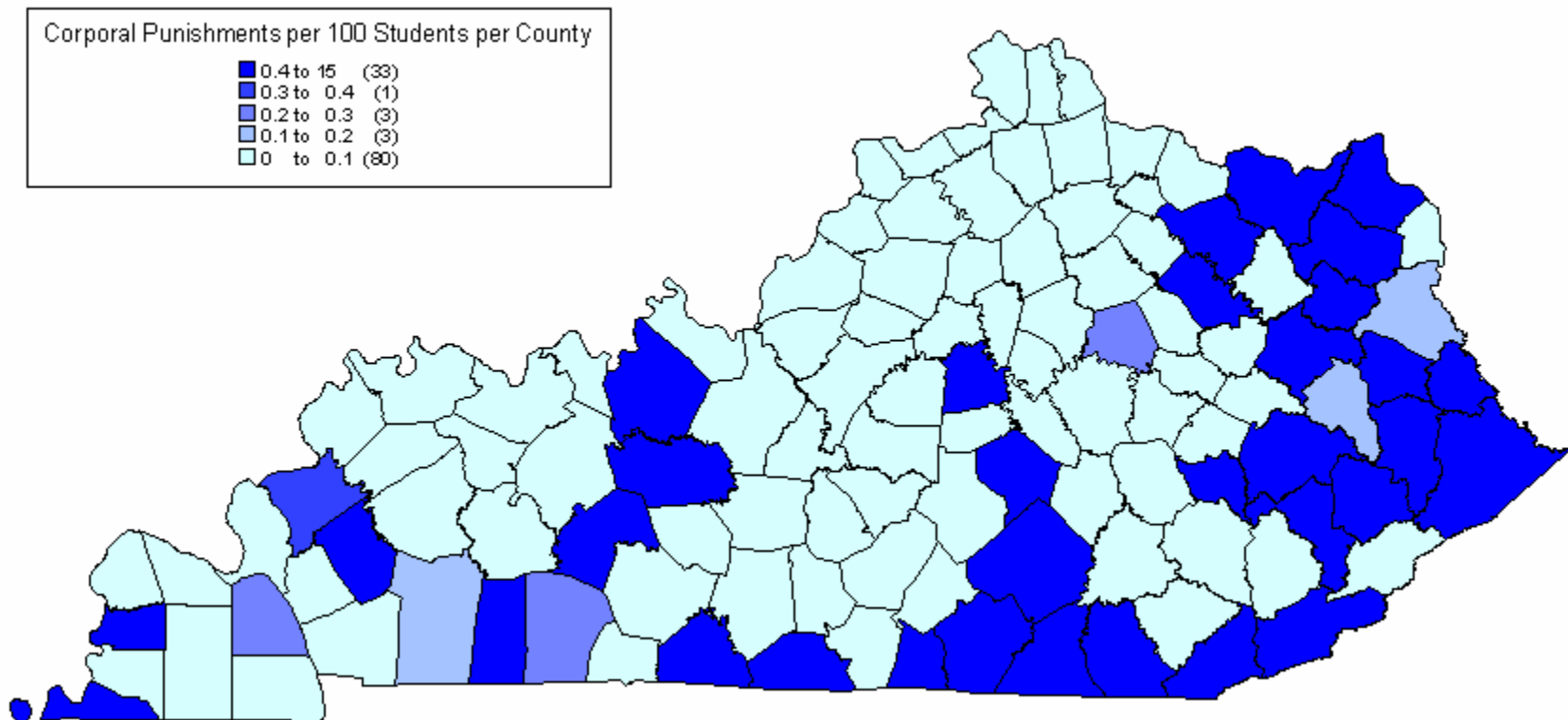
**Suspensions for Violations of School Board Policy Rates per 100 Students
2005-2006 School Year**



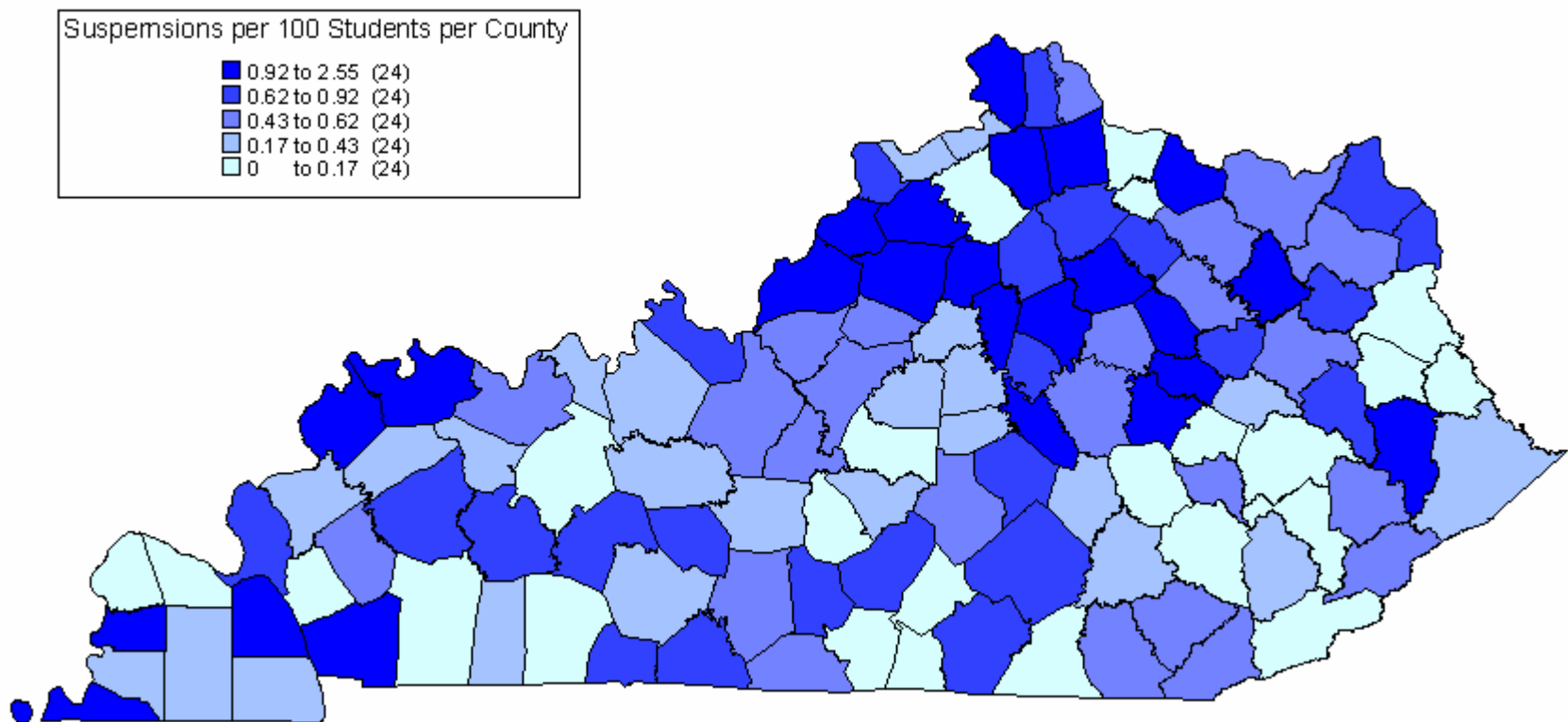
Expulsions for Violations of School Board Policy Rates per 100 Students 2005-2006 School Year



