What to Do if Your Child Makes a Threat

If you become aware that your child has made a threat of any kind against the school or another individual, it is your responsibility to report this immediately to school authorities or law enforcement. We take all threats seriously, and timely communication can help prevent dangerous situations from escalating. Threats, even if made in jest, carry serious consequences and can lead to disciplinary actions or legal involvement.

What to Do if Your Child Reports Another Student Made a Threat

If your child reports that another student has made a threat, encourage them to provide as much detail as possible and reassure them that reporting is the right thing to do. Immediately report the information to the school or local law enforcement so the threat can be thoroughly investigated. Your child's safety is our top priority, and we will take swift action to evaluate any report, regardless of its nature.