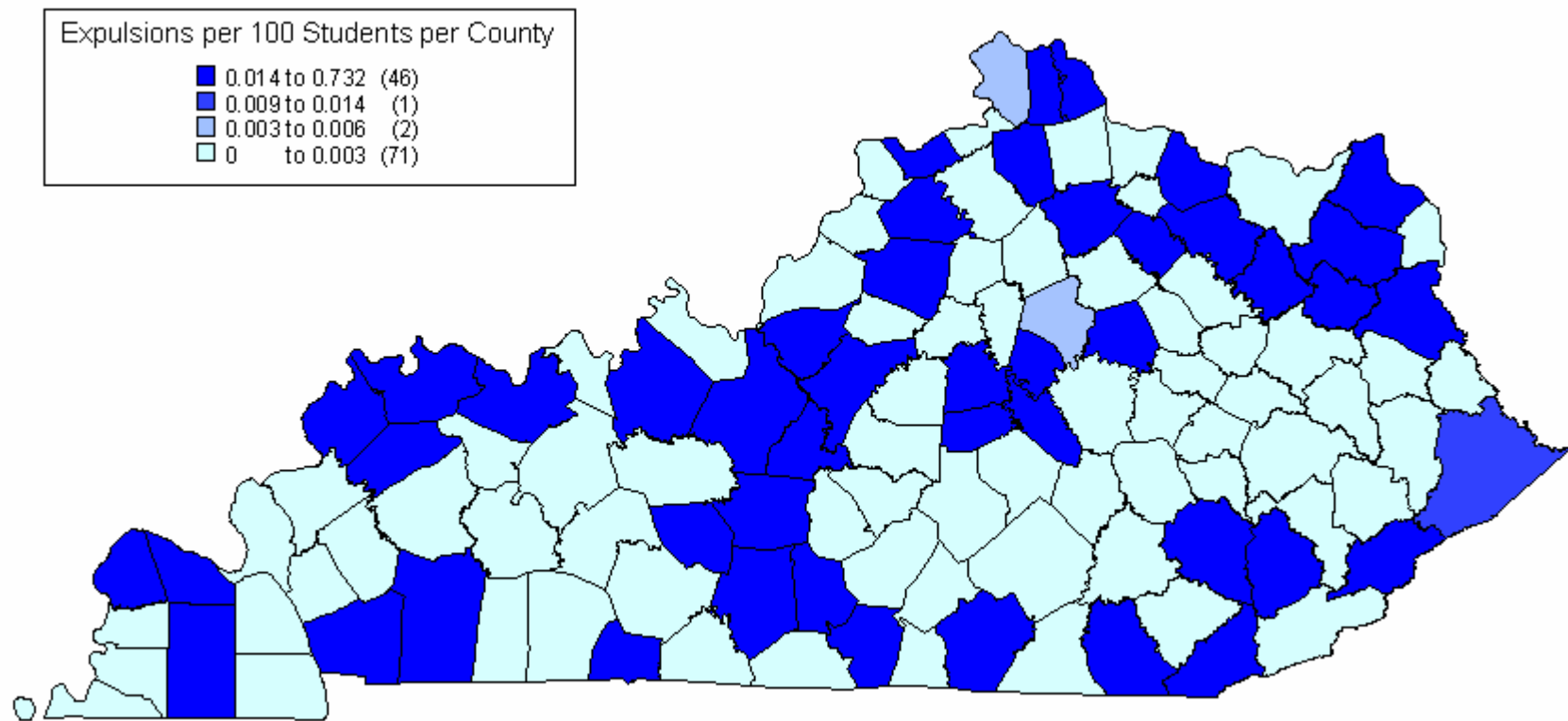
Corporal Punishments for Violations of School Board Policy Rates per 100 Students 2005-2006 School Year



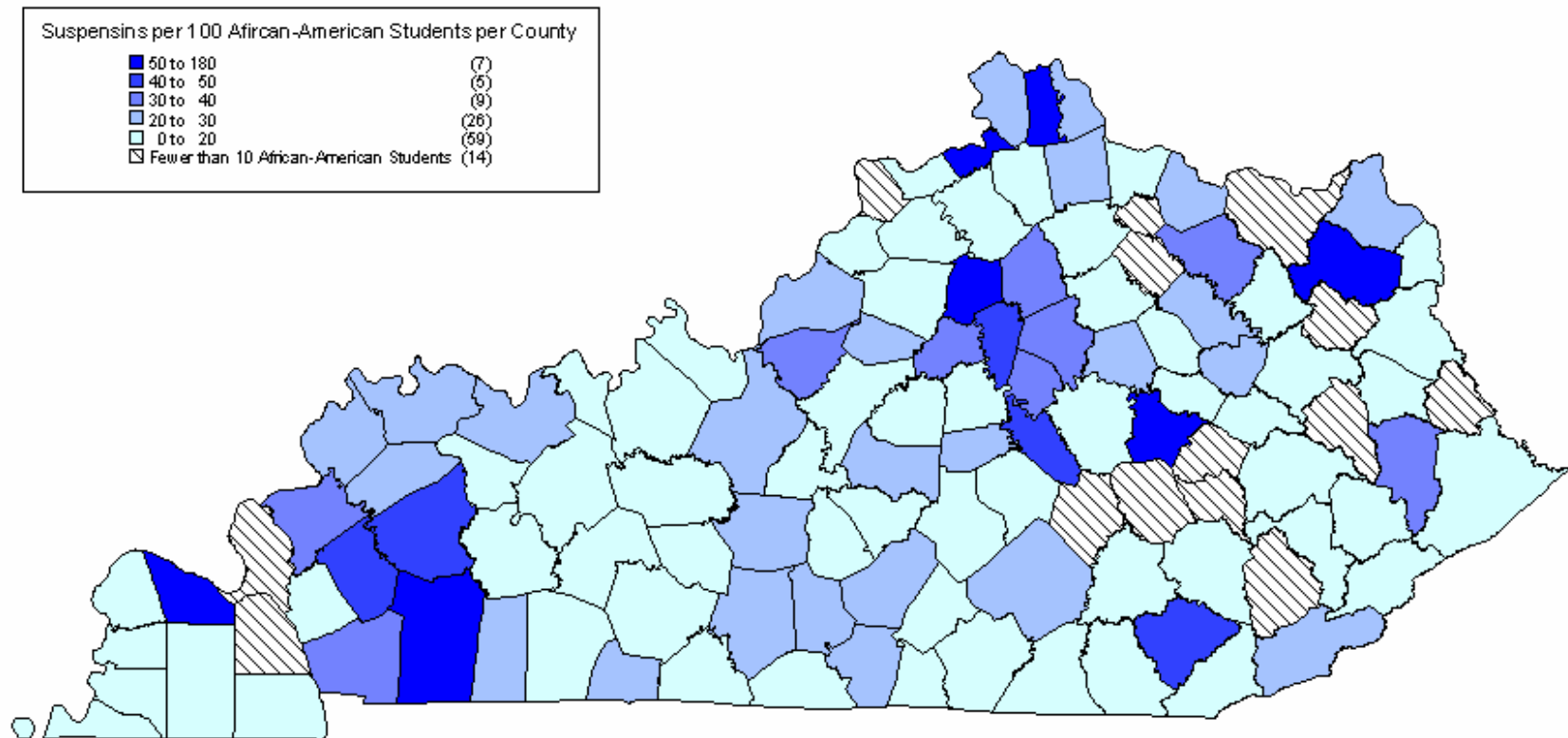
Suspensions for Law Violations Rates per 100 Students

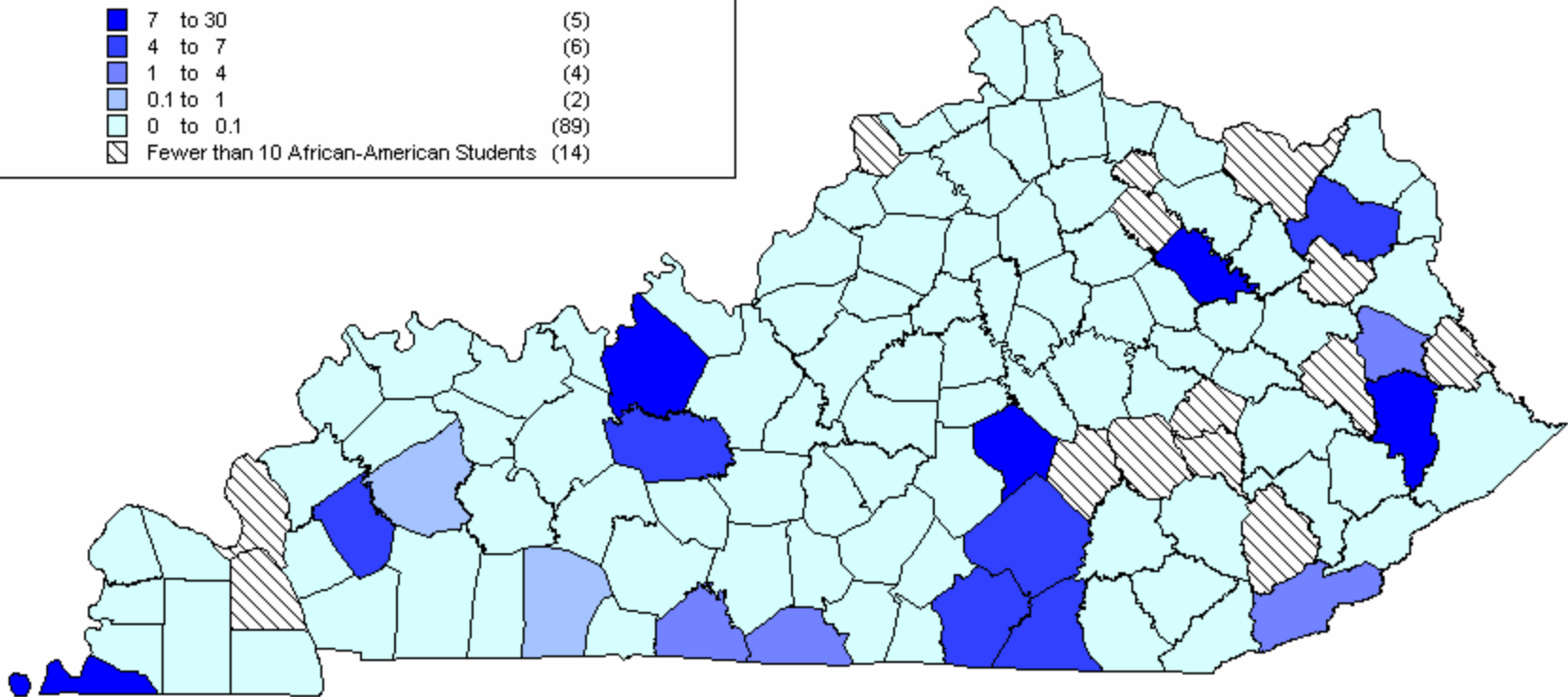
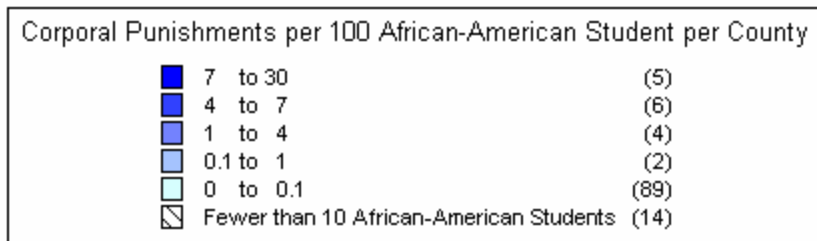
Expulsions (with and without services) for Law Violations Rates per 100 Students

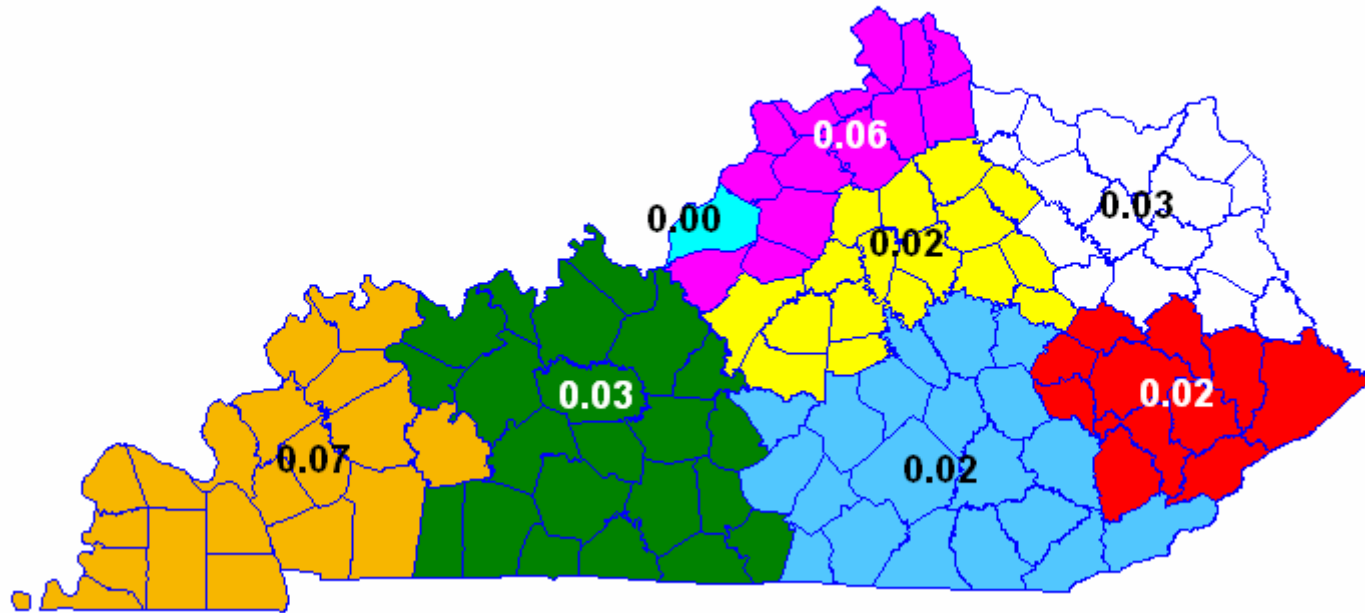
**Corporal Punishments of African-American Students for Board Violations Rates

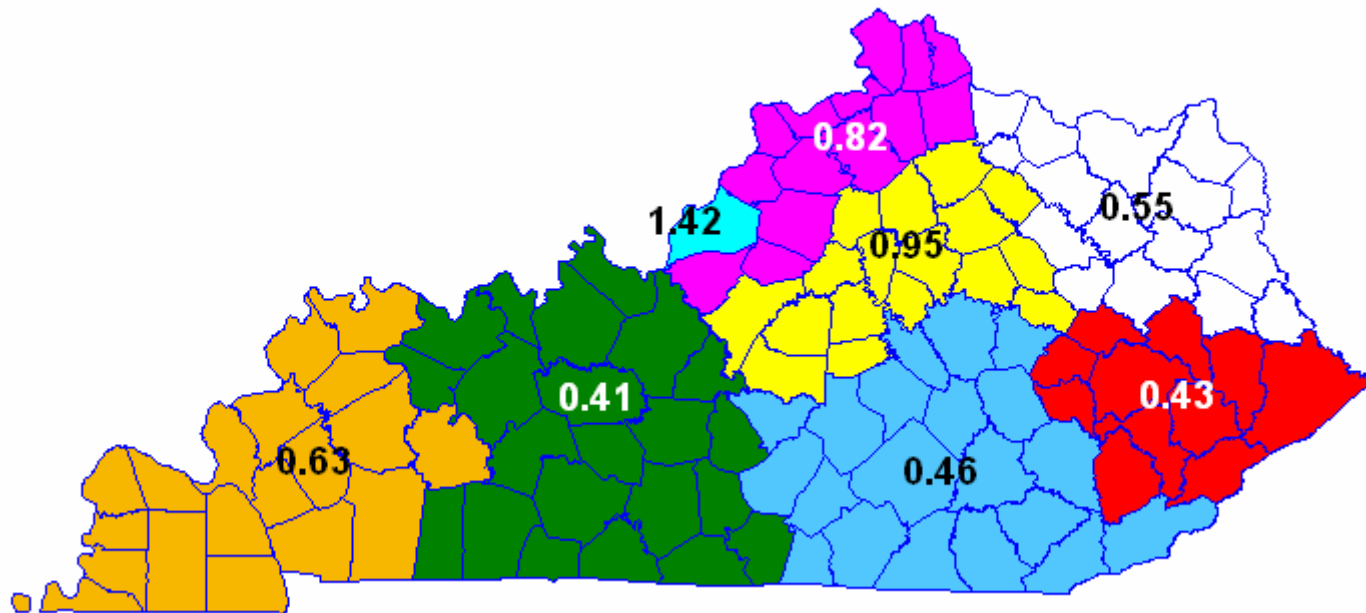
Region Maps

2005-2006 School Year**



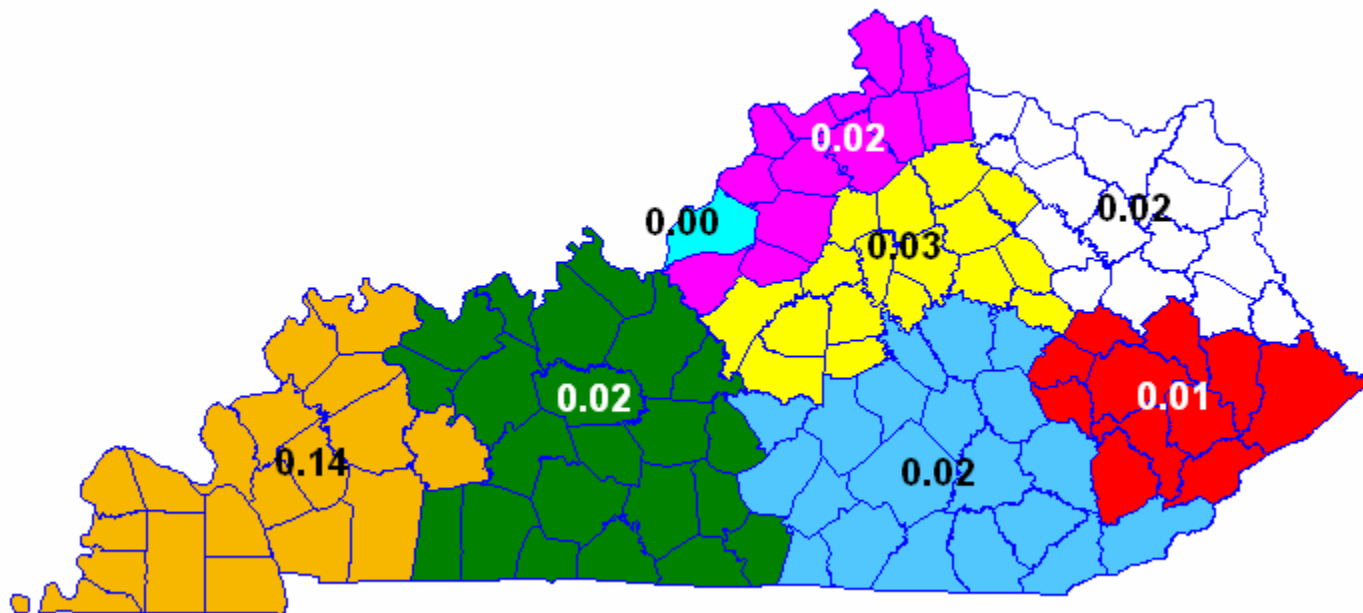

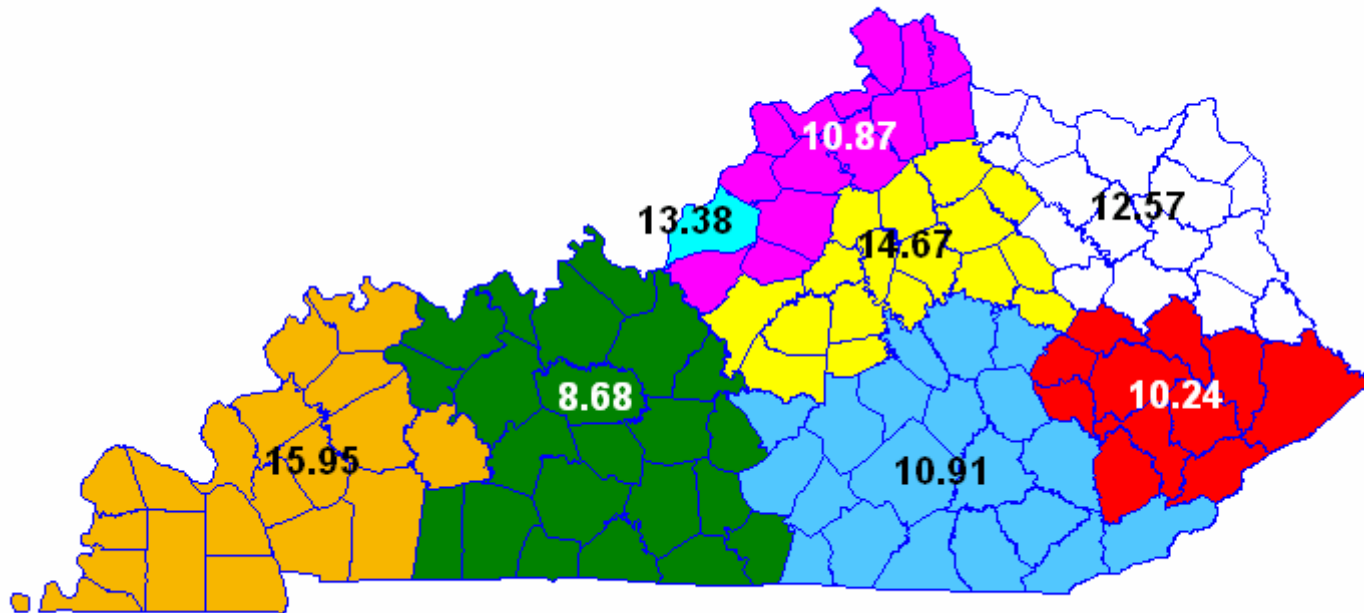

2005-2006 School Year**



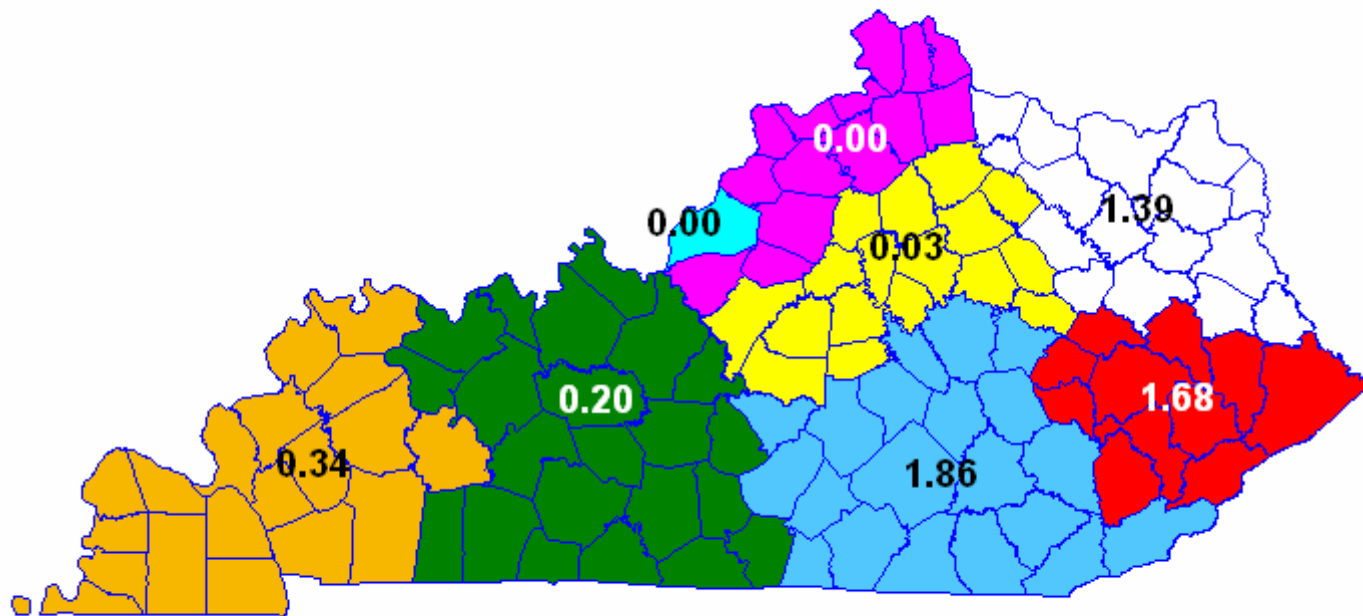

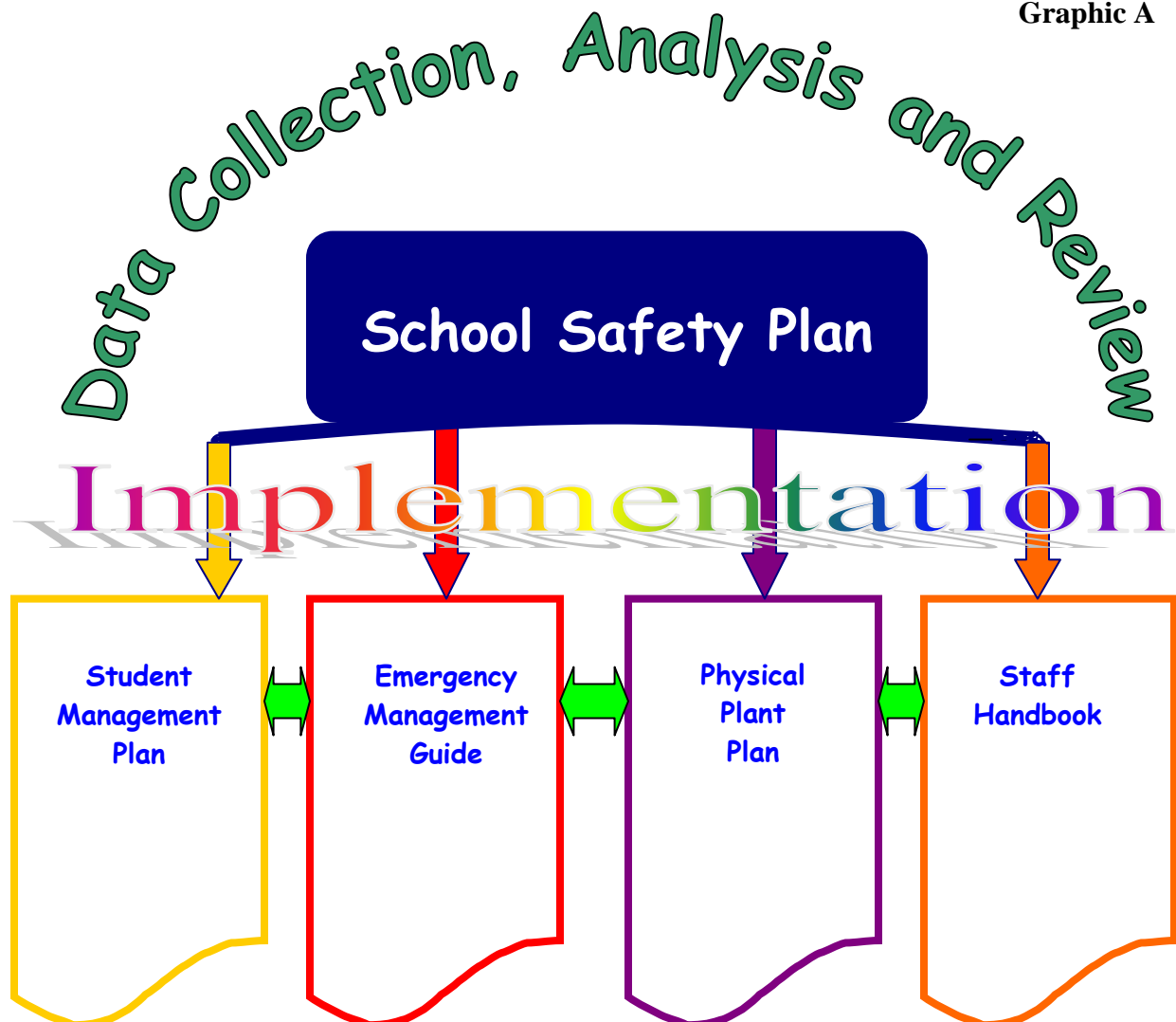
Using the 2005-2006 Report

The passage of HB330 in 1998 not only created the Kentucky Center for School Safety, but also required all Kentucky public schools to create a school safety plan. Additionally, schools were mandated to report all discipline data to the Kentucky Department of Education. While the bill does not specifically link these two activities, a school safety plan cannot be considered comprehensive unless there is a direct link between the data collection and the planning processes.

Section VI Using the 2005-2006 Report

Let's consider what is essential in a comprehensive school safety plan. Graphic A illustrates that four components are necessary for a school safety plan to be considered comprehensive (i.e., a Student Management Plan, an Emergency Management Plan, a Physical Plant Plan, and a Staff Handbook). However, the overarching representation of data symbolizes the necessity for data to be collected, analyzed, and reviewed at every step of the planning process.

DATA COLLECTION, ANALYSIS AND REVIEW

First and foremost, a school safety plan must begin with the collection of data. A school should begin the development of a school safety plan with the collection and/or consolidation of several types of data. A school should use the data collected for this report as a starting point. Data regarding suspensions, expulsions, and corporal punishments, as well as other discipline responses that occurred as a result of an office discipline referral, should be compiled. Next, a format similar to the one below should be used to analyze the data:

1. Collect other forms of data (i.e., observational data, student, staff, and parent surveys) and combine those results with the discipline data.
2. Sort the data by location, month, time, gender, ethnicity and type. Depict the data graphically or pictorially.
3. Analyze the data by posing several questions:
 - 3.1. What are the most frequent infractions?
 - 3.2. Where and when are they occurring?
 - 3.3. What are your least frequent infractions?
 - 3.4. Where and when are they occurring?
 - 3.5. Who are your most frequent offenders?
 - 3.6. Is there a common denominator among repeat offenders, type of infraction occurring most frequently, and location and time of most infractions?
4. Sort the data into four categories for possible changes: Structural, Organizational, Instructional, and Rules and Policies.

The goal with the data collection and analysis is to produce information that drives planning and decision-making.

Student Management Plan: Every school should clearly articulate the rules and expectations for positive student behavior. Frequently schools call this a Discipline Plan or Code of Conduct; however, rather than a list of “Thou Shall Nots”, the plan should clearly specify expectations for student behavior that will result in student success. An approach to developing the Student Management Plan is to:

1. Use the school data to direct the development of a pro-active student management plan that acts as a guide for positive student behavior and sets the stage for student success.
2. Include the school’s mission and a philosophy of behavior management that treats students with respect and dignity while placing the responsibility for behavior squarely on the shoulders of the student.
3. Address misbehavior in the plan. Rather than give a finite listing of infractions with a corresponding consequence, construct a menu of disciplinary consequences for misbehavior. This will provide staff the opportunity to consider the degree and frequency of the misbehavior before choosing an appropriate consequence.

Emergency Management Guide: In a natural or man-made disaster, events occur that necessitate the coordination and delivery of crisis intervention and response services. Consequently, schools must be prepared with a plan of action, which is really a set of plans rather than one overall plan. For every possible emergency situation, a school should have a plan that addresses readiness, response, and recovery and identifies the responsibilities of each staff for each stage. For example, responding to a fire in a school is very different than responding to a tornado; therefore, a plan for each is necessary. Practice drills are necessary to ensure that staff and students know how to respond to emergency situations. Check the KCSS website, www.kysafeschools.org, and the United States Department of Education's Office of Safe and Drug-Free Schools website, www.ed.gov/admins/lead/safety/emergencyplan/index.html for additional information in developing emergency management and crisis procedures.

Physical Plant Plan: Creating a safe and healthy learning environment necessitates maintaining an appropriate physical setting. The plan should require that a complete safety inspection of the building and grounds be conducted annually. Additionally, requisite monthly safety checks should be implemented as mitigating unsafe conditions may arise in short periods of time. All staff members should be made aware of the process for reporting potentially unsafe conditions to the principal for a timely response to remedy the unsafe conditions.

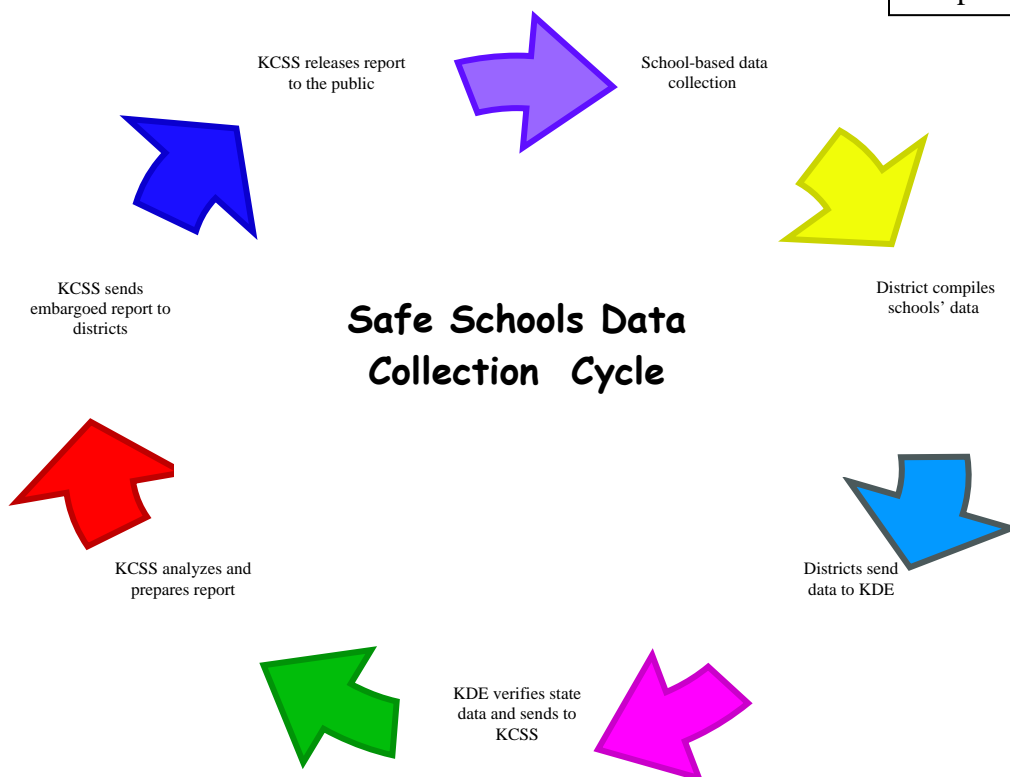
Staff Handbook: A staff handbook is a vital tool for not only the new teacher, but the seasoned teacher as well. A staff handbook should include everything a teacher needs to know about school rules, routines and procedures. While the rules, routines and procedures are preventive in nature, a major portion of the handbook should address positive student management and extend the student discipline plan to include staff instructional responsibilities. For example, during student arrival, the handbook will clearly identify staff responsibilities for supervision while different responsibilities may be identified for dismissal. Additionally, the handbook should outline a plan for instructing students regarding the student management and emergency management plans.

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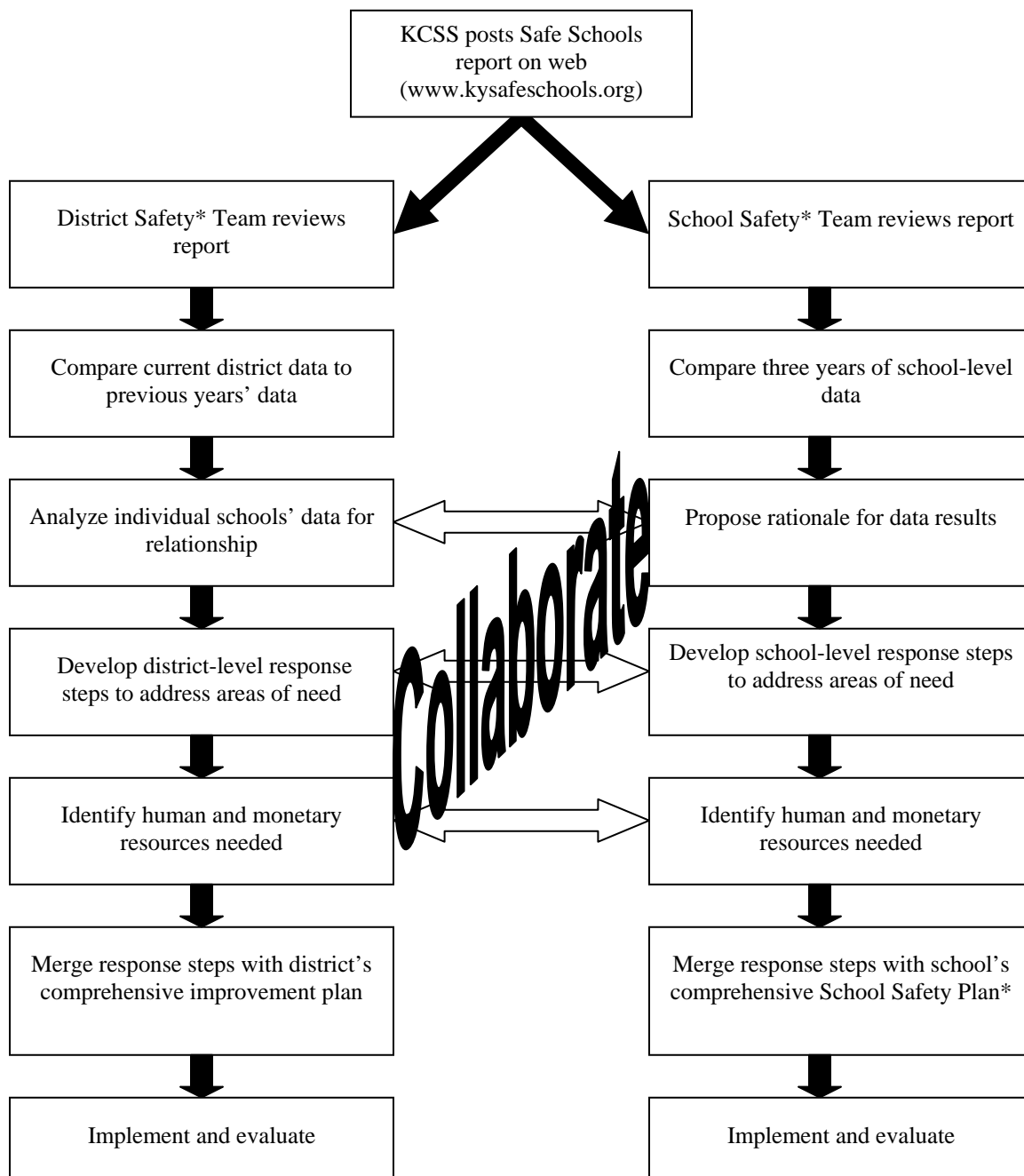
The process that provides the data for this report has developed into a predictable and dependable cycle (Graphic A). All public schools in Kentucky use STI software to collect discipline data each year beginning July 1 and ending June 30. Throughout the school year, the school enters discipline data daily and performs periodic errors checks to maintain data accuracy. At the local district level, the designated STI technology coordinator also performs error checks and works with the school to reconcile any discrepancies. At the end of the year, final verifications with the school and district are made before the district transmits the data to KDE who performs its own verification check. Once KDE has finished inspecting the data and is satisfied with the accuracy, the data are sent to KCSS. The data are checked again and entered into a statistical package for organization and analysis. KCSS staff writes an annual report of the data with state and regional interpretation. District level data are illustrated in charts that report disciplinary actions by raw numbers, total student rate, and rate for white and African-American students. The report is sent to districts in an embargoed form to allow districts to make a final confirmation of their data and to have the Center make any last minute corrections to the report. Following the embargoed period, the report is released to the public during a press conference and posted at www.kysafeschools.org, the Center's website. While the posting of the report is the end for that sequence, collection of school-level data for the next period is ongoing.

Section VI Using the 2005-2006 Report

The following flowchart, Graphic B, illustrates how the information in this report can be used by the district and at the school-level. The district's Safety Team, or other designated committee, should review the report and compare current data with previous years' data. The district data should be further analyzed by review of individual school-level data to determine areas of concern. Simultaneously, a school-level team is reviewing the school's data, comparing it to past data, and asking "why" the results are what they are. District personnel and school personnel should begin to collaborate to prepare a rational and doable plan to respond to areas of need. The plan must include needed monetary and human resources with a corresponding plan to provide those resources. Subsequently, the school and district develop implementation plans that specify the responsible person(s), beginning/ending dates, and evaluation measures.
